A quorum being present the Chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

The Town Clerk then proceeded to read the minutes of the meetings held March 6th, and March 20th, 1944, and on motion of Councilman Pawlak seconded by Councilman Ladwinker, these minutes were approved as read and ordered placed on file.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

The Town Clerk then presented the monthly reports from the Town Clerk and Judge Falter for the month of March, 1944, Supervisor Zalemski ordered these tabled until the next meeting.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak seconded by Councilman Ladwinker, the building petition from Elmer Mesner was referred to the Petitions Committee for the necessary action.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

A petition consisting of Thirty-four (34) signers, in and along Long Avenue, Andrew Avenue, and Schoedel Avenue, protesting against the Lauerer Sash and Door Co., at 71 Long Avenue, erecting any more additions to their present buildings was read. Supervisor Zalemski, referred this petition to the Town Board, Zoning Board of Appeals and Building Inspector for study.

Communication from the Kensington Businessmen's Ass'n. Inc., was read, protesting against the condition of Eggert Road at the Kensington Gardens Housing Project, also the parking situation on Eggert Road at this project.

Supervisor Zalemski, referred this complaint to the Highway Superintendent, Mr. Zablotsky, and ordered a copy of same be furnished the Erie County Highway Supt, Mr. Yaw.

Communication from the Board of Assessors requesting that a typist be designated to them to prepare the 1944 School Tax Rolls was read.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak seconded by Councilman Ladwinker Supervisor Zalemski, was authorized to designate a typist to the Assessors for the 1944 School Tax Rolls as per their request.

Councilman Pawlak moved the following resolution and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Assessors be and they hereby are authorized to return and assess the so-called Woodland Avenue, as shown in the Kensington Extension No. 1 Subdivision Map, filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office as Cover No. 1493 and 1530 on April 7th, 1931 to the said owner and subdivider John Oehman, for Subdivision lots.

Councilman Henry offered the following resolution and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski.

WHEREAS, there has been numerous complaints about dogs running at large within the Town of Cheektowaga without State Licenses or muzzels,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT,

RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police and Benjamin Kraska, Dog Warden be and they hereby are instructed to enforce the provisions of the law requiring all dogs running at large to be muzzeled and licensed and to seize, impound and destroy all dogs that do not meet with the provisions of the law, and,

BE IT FURTHER,

RESOLVED, that the working hours of service of Benjamin Kraska Dog Warden be and are from 8 A.M. until 4 P.M., and

BE IT FURTHER,

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk have 200 notices printed and posted notifying the owners of dogs within the Town of Cheektowaga as to the provisions of the law regarding dogs running at large without muzzels and State Licenses.

Mr. Henry offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, a certain highway in the Town of Cheektowaga, designated upon a Subdivision Map of Roycroft Park, filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office under Cover of Maps No. 1359 on May 17, 1926, is thereon named Merrymont Road, and

WHEREAS, A portion of the said Merrymont Road hereinafter described has not been opened and worked within six (6) years from the time it was dedicated to the use of the public, and

WHEREAS, the School Board of Common School District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga has petitioned this Town Board to abandon such highway, and

WHEREAS, Common School District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga is the owner of the lands abutting on that portion of Merrymont Road which is sought to be closed, except for the land conveyed by said School District to the United States of America and as to that land the School Board of said School District is operating the school building thereon erected by the United States of America and being used as part of the school facilities of said School District,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that that portion of the highway known as Merrymont Road and described as follows, to wit:

The Town Clerk then proceeded to read the minutes of the meeting held April 3rd, 1944, and on motion of Councilman Pawlak seconded by Councilman Ladwinker, these minutes were approved as read and ordered placed on file.

The Town Clerk then presented the monthly reports from the Justice of the Peace and Town Clerk for the month of March, 1944, and there being no objections, the Supervisor ordered them received and filed.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker seconded by Councilman Henry, the application from Elmer Mesner to erect an Incubator House and Tool House on Lot 128 Ravenswood Terrace was rejected.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Supervisor Zalemski ordered the petition from the Buffalo Transit Company Inc., for a consent to operate their buses one city block on Beach Road between Huth and Cleveland Drive, referred to the Town Board and Town Attorney for study.

A petition with forty eight (48) signers in and along Como Park Blvd., Borden Road, etc. requesting that the Buffalo Transit Company be granted permission to re-route their present bus line east along Como Park Blvd., to Borden Road, thence northerly over Borden Road to Broadway, was presented and read.

Supervisor Zalemski referred this petition to the Town Board and Town Attorney for study and the necessary action.

Communication from the Buffalo Niagara Electric Corp. was read stating that an overhead street light mounted on Pole 22 on Leroy Road should be replaced, and were of the opinion that if this light could be moved to the opposite side of Leroy Road it would eliminate the street crossing with the necessary wires and be just as effective.

Supervisor Zalemski referred this to the Town Board and Town Attorney for study for investigation.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred the Sub-division Map of the Genesee Urban Terrace, and being part of Lot 74, Township 11, Range 7 and cover no. 1575 in the Town of Cheektowaga, to the Petitions and Highway Committee and Town Attorney for the necessary action.

A delagation of residents from the Dean Hyland Sub-division were present and stated that they had petitioned the Western New York Water Co. for water in their respective district and had met with no success, and asked that the Town Board assist them in getting water for the home owners in this district.

Supervisor Zalemski and Town Attorney Kitzynger offered to meet with a committee and assist them in any way they can to procure water in their respective district and the Town Attorney said that he would make the necessary arrangements for a meeting with the proper representatives of the Water Co.

Councilman Pawlak moved the following resolution and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski.

WHEREAS, the Plumbing and Drainage Ordinance, Building Code and Zoning Ordinance are now printed in Book form, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga has gone to considerable expense in printing and publishing this book,

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is duly authorized to charge twenty-five cents (\$.25) per book, said charge to be retained by the Town of Cheektowaga and deposited in the General Fund of the town.
