Dr. Victor Reinstein speaking in favor of the proposed ordinance related to the Board that the streets should be under the supervision of the Town and that inspectors should be appointed by the Town Board to work in conjunction with the Town Engineer, and that the contractors should not be made to put in a better street then one that the Town puts in, and also that the contractors should not be strangled by the adoption of the proposed ordinance.

Following is a list of proposed specifications for the construction of highways in the Town, submitted by the Town Engineer, Town Attorney, and the Town Superintendent of Highways;

TO THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK:

You requested us to prepare proposed specifications for the construction of highways in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, for your consideration.

MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS FOR STREET OR HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

1. No street or highway will be accepted as an improved Town Highway by the Town Board or Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, unless the following minimum specifications are complied with:

Legal References: Highways by Dedication - See Section 171,
Highway Law
Requirements as to width - See Sections 171
and 180 (No highways shall be laid out less
than 3 rods in width)

SUBGRADE

2. The subgrade on all types of road shall be properly prepared after proper drainage has been provided. All boulders, muck, quicksand, soft elay, spongy material and any other objectionable material shall be removed as directed by the Town Engineer and Town Superintendent of Highways. All spaces from which objectionable materials have been removed shall be refilled with acceptable materials such as stone, slag or gravel, as directed.

FOUNDATION COURSE

3. After all drains have been satisfactorily completed and the subgrade has been properly shaped, it shall be throughly rolled and compacted with an approved self-propelled roller weighing not less than ten tons. Care shall be taken not to roll clay foundations enough to develop a plastic condition. All hollows and depressions which develop shall be filled with acceptable materials and the subgrade shall again be rolled. This process of filling and rolling shall be repeated until no depressions develop. In places where the character of the material make the use of such a roller impracticable, a lighter one may be permitted. The subgrade shall not be muddy, or otherwise unsatisfactory when the pavement is placed upon it. All necessary drainage th effectively drain the roadway must be completed before the placing of any pavement will be permitted thereon.

ENBANKMENT

4. Embankments shall be formed of suitable materials, graded and rolled to the property lines, and approximately true to lines and grades. All stones larger than 3 inches in diameter or any other objectionable material shall be removed from the surface.

INTERSECTING HIGHWAYS

5. At all intersecting public highways a smoot riding and satisfactory junction must be produced.

MATERIALS CONTROL TO PROTECT OF THE PROTECT OF THE SECOND SECTION OF THE SECOND SECOND

6. Bottom Courses: Highways may be constructed of gravel, slag or stone

and sufficient filler shall be added so that the material will compact in a dense mass. The owner shall get the approval of the Town Superintendent of the material that he proposes to use before placing same. Material shall be placed upon roads in layers of not more than 6 inches loose and thoroughly compacted with a 10-ton roller.

Top Course: The top courses shall be ITEM 53M, Option No. 6
Asphalt Concrete-Steam Dispersion Process of the New York State
Public Works Specifications. A course of binder with a compacted
thickness of two (2) inches shall be laid, followed with a course
of top (fine) with a compacted thickness of one (4) inch. An
eight to ten ton tandem roller shall be used to compact the
asphalt concrete.

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7. Curb shall conform to the sections as shown in the Specifications, or of such sections as approved by the Engineer, and shall be required only in sections where adequate storm sewers are available and adequate. Cast in place curb under these specifications shall be composed of Lake Erie Sand, Lake Erie Gravel, Crushed Stone or Crushed Blast Furnace Slag. Blast Furnace Slag shall be as produced by the Buffalo Slag Company.

Fine Aggregate: The fine aggregate shall be washedeand graded in compliance with A.S.T.M. Specification C33-49. It shall pass the 10 cycle Sodium Sulphate test with loss not greater 8%.

Course Aggregate: The coarse aggregate shall be clean and graded in compliance with A.S.T.M. Specification C33-49, for nominated size 3/4" to #4. It shall pass the 10 cycle Sedium Sulphate Test with loss not greater 5%.

Concrete Strength Requirement: Minimum compressive strength on Standard 6" x 12" concrete cylinders shall not be less than 3500 lbs. per square inch at 28 days.

At least two test cylinders shall be made on each day that concrete is poured, one for 7 days and one for 28 days. Tests to be made by a recognized testing laboratory satisfactory to the Town Engineer. Cost of such testing is to be paid by the contractor, and included in his bid.

