



THIS AGREEMENT

MADE this day of May, 1943, between the Lighting District of the Town of Cheektowaga, Sewer District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga, and the Village of Sloan,

WITNESSETH:

WHERRAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga did on the day of May, 1945, adopt a resolution authorizing the execution of this contract, and

WHRREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Sloan did on the _____ day of May, 1943, adopt a resolution authorizing the execution of this contract, and

NOW, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of said resolutions.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

FIRST: the Lighting District of the Town of Cheektowaga shall
maintain and light at their present locations, twenty-six 2500 lumen
street lights on Harlem Avenue between Broadway and William Street;
Thirteen - 2500 lumen street lights on William Street between Harlem
Avenue and the City line of Buffalo; Twenty - 4000 lumen street lights
on Broadway between Harlem Avenue and the City line of Buffalo and one
6000 lumen street light on William Street at easternend of the railroad
viaduct at the City line of Buffalo, The maintenance and lighting shall
be uniform with that of other street lights in the Lighting District
and shall be for the period from June 1, 1944 to May 31, 1954.

SECOND: The Village of Sloan shall be permitted to continue to discharge sewage from the southeasterly section of the said Village into the William Street and Harlem Avenue trunk sewers of Sewer District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga in the manner now provided. The sewage service shall be rendered for the period of June 1, 1944 to May 31, 1954.

THIRD: The Village of Sloan shall annually pay to the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga for the account of the Lighting District of the Town of Cheektowaga, the sum of Three hundred (\$500.00) Dollars on or before June 1, 1944, and on or before June 1, of each and every year thereafter until and including June 1, 1953.

FOURTH: The Village of Sloan shall annually pay to the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga for the account of Sewer District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga, the sum of Three hundred (\$300.00) Dollars on or before June 1, 1944 and on or before June 1, of each and every year thereafter until and including June 1, 1953.

CONTRACT BETWEEN

TRACCO HOMES OF BUFFALO, INC.

AND

REFUSE AND GARBAGE DISTRICT NO. 5 of the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into this 17th day of May, 1945 between the Tracco Homes of Buffalo, Inc., (hereinafter called "Corporation"), a domestic corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York and having its principal place of business at 415 Lexington Avenue, New York, New York, and Refuse and Garbage District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga, (hereinafter called "Utility"), a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York.

WITTNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Pursuant to a resolution of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga duly adopted on the 24th day of May, 1943, a contract on behalf of the Utility was duly authorized to be executed to provide for refuse and garbage collection for the residences located within the following described premises:

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND situate in the Town of Cheek-towaga, County of Erie, and State of New York and being part of Lot 19, Township 11, and Range 7 of the Holland Land Company's Survey and being more particularly bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point formed by the intersection of the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga and the center line of Union Road; thence southerly and along the center line of Union Road to the center line of Cleveland Drive; thence westerly and along the center line of Cleveland Drive to the center line of Beach Road; thence northerly and along the center line of Beach Road which line is also part of the east line of the existing Refuse and Garbage District No. 5 to the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga; thence easterly and along the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the center line of Union Road, this being also the point of beginning.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual convenants herein contained and for other good and valuable considerations, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Type of Service: The Corporation or the tenants or owners of the residences located within the above-described premises shall provide at each residence an appropriate receptacle or receptacles for the disposal of refuse and garbage and such receptacles shall be placed by such corporation, tenant or owner near the curb-line of the street upon which the residence abuts on the day agreed upon each week on which the collection of refuse and garbage shall be made by the Utility, but such receptacle shall not be placed within the paved or traveled portion of any such street. The Utility shall make a collection of refuse and garbage from each residence once a week upon a day to be mutually agreed upon between a duly authorized representative of the Ur tility and a duly authorized representative of the Corporation, and such collections shall be made only from such residences as are designated by the duly authorized representative of the Corporation. understood and agreed that the Utility shall not be required under this contract to render regular refuse and garbage collection to less than twenty (20) residences.

- 4. Charges for service: The Corporation shall pay to the Utility the sum of Forty-five Cents (\$.45) per month for each family whose refuse and garbage is collected weekly, pursuant to this contract.
- 5. <u>Billing and Payment:</u> On or about the 10th day of each calendar month, the Utility shall render a bill to the Corporation or its representative for services rendered during the immediate preceding calendar month. Payment of each such monthly bill shall be made on or before the 19th day following the date on which such bill is rendered by the Utility.
- 6. Penalty for Non-Payment: When any bill is not paid within thirty days after the ten days following the date of rendition it shall be considered in default and the Utility shall thereupon have the right to cancel this contract and suspend service.
- 7. Succession or Assignment: This contract shall be binding upon the successors or legal assigns of the Corporation and of the Utility.
