2. The Corporation agrees that it will throughout the term of this Contract, furnish adequate, suitable and prompt fire protection to said Fire Protection District, and

in connection therewith, it further agrees that it and its members will promptly respond to and attend any and all fires occurring in said District, and to the best of its and their ability will extinguish such fires and prevent loss of life and injury to person or property therefrom.

3. The Town of Cheektowaga agrees that it will pay for such services for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1949, and ending the 31st day of December, 1949, and for each year thereafter until the 31st day of December, 1953, to the said Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., such amount of money as may be raised by an assessment at the rate of .84 per thousand dollar assessed valuation, levied against the property situated within the limits of the Fire Protection District, and the payment of said moneys to be made to the Corporation between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of April each year.

4. January 17, 1949 - to Mr. Edward B. Jurgenski with regard to bringing the Assessors Maps up-to-date in accordance with the general terms of work described in the letter. The estimate of cost therein is \$7,067 to include the services of Mr. Popeall, whom the Town will engage. There are also extra charges for the reproduction of plans by the photostatic process to insert in the Atlas covers which the Assessors now have.

On the last page of the letter, we state that this is not to be considered as a bid for doing the work, by our office, but an estimate of the total cost of the work, including the services of Mr. Popeall. We understand that you did not care to obligate yourselves for a sum as large as this at the present time, so we offer to generally supervise the work, instruct Mr. Popeall in the manner of setting up the sheets and doing the drafting work, assist in the securing of deeds, subdivision maps and other basic data required for the revision of the sheets, prepare the Index Sheet and do such other work as may be necessary in combination with Mr. Popeall to eventually make the necessary revisions to the present map system for the sum of \$2,500.

Letter Dated September 14, 1948 to Mr. Ernest T. 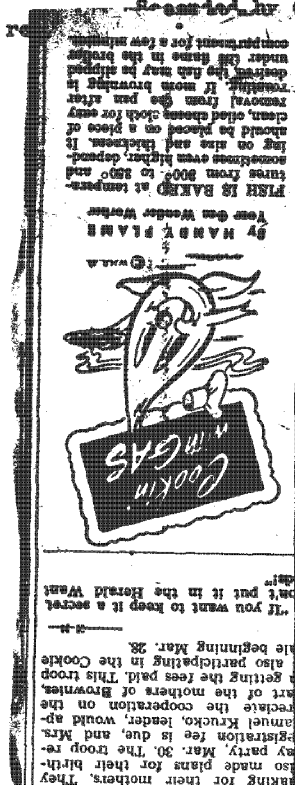

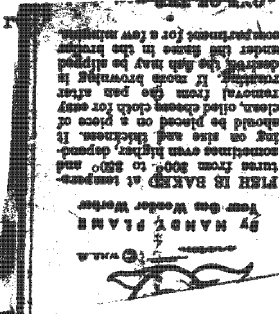

WHEREAS, the Taft Hartley Act, in its entirety, is an insult to the working people of the United States, a brand upon their integrity and decency, a handicap to all fair minded employers; and

WHEREAS, the Taft Hartley Act invades the constitutional guarantees of free speech, free press and freedom of contract; and

WHEREAS, the Taft Hartley Act breathes suspicion and repression in every line and in no instance aids or assists the process of peaceful collective bargaining, and

WHEREAS, one of the main issues in the past presidential campaign was the repeal of the Taft Hartley Law and such issue was supported by an overwhelming majority vote for candidates to political office who were on record for the immediate repeal of this vicious and obnoxious law; and

WHEREAS, the 81 st Congress has conducted hearings on a substitute labor bill known as the Thomas Bill and such hearings have resulted in needless repetitious testimony, consequently, delaying action on the repeal of this law; and

WHEREAS, thousands of collective bargaining contracts, presently expiring and will expire in the very near future, and labor organizations and employers cannot negotiate with any degree of confidence as to the provisions that may be contained in a new labor bill, thus creating an air of uncertainty and endangering harmonious labor relations between labor and management which may result in unavoidable work stoppages; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the United States of America have, by their vote last November, delivered a mandate to the new Congress for immediate repeal of the Taft Hartley Law,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Cheektowaga assert its disapproval of the Taft Hartley Law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Cheektowaga go on record for the immediate and unqualified repeal of the Taft Hartley Law and that the President of the United States, Harry S. Truman, the majority leaders of the house and the senate, the members of Congress from the Western New York area, and the United States Senators from New York State, be so notified as soon as possible after the passage of this resolution so that they may act accordingly.
