Minutes of a regular meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the Town Hall with the following members present:

A quorum being present to transact any and all business that may come before the meeting.

At 2 o'clock P. M., Daylight Saving Time, the Chairman called the meeting to order.

The Clerk then read the invitation to contractors to submit bids for the construction of the following local public improvements:

- ITEM 1: The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Concord Place from Cleveland Drive to a point 825 feet northerly therefrom.
- ITEM 2: The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Aris Avenue From William Street southerly to a point near the southerly boundary line of the William Harlem Land Corporation's tract.
- ITEM 3: The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Crisfield Avenue from William Street southerly to a point near the southerly boundary line of the William-Harlem Land Corporations tract.
- ITEM 4: The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along the easterly side of Pine Ridge Road from Wildy Street to a point distant 270 feet southerly therefrom.
- ITEM 5: The grading, drainage and pavement of Concord Place from Cleveland Drive to a point 825 feet northerly therefrom.

This proceeding having been brought by direction of the Commission to consider the elimination of the existing highway-railroad crossings at grade of the railroads operated by The Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company, Erie Railroad Company and Lehigh Valley Railroad Company and Ludwig (Violet) avenue located about 3.75 miles west of Depew station (Erie railroad) in the town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie; and public hearings having been held on May 6 and 19, 1931, by and before Maurice W. Williams, assistant engineer, specially authorized to conduct said hearings, at which those hereinbefore named appeared; and The Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company, Erie Railroad Company, Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, the Department of Public Works, the County of Erie, and other interested persons having been given the required notice of said hearings; and the Commission having determined that public welfare requires the elimination of said existing crossings at grade; it is

Ordered: 1. That the existing highway-railroad crossings at grade of the railroads operated by The Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company, Erie Railroad Company and Lehigh Valley Railroad Company and Ludwig (Violet) avenue, located about 3.75 miles west of Depew station (Erie railroad) in the town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, be and hereby are designated for elimination.

2. That the said existing crossings at grade shall be eliminated by placing the grade of the highway above the grade of the railroads substantially in accordance with a plan filed at the hearing on May 19, 1931, and marked "Exhibit 6", except as modified as follows:

(a) On the grade-separation structure curbs shall be 8 inches in height and the guard rail on the eastern side shall consist of closed metal pickets.

(b) Pavement on the approaches shall consist of a 2-inch top course of bituminous macadam type 4 or 5 and a 5-inch bottom course of broken stone or suitable slag, together with a run-of-bank gravel or slag foundation course where and to the extent necessary.

3. That The Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company shall with all convenient speed prepare the necessary plans, specifications and estimates of cost of the project herein authorized and directed and shall submit them to the Commission for its approval.

4. That The Delaware Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company shall perform all of the work hereinabove authorized and directed.

5. That of the 50 per centum of the cost of the project herein authorized and directed which is to borne by the railroad corporations, The Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company, Erie Railroad Company and Lehigh Valley Railroad Company shall each bear such per centum relating to that portion of said project occurring within the right of way of the railroad operated by it, and that said railroad corporations shall share equally said per centum relating to the remainder of said project; provided that said railroad corporations shall share equally said per centum relating to land and property damages for said entire project.
