SECTION 1. Every person operating a motor vehicle on any street shall drive the same in a careful and prudent manner and at a rate of speed so as not to en-danger the property of another, or the life or limb of any person; provided, that a rate of speed in any of the following streets with-in the limits prescribed to wit:

William Street from

Road to Andrew Street; Kensington Avenue from the City Line of Buffalo to the Town Line of the Town of Amherat;

Harlem Road from Cleveland Drive to Maryvale Road; Pine Ridge Road from Walden Avenue to Delavan Avenue; Walden Avenue from City Line to Harlem Road;

Delavan Avenue from City Line to Pine Ridge Road; Eggert Road from Delavan Ave-

nue to Sugar Road; Rowley Road from Como Park

Boulevard to Indian Road; Indian Road from Como Park Boulevard to First Street;

Harlem Road from Cayuga Creek Road to Center Street; in excess of twenty-five miles per hour for a distance of one-eighth of a mile shall be presumptive evidence of driving such motor vehicle

dence of driving such motor vehicle at a rate of speed which is not careful and prudent.

SECTION 2. Every person violating the provision of Section 1 of this ordinance may, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment for a period of time not to exceed thirty days or both, and all fines, penalties and forfeitures colfines, penalties and forfeitures collected under this ordinance shall be paid to the Town and credited to the general fund.

providing for the issuance of the bonds of said Town in the amount of \$67,455 to pay such cost; and further determining to purchase three trucks for the collection and disposition of garbage in said Town (the period of probably usefulness of which trucks is five years) and appropriating the sum of \$11,100 to pay the cost thereof and providing that \$555 of said \$11,100 shall be paid out of unappropriated current funds of the Townand that the balance of the cost of such trucks shall be paid by the issuance of \$10,545 bonds of said Town; and further determining that there shall be levied, assessed and collected annually by tax upon all the taxable property of said Town a sum sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said \$78,000 bonds as the same respectively become due and payable.

A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

Supervisor Zalemski stated that first in order was the public hearing on the granting of a consent by the Town Board to the International Railway Company to operate buses on Genesee Street and Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga.

MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS FOR STREET AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, N. Y.

be adopted

- No dedication of a street or highway will be accepted by the Town Board and the Town Superintendent of Highways unless it be improved to conform with the following minimum specifications.
- 2. (No highways shall be laid out less than (3) three rods in width).
- 3. Two classes of construction are hereby created:

Class One: Highways laid out where adjoining lots are laid out with a frontage of less than (100 ft.) one hundred feet.

Class Two: Highways laid out where adjoining lots are laid out with a frontage of more than (100 ft.) one hundred feet.

- 4. Specifications for Minimum Construction:
  - (a) Before starting work, the owner shall furnish the Town Superintendent of Highways a plan of the proposed highway, showing all work to be constructed within the highway bounds, together with the existing profile of the street, the proposed grade of the new highway and the proposed drainage structures, outlet drains and any other information that is necessary for the proper design of the highway. The typical section of the proposed highway shall also be shown and this section shall be at least equal to the sketch of the section shown herein.

This plan shall be approved by the Town Superintendent before the construction is begun. The Town Superintendent may request that the top of the base course, shall be constructed below the proposed grade if he deems it necessary.

- (b) The owner shall have the highway staked out with effset stakes set at intervals of at least 100 feet and at all intersections of streets and at the intersections of grades. A table of offsets and grades shall be furnished the Town Superintendent.
- (c) The Class One construction shall be at least 28 feet wide by 8 inches compacted thickness.

The Class Two construction shall be at least 20 feet wide by 8 inches compacted thickness.

- (d) Material: Highways may be constructed of gravel, slag or stone and sufficient filler shall be added so that the material will compact in a dense mass. The owner shall get the approvel of the Town Superintendent of the material that he proposes to use before placing same. Material shall be placed upon roads in layers of not more than 6 inches loose and thoroughly compacted with a 10-ton roller.
- (e) SUBGRADE:

The subgrade on all types of roads shall be properly prepared after proper drainage has been provided. All boulders, muck, quicksand, soft clay, spongy material and any other objectionable material shall be removed as directed by the Town Engineer and Town Superintendent of Highways. All spaces from which objectionable materials have been removed shall be refilled with acceptable materials, such as stone, slag or gravel, as directed.

