Supervisor explained that the meeting was called for the purpose of accepting the conditions of the City of Buffalo, as set out in their resolution numbered 186, in which the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, and the Works Progress Administration were granted a permit to extend Sczjaquada Creek drain from the easterly terminus to and into the Town of Cheektowaga.

Mr. Henfling made the following resolution which was seconded by Mr. Pawlak and unanimously carried.

WHEREAS, the City of Buffalo, did heretofore upon the request of the Town of Cheektowaga adopt the following resolution and permit:

"That upon the request of the Town of Cheektowaga and the County of Erie, the City of Buffalo hereby grants to the Town of Cheektowaga, the County of Erie, and the Works Progress Administration of the Federal Government its consent to enter upon the lands of the City of Buffalo from the easterly end of the present Sczjaquada Creek Drain to the easterly City Line and remove therefrom the present inlet protection and ice-breakers, and construct and extend the present drain from the easterly terminus thereof generally along the present channel line of said creek to a point approximately two hundred (200) feet easterly of the Pine Hill Road in the Town of Cheektowaga, all in accordance with the dimensions, design, and uniform continuation of the grade of the present drain. And that there be provided, constructed and maintained at the easterly end of the drain so to be constructed an inlet including ice-breakers and guiding walls of the same general type, design and size as is now provided at the easterly end of the present drain. Before any work is undertaken in connection with this permit the general plans for the completed drain shall be presented to and approved by the Commissioner of Public Works of the City of Buffalo. Proper and necessary precaution must be taken so as not to impede the natural and continuous flow of the waters of the said creek during construction and any material, debris or substance that may flow into the present drain by reason of the construction shall be removed by the Town of Cheektowaga and the County of Erie without expense to the City of Buffalo. The lands along the new drain within the City of Buffalo shall be filled and graded to the present uniform grade of the adjacent lands.

This permit or consent is upon the express understanding that the City of Buffalo does not assume any responsibility of liability whatsoever for any damage incurred or claimed by any person or corporation by reason of the construction and progress of the work or by reason of the construction and maintenance of the said drain herein permitted to be constructed.

This permit shall become effective upon the due acceptance thereof by the County of Erie through its board of Supervisors and the Town of Cheektowaga through its Town Board."

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the aforesaid permit to be effective that this Board duly accept the conditions as set forth in the permit and resolution,

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga does accept all of the terms and conditions of the aforesaid resolution and permit, which conditions will be carried out by the Works Progress Administration and the Supervisor is authorized to accept in writing the aforesaid conditions on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga.

The following resolution was moved by Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak, and was duly carried.

WHEREAS, C. CHASE ZALEMSKI, Supervisor, has filed charges of neglect of duty against Dog Warden Edward Witkowski, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that Edward Witkowski be and he hereby is suspended from his duties as Dog Warden without pay effective this date and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a hearing on the charges preferred against Dog Warden Edward Witkowski be heard at a regular meeting of the Town Board to be held in the Council Chambers at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga on the 5th day of April, 1937 at 3:00 P. M. and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be authorized and directed to notify Dog Warden Edward Witkowski of said time and place of hearing and of the nature of the charges preferred against him.
