Dear Mr. Zalemski:

I am enclosing a print showing the recommended locations of street lights on Walden Avenue from Randolph Steet to Krakus Blvd. and on the streets north of Walden Avenue. The present locations on Walden Avenue are shown in red and have been changed to 4000 lumens.

We suggest that the old brackets be removed and new mast arms and fixtures be installed. We also suggest that since the streets north of Walden are comparatively narrow that the appearance will be improved by placing all the lights on one side of the street. This will eliminate crossing the street and will improve the lighting. We would use either 4000 or 6000 lumens on Walden and 2500 lumen on the side streets. There would be no cost to the Town for making these changes.

The present cost of this entire section is \$2550.67 per year. The suggested plan would be about greatly improved.

Posed locations for new overhead lights in place of the preent underground. At George Urban Boulevard, the New York as shown. We would appreciate your advice on whether or install #1603 and #1625.