#### FOUNDATION COURSE

After all drains have been satisfactorily completed and the subgrade has been properly shaped, it shall be thoroughly rolled and compacted with an approved self-propelled roller weighing not less than ten tons. Care shall be taken not to roll clay foundations empugh to develop a plastic condition. All hollows and depressions which develop shall be filled with acceptable materials and the subgrade shall again be rolled. This process of filling and rolling shall be repeated until no depressions develop. In places where the character of the material make the use of such a roller impracticable a lighter one may be permitted. The subgrade shall not be muddy, or otherwise unsatisfactory when the pavement is placed upon it. All necessary drainage to effectively drain the roadway must be completed before the placing of any pavement will be permitted thereon. The shoulders shall be rolled with a roller weighing not less than three tons and left in a compact and satisfactory condition at the completion of the pavement. At intervals of one hundred (100) feet lateral trenches or weepholes shall be opened up through the shoulders to the ditches, or at shorter intervals if, in the opinion of the Town Superintendent of Highways, the type of sub-soil requires same. These shall be filled with the same material as that of which the foundation course is constructed.

#### (f) EMBANKMENTS:

Embankments shall be formed of suitable materials, graded and rolled to the property lines, and approximately true to lines and grades. All stones larger than three (3) inches in diameter or any other objectionable material shall be removed from the surface.

## (g) INTERSECTING HIGHWAYS:

At all intersecting public highways a smooth riding and satisfactory junction must be produced. There shall be no connecting of a highway into one of the Town Highways or County Highways without a radius curb being installed by the owner before acceptance by the town.

### (h) CULVERTS DRAINAGE:

No culverts shall be placed that are less than a 12" diameter pipe. Twelve-inch pipe shall also be placed at the intersection of all drive-ways and the highway ditches. Outlet ditches shall be dug more necessary to properly drain the highway. The owner shall furnish the town permanent easements for this purpose when required by the Town Superintendent. No highway will be accepted where the drainage has not been thoroughly taken care of.

# (1) SEASONAL AND WEATHER LIMITATIONS:

No material shall be placed from October 15th to May 15th except by written permission of the Superintendent of Highway.

(j) The owner shall notify the Town Superintendent when he plans to commence construction. No material for the construction of the road or drainage shall be placed until the Town Superintendent has been notified and had a chance to inspect and approve the work.

Before the highway is finally accepted, the owner shall furnish the town with a deed at no expense to the town.

Dear Mr. Zablotny:

We are enclosing two blueprints which will be helpful to you in providing the drainage ditches to remove the surface water which is now going across the tract of land on which we are going to erect a factory.

The first print is the regular survey map dated October 29th, 1940 and is titled "Job NC-8918" by Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc.

We are also enclosing a ground plan made by our architect which shows the location of the main building, the fences, etc. You will notice that the fence extends along the lot line on the Kennedy Road side a distance of 1400 feet from Broadway, where it turns at right angles across the property its full width of about 700 feet to the east line, where again it follows the property line back to Broadway.

We are particularly concerned about the culvert crossing Broadway, which drains the cemetery on the north side. This culvert enters our property at a point rather close to the east line and it is our suggestion that you divert this water by providing a proper drainage ditch east along Broadway to our fence corner and then south along our east lot line.

Your suggestion that it might be better to carry this particular drainage ditch almost the entire length of our property, in this way intercepting the present ditch which crosses the south end of our property, and passing under Kennedy Road, drains in a general southwest direction, probably is the least costly and the best way to accomplish this result.

We are going to want to put tile drainage in our parking lot which will be in the front 600 feet of our property for its entire width and of course will drain through the drainage ditch which you will provide. For this reason, the ditch should be more than 3 feet deep on the northeast corner of our property.

The writer has been in touch with the D. L. & W. Local engineer since his visit with you this afternoon to try to determine if we could obtain an easement so this open ditch could be carried down their property just east of ours, but find this will require action by their New York office. We have already taken immediate steps to try to accomplish this and will have an answer in a few days.

In the meantime, there is nothing to prevent your going ahead with your plans because if the D. L. & W. object to a ditch on their property, you have already been assured that we will then permit you to put it inside of our east fence line.

We assume that the same time you talk about this diversion of the culvert water from the Broadway end, you will also take care of deepening the surface ditch on the west side of Kennady Road and deepening the ditch mentioned above running from Kennedy Road toward Harlem Road.

In accordance with our conversation, we have started at once the contract for the 5 foot sidewalk, one foot west of our fence line down Kennedy Road from the Broadway curb to the side of the parking lot entrance gate some 600 feet from Broadway.

You have indicated to the writer that you would see that the power and light posts were moved to permit this installation at once.

The wider paving on Kennedy Road, which was discussed with members of the Board, prior to our acquisition of the property, will be necessary at least as far as our parking lot entrance gate because at this gate will be located the watchman and the employment office and it will as well handle incoming freight trucks.

This material is all being sent to you by special messenger so it will be available before your meeting Wednesday morning.
