A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

On motion of Councilman Sliwinski, seconded by Councilman Napieralski the minutes of the regular meeting held Monday April 1st, 1940 were approved as read by the Town Clerk.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

The Town Clerk then presented the monthly reports from the Justice of the Peace, and Town Clerk for the month of March, 1940, and their being no objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered them received and filed.

On motion of Councilman Sliwinski, seconded by Councilman Ladwinker the following building petitions were granted and the Town Clerk was authorized to issue permits for same.

Walter Dombrowski, to add two domers to his present dwelling on Pleasant Parkway.

Mary A. Hofling, to add an addition to her present dwelling on Kaufman Road.

Henry F. Stube, to erect a frame dwelling on Beach Road.

Danitz Construction Co., Inc., to erect three new homes on lots 115, 119 and 154 Robinhood Road.

A petition from nineteen Town Employees, petitioning the Town Board to accept the Blue Cross Hospitalization Plan was presented and read.

Councilman Ladwinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski;

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga pursuant to Section 93 of the General Municipal Law, is hereby authorized to deduct from the wages or salary of any employee of the Town of Cheektowaga who is insured under any group, life, group accident or group health insurance, or who is a member of a corporation existing by virtue of Article 9-C of the Insurance Law, such amounts for the payment of premium or premiums, or payment thereon, as such employee may specify in writing filed with the said Supervisor and the Supervisor shall transmit to the insurance company writing such insurance the amount so deducted as aforesaid on behalf of the employees from whose wages or salary such deductions were made, provided however, that any such written authorization may be withdrawn by such employee at any time upon filing written notice of such withdrawal with the Supervisor on a form approved by him.

Communication from the Board of Fire Commissioners, Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6, petitioning the Town Board to have (2) two fire hydrants installed on Vernon Drive, and (2) two fire hydrants installed on Huth Road was read.

Councilman Sliwinski offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Pawlak;

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6 in the Town of Cheektowaga adopted the following resolutions at a regular meeting held by the said Board of Fire Commissioners, April 5th, 1940.

Motion by Mr. Hagman, seconded by Mr. Walter that this Board accept the petition of the Babcock Construction Company for the installation of two (2) hydrants on Vernon Drive, one to be placed 500 feet running north on Vernon Drive and one to be placed at or near the district line, and

Motion by Mr. Walter, seconded by Mr. Hagman to accept the petition of property owners on Huth Road near Beach Road for the installation of two (2) hydrants over a distance of 986 feet running west of Beach Road. Hydrants to be placed at an equal distance from Beach Road.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT,

RESOLVED, that Supervisor Zalemski be and he hereby is authorized to petition the Western New York Water Company for the installation of said fire hydrants as per resolutions adopted by the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6 in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York.

Chief of Police, Walter J. Marynowski requested the Town Board to take under consideration the purchase of new police cars for the Police Department to replace the cars now in use by the said department.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Napieralski permission was granted to George Hartel to collect, store, sell, repair and dismantle auto cars and trucks and deal generally in tire parts and accessories on the premises located on Transit Road about one mile south of Genesee Street and known as the John Brinkman Farm or Estates.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Sliwinski permission was granted to Edmund Nowicki to operate a public garage at 38 Shanley Street in the Town of Cheektowaga.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Pawlak permission was granted to Allen S. Bauer to install two (2) gasoline pumps in front of his property at 1113 Harlem Road.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Ladwinker the Week of May 13th was designated as "Clean-Up-Week" in the Town of Cheektowaga, and the Superintendent of Highways and Superintendent of Public Works were directed to assist with the necessary trucks and lifters for this week, and the Town Clerk was authorized to have printed the necessary posters notifying the residents of the Town of this fact.

Supervisor Zalemski reported that he had received a complaint about an automobile sales yard on Broadway, conducted by Mr. Geo. Warrington, stating that this yard was in a deplorable condition and should be cleaned up. No objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred this complaint to the Chief of Police with instructions to see that Mr. Warrington remedies this condition and complies with the ordinances of the Town at once, Chief of Police, Walter J. Marynowski recommended to the Board that some action should be taken relative to Pin Ball Machines being operated in the Town and was of the opinion that a license should be charged for the operations of these machines. Their being no objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred this request to the License Committee and Town Attorney for study.

Councilman Ladwinker reported that the committee working on the plumbing code had two meetings and needed more time to complete their study in this matter. Their being no objections Supervisor Zalemski referred this back to the committee with an extension of time to complete their work.

Sec. 1. Definitions. The term "person" wherever used in this section shall mean and include one or more individuals, a partnership, company, an association of persons and a corporation.

