A quorum being present the Chairman called the meeting to order to transact any and all business that may come before the board.

Moved by Mr. Pawlak, seconded by Mr. Henry minutes of June 30th, 1947 meeting were approved as read by the Clerk and same were ordered placed on file.

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Town Board a written application for the re-zoning of the hereinafter described property from a "residential district" to a "business district" and a notice of the Town Board reciting the receipt of said application and specifying the time when and place where said Town Board would meet to consider the said application and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, having been published as required by law and the hearing taking place at the Town Hall, Town of Cheektowaga, New York, on July 7th, 1947, at which hearing no person appeared in opposition to the proposed amendment of the zoning map, and the Town Board having given due consideration thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED, by this Town Board that the ordinance adopted December 21, 1942 and as now amended, entitled "Zoning Ordinance", be and the same hereby is amended by changing the zoning map so as to change the following described property from that of "residential district" to "business district".

DESCRIPTION

All that tract or parcel of land, situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Lot No. 17 in the 11th Township and Seventh Range of the Holland Land Company's Survey and bounded as follows: South by a line parallel with the south bounds of Lot No. 17 at the distance of 1,105.50 feet north therefrom 3,944.82 feet; west by Lot No. 25, 452.43 feet, North by a line parallel to the North Line of said Lot No. 17 at the distance of 2,105.07 feet east therefrom 3,946.80 feet and South along the East line of said Farm Lot 594.33 feet to the point of beginning. This property being located on the West side of Union Road, said road being 66 feet wide.

(It is desired to re-zone to a depth of 200 feet at this time.)

Communication from A.J. Ferantz, Superintendent of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, re: repairs on bridges namely Ludwig Avenue and Harlem Avenue.

This was referred to the Highway Superintendent, John J. Zablotny and Kenneth W. Kitzinger, Town Attorney.

A communication from Kimball, Smith, Miller and Murphy Attys., regarding rezoning of property as requested by Albert C. Engl, property located at Cleveland Drive and Merrymont Road for the purpose of erecting a liquor store. The above mentioned Attorneys representing the Baco Properties, Inc. who are opposed to the rezoning inasmuch as Albert C. Engl is a tenant in their building conducting a liquor store at the present time and is only one block away from the property he now wants to re-zone.

The Chairman ordered this communication received, filed referred to the Town Board and Petitions Committees.

The Board of Fire Commissioners U-Crest Hose Co. #4 called attention to the Town Board the laxity of the Western New York Water Company installing hydrants on Fairvale and Clearvale Streets and asked further assistance from the Board in obtaining the installation of these hydrants.

The Supervisor ordered this letter received, filed referred same to the Town Attorney and the Supervisor.

The North Cheektowaga Home Owners Ass'n. sent in a communication which was read by the Clerk regarding Ball diamond behind School Annex #2 and the old sand quarry on Cayuga Road, stating in each case that these are hazardous to children.

An invitation from V.F.W. Cheektowaga Post 2429 to attend their Annual Field Day Picnic, July 19th and 20th was ordered received, filed and accepted.

The petition for Fire District from Transit Road to Rein Road to West Shore Railroad thence north to Sugg Road, etc was referred back to the Board of Assessors.

Moved by Mr. Henry, seconded by Mr. Pawlak, a Public hearing be set for July 21st at 8:00 o'clock P.M. E.D.S. T. on underground street lighting both sides of Krakus Blvd. and both sides of Chopin.

A petition signed by 18 property owners requesting street lights on Awood Place from Genesee Street to Greenwood Street was ordered received, filed, referred to the Town Board, Board of Assessors and the Town Attorney.

The communication from the Buffalo Niagara Electric regarding change of certain street lights in various parts of the Town showing also, maps and sketches of said change was referred to the Town Board for study.

Moved by Mr. Henry, seconded by Mr. Napieralski, the estimate of One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seven Dollars and Eighty Cents (\$1,907.80) from the Top Home Insulation, for insulating the Town Hall be accepted as per specifications, subject to filing the necessary insurance to protect the Town of Cheektowaga, N.Y.

Chief Marynowski reported to the Town Board the inadequate Switchboard which is located in the Police Department in the Town Hall. He further stated it is beyond repair and causes a great deal of dissatisfaction for incoming and outgoing calls.

Moved by Mr. Pawlak, seconded by Mr. Henry, Supervisor C. Chase Zalemski be and he hereby is directed to contact the New York Telephone Company requesting said Company to install a new switchboard in place of the present board which is obsolete and constantly out of repair.

Hoffler Bros., Hamburg, New York - \$24,000.00

Lakeland Construction Co., Buffalo - \$24,750.00

All bidders included the Chain Belt equipment which was scheduled for 18 months delivery. We believe that it may be possible to secure better delivery as time goes along. We talked to the low bidder with regard to his program for installation. He proposes to build the chamber complete, without equipment, and then install this at a later date when it may be delivered. This, we believe, would be entirely satisfactory to the Town and in the meantime give some service.

All bids were accompanied by a bond in the amount of \$1,400.00 as required by the Advertisement.

At the time the second addition was being made to the Sewage Treatment Plant under P.W.A., known as the McKean Contract, this work was then bid as an extra to that contract at a little over \$16,000.00. In view of the increases in prices since that time, we believe that the low bid is favorable and would recommend its acceptance.

Dear Mr. Zaleski:

I am enclosing a print showing the recommended locations of street lights on Walden Avenue from Randolph Steet to Krakus Blvd. and on the streets north of Walden Avenue. The present locations on Walden Avenue are shown in red and have been changed to 4000 lumens.

We suggest that the old brackets be removed and new mast arms and fixtures be installed. We also suggest that since the streets north of Walden are comparatively narrow that the appearance will be improved by placing all the lights on one side of the street. This will eliminate crossing the street and will improve the lighting. We would use either 4000 or 6000 lumens on Walden and 2500 lumen on the side streets. There would be no cost to the Town for making these changes.

The present cost of this entire section is \$2550.67 per year. The suggested plan would be about \$515.00 increase per year, but the lighting would be greatly improved.

The enclosed Harlem Avenue sketch shows proposed locations for new overhead lights in place of the present underground. At George Urban Boulevard, the New York State Electric and Gas Company now have an overhead lamp as shown. We would appreciate your advice on whether or not to install #1603 and #1625.

Our orders called for two (2) lamps south of Peach Tree Rd. on Pine Ridge Road but we are uncertain as to location. We also have orders for two (2) lamps on David Street. We now have lamps on poles No. 120 and No. 169 on David Street and thought one additional lamp on pole No. 144 might be sufficient.

AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE
