A quorum being present to transact any and all business that may come before the Board, the Chairman then called the meeting to order.

Mr. Sturm offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, C. CHASE ZALEMSKI, as Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga has reported to this Town Board that insufficient funds were available for the payment of the principal and interest of certain Town bonds heretofore issued by the Town of Cheektowaga and which became due and payable on January 1st, 1933 in the principal sum of \$20,000.00, together with interest charges in the further sum of \$48,616.86, and

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of November, 1932, the Town Board of this Town, pursuant to the provisions of Article VI-A of the Town Law, duly adopted its annual estimate and tax budget for the year, 1933, and included therein an appropriation for the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds hereinbefore referred to sufficient for the payment thereof, and

WHEREAS, the total appropriation in such annual estimate and tax budget for various town purposes, after the deduction of anticipated revenues, amount to \$680,226.71, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie, on the 13th day of November, 1932, duly levied, assessed and provided for the raising by tax upon the real and personal property liable to taxation in the Town of Cheektowaga the said amount hereinbefore referred to, and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that for various town purposes for which funds have been appropriated and within the amounts appropriated therefor, the sum of \$11,383.14 will be required before revenues and/or taxes are received for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1933 and ending December 31st, 1933.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow from the M. & T. Trust Co. of Buffalo, for the purposes aforesaid, the sum of \$80,000.00 in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1933 and ending December 31st, 1933, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that one Certificate of Indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York in the principal sum of \$80,000.00, dated the 4th day of January, 1933, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum and maturing on the 15th day of March, 1933, be issued in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1933 and ending December 31st, 1933, and that such Certificate of Indebtedness be issued in substantially the following form:

The Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, hereby certifies that it is indebted to the M. & T. Trust Co. of Buffalo, New York, in the sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) which the said Town promises and agrees to pay to the M. & T. Trust Co., together with interest thereon, at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum from the date hereof.

This certificate of indebtedness is issued by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, pursuant to Section 149 of the Town Law, as amended, against revenues and taxes levied for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1933 and ending on the 31st day of December, 1933, and pursuant to a resolution duly adopted by the Town Board of said Town on the 4th day of January, 1933.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, to happen and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this certificate of Indebtedness, exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that the issue of Certificate of Indebtedness of which this is one, together with all other indebtedness of said Town, is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of the State of New York. The full faith and credit of said Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this certificate of indebtedness according to its terms.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said Town of Cheektowaga has caused this Certificate of Indebtedness to be signed by the Supervisor and sealed with the corporate seal of said Town, countersigned by its Town Clerk and this Certificate of Indebtedness to be dated as of the 4th day of January, 1933.

A quorum being present, the Chairman called the meeting to order to transact any and all business that may properly come before the Board.

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Faber, the minutes of the regular meetings held on December 19th, 24th, and December 28th, 1932, also January 4th, 1933 were approved as published in the Cheektowaga Record, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga.
Carried.

The report of Elmer C. Mesner, Town Engineer, relative to a survey of the water conditions in Sanitary Sewer District #2, along with recommendations for relief of the flooded conditions in that district was presented and read and on motion of Sturm, seconded by Faber, this report was referred to the Superintendent of Highways.
Carried.

Application of Matthew Pfohl for permission to collect garbage in District known as Cleveland Hill in the Town of Cheektowaga, was read and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl, this application was granted.
Carried.

Communication from the Town Attorney, informing the Town Board that he had proceeded with the mandamus against the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie to prohibit the County of Erie from charging back against the Town of Cheektowaga deficiencies arising out of foreclosures of tax scripts, as per resolution passed by the Town Board was on motion of Sturm, seconded by Pawlak, ordered received and filed.
Carried.

Communication from Don Durfee, Cayuga St., Cheektowaga, N.Y. offering his services and airplane to the Cheektowaga Police Department was read, and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl, this communication was ordered received and filed for further consideration.
Carried.

On motion of Eberl, seconded by Piatek, the bill of Dr. A. W. Wagner, [redacted], for services rendered to Max Kaiser, [redacted], Cheektowaga, N.Y., Fireman, U²Crest Hose Company, and injured while attending a fire at Genesee Street near Rupp Ave., on September 25, 1932, was referred to the Supervisor for payment and to be charged back to the respective fire district.
Carried.