The term "coin-controlled amusement device" shall mean and include any mechanical device used or designed to be operated for amusement, by the insertion of a coin, and shall include the type of mechanical devices commonly known as bagatelle, baseball, football and pinball amusement games. The above enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive. Said definition, however, shall exclude any device, the possession or use of which is prohibited by law or for musical purposes only.

Sec. 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, no person after this ordinance takes effect shall place or deliver for use, any coin-controlled amusement device on any premises in the Town of Cheektowaga, or permit the use thereof in any place under his control without a license so to do having first been obtained from the Town Clerk.

Sec. 3. The owner of any such coin-controlled amusement device, or his duly authorized agent acting in his behalf, who desires to distribute or place any such device for use, shall make application to the Town Clerk for such permission, upon blanks to be furnished by him, giving the name and address of the applicant, the name and address of the manufacturer of the device, a detailed description of the mechanical features of the device, the method of its operation the name and address of the person having responsible charge of the premises upon which the device is proposed to be located for use and the location of said premises by street and number.

The Town Clerk may require such further information as he may deem reasonably necessary. The application shall be verified.

Sec. 4. Said application shall be referred by the Town Clerk to the Chief of Police for his investigation and recommendation. Such investigation shall include an inquiry as to the reputation of the applicant and the person in responsible charge of the premises upon which the device is proposed to be located, and whether the possession and use of such device is forbidden by law. The Chief of Police shall return the application within a reasonable time to the Town Clerk, with his recommendation as to approval or disapproval.

Sec. 5. The Town Clerk upon receipt of any such application approved by the Chief of Police, may issue a license to the applicant to place and permit the use upon the premises designated in the application of the coin-controlled amusement device described therein and in the manner therein specified.

A license shall be procured for each device so placed. A metal tag, bearing the same number as the license, shall be obtained from the Town Clerk and securely attached to the licensed device.

Sec. 6. The Town Clerk shall not issue any license hereunder until the sum of Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars therefore for each licensed device and the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar for each tag have been paid to the Town of Cheektowaga. Each such license and tag shall expire on the 30th day of June next succeeding the date of its issuance.

Sec. 7. No license or tag shall be transferable from one device to another, nor from one location to another, without permission in writing from the Town Clerk endorsed upon said license.

Sec. 8. The Town Clerk may revoke any license or tag issued hereunder in the manner prescribed by law.

Sec. 9. A person convicted of the violation of this section is punishable by imprisonment in the penitentiary or the County Jail for a term not to exceed ten days or by a fine not less than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars or not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or both.

This ordinance shall take effect beginning with the 1st day of July, 1940.

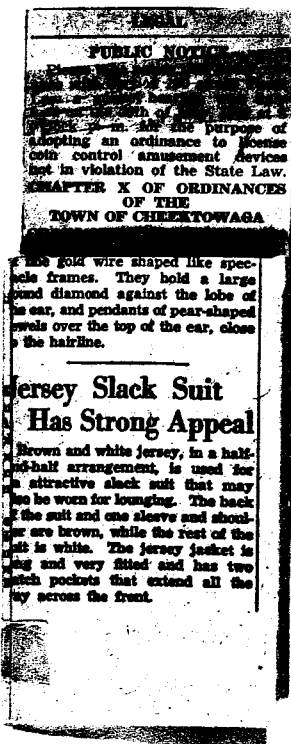

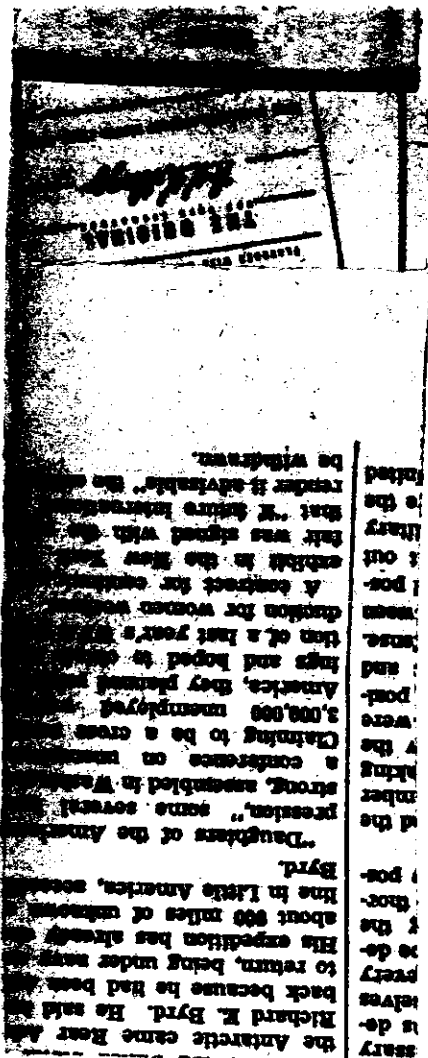
