Schulenberg to the center line of Genesee Street, thence east along the center line of Genesee Street to the center line of the Sugg Road thence north along the center line of Sugg Road to the north line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad, thence west along the north line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad to the center line of Spies Road, thence north along the center line of Spies Road to the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga, thence east along the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga, and thence south along the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the place of beginning.



We have made a recapitulation on a number of the Bid Items for the above job and find the following:

In accordance with the attached summary, Bid Item No. 5 for underdrains has underrun \$1,442.70. The underdrains for Soft Ball Diamond No. 1 were authorized to be omitted. In the grading of this area we find that it is advisable to install about 300 lineal feet of 6 inch vitrified tile with a receiver to drain a low spot for which there is no natural drainage. We, therefore, request that about 300 lineal feet of 6 inch vitrified tile and the receiver be authorized for installation at a price of \$1.00 per foot for the pipe, and \$100.00 for the receiver. This will leave a balance of \$1,442.70 in this Item.

Under Bid Item No. 8 concrete for headwalls, nine headwalls were originally specified. Not over 6 may be required and possibly only five, due to the changes made in the underdrains. This Item may, therefore, be reduced from \$4,800 to about \$3,800. There will, therefore, be a balance of about \$1,000 in this Item.

Bid Item No. 11, tile for underdrains under pavements under-run about \$300.00, see attached schedule.

Bid Item No. 12, pavement, underrun about \$400.00 because the spur to the west from the Park Drive to the bridge was omitted. See attached schedule.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT, made this 24th day of November, 1947, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation with its principal office and place of business at the Town Hall, in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, party of the first part, hereinafter called the "TOWN", and NEWELL L. NUSSBAUMER and IRVING CLARKE, co-partners, and licensed engineers, in the State of New York, doing business under the name and style of NUSSBAUMER AND CLARKE, at 327 Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York, party of the second part, hereinafter called the "Engineer".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town did previously engage the Engineers to prepare a preliminary report and plans for drainage and storm sewers for the Town of Cheektowaga, which report was sub-

mitted to the New York State Postwar Public Works Planning Commission for approval for funds for the preparation of final drawings, Serial No. 2420, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Postwar Public Works Planning Commission has approved a section of the work estimated to cost \$750,000 and allocated the sum of \$11,250 as its half of the cost of engineering for preparing the final plans and specifications for the part of the work designated as follows referring to Exhibit No. 2 of Progress Report No. 3 of the preliminary drainage report prepared by the Engineers:

Trunk storm drain in East Grand Boulevard, running north from Scajaquada Creek and continuing over Genesee Street east to Elwood, north on Elwood and its extension to Seaton Road extension, shown as Station X on the plan in the preliminary report for the project, thence westerly over the Seaton Road extension and Seaton Road to Roycroft Boulevard, and then north on Roycroft Boulevard to Homesgarth extension shown as Station XV on the plan in the preliminary report for the project, and

WHEREAS, the Town has appropriated its share of \$11,250. and accepted the grant of State Funds,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties hereto, as follows:

The Town agrees to employ, and hereby does employ the Engineer as engineers for the above mentioned project, and the Engineer agrees to act as such engineers and to perform the services hereinafter mentioned, and to conform to good, standard engineering practice, and to the requirements of the New York State Postwar Public Works Planning Commission.

All services rendered by the Engineer shall be subject to the approval of the Town.

A. Services to be rendered by the Engineers:

The Services to be rendered by the Engineers under this contract shall pertain to the design of drainage facilities located in the position described above, or such alternates as may develop as the work progresses, which may be thought to be more desirable or economical.

The design shall be in accordance with the provisions of Progress Report No. 3, Paragraph 4, Page 5, which provides for overflow reliefs from the Sanitary Sewers.

Variations from this schedule shall only be made with the approval of the Town Board.

The services to be performed by the engineers shall include:

1. Necessary field work and measurements to prepare the plans and profiles for the proposed construction.

2. Field measurements on existing sanitary and storm sewers to make plans for required interception and overflow structures.

3. Preparation of final plans and profiles for the proposed work.

4. Preparation of specifications and contract documents covering the proposed work, ready and suitable for the taking of bids.

