WHERMAS, The courts of New York have decided that the factor of economic depreciation must be considered in arriving at a proper evaluation of properties, and

WHEREAS, the said railroads have offered to compromise the controversies and to stipulate the discontinuance of all and any certiorari proceedings now pending, providing that the assessments of the properties of the said railroads located in the Town of Cheektowaga for the year 1938 be reduced in the sum of \$401,687.50 and for the year 1939 in the amount of \$396,337.50, and for the year 1940 in the amount of \$389,912.50 and for the year 1941 in the amount of \$381,411.25, a total of \$1,569,348.75 and that this amount of assessed valuation be deducted from the assessed valuations of the properties of the said railroads to the extent of \$523,116.25 for the year 1942 and \$523,116.25 for the year 1944, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, in consideration of the decisions of the courts of New York State, the testimony of the Board of Assessors, the arguments of counsel for the railroads, computations and other statements of the State Tax Commission and advice of its own counsel and accountants,

NOW, THEREFORE,


