# OBJECTIONS PURSUANT TO SECTION 219-h of the TAX LAW AMENDED BY CHAPTER 604 OF THE LAWS OF 1943

TO: FRANK A. SLADE, TREASURER COUNTY OF ERIE

PLFASE TAKE NOTICE, pursuant to Section 219-h of the tax law amended by Chapter 604 of the Laws of 1943, the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, hereby objects to the distribution as described in the certification made by you under date of August 5, 1943, on the following grounds:

### OBJECTION NO. I

Examination of that portion of the Comptroller's list of payments allocated for the quarter ended June 30, 1943, relating to the Town of Cheektowaga, shows no amount as having been paid by the Buffalo Aeronautical Corporation and allocable to the Town of Cheektowaga. It further appears that the Buffalo Aeronautical Corporation did pay additional franchise tax during the quarter ended June 30, 1943, and that the State-shared portion thereof allocable to the Town of Cheektowaga is as follows:

The Town of Cheektowaga contends that all of the amounts mentioned above are properly due and payable to it. Examination of that portion of the list relating to the City of Buffalo shows that the three items listed above have been credited to the City of Buffalo. It is the contention of the Town of Cheektowaga that the Buffalo Aeronautical Corporation does business within the Town and that its shops are located there as well as its main office. The Town of Cheektowaga claims that no portion of the tax is properly allocable to the City of Buffalo. The Town of Cheektowaga demands that payment of the sum of \$167.25 be made to it instead of to the City of Buffalo, being the total of the items listed above. It is further claimed that the original State-shared portion of the tax paid by Buffalo Aeronautical Corporation for the franchise tax years 1940 and 1942 was erroneously paid to the City of Buffalo and is now due and payable to the Town of Cheektowaga.

The Town of Cheektowaga further contends that all of the State-shared portion of the tax paid by puffalo Aeronautical Corporation for all previous years has been erroneously paid to the City of Buffalo instead of to the Town of Cheektowaga and payment of the same is herewith demanded.

#### OBJECTIONS NO. II

The Town of Cheektowaga further protests the limited character of the information which prevents ascertainment of the full amount due to it. As set forth in the preceding objection, amounts due to the Town of Cheektowaga have been erroneously credited to another municipality within the County. When erroneous allocations are made crediting amounts due to the Town of Cheektowaga to municipalities outside of the County of Brie, information is not available for the purpose of specific protests. Accordingly, the Town of Cheektowaga demands that complete information be furnished as to the distribution of the franchise tax paid by all corporations

doing business within the Town of Cheektowaga, irrespective to the fact that the allocations involve municipalities outside of the County of Erie and further demands payment of all the State-shared portion of taxes paid by such corporations which is due to the Town of Cheektowaga.

#### OBJECTIONS NO. III

The Town of Cheektowaga further objects to the provision of said Section 219-h providing that written objections to the certification of the County Treasurer should be filed within ten days after the receipt of such certification, and to the provision in said section to the effect that the municipal sub-division shall within twenty days from the receipt of the determination of the County Treasurer institute a proceeding to review it on the grounds that said provision provides unreasonable time limitations in view of the inadequacy of the information furnished which, in effect, results in divesting the municipal sub-division of its substantive rights and in effect constitutes a taking of property without due process of law.

# OBJECTION NO. IV

The Town of Cheektowaga further objects to the provision of said section 219-h of the Tax law providing for a proceeding to review a determination of the County Treasurer on the grounds that said provision is vague, indefinite and uncertain and is therefore invalid.

WHEREFORE, the Town of Cheektowaga hereby demands that a hearing be held by you in accordance with the provisions of Section 219-h of the tax law and that notice of the said hearing shall be given to the Town of Cheektowaga by serving same upon C. C. Zalemski, Supervisor, at his Office - Town Hall, Cheektowaga, New York, and on Kenneth W. Kitzinger, Attorney, at his office - 611 Walbridge Building, Buffalo, New York.
