RESOLVED: That the Supervisor be authorized and empowered to negotiate with the City of Buffalo relative to obtaining an agreement with said City to connect the sewers in the following streets with the city sewer, Viz; Shanley, Colton and Charles Sts. that

the following communication be sent to the Common Council of the City of Buffalo by the Supervisor.

September 19th, 1935.

To the Honorable Common Council of the City of Buffalo, N. Y.

Gentlemen: -

I have been requested by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, to take up with your Honorable Body the matter of obtaining the consent of the City to permit the connection of sanitary sewers on Colton, Charles and Shanley Streets, with the City's sewer in South Ogden Street. The South Ogden street sewer was recently relocated and extends beyond the city line into our township, and it is our desire to make the connection with the South Ogden Street sewer in the Town of Cheektowaga.

Early in 1935, a project was duly submitted to the E. R. B. and approved, to construct sanitary sewers in several streets in the Town of Cheektowaga closely bordering upon the City of Buffalo. This work has proceeded almost to completion and in every other instance than above mentioned, the sewers have been connected with the sewer system of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Shanley, Colton and Charles Streets are streets of Approximately one thousand feet in length and run southerly from William Street to Bismarck Street, Shanley is the first street east of the Buffalo City Line, Colton is the second and Charles is the Third street. As these streets do not extend to Dingen street, it is impossible to connect the sewers with the Cheektowaga system without running the sewer through private lands, which would necessitate the Town obtaining easements in addition to paying for the laying of almost two thousand feet of additional sewer. As stated before, this work is being done as a relief project and it is our belief that it would be a useless expenditure of money to make this extention, as the area affected is so small. There are only a few homes located on these streets, but at the same time we cannot deny the residents the sanitary facilities furnished the other residents in this neighborhood. At the same time we do not desire to place any unnecessary burdens upon the taxpayers in this particular sewer district and we believe it would be advantageous to them if a lease were made with the City similar to existing leases, providing for the payment of a reasonable rental charge.

In addition to the three leases now existing between the Township of Cheektowaga and the City of Buffalo, there is a lease with the Town of Amherst, permitting a connection with the Amherst sewer upon streets close to the dividing line of the two towns.

The State Health Department will not approve of plans submitted to it, or permit the Town topproceed with the work until either a lease is made with the City or some other method of disposing of the sewage is provided. Enclosed herewith you will find a blue print upon which the locations and sizes of the proposed sewers are shown.

I would appreciate it very much if you would refer this matter to the proper committee with the request that it take action immediately.
