This is to inform your Committee of the attitude of the Government of the Town of Cheektowaga in favor of Congressional Legislation which would permit the taxation of Federal owned property in the same fashion as private owned property or provide for the payment in lieu of taxes of an equal amount for the following reasons. (1) Real Estate is now bearing a greater load of the cost of Government than is fair. (2) The special services such as those of light, sewer, drainage, fire, highway including snow removal and also general services such as police protection, work of Town Clerk, Board of Assessors, Tax Office, Town Board, and Engineering directly benefiting United States Owned property should not be borne by the property owners whose benefit from the Federal owned facilities may be very indirect. (3) Bonded indebtedness was incurred in the past on the assumption the property would remain taxable. (4) Budgetary planning is impossible and assessment rolls are upset. (5) Many Federal Projects are of a paternalistic Character and in fairness to private taxpayers should bear their fair share of the local tax load.

An instance in our Town is the parcel of land next to the Buffalo Municipal Airport measuring 2461 feet by 1285 feet the assessed value of which for land is \$32,000 and for improvements \$1,383,000. A total loss in assessed valuation of \$1,415,000. This property is used as a Modification Center by the War Department.

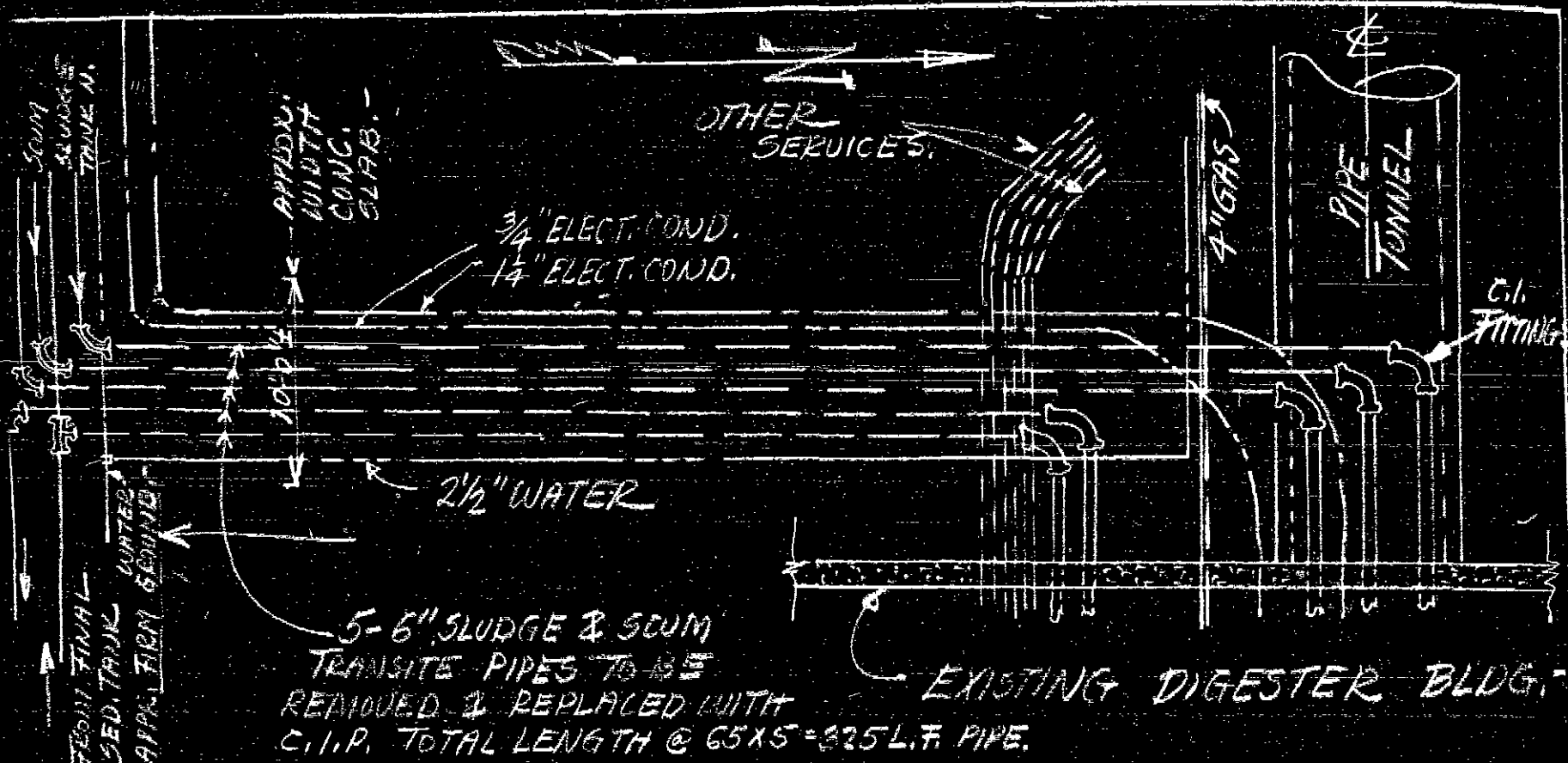

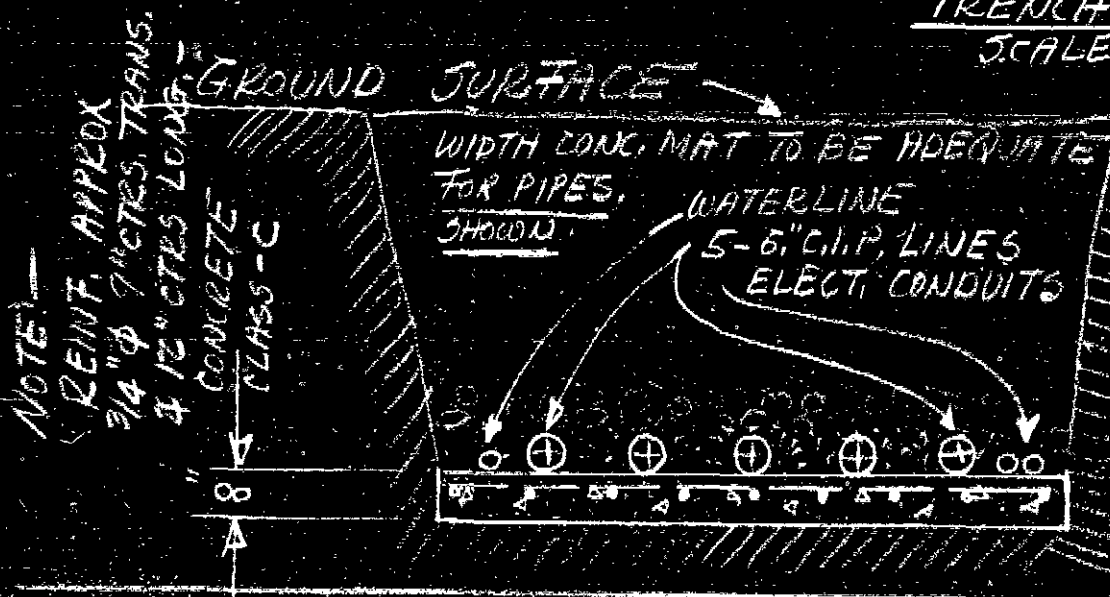
