A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak the minutes of the meetings held March 15th, and March 29th were approved as read by the Town Clerk.

No objections the Supervisor ordered the monthly reports of the Justice of the Peace and the Town Clerk for the month of March laid on the table until the next regular meeting.

On motion of Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Henfling the following building petitions were granted and the Town Clerk was authorized to issue permits for same:-

No objections the Supervisor ordered the communication from the Department of Civil Service received and filed for further consideration.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered the report from the Town Attorney, relative to extra fees for feeding dogs received and filed.

Highway, Supt. John Eberl, recommended that street lights be installed on Huxley Drive and Mildred Drive, also, that the Town Board petition the State Highway Dept. to have slow warning signs placed on Broadway at the intersection of Broadway and Union Roads.

No objections, the Supervisor directed the Town Clerk to petition the State Highway Dept. to have erected two slow warning signs on Broadway at Union Road as recommended by the Supt. of Highways. No objections, the Supervisor ordered the report of the Town Attorney, relative to speed regulations referred to the Chief of Police and Highway Supt. for study.

No objections, the Supervisor ordered the communication from the William Street Citizens Protective Ass'n., Inc. relative to the planting of trees in their respective section referred to the Superintendent of Highways.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered the Sub-division map of the Genesee-Urban Terrace Sub-Division referred to the Superintendent of Highways, Board of Assessors and Town Attorney for study and recommendation.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Denk the Supervisor was authorized and directed to cancel the rider on Compensation Insurance policy, relative to Elected Officials of the Town of Cheektowaga.

A petition signed by several plumbers in the Town of Cheektowaga along with a proposed code regulating the plumbers in the Town was presented by Robert Brunner for the Town Board's approval.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Denk the Town Attorney and Chairman of the Board of Assessors were directed to go to Albany and check on Franchise Tax and earning of the various Companies in the Town of Cheektowaga and that the expenses incurred be a charge against the Town of Cheektowaga.

On motion of Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Henfling the Supervisor, Town Council, Town Clerk and Town Superintendent of Highways were authorized and directed to execute the sewer agreement between the Towns of Amherst and Cheektowaga. Copy of same is hereto placed in the minutes of the Town of Cheektowaga.

A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT made this 19th, day of April, 1937, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, in the County of Erie and State of New York, a municipal corporation, subdivision of the said State of New York, Party of the First Part, and TOWN OF AMHERST, in the County of Erie and State of New York, a municipal corporation, subdivision of the said State of New York, Party of the Second Part.

WHEREAS, the First Party is desirous of constructing, as a part of its sewer system, certain sewer connections and manholes within the territory limits of the Party of the Second Part, as shown upon the attached map or plan, marked "Exhibit A", and made a part hereof by reference, and

WHEREAS, such sewer shall have its outlet through the said sewer system of the Party of the First Part, and the Party of the First Part is willing to give complete sewage service through said system to property and property owners within the Town of Amherst abutting upon said sewer lines or any connections thereof within the said territory limits of the Second Party.

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETH THIS AGREEMENT:

The first Party agrees to completely construct sewers, manholes and sewer connections within the territory limits of the Party of the Second Part, as more fully described and referred to in "Exhibit A", above mentioned, such sewer, manholes and sewer connections to be tight so that no water or sewage passing through the same can leak therefrom, and the First Party further agrees that when said sewer, manholes and sewer connections have been fully completed to connect same with the sewage system of the First Party and through out the continuance of this agreement to maintain such sewer, manholes and sewer connections in first class condition so that the same will, at all times, be in strict compliance with the laws of the State of New York, ordinances of the Second Party and the rules and regulations of any and all of their respective officers, bodies or boards.

The First Party further agrees that the owners of all property fronting on the south side of Wehrle Drive, the various streets and highways running south from said Wehrle Drive and along said sewer or sewers and the property fronting on the north side of said Wehrle Drive, beginning at Harlem Road and running thence east along Wehrle Drive for a distance of 430 feet, all within the territorial limits of the Second Party, shall make connections to said sewer and have free use of said sewer for their purposes, throughout the term of this agreement, so long as all connections and the said use is in complete compliance with the said Laws, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations. The use herein given by the First Party to the said property and property owners shall be without charges or expense as against said property, property owners or the Party of the Second Part, throughout the continuance of this agreement.