5. Preparation of revised estimated of quantities and costs based upon the final plans.

6. Negotiations with the New York State agencies as may be required or directed by the Town.

7. Conferences with the Town Board or other Town Officials as may be required.

8. Supervision of the taking of borings or other subsurface explorations as may be required or ordered.

9. Submission of the completed documents to the New York State Postwar Public Works Planning Commission for approval.

10. Revise and correct plans and documents, without additional compensation, to meet the requirements of the New York State Postwar Public Works, Planning Commission.

B. General Conditions:

1. Plans are to be prepared in pencil on cloth.

2. Estimates are to be based upon prices approved by the New York State Department of Public Works, generally, for the year 1941.

3. All approved original and other finished drawings prepared by the Engineer shall become the property of the Town.

4. Six copies of the completed plans, specifications, and other contract documents, are to be included in the work required under this contract. Copies required in excess of this number shall be paid for by the Town in addition to stipulated fee payments.

5. The Engineer agrees that it will not assign, transfer, convey, or otherwise dispose of this Contract, or their right or interest therein, or of their power to execute the same, without the consent in writing of the Town.

6. This Contract shall be null and void, and of no force and effect unless the Engineer shall secure compensation for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this Contract, such employees as are necessary to be insured in compliance with the provisions of the Workman's Compensation Law of the State of New York, and will also comply with the Labor Law, and all other laws effecting this Contract in any way.

7. The Engineer represents that they are duly licensed engineers, and authorized to practice their profession in the State of New York, and there shall be attached to the specifications, plans and drawings their licensed engineer's seal.

8. The Town agrees to furnish and make available to the Engineer all existing information and data pertaining to the proposed project which it may have.

C. Payments:

The total fees to be paid by the Town to the Engineer for services as herein described shall be \$22,500.00, as previously set forth.

Payments are to be made in six installments, as follows
One-sixth, or \$3,750, when the work is 25% complete.
One-sixth, or \$3,750, when the work is 50% complete.

One-sixth, or \$3,750, when the work is 75% complete.
One-sixth, or \$3,750, when the work is complete and
filed with the Town Board.

One-sixth, or \$3,750, within three months of the
filing of said completed documents.

The final one-sixth, or \$3,750, upon receipt by the
Town of the approval of the work by the New York State Postwar ^{Public} Works
Planning Commission.

Payments for additional plans and contract documents
in excess of the six required by the contract shall be paid by the
Town at the Engineer's cost and in addition to the above fees.

The cost of any borings which may be required by the
New York State Postwar Public Works Planning Commission, The Town,
or the work, shall be paid by others than the Engineer.

D. Alternate Plans:

Should the Town request alternate plans and speci-
fications to be prepared so as to give an opportunity to receive bids
on competing types of structures or equipment, or for alternate
locations, or for other reasons, it is agreed that the Engineer
shall furnish, but shall be paid therefor, in addition to the first
above mentioned fees, two-thirds of the fees quoted for the orig-
inal plans and specifications.

E. Travelling Expenses:

The cost of all travelling expenses to the site of
the work is included in the above fees. Should the Town direct
the Engineer to travel to Albany, New York, or other points be-
yond one hundred miles from Buffalo, the travelling expenses in-
volved shall be reimbursed to the Engineer by the Town.

Gentlemen:

There have been no Change Orders recommended by the Engineers to the Town Board since April 7, 1947.

At that time it was pointed out in the letter to the Board that several additional changes would be required in connection with the installation of a completely new hoist in the Repair Shop in place of the one now in the Highway Department, which it was originally proposed to move. It also developed that the compressor that was there, was too small to operate the proposed new equipment. Under date of April 7 you approved the change in the hoist and ordered us to negotiate with the Contractor for the installation of a new 5 horsepower compressor.

We are now advised that the Contractor can supply a 5 horsepower Ingersoll Rand compressor, 3 Phase, 60 Cycle, 220 Volt, for immediate delivery at a cost of \$759.00 installed.

As of the former date, a change order was authorized to rearrange the Forced Draft Fans for ventilating and also for the Waste Heat Boiler, which resulted in a credit to the Town of \$76.35.

