FESCUARD, That pursuant to the provisions of the Town Lew of the State of New York, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowers, Eric County, New York shall meet at the Town Hell corner of Union Road and Broadway, in said Town, on the 7th day of September, 1948, at 2.30 P.W. Hestern Daylight Saving Time. for the purpose of considering the advisebility of repealing Section 18 of the Zoning Ordinances, entitled "Sign Boards" adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektoware, New York or December 21, 1942, and hearing of persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same, which said Section 18, entitled "Sign Boards", adopted as aforesid, provides as follows?

No sign board or bill board shall be erected upon any real property so as to obstruct the view of operators of motor vehicles at street intersections, and the same must be set back at least twenty (20) feet from the front street line. No such sign board or bill board shall hereafter be erected without a permit to construct same having been obtained from the Town Clerk, but can only be issued by him after application has been approved by the Town Foard. Application for such permit must be made in writing to the Board, with a description of the property upon which it is intended such sign board or bill board is to be erected, the distance from street intersections, the height of same and such other information shall be furnished the Town Board as it may require in the application of such permit. The fee for issuing such permit shall be \$20.00 per annum and no license shall be issued for a period of more than one year. All licenses for less than one year may be issued upon payment in each case of a fee bearing the same proportion to the amount of the annual fee for such license as the period of time intervening between the date of such issuance and the thirtieth day of June thereafter bears to now year, provided that no fee shall be accepted for less than three months and that a fraction of a month shall be counted as full month.

Any person, firm or corporation violeting any of provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine of \$50.00 for each offense, and each day during which any sign shall be maintained contrary to the provisions of this section shall be deemed a separate offense."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That pursuant to the provisions of the Town Lee, the Toan Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, Eric County, New York, shall meet at the Town Hall, corner of Union Road and Broadway in said Town, on the 7th day of September, 1948, at 2.30 P.M. Eastern Daylight Saving Time, for the purpose of considering the advisability of enacting the following ordinances to be known as Section 18 "Sign Boards", of the Zoning Ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York:

Licenses for less than one year may be issued upon payment in each case of a fee bearing the same proportion to the amount of the annual fee for such license as the period of time intervening between the time of such issuance and the first day of October, thereafter bears to one year providing that no fee shall be accepted for less than three months and that a fraction of a month shall be counted as full month."

No sign toard or bill board from the day of the adoption of this ordinance shall be erected, owned or used as a sign board or bill board by any person, firm or corporation without first obtaining a license and the fee for issuing such license shall be \$20.00 per annum and it may be renewed each year on or before the first day of September for the following year, the annual fee \$20.00 per annu. This ordinace shall apply to all sign boards and bill boards regardless when the same were erected. This ordinance shall not apply to Sign Boards erected on premises by the owner or tenant to advertise a business conducted on the same premises. Any person, firm or corporation vibilating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdeameanor and shall be liable to a fine of \$50.00 for each offense and each week during the time the said sign shall be maintained contrary to the provision of this section shall be deemed a separate offense."






