At a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, held at the Town Hall in said Town on the 7th day of October, 1946, at 2 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, there were

The Chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the Board.

The Town Clerk then proceeded to read the minutes of the meetings held September 16th, 23rd, and September 30th, and there being no alterations or corrections to same, it was moved by Mr. Pawlak, seconded by Mr. Napieralski, that these stand approved as read and placed on file.

Supervisor Zalemski then stated that the adjourned hearing for the purpose of determining the advisability of granting consents to operate motor buses by the International Railway Company in Broadway in the Town of Cheektowaga, was now open.

The Town Clerk then read the notice of hearing.

Mr. John Ryan, Council for the Buffalo Transit Company, Mayor Januchowski and others spoke against the granting of consent to the International Railway Company; and Mayor Januchowski of Sloan filed a set of minutes and a petition of protest from a public hearing held October 4, 1946 at the Village Hall, Sloan, New York, against the granting of consents.

Supervisor Zalemski ordered these minutes and petitions received and filed.

Mr. Franklin Brown, Council for the International Railway Company spoke in favor of granting this consent.

Supervisor Zalemski then declared the hearing closed.

Supervisor Zalemski then relinquished his chair to Councilman Pawlak and moved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the International Railway Company has petitioned this Board and requested the consent to operate motor buses on Broadway, a public highway and thoroughfare in said Town, from the Buffalo city line to Harlem Road and return, and

WHEREAS, a public notice of hearing was duly given on this matter and which hearing was held before this Board on the 16th day of September, 1946, and which hearing was continued to this date, and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Buffalo Transit Company who with others opposed the granting of a consent have raised the question of the financial damage that will be done to the Buffalo Transit Company by reason of this competition over a portion of the route now being serviced by the Buffalo Transit Company and they have stated that the anticipated loss of revenue might force the Buffalo Transit Company to curtail the service which they now render to the Village of Sloan, William Street, and other parts of the Town of Cheektowaga, and

WHEREAS, this Board feels that there may be or may not be merit to such contention but that this Board is not equipped with an accounting and operating staff which would enable them to investigate the financial structure of the companies involved and the possible results of this competition and this Board is of the opinion that the Public Service Commission which has been created to serve the public for this and other services is adequately equipped with investigators and accountants and that they should pass upon the merits of that phase of the objection and the riders, the people of our community, should not be deprived of any service by reason of our failure to allow the Public Service Commission to pass upon this application; now after hearing all of those who desired to speak for and against the granting of this consent and after due deliberation thereon and for the above mentioned reasons, it is

RESOLVED, that the petition of the International Railway Company requesting permission to operate its buses on Broadway, a public highway and thoroughfare of this Town, from the Buffalo city line to Harlem Road and return, be and the same hereby is approved and granted, subject, however, to the following terms and conditions:

1. That the International Railway Company prior to exercising this consent shall first exercise the consents heretofore granted to it by this Board to operate buses on Walden Avenue from the city line to Harlem Avenue and return, and William Street, on Clinton Street, and Delavan Avenue, over the routes heretofore granted.

2. The granting of this permission shall also be subject to International Railway Company consenting and agreeing that if their application is granted and approved by the Public Service Commission when presented that they will not charge as a fare on any of the aforesaid routes including the one for which they are petitioning or request a fare in excess of that they are receiving or will receive in the City of Buffalo on their lines and that the riders shall have all of the transfer privileges and others now enjoyed or that may hereinafter be enjoyed by the riders in the City of Buffalo on said lines and that they shall not be discriminated against in any manner whatsoever.

WHEREAS, there has been duly presented to this Town Board a written petition in due form together with the necessary map and plan for the extension of the existing water district in this Town known as Water District No. 4 by annexing thereto the territory situate in such town and hereinafter described and an order of the Town Board reciting the filing of said petition and specifying the time when and place where said Town Board would meet to consider the said petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, having been published and posted as required by law, and the hearing having taken place at the Town Hall, corner of Broadway and Union Road, Town of Cheektowaga on October 7, 1946 at which hearing no person appeared in opposition to the proposed extension and the Town Board having given due deliberation thereon, and

WHEREAS, the said petition dated the 15th day of August, 1946 for the extension of the existing Water District No. 4 in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, is signed, proved and acknowledged as required by law and is otherwise sufficient and that there is annexed to said petition a map and plan prepared by Newell L. Nussbaumer and Irving Clarke, competent engineers, duly licensed by the State of New York, showing the boundaries of the existing water district, the general plan of the proposed water system, sources of water supply, the water mains, distribution pipes, hydrants, reservoirs, if any, and the location of each, and

WHEREAS, it is not proposed or required that the Town shall finance the cost of this extension by the issuance of the bonds, notes, certificates or other evidences of indebtedness of the Town therefor,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it is in the public interest to grant the whole relief sought by said petition, and that all the property owners, and interested persons within said proposed extension of the existing water district are benefitted thereby, and that all property or property owners benefitted are included therein and that no property or property owners or interested persons benefitted thereby have been excluded therefrom, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the petition for the extension of the existing Water District No. 4 be and the same is hereby granted and the said existing Water District No. 4 is hereby extended to embrace the following described territory to wit:

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being parts of Lots 4 and 12, Township 11, Range 7, bounded and described as follows:

Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, a written petition, dated August 17, 1946 was duly filed with this Board requesting the construction of a lateral sewer in the highway known as Arthur Street for its entire length, to wit: from 150 feet distant south of Genesee Street to the southerly end of said Arthur Street at Broad Street and that said sewer shall be constructed so as to serve the properties on both sides of public highway, and

WHEREAS, said petition was duly signed by owners of real property constituting the owners of at least one-half of the entire frontage or bounds on both sides of said highway to be improved as aforesaid and also constituting resident owners owning not less than one-half of the frontage owned by resident owners along said highway proposed to be improved, and

Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, Supervisor C. Chase Zalemski has submitted to this Board a plan for tax relief of owners of real property and for raising necessary revenues for the operation of municipalities, and

WHEREAS, said plan provides among other things for a redistribution of the tax burden from the small home-owner and the small wage earner to corporations and individuals in the high income tax bracket who are better able to bear the necessary cost of government. The plan provides in detail as follows:

1. A Payment of 1% by each business corporation of the taxable net income shown by its New York State franchise tax return; such payment to be made with its return to the State Tax Commission; and such payments to be remitted by the Commission in their entirety to respective county treasurers.

2. A payment of 1% of net income in excess of personal exemptions and credits for dependents by each individual filing a New York State personal income tax return; such payments to be made with the return to the State Tax Commission and remitted in entirety by the Commission to respective county treasurers.

3. The county treasurers to receive payments from the State Tax Commission allocated to each city, town and village within the county. One-half of the amount due each local government (other than the County) to be retained by the County Treasurer and deducted directly from the county tax which would otherwise be spread against the taxable real estate of the respective local government.

4. The remaining one-half allocated to the local governments to be paid over to such local governments by the county treasurer; such sums to be deducted from amounts which would otherwise be spread against the taxable property in the taxing unit.

and

WHEREAS, some of the factors favoring such a plan are:

(a) Simplicity and economy in collection and administration.

(b) The amount of benefit for each local government would be the full amount contributed by its own taxpayers, in contrast to the Moore Plan which uses population rather than the amount received from the locality as a basis of distribution.

(c) Payments would be made according to ability to pay.

(d) The operation of the LOCAL TAX BURDEN ADJUSTMENT PLAN would have no effect upon the revenue of the State Government or its plan for allocating a portion of such revenues to local governments, the State acting merely as a collection and administrative agency for the local governments.