Mr. John Markowski, entered a complaint against the unsanitary housing conditions of men working for the New York Central R.R. Co. stating that these men were living in box cars and, in his opinion, this should be investigated by the Health Officer, also complained about the poor water conditions in and along Union Road and that an effort should be made to compel the Western New York Water Co. to supply water to that section of the

town. This complaint was referred to the Judicial Committee and Health Officer to meet with the delegates of Cheektowaga Taxpayers Assn. No. 1 for investigation.

Ben Behringer entered a complaint against the dumping of garbage on the Matthew Pfohl farm on the Creek Road, stating that in his opinion this was very unsanitary and should be stopped at once, this complaint was referred to the Judicial committee and to report back to this board at its next regular meeting.

Mr. Joseph Dux, delegate from the Central Council Taxpayers Assn'n addressed the Board relative to additional lights on Genesee Street at the Bridge corssing the West Shore Railroad saying that this was a dangerous curve and should have more lights for the protection of motorists. This was referred to the public Improvement Committee.

On motion of Sturm, seconded by Faber the following resolution was adopted;

WHEREAS, the Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company has protested against the assessment of certain portions of their land, claiming that said land is being used for Right-of-way purposes only.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that this matter of assessment be referred to the Town Engineer, Board of Assessors and Town Attorney, to investigate and advise the Board all of the facts and circumstances in connection with same. Carried.

Judge Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was duly seconded by Mr. Eberl.

WHEREAS, that heretofore and during the year of 1926, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga and the sewer commissioner District #5 of the Town of Cheektowaga entered into a contract with the Town of Amherst to furnish sewer service to that portion of the Town of Cheektowaga known as sewer district #5, for which service the said Town of Cheektowaga agreed to pay the agreed price, which was a charge computed at the same rate per thousand square feet, as was during each of said years computed, charged and assessed for disposal plant and trunk sewer expense on the property within Amherst Sewer District #1, such payment to be made on the 1st day of the year following the rendering of such sewer service, and

WHEREAS, during said years, above referred to, the Town of Cheektowaga used said sewage service and that be reason of the premises there became due and owing to the Town of Amherst from the Town of Cheektowaga, on January 1st, 1927, \$574.39; on January 1st, 1928, \$759.13; on January 1st, 1929, \$1,563.86 and on January 1st, 1930, \$1,563.88, all of said sums being computed and charged on the basis hereinbefore referred to.

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WHEREAS, that on or about April 7, 1930, the Town of Amherst and the Town of Cheektowaga, each through their then duly elected constituted officials, or more than a majority of the duly and elected constituted officials of said Township, entered into a certain agreement in writing, wherein and whereby the Town of Amherst agreed to and with the Town of Cheektowaga, to furnish sewage service to that portion of said Town of Cheektowaga, known as Sewer District #5, under and pursuant to certain conditions and terms referred to in said written agreement. That among the terms of the said agreement, the Town of Cheektowaga agreed to pay to the Town of Amherst for such sewerage service annual rental to be computed at the same rate per thousand square feet as shall be computed and assessed for disposal plant and trunk sewer expenses each year on the property within Amherst Sewer District #1, Computations to be made as of October 1, 1930 and the 1st day of October of each year thereafter during the life of the agreement and payment to be made on the said October 1, 1930 and the 1st day of each October thereafter during the continuance of said contract, Pursuant to said agreement heretofore referred to there is now due from the Town of Cheektowaga to the Town of Amherst the sum of \$5,790.91, with interest on \$574.39, part thereof, from January 1st, 1927, interest on \$759.13, part thereof, from January 1st, 1928, interest on \$1,563.86, part thereof, from January 1st, 1929, interest on \$1,563.88, part thereof, from January 1st, 1930 and interest on \$1,329.65, part thereof, from October 1st, 1931 and

WHEREAS, the Town of Amherst has instituted suit in the Supreme Court, Erie County for the collection of the aforesaid charges, and