The First Party further agrees that in the event it fails at any time to construct and / or maintain the said sewer, manholes and sewer connections in the manner above provided, the Second Party may, at its election, so maintain, and the expense thereof shall be paid by the First Party to the Second Party within ten days from receipt by the First Party from the Second Party of a verified claim therefor, or in the alternative, the Second Party may, at its election, in the event said sewer, manholes and sewer connections are not so constructed and / or maintained, disconnect and cut off said sewer, manholes and sewer connections at the various points where the said sewer, etc. cross the territorial line of the Second Party, and the Second Party may, in such event, then connect said sewer, etc. to the sewage system then under control of the Second Party or any Special District therein, and thereafter the said Sewer, manholes and sewer connections shall forthwith become the property of the Second Party or any such Special District thereof, and in such event, the First Party shall thereafter have no claim of ownership thereto. However, the latter option of discontinuing said sewer connection to the sewage system of the Second Party shall not be exercised by the Second Party until after it has given to the First Party 90 days notice of any conditions complained of and said option shall not become operative in the event, during said 90-day period, the First Party remedies the conditions complained of in said notice.

The First Party represents to the Second Party that it has or will have, before said sewer lines, manholes and sewer connections are completed, obtained, or obtain, as the case may be, all permits and approvals of any Government or Governmental Agency, Bureau or Board, necessary for the construction and / or maintenance of said sewer, etc., laid or to be laid in accordance with said "Exhibit A".

The second Party agrees to, and hereby does, grant to the First Party the right, privilege and consent to construct and maintain said sewer, etc. in the places and under the conditions and in the manner indicated on said "Exhibit A", and such grant and consent shall continue in full force and effect, subject to the terms of this agreement until otherwise agreed between the parties hereto.

It is further understood and agreed that all rights, consents and grants, which may have been duly authorized and given by either party to the other and / or for the benefit of property and / or property owners within the territorial bounds of either party, shall be irrevocable, except under the conditions for completion, maintenance and termination above provided.

It is further agreed that the First Party will, within days from the date hereof, disconnect from the sewer system of Sanitary sewer District #1 of the Town of Amherst, Erie County, New York, the sewers of the First Party, or any Special District

thereof, or property located therein, such disconnecting to be accomplished at the point where they are originally connected and the First Party further agrees that when such disconnecting is accomplished to leave the sewers of said Sanitary Sewer District #1, at such points, in the same condition as they were in prior to the making of the connection or connections thereto by the First Party, etc.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this agreement to be duly executed under the hands of their proper officers, thereunto duly authorized, and under their corporate seals, the day and year first above written.

THIRD:- That the said Buffalo Transit Co., Inc., its successor or successors, assign or assigns, shall at all times, during the period covered by this franchise and during any period covered by any extension thereof, charge a reasonable rate of fare for any service rendered; which fare shall not exceed the rate of fares set forth on the schedule of fares heretofore filed with this board, unless the said schedule of fares shall have been modified with the formal consent, manifested by the adoption of a resolution, setting forth the changes therein by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga.

FOURTH:- That children under 5 years of age, if accompanied by parent or guardian, shall be carried free. And children between 5 and 12 years of age shall be carried at one-half the fare charged for carrying adult passengers over the same route;

FIFTH:- That the permission hereby granted shall not be assigned without the formal permission of this board, and is and shall be subject to modification, or revocation, by the further order of this board, or of its successor or successors, and shall end and expire of the 3 day of May, 1942, unless extended beyond that date by further action of this board, or its successor, or successors.

SIXTH:- That, before this permission shall become operative, or of effect, in any degree or manner, the said Buffalo Transit Co., Inc., shall file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, its written acceptance of the same and of the conditions upon which it is granted.