The Waste Heat Boiler which the Nichols Engineering and Research Corporation was eventually able to supply required some greater clearances than what was originally shown on the plans. In order to make an acceptable arrangement we changed the location of the boiler, which required longer runs of heating piping to and from the boiler. We have received a bill from the Contractor in the amount of \$205.00 for this work. Taking into consideration the \$76.35 credit, the complete change is being made for \$128.65.

At the time of the former letter, we advised you that there would be necessary some changes in the heating system so that it would be possible to take advantage of the Waste Heat Boiler as against using the small auxiliary boiler burning purchased gas, for all of the heating units. We have divided the supply lines into two sections, separately valved, and have provided a ~~station~~ pump which will provide better operation and should in the long run, result in considerable savings in operation. The cost of the pump is \$897.00, together with two 4 inch gate valves, two 1 inch gate valves, and one 1 inch check valve, which amount to \$200.00.

The specifications call for an allowance of \$45.00 per thousand for face brick. The cost of the face brick finally selected for the job was \$47.50 per thousand. As there are 70,000 face brick, this results in an extra charge of \$175.00.

Wheel guards and bumpers were supplied at the entrance doors to the Garage and the Main Door entrance on the Charging Floor. No wheel guards were provided on the original plans at the doorway to the Repair Shop. No wheel guards were provided at the interior door to the Ash Elevator because it was thought these were included with the elevator equipment. It was found, however, that their equipment included only a door but no bumpers and guards. It was necessary to supply these.

Due to a slight change in the rearrangement of the stairs, it was found necessary to install a small concrete beam not shown on the plans. This was just below the Charging Floor level.

In connection with the shop plans prepared for the reinforcing steel on the Charging Floor, it was found desirable to install what is known as a "Z" bar hinge to reduce the effect of expansion in the large columns supporting the roof. These were added at six columns at a small extra charge.

We, therefore, recommend extra work orders to the Contractor, as follows:

6. Supplying new compressor in Repair Garage - \$750.00

7. Extra allowance for face brick on account of increase in price from \$45.00 per thousand to \$47.50 per thousand. Total price \$175.00.

8. Providing additional bumpers and wheel guards at doorways which were not included in the original plans:

2 Bumpers at Ash Tunnel Door - \$45.00

2 Concrete Door Jambs at inside elevator door entrances - \$65.50

The low bid is \$16,457.05 below the estimate, and \$13,258.85 below the next bidder.

Because of the varying amounts of pavement, sidewalks, and drive-ways to be replaced, curbing to be protected, and other private structures to be protected, it was thought best to include the replacement of these items in the price for installing the sewer pipe, and constructing the man-holes and chambers.

The chambers are all of special construction and are more ex-pensive than manholes. The pavement replacement as above, is to be in-cluded in the chamber cost.

A person unfamiliar with this type of work, or who did not care-fully examine the plans may have overlooked these details.

In addition, the specifications call for work to be started at once and to be completed in 120 days to be ready to give relief this Spring, which requires winter work.

The low unit bid by the Depew Paving Company for 12 in. pipe installed at depths of 10 - 16 ft. was \$4.60 per lineal foot. The next bidder was \$11.20, and these prices ran up to \$19.00. The cost of the pipe alone delivered along the trench is \$1.55 per lineal foot. Other miscellaneous materials such as jointing compound, hemp, etc. might run about \$.40 cents per lineal foot. Where pavement replacement is required about one-half a square yard is allowed per lineal foot for reinforced concrete pavement. To remove and replace it would cost about \$5.00 per square yard or \$5.00 per lineal foot. Therefore, the costs as described exceed the bid price, and there is no allowance for digging up to 16 ft. deep, controlling traffic, etc.

This figure assumes that the pavement replacement is included in the sewer figure.

The Depew Paving Company bid for this item was \$350.00. The next bid was \$2,087.00.

The Depew Paving Company are financially responsible for this size job. We have spoken with several of their principals to explain these circumstances. On Saturday we were advised by Mr. Gibbs of their Company that they desired to have the job awarded to them.

Instead of recommending an immediate award of this contract to the Depew Paving Company, we suggest that the principals of their firm and a representative of their bonding company be requested to meet with your Board. If they then indicate they intend to meet all conditions of the plans and specifications, despite the fact that their bid is below cost, we see no reason why the contract should not be awarded to them.

We have completed the preliminary field work for the entire length of the project from the end of Seaton Road open ditch, as included in the Roycroft Pump Station Project, to Scajaquada Creek.

