A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the meeting.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Napieralski the minutes of the meeting of March 20th, 1939 were approved as read by the Town Clerk.

No objections Supervisor Zalemski ordered the monthly reports of the Justice of the Peace and the Town Clerk for the month of March, tabled until the next regular meeting.

No objections, the Supervisor ordered the petitions for permission to establish an auto wrecking and used automobiles sales lot, referred to the Public Improvement Committee, Board of Assessors and Town Attorney for study and recommendation.

No objections the Supervisor ordered the reports from the Public Service Commission and being cases Nos. 4786 and 4236 received and filed.

No objections the Supervisor ordered the communication from the Works Progress Administration relative to Possible Curtailment of W. P. A. Projects, referred to the Supervisor, Superintendent of Public Works and Town Attorney for study.

Supervisor Zalemski, ordered the communication from Arthur Kahl, Secretary, Fire District No. 4, Town of West Seneca, relative to insurance on Firemen; from West Seneca attending a fire in Cheektowaga referred to the Town Board as a whole and Town Attorney for study, no objections.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred the Claim of the East Seneca Fire Company, of \$50.00 for responding to a fire on Transit Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga to the Town Board and Town Attorney for consideration.

Robert J. Walter, entered a complaint about excess water on a lot next to his property at 32 George Urban Boulevard as being unsanitary and dangerous to children, no objections, the Supervisor referred this complaint to the Superintendent of Highways, Superintendent of Public Works, Health Officer, Dr. Nadolny, Chief of Police and Board of Assessors for study and recommendation.

The William Street Citizens and Taxpayers Association entered a complaint about a vacant house and barn located on Colby Street as being dangerous to the Public as these buildings are gradually being taken down by various people. No objections, the Supervisor referred this complaint to the Chief of Police, Board of Assessors, and Superintendent of Public Works for investigation.

Councilman Ladwinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Pawlak;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to request the Department of Public Service of the State of New York to relocate the monument at a place to be designated by the Supervisor, to relocate the tennis courts at a place to be designated by the Supervisor and to restore the lawn surrounding the Town Hall.

PUBLIC NOTICE ORDINANCE

RESOLVED that the following ordinance for the regulation of "Hawkers" and "Peddlers" shall be immediately adopted and the Town Clerk is directed to publish the same in accordance with the law. Said ordinance to become effective immediately after 10 days in accordance with the law.

ARTICLE X

Section 1. DEFINITIONS: The terms "hawker" and "peddler" as used in this ordinance shall mean and include except as hereinafter expressly provided, any person, either principal or agent, who, from any boat or car on a railroad track or in any public street or public place or by going from house to house or place of business to place of business, on foot or on or from any animal or vehicle, sells or barter, offers for sale or barter or carries or exposes for sale or barter any goods, wares or merchandise, except milk, newspapers and periodicals.

The term "solicitor," as used in this Ordinance shall mean and include any person who goes from place to place or house to house or who stands in any street or public place taking or offering to take order for goods, wares or merchandise, except newspapers or milk, or for services to be performed in the future, or for making, manufacturing or repairing any article or thing whatsoever for future delivery.

The term "established place of business" as used in this Ordinance shall mean and include a building or store in which or where the person transacts business and deals in the goods, wares and merchandise he hawks, peddles or solicits for during regular business hours.

The word "person" as used in this Ordinance shall mean and include one or more persons of either sex, natural persons, corporations, partnerships, associations, joint stock companies, societies and all other entities of any kind capable of being sued.

Section 2. EXEMPTIONS: No thing in this Ordinance shall be held to apply to any sales conducted pursuant to statute, or by order of any court to any person selling personal property at wholesale to dealers in such articles, to merchants having an established place of business within the Town of Cheektowaga or their employees for soliciting orders from customers and delivering the same, to farmers and truck gardeners, who themselves or through their employees, vend sell or dispose of products of their own farms and gardens, or to berry pickers who sell berries of their own picking. This Ordinance shall not apply so as unlawfully to interfere with interstate commerce.

Section 3. LICENSE REQUIRED: It shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheektowaga, exclusive of the Villages of Depew and Sloan, to act as a hawker, peddler, or solicitor, as herein defined without first having obtained and having in force and effect a license therefor.

Section 4. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE; BOND: Any person desiring to procure a license as herein provided shall file with the Supervisor a written application upon a blank form prepared by the Town Clerk and furnished by the Town of Cheektowaga, and shall file at the same time satisfactory proof of good character. Such application shall give the number and kind of vehicles to be used by the applicant in carrying on the business for which the license is desired; the kind of goods, wares, and merchandise he desires to sell, or the kind of service he desires to perform; the method of distribution; name, address and age of the applicant; the name and address of the person, firm or corporation he represents; the length of time the applicant desires the license, and such other information as may be required by the Supervisor.

