On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl the minutes of the regular meeting held on March 21st, 1932 were approved as published in the Cheektowaga Record, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga, N.Y.

Carried.

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl the monthly reports of Judge Pawlak, Faber, Piatek and Judge Milne, also the monthly report of Town Clerk Sturm was ordered received and filed.

Carried.

On motion of Eberl, seconded by Sturm, the invitation from Pine Hill Hose Co. #5 Drum Corps. inviting the Town Board to attend their annual dance, Saturday April 9th, was ordered accepted, and received and filed.

Carried.

On motion of Milne, seconded by Sturm, the invitation of the Pine Hill Hose Co. #5 inviting the Town Board to attend their annual dance and fish fry on Wednesday evening April 20th, 1932 was accepted and ordered received and filed.

Carried.

An invitation from the U-Crest Volunteer Hose Co. inviting the Town Board to attend their annual card party and social was presented and read and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl this invitation was accepted and ordered received and filed.

Carried.

Communication from the Rescue Volunteer Hose Co. #1 that they had appointed Mr. Robert Stier, as Fire Police, was on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Faber referred to the Chief of Police.

Carried.

Communication of the Central Council of Citizens and Taxpayers Ass'n stating that it was reported that the Town Board was going to hold one public meeting monthly in the evening, and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Faber this communication was referred to the Board as a whole and the Supervisor directed to communicate back to the Association on the findings of said Board.

Carried.

Communication from the Clinton Garden Taxpayers Ass'n desiring to know why the Police officer on foot was taken away from their section was referred to the Chief of Police, this Association again also, protested to the dumping of garbage on Dingen Street, and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Faber, this second protest on the dumping of garbage was referred to the Supervisor.

Communication from the Doyle Volunteer Hose Company No. 1 stating that they had approved of Mr. Joseph Stoeckl, to act as Fire Policeman, and requested that the Town Board confirm this appointment,

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl this request was granted and referred to the Chief of Police.

#### Carried.

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl, Charles Wohlford Jr. Chief of Police, was authorized to join the New York State Association of Chiefs of Police, and the Supervisor was duly authorized to draw an order in favor of said association, for the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) to pay dues for the first annum.

WHEREAS, the Board of Highway Superintendents and Town Board of this Town heretofore and at various times between March 4th, 1929 and September 8th, 1931 borrowed large sums of moneys from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, New York and issued to the said Liberty Bank its temporary certificates of indebtedness therefore, and

WHEREAS, none of such loans were paid when due, but, have been repeatedly renewed, and

WHEREAS, the moneys raised by taxation upon the lands of this Town to pay such obligations of the Town has been diverted to other purposes, and

WHEREAS, the Liberty Bank of Buffalo by reason thereof applied all available moneys of the Town on deposit in such bank to the certificates of indebtedness of the Town held by it, and

WHEREAS, the Liberty Bank, through its representatives has agreed to restore with interest all Town moneys on deposit previously appropriated by it for application of Town loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the payment back of such moneys with interest be approved and that the Town Attorney be instructed to withhold the institutions of suit to recoved back such moneys as previously directed to pay from the General Fund of the Town to the Liberty Bank of Buffalo the sum of Forty-four thousand, eight hundred and twenty-four dollars and ninety-five cents (\$44,824 in full payment of the principal and interest on the following certificates of indebtedness of the Town held by said bank, to wit;

WHEREAS, such charges, claims and demands are for the payment of certain certificates of indebtedness of this Town here-tofore issued in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the year 1932, and

WHEREAS, the Receiver of Taxes and Assessments of this Town has failed to collect the full amount of the taxes levied by the Board of Supervisors of Erie County for the year 1932 for Town purposes, and

WHEREAS, a certificate has been filed in the office of the Town Clerk to the effect that the charges, claims and demands, of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, New York, have been allowed in whole, and thereby become legal obligations and charges against this Town.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board, in anticipation of the Taxes of the current fiscal year, borrow upon the fiath and credit of the Town a sum of money sufficient to pay the aggregate amount of the accounts so audited and allowed, and

BE IT RURTHER RESOLVED, that a temporary certificate of indebtedness be issued therefore, bearing interest at six percent perannum, payable three months from the date hereof, and that the Supervisor of this Town be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute such certificate in the name of the Town and that the Town Clerk be and hereby is directed to affic thereto the seal of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and hereby is authorized and empowered to borrow from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, New York upon the fiath and credit of the Town a sum sufficient to pay the principal sum of such note and accrued interest, and to execute and deliver to said Liberty Bank the promisory note of the Town therefore, countersigned by the Town Clerk, payable ninety days from the date therof, with interest at the rate of six percentum (6%) per annum.