The description of the location of the drain given in the preliminary report submitted to the Postwar Planning Commission was tentative, depending upon levels, to be taken in the field.

These levels and field data indicate that the drain should be located in Frederick Drive from George Urban Boulevard north to Genesee Street, rather than in East Grand Boulevard and Verdun Place. In the first case, since our preliminary report was made, apparently a builder has purchased the lots on both sides of East Grand Boulevard and has houses under construction on both sides, and has already completed some around the bend at the north end through which the drain would have to pass. Under these circumstances it seems inadvisable to consider East Grand Boulevard.

There are only a couple of houses along Frederick Drive. An existing ditch which in some places is 16 feet deep, is already located along the center of Frederick Drive for about one-third of its length. If the covered drain is installed in Frederick Drive it would cause little inconvenience generally, and we believe would considerably improve local conditions by permitting the closing of the present open ditch.

There is also some question as to the best route to be used in either passing through or around the Tio-Run-Da Housing Development. We are working on several alternate routes and will be ready to report to you at the next meeting, our recommendations.

If the Frederick Drive route is acceptable to your Board, we would ask that you approve of the same by resolutions.

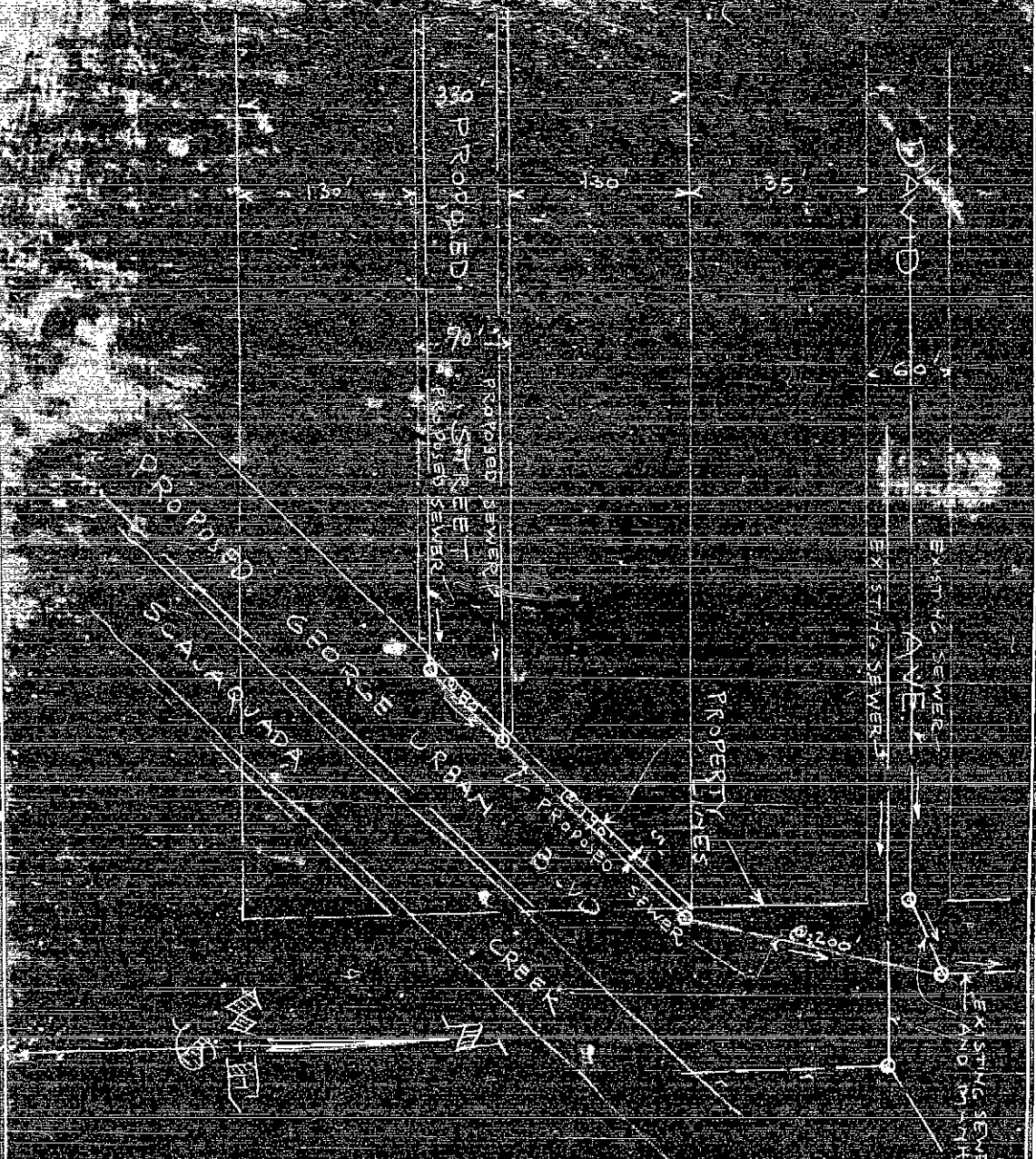

Gentlemen:

The Lakeland Construction Corporation has submitted to us at your request, figures for installing and constructing landscaping around the incinerator grounds, as has been previously discussed. A plan accompanies this letter showing the details of landscaping, together with planting plans for the number of plants, trees, shrubs, etc. required.

Item No. 1 includes the installation of about 4,700 Honeysuckle plants on the two sides slopes of the ramp to the turning platform. These plants are low, hardy, and with root ground that will retard any weathering of the side slopes. In the planting straw will be used as a mulch to prevent erosion the first year. Estimated cost of this item is \$1,392.00.

