Such bonds shall be signed in the name of the Town of Cheektowaga by its Supervisor and attested by its Clerk under the Town seal.

Section 4. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such resitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law and within the limitations hereof, as the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga shall determine. The period of probable usefulness of such object or purpose, consisting of the construction of a sidewalk, within the meaning of Subdivision 24, paragraph A of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, is five years.

The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale, and awarding the bonds to the successful bidder, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as he shall deem best for the interests of the Town, provided however that in the exercise of these delegated powers he shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of bonds.





The period of probable usefulness of such object or purpose, consisting of the purchase of a Tandem Roller, within the meaning of Subdivision 28 of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, is five years.

- (a) That the aggregate valuation of the real property of the relators in the Town of Cheektowaga (exclusive of special franchises) and also of the real property of the Pioneer Real Estate Company in the said Town of Cheektowaga for the purposes of taxation is \$850,000 and no more.
