We are now supplying electric service to traffic signals located in the Town of Ghoshtomagn at Harlem Road and Gloveland Brive, our account No. 2707-290, Manyvale Drive and Rarlem Road, our account No. 2607-514, Pine Midge Road and Boat Street, our account No. 2607-570, Waldem Avenue and Harlem Road, our account No. 2607-270, Reneington Avenue and Contemy Road, our account No. 1607-1600.

These traffic signals are now being billed on rule POU No. 7, service alassification No. 5, which is our standard conservial schedule. The bills rendered on these accounts for a 12-month period ending in April 1949 encumbed to a total of \$650,00. See attached shoot for detail.

Had these signals been billed on the first rate of \$1.13 per face (4 faces each), the charge for the five signals would have been \$271.20, or a saving of \$9.50. An additional saving would have been realized in the installation of these signals because of the more simplified wiring system.

It is our recommendation that we be given the settlerity to change the method of billing from PSG No. 7, service classification No. 5 to the block rate of \$1.13 per signal face per month. 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