Item No. 2 - There are five large trees shown to be planted in the area in front of the drives. These trees are elms and pinoaks 20 ft. to 25 ft. in height. The trees will be planted in special soil and guids so as not to blow over during the initial period of growth. The estimated cost is \$788.00 for this item.

Item NO. 3 - The balance of the landscape work indicated on the plans and listed in the planting list which includes the planting along the north line of the hedge, and planting opposite the gasoline station, the planting on the north side of the garage, the ornamental evergreens in front of the incinerator building facing towards Union Road. A low hedge around the flag pole area and other nursery stock trees as shown on the plans will be 3 in. to 3½ in. caliper and about 15 ft. high. The estimated cost of this item is \$3,170.00. All of this stock will be planted in top soil, skillfully installed so as to assure good survival of the material installed.

Item No. 4 - A 60 ft. metal flag pole with concrete base, pulleys, rope and stepping stones from pavement to pole for the sum of \$1,330.00.

This work cannot be started until the grading is finished and the weather permits, which will be about the last of April. However, the landscape man wants to arrange for the purchase of stock and the delivery on the flag pole is such that it will be necessary to place orders at this time.

The total of the four items above is \$6,680.00. The engineering expense of detailed plans, supervision of construction, staking out the work, etc. will be about \$500.00, so that the total for these items will amount to about \$7,200. We have checked the funds available in the balance of the account and find that there is an unencumbered balance of approximately \$8,500.00. We believe, therefore, there are sufficient funds to make an award of this work, if you desire to do so.

- III. THAT only sewage and no storm water or surface water from streets, roofs or other areas shall be admitted to the proposed sewer extensions.
- IV. THAT the sewers shall be made as watertight as practicable to exclude so far as possible ground water infiltration.
- V. THAT whenever required by the State Commissioner of Health, additional or more adequate works for the collection or disposal of sewage shall be installed and put in operation, plans for which shall first be submitted to and receive the approval of the State Department of Health.

