A quorum being present to conduct any and all business that may come before the meeting.

At 2 o'clock P.M., Standard Time, the Clerk called the meeting to order.

In the absence of the Supervisor, it was moved by Walter, seconded by Pawlak, that Peter J. Inda, act as Chairman of this meeting.

Moved by Walter, seconded by Pawlak, that the minutes of the previous regular and special meetings be approved as published in the official paper.

Moved by Walter, seconded by Kaufman, Highway Superintendent that the following preamble, ordinance and order be adopted:

WHEREAS, it has been found, after frequent complaints on the part of the public, that the landing, ascent and testing of aeroplanes on landing fields and airports, located in close proximity to public highways, causes dust to rise in clouds and to be carried by air current upon public highways and into homes and business places in their vicinity, in the Town of Cheektowaga, to the great discomfort of the public and damage to their property, and

WHEREAS, the nuisance thus caused can easily be prevented and avoided through the proper operation of such landing fields and airports, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that no person, firm or corporation shall maintain or operate a field, ground, airport or station, by whatever name designated, for the landing, ascent, testing, or repair of aeroplanes or flying machines of any character, unless such field, ground, airport or station shall be kept in such condition by the use of oil or other substance or by type of construction, that no dust or other offensive substance shall escape from the premises upon which such field, ground airport or station, is or shall be located. And be it further.

RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that any violation of this ordinance and order shall constitute disorderly conduct and the violator thereof shall be subject to a fine of not more than fifty (\$50.00), dollars, for each and every offense. And that each day on which the violation of this ordinance and order shall continue, shall constitute a separate offense. And be it further:

RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that this ordinance and order shall take effect within 3 days after the service of a certified copy thereof upon the owner, operator or person in charge of any landing field, airport or station now existing within the Town of Cheektowaga. And be it further

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RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that the Town Clerk, be, and he is hereby, directed to serve a certified copy of this order upon the owner, operator or person in charge of any and all landing fields, airports or stations now within the said town. And be it further ordered and directed to cause a copy of this order to be published in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga.  
Carried, Ayes 5, Noes 0.

Moved by Walter, seconded by Pawlak, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to place Wiremen's Indemnity Insurance on all members of Fire companies in the Town of Cheektowaga, to cover injuries received by them in any portion of the Town of Cheektowaga, that is not within any fire district or incorporated village, as provided by Article 10 of the General Municipal Law, Section 205.  
Carried, Ayes 5, Noes 0.

At 2 o'clock P. M. Eastern Standard time, the Town Clerk read the notice of hearing on the petition for the construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along the east side of Pine Ridge Road, from Wildy Street, to a point 270 feet south of Wildy Street, in the Town of Cheektowaga, and submitted proof of publication of said notice in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga, and the certificate of the Town Clerk, showing that said notice was duly posted, as provided by statute.

It was thereupon moved by Walter, seconded by Pawlak, that the proof of publication and of posting said notice, be placed on file in the Town Clerk's office.

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness became, by its terms, due and payable on the 6th day of April, 1931, and it is necessary to renew the same for a further period of 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga and the collection of assessments to raise the cost of said improvements; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under its corporate seal, to execute and issue a certificate of indebtedness of said town for the sum of \$97,500.00, to be dated as of the 6th day of April, 1931, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum; which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk,

who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and shall be delivered to the said bank in renewal of the certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, dated the 5th day of January, 1931, now held by said bank.  
Carried, Ayes 5, Noes 0.

It was moved by Walter, seconded by Pawlak, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore and on or about the 5th day of January, 1931, duly authorized the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, the certificate of indebtedness of said town for the sum of \$20,000.00, payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, within 90 days after its date, with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate was duly delivered to the said Liberty Bank of Buffalo and the sum of \$20,000.00, was duly loaned thereon by said bank and said sum was duly received by the Town of Cheektowaga; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness has become due and payable to said Liberty Bank of Buffalo and the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay and satisfy the same and it is necessary to renew the said loan, temporarily, pending the collection of valid taxes levied and outstanding against the taxable property of the Town of Cheektowaga; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$62,000.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo to pay the share of the said town in the cost of extending and improving Pine Ridge Road, as a County Aid-Town Highway, from Harlem Avenue to Cayuga Street, in said town, and for the purpose of securing said loan, did duly issue and deliver a certificate of indebtedness for said sum to said bank; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness, dated the 12th day of January, 1931, became, by its terms, due and payable on the 13th day of April, 1931 and it is necessary to renew the said loan and certificate of indebtedness for a further period of 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of \$62,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, for a further period of 90 days, from the 13th day of April, 1931, and that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby, directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and upon its faith and credit, a certificate of indebtedness of said town, to be dated as of the 13th day of April 1931, to provide for the payment of the sum of \$62,000.00, with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, and which said certificate of indebtedness shall be delivered to the said bank in renewal of the certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, dated the 12th day of January, 1931, which said bank now holds.

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$14,500.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, to pay valid claims for work done and materials furnished in and about the execution of written contracts with the Town of Cheektowaga for the construction of certain local public improvements, and, as security therefor, did duly execute, issue and deliver to the said Liberty Bank of Buffalo, a certificate of indebtedness of the said town for the sum of \$14,500.00, dated as of the 19th day of January, 1931; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness became,

by its terms due and payable on the 20th day of April, 1931, and it is necessary to renew the same for a further period of 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga and the collection of assessments to raise the cost of said improvements; now, therefore, be it

After further consideration of the matter, by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents, it was moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the petition of Buffalo Valley Bus Lines Inc., as set forth in the notice of this hearing be denied.

It was then moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Inda, that the following be adopted:-

RESOLVED, that the application of Buffalo Transit Co. Inc., to operate a bus route in the Town of Cheektowaga, described as follows, to-wit:

COMMENCING at the intersection of Broadway and Union Road; thence southerly along Union Road to Buffalo and Depew Boulevard; thence easterly along Buffalo and Depew Boulevard to Bennett Road; thence easterly along Bennett Road to Indian Road so-called; thence northerly along Indian Road to Rowley Road; thence easterly along Rowley Road to Borden Road; thence northerly along Borden Road to Broadway; thence easterly along Broadway to Transit Road and, by reverse movement, over the same route westerly be and the same is hereby granted subject to and upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

- FIRST:- That said Buffalo Transit Co. Inc., its successors and assigns, shall comply with all of the provisions of the Transportation Corporations Law, the Highway Law and the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York; and with all ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga and of its successor, or successors, including all laws and ordinances now in force and such as shall hereafter be enacted and or come into effect;
- SECOND:- That, neither the said Buffalo Transit Co. Inc., nor its successor or successors, assign or assigns, shall operate any bus or other vehicle in and along any public highway in the Town of Cheektowaga by means of the trackless trolley system, so-called;
- THIRD:- That the said Buffalo Transit Co. Inc., its successor or successors, assign or assigns, shall at all times, during the period covered by this franchise and during any period covered by any extension thereof, charge a reasonable rate of fare for any service rendered; which fare shall not exceed the rate of fares set forth on the schedule of fares heretofore filed with this board, unless the said schedule of fares shall have been modified with the formal consent, manifested by the adoption of a resolution, setting forth the changes therein by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga;
- FOURTH:- That children under 5 years of age, if accompanied by a parent or guardian, shall be carried free. And children between 5 and 12 years of age shall be carried at one-half the fare charged for carrying adult passengers over the same route;
- FIFTH:- That the permission hereby granted shall not be assigned, without the formal permission of this board, and is and shall be subject to modification, or revocation, by the further order of this board, or if its successor or successors, and shall end and expire on the 1st day of July 1934, unless extended beyond that date by further action of this board, or its successor, or successors;
- SIXTH:- That, before this permission shall become operative, or of effect, in any degree or manner, the said Buffalo Transit Co. Inc., shall file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, its written acceptance of the same and of the conditions upon which it is granted.