An application for a license as a solicitor, who demands, accepts, or receives payment or deposit of money in advance of final delivery shall also be accompanied by a bond to the Town of Cheektowaga. Approved as to form and surety by the Town Attorney, in the penal sum of \$500.00, with a sufficient surety or sureties or sufficient collateral security, conditioned for making a final delivery of the goods, wares or merchandise ordered or services to be performed in accordance with the terms of such order, or failing therein, that the advance payment on such order be refunded. Any person aggrieved by the action of any licensed solicitor shall have right of action on the bond for recovery of money and damages, or both. Such bond shall remain in full force and effect, and in case of a cash deposit, such deposit shall be retained by the Town of Cheektowaga for a period of 90 days after the expiration of any such license, unless sooner released by the Supervisor.

Section 5. LICENSE: Upon filing of the application, and bond, as provided in the preceding section, the Supervisor shall upon his approval of such application issue to the applicant a license, as provided in Section 3 signed by the Supervisor, except as herein provided no license shall be refused, except for a specific reason and for the protection of the public safety, health, morals or general welfare. A license shall not be assignable. Any holder of such license who permits it to be used by any other person, and any person who uses such license granted to any other person shall each be guilty of a violation of this Ordinance. In case that such license shall be lost or destroyed, a duplicate in lieu thereof, under the original application and bond, may be issued by the Supervisor, upon filing with him by the licensee of an affidavit setting forth the circumstances of the loss, and other facts in reference thereto. Such license shall automatically expire on January 1st following the date of issuance of such licenses, but such licenses may specifically state and provide for an earlier expiration date. Every licensee, while exercising his license, shall carry the license with him and shall exhibit the same upon demand. Such license shall include the right to use only one vehicle in carrying on the business for which the person is licensed.

Section 6. LICENSE FEES: The license fees shall be as follows:-

For each license for selling, peddling, hawking, or vending from a licensed vehicle or other receptacle, or on foot, - \$10.00

For each one horse vehicle \$25.00.

For each two horse vehicle \$35.00.

For each motor driven truck \$35.00.

No fee for a license for selling, hawking or vending shall be charged where the applicant holds a valid license issued pursuant to Section 32 of the General Business Law but nothing under this section shall exempt such honorably discharged soldier, sailor, or marine from obtaining a license as provided in this Ordinance.

Section 7. BADGES: The Supervisor shall supply badges to licensed hawkers, peddlers, and solicitors, which shall not be transferred or assigned, and on expiration of the license, the licensee shall surrender his badge to the Supervisor. It shall be unlawful for any person to wear or have in his possession such badge unless he be the licensed hawker, peddler, or solicitor in whose name the license is issued. The licensee, while exercising his license, shall wear the badge on the front of his outermost garment. The wearing of the badge is hereby made a condition of every license, and failure by the licensee to wear the badge, as aforesaid, while in the exercise of his license, shall be cause for the revocation of such license. A charge of \$5.00 shall be made by the Supervisor for each badge, which sum shall be refunded when the badge is returned by the licensee. The vehicle kept or used by the licensee in the exercise of his license shall be marked on both sides with the number of his license, and the words "Licensed Vendor" in plain letters and figures at least two inches in length, and of such color as to be plainly read at a distance of at least ten feet.

Section 8. REVOCATION OF LICENSE: The Supervisor may at any time, for a violation of this or any other Ordinance or any law, revoke any license. When a license shall be revoked, no refund of any unearned portion of the license fee shall be made. Notice of such revocation and the reason or reasons therefor in writing shall be served by the Supervisor upon the person named in the application, or by mailing the same to the address given in the application, and upon filing a copy of such notice with the Town Clerk.

Section 9. RESTRICTIONS: A licensed huckster, peddler or solicitor shall:

(a) not falsely or fraudulently misrepresent the quantity, character or quality of any article offered for sale; or offer for sale any unwholesome, tainted or diseased provisions or merchandise.

(b) not wear the badge provided by the Town after the expiration or revocation of the license presented by them.

(c) keep the vehicles and receptacles used by him in a clean and sanitary condition and the foodstuffs and edibles offered for sale well covered and protected from dirt, dust and insects.

(d) not blow a horn, ring a bell or use any other noisy device to attract public attention to his wares, or shout or cry out his wares.

(e) not stand or permit the vehicle used by him to stand in one place in any public place or street for more than ten minutes, or in front of any premises for any time if the owner of or lessee of the ground floor thereof objects.

(f) not sell any confectionery or ice cream within 250 feet of any school between the hours of eight (8) A. M. and four (4) P. M. on school days.

(g) not permit any vehicle used by him to stop or remain on any cross walk.

(h) not create or maintain any booth or stand or place any barrels, boxes, crates or other obstructions upon any street or public place for the purpose of selling or exposing for sale any goods, wares or merchandise.