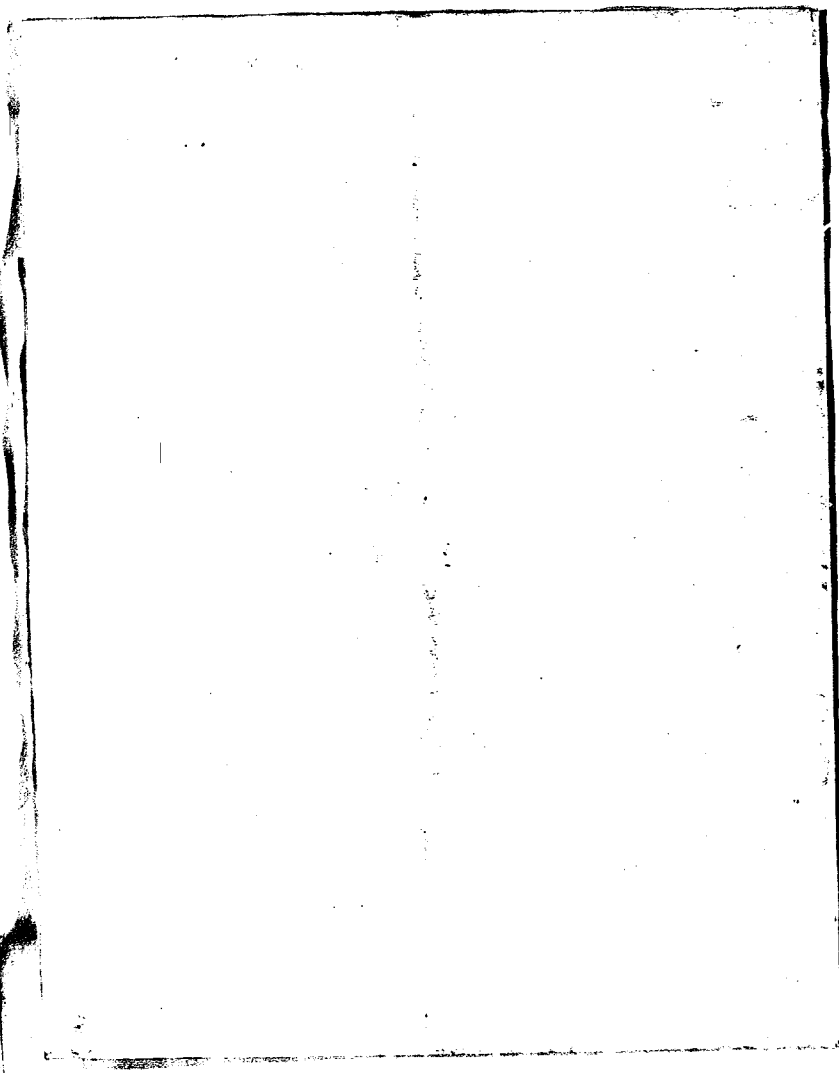

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with the resolution adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, on September 22, 1947, after a public hearing had been duly and legally called held and conducted, pursuant to a petition duly filed, the construction of curbs on Wanda Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York is hereby authorized.

Section 2. The estimated maximum cost of such object or purpose is \$13,750. The plan of financing such object or purpose consists of the issuance of \$13,750 serial bonds of said Town,

hereinafter authorized.

Section 3. For the purpose of paying the cost of such object or purpose, there are hereby authorized to be issued, pursuant to the Local Finance Law §13,750 serial bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, each designated substantially STREET CURBING (SERIAL) BOND, 1948, dated January 1, 1948, in the denomination of \$1,000 each except bond numbered 1 in the denomination of \$750, numbered 1 to 14, both inclusive, maturing in numerical order in the amount of \$2,750 on January 1, 1949, \$2,000 on January 1, 1950 and \$3,000 on January 1 in each of the years 1951 to 1953, both inclusive, and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on July 1 and January 1. Such bonds shall be in bearer coupon form with the privilege of conversion into bonds registered as to both principal and interest, and shall be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at Manufacturers and Traders Trust Co. in Buffalo, New York, which by contract is the paying agent of the issuer. Such bonds shall be signed in the name of the Town of Cheektowaga by its Supervisor and sealed with its corporate seal, attested by its Town Clerk, and the interest coupons shall bear the facsimile signature of its Supervisor.

Section 4. All other matters except as provided herein relating to such bonds shall be determined by the Supervisor. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in additions to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that subdivision 24 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law applies to such object or purpose and that the period of probable usefulness thereof is five years, computed from January 1, 1948, there being no bond anticipation notes outstanding therefor,

Section 6. The faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land especially benefitted by the aforesaid improvement in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same and in the pertinent manner provided in Section 202-a of the Town Law, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable. In the event that the annual collection of such assessments shall be less than the amount required to pay the principal and interest of such bonds as they shall become due, the Town Board shall direct that surplus moneys not otherwise appropriated be applied.

Section 7. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct, the sale and award the bonds in such manner as he shall deem best for the interests of said Town, provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers he shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 8. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
