A quorum being present, the Chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the Board.

Supervisor Zalemski opened the meeting with the following address:

Friends, in opening this organization meeting of the Town Board for the term beginning this date, I wish to pay tribute to the people of Cheektowaga, who have taken such a keen interest in their local Town Government. I wish to especially thank the people who have seen fit to return me to office, and who have elected my republican colleagues to Town Office.

Many are here today to share with us the honor and privilege of taking part in this, our organization meeting. To you and to all of the People of Cheektowaga, I promise that I will continue my efforts to make Cheektowaga a fine, healthy and beautiful American Town, and the place which you will be proud to have your children grow up in and eventually take your place.

It has always been my policy to cooperate with all of the officials of the Town regardless of political faith, and this policy will be continued. I wish to state to the members of the Town Board and to the other Officials that I will work with them in the interests of all the people to the end of renduring a businesslike, efficient administration.

During the last four years, we as officials, had to augment our efforts on behalf of the Town and carry on and do many things in cooperation with the Federal and State Governments in connection with the war effort. The war is over now, but those extra duties, which we will have to perform, while they have changed a bit, will continue, we must use our best efforts to carry out our postwar program; to assist the returning veterans in many matters, such as employment, housing, health, rehabilitation and recreation; To continue every effort to secure the establishment of new industries in addition to those now already located in our midst. The coming of the Westinghouse Electric Corp., American Machine and Foundry Co., Twin Coach Lines and Anchor Concrete Block and Products Co. to this Town and the expansion of production by the Spencer Lens Co. certainly mean to all Cheektowagans a Happy New Year in terms of opportunities for employment. We must likewise continue to encourage the building of new homes. All of this industrial and building activity will provide substantial increases in the Assessed valuation of the Town.

Last but not least, we must continue to keep the high standard of Government which we have heretofore established. I am sure that each and every one of us pledges to do these very things in discharging the duties of our respective offices with the help of God.

To the officials and to all of you I wish to extend my sincere Good Wishes. May Cheektowaga progress and go forward.

The Board may determine the rules of its procedure, and the Supervisor may, from time to time, appoint one or more committees, consisting of members of the Board, to aid and assist the Board in the performance of its duties, and

#### BE IT RESOLVED, that

- No act, motion or resolution shall be deemed to be adopted by this Board without the affirmative vote of at least three of its members.
- 2. Voting upon all motions, resolutions or other matters before this Board for consideration shall be oral and by ayes and noes and the Clerk of the Board shall, for the purpose of all such voting, call the roll of all members of this Board according to the Alphabetical location of the first letter of the last name of each of the members of the Board, in alphabetical order, A's first and Z's last.
- 3. No member of this Board present, at any given meeting thereof shall be excused from voting on any matter before the Board for vote, except upon the unanimous consent of the Board voting at such time to grant such excuse.
- 4. No report shall be made by any committee on any subject referred to them in the absence of a majority of said committee unless a majority of the Board so direct.
- 5. All questions relative to priority of business shall be decided by the Chairman without debate and his decision shall be final, unless reversed by a majority of the members then in attendance.
- 6. The following standing committees to consist of three members each shall be appointed by the permanent Chairman within twenty-five days after the annual organization meeting and the list of Committee shall be filed with the Town Clerk.