(i) not solicit, peddle, or hawk between the hours of 6:00 o'clock P. M. and 8:00 o'clock A. M. (Eastern Standard Time), nor between the hours of 6:00 o'clock P. M. and 8:00 o'clock A. M., (Daylight Saving Time), when Daylight Saving Time shall be in effect in the Town of Cheektowaga, except farmers and truck gardeners who themselves or through their employees vend, sell, or dispose of products of their own farms or gardens, or for berry pickers who sell berries of their own picking.

Section 10. ORDERS: All orders taken by licensed solicitors who demand, accept or receive payment or deposit of money in advance of final delivery, shall be in writing, in duplicate, stating the terms thereof and the amount paid in advance, and one copy shall be given to the purchaser at the time the deposit of money is paid to the solicitor.

Section 11. RECORDS: It shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to keep a record of all applications and of all licenses granted under the provisions of this Ordinance giving the number and date of each license, the name and residence of the person licensed, the amount of the license fee paid and also the date of revocation of all licenses revoked.

Section 12. PENALTY: A violation of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, is hereby decreed to be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00, or imprisonment not to exceed three months or both. It is also provided that for every violation of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, the person so violating the same shall forfeit and pay to the Town a civil penalty of not to exceed \$50.00 which the Town Board may maintain an action or proceeding to collect in the name of the Town in any court of competent jurisdiction or to compel compliance with this Ordinance by injunction, notwithstanding that this Ordinance provides a penalty or other punishment for a violation thereof.

"From the junction point of Union Road and Broadway, south on Union Road to Como Park Boulevard, east over Como Park Boulevard to Bellevue Boulevard, east on Bellevue to Bennett Raleigh Road, and return over the reverse of said route"

and that a public hearing will be held for the purpose of determining whether or not the said franchise and consent should be granted, said public hearing to be held in the Council Chamber of the Town Hall of the Town of Cheektowaga, on the 19th day of June, 1939, at 5 o'clock, Eastern Daylight Saving Time.

Supervisor Zalemski then asked if there was any one present who objected to the consent of the Buffalo Transit Company to operate an omnibus line in the Town of Cheektowaga.

No objections were heard.

Supervisor Zalemski then asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak in favor of same.

Dr. Victor Reinstein, spoke in favor of same.

The Supervisor then declared the hearing closed.

Councilman Henfling offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski;

Resolution of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga held on the 19th day of June, 1939.
 RESOLVED, that the application of Buffalo Transit Company, Inc. to operate a bus route in the Town of Cheektowaga, described as follows:

From the junction point of Union Road and Broadway, south on Union Road to Como Park Boulevard, east over Como Park Boulevard to Bellevue Boulevard, east on Bellevue Boulevard to Bennett Raleigh Road, and return over the reverse of said route, be and the same is hereby granted subject to and upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:

- FIRST:- That said Buffalo Transit Company, Inc., its successors and assigns, shall comply with all of the provisions of the Transportation Corporation Law, the Highway Law and the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, and with all ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga and of its successor, or successors, including all laws and ordinances now in force and such as shall hereafter be enacted and or come into effect;
- SECOND:- That, neither the said Buffalo Transit Company, Inc., nor its successor or successors, assign or assigns, shall operate any bus or other vehicle in and along any public highway in the Town of Cheektowaga by means of the trackless trolley system, so-called;
- THIRD:- That the said Buffalo Transit Company, Inc., its successor or successors, assign or assigns, shall at all times, during the period covered by this franchise and during any period covered by any extension thereof, charge a reasonable rate of fare for any service rendered; which fare shall not exceed the rate of fares set forth on the schedule of fares heretofore filed with this board, unless the said schedule of fares shall have been modified with the formal consent, manifested by the adoption of a resolution, setting forth the changes therein by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga;
- FOURTH:- That children under 5 years of age, if accompanied by parent or guardian, shall be carried free. And children between 5 and 12 years of age shall be carried at one half the fare charged for carrying adult passengers over the same route;
- FIFTH:- That the permission hereby granted shall not be assigned without the formal permission of this board, and is and shall be subject to modification, or revocation, by the further order of this board, or of its successor or successors, and shall end and expire on the 19 day of June, 1944, unless extended beyond that date by further action of this board, or its successor, or successors.
- SIXTH:- That, before this permission shall become operative, or of effect, in any degree or manner, the said Buffalo Transit Company, Inc., shall file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, its written acceptance of the same and of the conditions upon which it is granted.

Councilman Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski;

RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney be and he hereby is directed to notify the Buffalo Transit Company, that if a change in schedule is made in the operations of their omnibuses through any route in the Town of Cheektowaga notice must be given to the Town Board of such change and approval from the Town Board obtained before such changes can be made.

Councilman Pawlak, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski;

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk announced that the resolution of April 3rd, 1939 with reference to the purchase of lands of the Town of Cheektowaga by Regina Mamuszewski, had been duly published and that more than the required time had passed and that no demand for a referendum had been received by his office,

IT WAS THEREFORE, RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney be instructed to prepare a deed to the property for the Supervisor's signature.