WHEREAS the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga received through tax collections and payments from the Treasurer of the County of Erie the entire sums levied against Sewer District No. 3 for the years 1932 and 1933 which amounts were credited on the books of account to Sewer District No. 3, and

WHEREAS the omitted items were charged back against the Town of Cheektowaga by the County of Erie and made a part of the amounts levied as State and County taxes against all the taxable property in the Town of Cheektowaga for the years 1933 and 1934, and

WHEREAS the omitted items of 1932 and 1933 were included as a part of the taxes levied against Sewer District No. 3 for the year 1934, and

WHEREAS such omitted tax when collected was also credited to Sewer District No. 3 resulting in said District receiving two credits for the same items and with the Town of Cheektowaga as a whole paying for the original omission by an increased amount of State and County Taxes in the years 1933 and 1934

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to charge against Sewer District No. 3 \$4,330.30 representing Sewer Tax omitted from the taxrolls of Sewer District No. 3 for the years 1932 and 1933 and charged back to the Town of Cheektowaga by the County of Erie as a part of the levy for State and County Taxes of 1933 and 1934; that the Supervisor reduce the balance owing by the General Fund to the Special Districts Fund by the \$4,330.30 hereby authorized to be charged against Sewer District No. 3.

WHEREAS, interest and other charges for the period during which the original certificate and renewals were outstanding increased the total outlay to \$14,409.75 and,

WHEREAS, certain annual sums have been assessed, collected and credited to the six special districts because of the improvements made

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to charge the districts benefited by the improvements paid for out of the loan of September 23, 1931, amounting to \$13,125.55 and subsequent costs of \$1,284.20 the \$14,409.75 disbursed by the General Fund and at this date unrecovered; that the costs be allocated to the districts benefited in the amounts hereinafter set forth, which allocation is based upon the relative cost of the improvements made in each respective district.

WHEREAS, the total appropriation in such annual estimates and tax budget for the various Town purposes, after the deduction of anticipated revenue, amounts to Five hundred ninety thousand six hundred eighteen dollars and thirty cents (\$590,618.30) and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie, on the 24th day of November, 1936, duly levied assessed and provided for the raising by tax upon the real and personal property liable to taxation in the Town of Cheektowaga, the said amount hereinbefore referred to, and

WHEREAS, the warrant heretofore delivered to the Receiver of the Taxes and Assessments of this Town by the County of Erie directed said Receiver of Taxes and Assessments to collect for the year 1937 the total sum of Nine hundred six thousand seven hundred eight dollars and three cents (\$906,708.03) for all purposes, and

WHEREAS, said Receiver of Taxes and Assessments collected of such total sum the amount of Four hundred ninety-five thousand two hundred ninety-one dollars and seventy-eight cents (\$495,291.78), and

WHEREAS, the total appropriation in the annual estimate and tax budget of the year 1937 for various town purposes after the deduction of anticipated revenue, amounts to Five hundred ninety thousand six hundred eighteen dollars and thirty cents (\$590,618.30), of which amount the Supervisor of this Town has received from the Receiver of Taxes and Assessments of this Town the total sum of Four hundred ninety-five thousand two hundred ninety-one dollars and seventy-eight cents (\$495,291.78), and

WHEREAS, there is owing to the Town of Cheektowaga and payable by the County of Erie, pursuant to law, the further sum of Ninety-five thousand three hundred twenty-six dollars and fifty-two cents (\$95,326.52),

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow from the Manufacturers & Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, New York, for the purposes aforesaid the sum of Sixty thousand (\$60,000.00) dollars in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1937 and ending December 31st, 1937, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that one Certificate of Indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga in the County of Erie and State of New York, in the principal sum of Sixty thousand (\$60,000.00) dollars, dated the 30th day of June, 1937, bearing interest at the rate of four per centum (4%) per annum and payable ninety (90) days from date, be issued in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1937 and ending December 31st, 1937 and that such Certificate of Indebtedness be issued in substantially the following form:
