A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact any and all business that may come before the board.

Supervisor Zalemski stated that the public hearing was now open for all interested parties on the assessment rolls for special districts in the Town of Cheektowaga.

The Town Clerk then presented proof of publication of a notice calling for a public hearing on the following districts, namely:

Sewer Districts, 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5.

All Storm Sewer Districts,

All Lateral Sanitary Sewer Districts.

All Paving Districts and followed by reading the net estimated expenditures for the various districts.

Supervisor Zalemski then asked if there was any one present who desired to speak against the assessment rolls for special districts as presented and read.

Dr. Victor Reinstein presented the following protest:

I hereby protest and object to the sewer tax assessed against my property in Cheektowaga sewer district No. 3, on the grounds that the method used in spreading the same is inequitable, illegal, confiscatory and not in accordance with the benefits or the law.

No more objections were heard.

Supervisor Zalemski then asked if there was any one present who wished to speak in favor of the Special Districts assessment rolls.

No one was heard.

Supervisor Zalemski then declared the public hearing on the Special Districts assessment rolls closed.

Supervisor Zalemski, stated that the annual estimates and revenues of the various departments had been reviewed by the Town Board for the year of 1938 and it was in order to adopt a resolution approving of same, also, a resolution for the publication of a notice of Hearing upon the annual estimates of the revenues and expenditures of the Town of Cheektowaga for the fiscal year 1938.

The following objections to the estimated revenue and expenditures in the 1938 Budget were presented by Councilman Burst and Councilman Denk:

Councilman Burst, objected to salary of the Town Clerk, Chairman of the Board of Assessors salary, also item of telephone operators and various items in the Highway Budget.

Councilman Denk, objected to item of telephone operators also, was in favor of an increase in pay for the garbage department.