WHEREAS, the Board has heretofore instructed the Town Attorney to defend the action in an effort to ascertain the legality of the contract heretofore referred to, and

WHEREAS, it now appears that the contracts were entered into by the proper officials and the services were rendered and that the charges are in order,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it


RESOLVED, that in view of the foregoing facts; that the Town of Cheektowaga pay to the Town of Amherst the sum of \$5,790.91 with interest on \$574.39, part thereof, from January 1st, 1927 interest on \$759.13, part thereof, from January 1st, 1928, interest on \$1,563.86, part thereof from January 1st, 1929, interest on \$1,563.88, part thereof, from January 1st, 1930 and interest on \$1,329.65, part thereof, from October 1st, 1931, Said sum to be paid upon the receipt of the 1931-1932 back tax moneys from the County of Erie. The sum of \$1430.24, plus interest due for the year of 1932, shall be paid on or - - - - - about April 1st, 1933, and be it further

RESOLVED, that said sum to be paid be a charge against Sewer District #5, and be it further

RESOLVED, that upon the payment of the aforesaid sum the Town Attorney, be and he hereby is instructed and directed to discontinue the action now pending between the Town of Amherst and the Town of Cheektowaga.

M. on the 17th, day of October, 1932 when she tripped and fell over a water meter pipe projecting from the ground in front of No. 8 Olcott Place, testimony of the hearing was taken by the Town Attorney and is now on file in the Town Clerks office, and the said claim was referred back to the Town Attorney to defend the interest of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Mr. Leo M. Abeles, President of the Cheektowaga Board of Trade, addressed the Board relative to the Grade crossing elimination of the West Shore Railroad at Harlem Avenue and Walden Avenue and urged the Board to cooperate with the Board of Trade to have the project started as soon as possible.

RESOLVED, that the Town Board go on record as being unanimously opposed to any further extentions being given to the New York Central Railroad Company to begin construction of the Harlem Avenue elimination of the West Shore Railroad Crossing and be it further,

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor and Town Attorney be authorized to confer and cooperate with Leo M. Abeles, President of the Cheektowaga Board of Trade and demand action of the New York Central Railroad Company.

On motion of Milne, seconded by Faber the Supervisor and Town Attorney were authorized to attend the conference of the Association of Towns to be held at Albany, New York on Feb. 15th and 16th and such other legislative matters as may be of interest to the Town.

Carried.

A verbal complaint was presented to the Board relative to the Dumping of garbage on the Matthew Pfohl farm on the Ellicott Road. The chairman referred this complaint to the Judicial Committee and Health officer and to report back to this Board at its next regular meeting, also a verbal complaint on lights being out, in and along William Street this complaint was referred to the Public Improvement Committee and to report back at our next regular meeting.

A petition from residence and Taxpayers of Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga, requesting the Town Board to investigate the present condition of sewerage equipment, sewers, drains and disposal plant, in the said district as to terms of contract, Bonds, Taxes, etc. was presented and read.

After some discussion on the above petition the Supervisor appointed the following committee to investigate the conditions of sewer district No. 5, Eberl, Sturm, Faber, Town Attorney Fisher, Town Engineer Mesner and Supervisor Zalemski, this committee to report back to the Town Board as soon as possible on their findings.

Petition to have exempted from Taxation a certain parcel of land situated on the Ellicott Creek Road and being about 4 acres in all and that the United States of America is about to purchase this property to be used for airway station purposes and is now owned by Joseph Foisset and Mary I. Foisset on motion of Sturm, seconded by Eberl this petition was referred to the Judicial Committee and the Town Attorney.

Carried.

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Faber the communication from the Evangelical Lutheran, St. Johns Church of Buffalo relative to cemeteries was referred to the Supervisor and Town Attorney.

Carried.

Communication from the New York State Association of Highway Engr's relative to moneys appropriated for State Highways, Engineers, ect. was on motion of Milne and seconded by Pawlak ordered received and filed.

Carried.

Communication from the Department of Public Works, relative to flooded conditions along Genesee Street being county Highway No. 1212 stating that this condition would be improved by the construction of a shallow ditch parallel with the Highway in the spring, on motion of Eberl, seconded by Faber this communication was ordered received and filed.

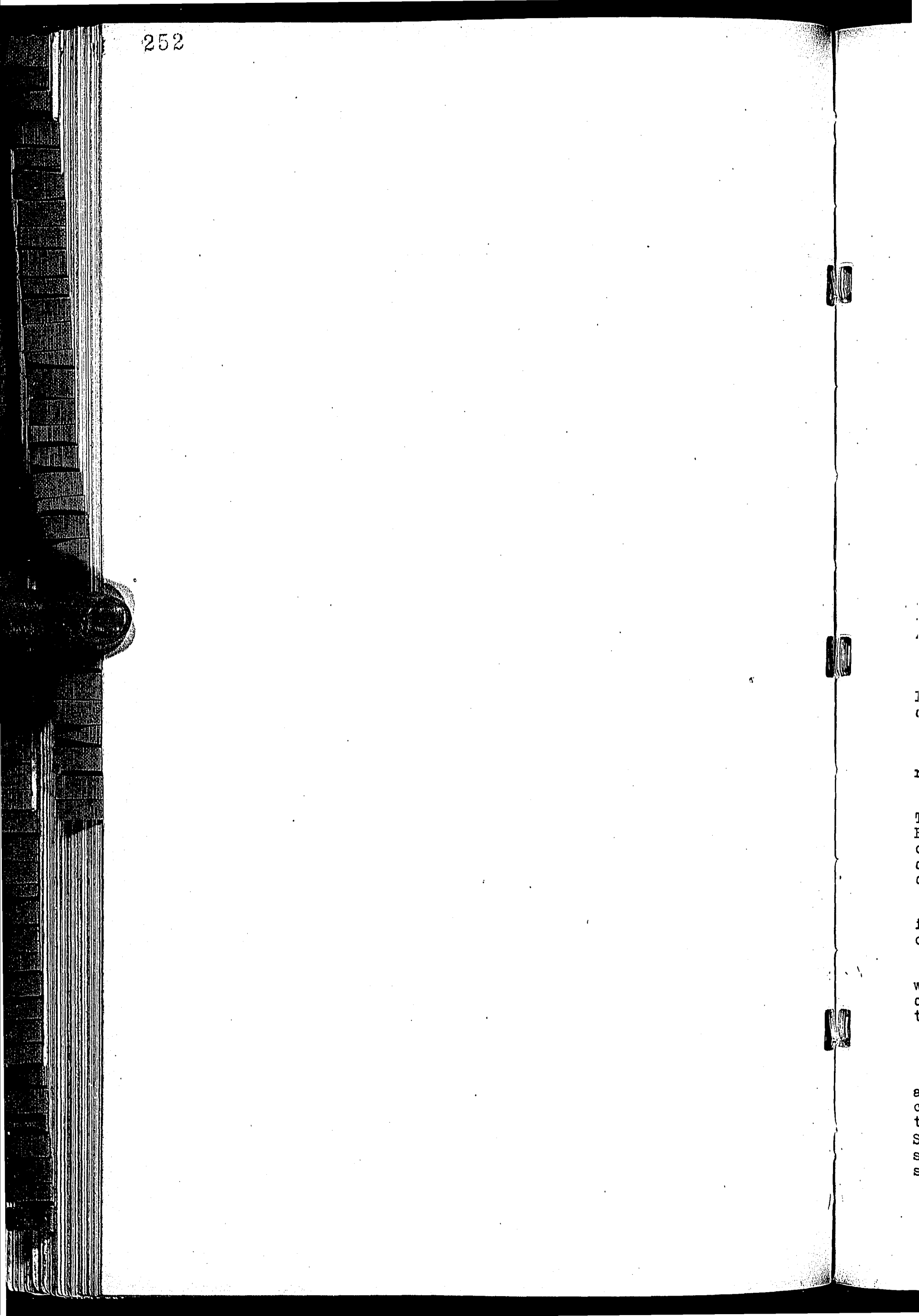

WHEREAS, this Board has heretofore referred to the Town Attorney, the claim of the Town against Thomas Richard Brothers for damages sustained by the Town as a result of a collision in which Thomas Richard Brothers ran into the rear of one of the police cars owned by the Town on the 4th, day of December, 1932 and

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney informs us that he has instituted suit in the Supreme Court of Erie County for the collection of said damages, and

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney has advised us that it would be to the best interes of the Town to settle this cause of action for the sum of \$250.00 which has been offered by the defendant or his representative.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the claim of the Town of Cheektowaga, against Thomas Richard Brothers, arising out of the aforesaid collision on the 4th day of December, 1932, damaging one of the police cars, be settled for the sum of \$250.00 and the Supervisor is hereby authorized to execute and deliver to the said Thomas Richard Brothers, a release upon receipt of said sum and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney be and he hereby is authorized to discontinue the action started by him in the Supreme Court of Erie County upon the confirmation of the settlement.

On motion of Sturm seconded by Eberl the claim of Jacob Jacobson, Stty, against the Police Department for the return of a Bell and Howell motion Picture Projector, Model 57, 400 Watt Type, and seized by the Police department on the night of February 13, 1933 claiming that he would be forced to institute replevin proceedings against the department for it if not returned at once was referred to the Chief of Police and Town Attorney.

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl the following resolution was duly adopted and carried.

WHEREAS, the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of New York state has by a decision interpreted Sec. 7 of the Religious Corporation Law, to mean that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie have no control over the formation, or the right to acquire additional cemetery property by the rights of religious Organization, and

WHEREAS, this question presents a very serious problem to the taxpayers of the Town of Cheektowaga and it is not the desire of this Board to have cemeteries extended or formed without some supervision or consent on the part of the Board of Supervisors or some other representative of the taxpayers and residents of the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, stands opposed to allowing any religious body whether existing or newly organized to take unto itself unlimited amounts of land for cemetery purposes, and this Board opposes opening wide the way for the creation of cemeteries in the Township by those wishing to commercialize these ventures regardless of the need of the community for these cemeteries, thereby excepting large tracts of land from tax and preventing the natural growth of the Town and depreciate land values of property surrounding the cemetery, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Attorney General for the State of New York be forwarded a copy of this resolution and be requested to intervene in the action of Helen E. Wojtkowiak and Others, Appellants against the Evangelical Lutheran St. John's Church of Buffalo, Respondent, which action we understand is soon to be heard by the Appellate Courts, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie recommending that they adopt a similar resolution.

On motion of Faber, seconded by Piatek the following resolution was duly adopted and carried.

WHEREAS, Joseph Foisset and Mary T. Foisset, his wife, of the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, State of New York, are about to deed and convey to the United States of America separate parcels of land situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, State of New York, all of which is included in the following description:

Foisset, his wife which property is hereinbefore described, from any and all taxes which may or might become on such raal property after the same is deeded to and such deeds are accepted by the United States of America, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Highway Superintendents and the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, State of New York, does hereby exempt the said premises so conveyed from any and all taxes accruing after the date and delivery of the aforesaid deed or deeds, and during the time as the same shall be owned by the United States of America.

Supervisor stated that the purpose of this meeting was to renew the note due the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, for \$14,057.04, pending the sale of Bonds.

Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption; seconded by Mr. Eberl.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga has heretofore adopted plans and specifications and entered into contracts for the execution of certain improvement work, to wit; Aris and Crestfield sewer, Pine Ridge Road sewer, Concord sewer and Concord paving, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga heretofore and on the 8th day of September, 1931, borrowed the sum of Thirteen thousand, one hundred and twenty-five dollars and fifty-five cents (\$13,125.55) from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, New York, in anticipation of the sale of bonds for such improvements, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga on the 21st day of December, 1931, authorized the renewal of such loan, but failed and neglected to carry such authorization into effect, until the 28th day of July, 1932, and

WHEREAS, said loan became due and payable on the 26th day of October, 1932, and was renewed and again became due and payable on the 25th day of December, 1932, and was renewed and again became due and payable on the 27th day of February, 1933, and