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Concrete Mix Proportions (Per Cubic Yard)

Portland Cement (Minimum)

Maximum slump for any of the three types of concrete shall be six (6) inches.

Cold weather concrete: All concrete placed in cold or freezing weather, must have both mixing water and aggregates heated. The concrete when deposited in the forms shall have a temperature of at least 70 degrees, maximum temperature 110 degrees F. After placing concrete in the forms, it shall be fully protected from the elements by being covered with straw or other suitable material for at least 10 days.

No concrete shall be placed on frozen ground.

Mixing and Placing of Concrete: Concrete may be either transit mix or job mix. In either case, the mix proportions must be held rigidly to those eutlined under concrete mix proportions of this specification.

Care must be exercised in placing concrete in the forms. After placing, it shall be redded or spaded, so that the finished concrete shall be smooth and represent a workmanlike job.

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If after removal of the forms, any open or rough spots are noted, they shall be immediately repaired with a cement and mix of 1:2 by the cement finisher.

Curbing shall be covered, immediately after finishing, with burlap or other material acceptable to the Engineer which shall be kept wet for a period of 3 days.

The centractor shall protect the curbing and keep it in first class condition and alignment until the completion of the contract. Any curbing which is damaged at any time previous to the final acceptance of the work shall be removed and replaced with satisfactory curbing at the contractor"s expense.

All backfilling behind curb must be tamped in layers not more than 6 inches in depth to a height of not less than 6 inches below the top of the curb. Each earth layer shall be thoroughly and uniformly compacted by solidly tamping with appropriate tools in such a manner as not to injure or disturb the completed curb.

All backfilling on the front, or pavement side, of the curb shall be filled with crushed stone, slag, or other suitable porous material and properly compacted. No earth fill will be allowed.

SEASONAL AND WEATHER LINITATION

8. No material shall be placed from October 15th to May 15th, except by written permission of the Engineer, nor when the air temperature in the shade is below 50 degrees F.

person, firm, or corporation from constructing at his own expense a road or a highway on private property, to be deeded later to the Town upon completion, so long as he complies with the foregoing requirements. He must, however, before commencing work, file with the Town Engineer, written plans and specifications which shall in every respect comply with the foregoing specifications. All work on said highway shall be done under the supervision of the Town Engineer and the Town Highway Superintendent and such other person or persons as either of them designate to inspect the work.

The foregoing specifications are similar to the ones now in effect in the Town of Tonawanda, with certain revisions. The Town of Tonawanda's specifications require curbing in all streets. Curbing has been omitted in the above specifications, except in existing storm sewer districts.

We further wish to call to the Town Board's attention the fact that the present specifications in force require the builder or developer to construct an 8-inch base of gravel, slag, or stone. When such work meets the approval of the Town Highway Superintendent, he places a penetration surface on the compacted base. The penetration surface constructed by the Town Highway Bepartment consists of 2 inches of No. 2 stone, rolled and shaped with a 10-ton roller. The Highway Department them applies one gallon of asphalt per square yard by pressure to the rolled surface. This coating is then covered with No. 1 stone and again rolled. This is followed by an application of one-half gallon of asphalt per square yard and then a cover of 1-A stone applied and rolled by the 10-ton roller.

Thereafter, the Highway Department has to recoat the surface whenever it starts to bleed. This may happen a few months after the road is laid or it might be the following year. The Highway Department in about 2 or 3 years applies another application of asphalt, a half gallon per square yard, for a sealer coat. The road has to be maintained thereafter by the Highway Department; but if the road is preperly laid in the first place, maintenance expense is not too great.



1. No street or highway will be accepted as an improved Town Highway by the Town Board or Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York York, unless the following minimum specifications are complied with:

Legal References: Highways by Dedication—See Section 171, High-way Law. Requirements as to width —See Sections 171 and 180 (No highways shall be laid out less than rods in width). SUBGRADE

2. The subgrade on all types of road shall be properly prepared after proper drainage has been provided. All boulders, muck, quicksand, soft clay, spongy material and any other objectionable material shall be re-moved as directed by the Town Engineer and Town Superintendent of Highways. All spaces from which objectionable materials have been removed shall be refilled with acceptable materials, such as stone, siag or gravel, as directed. FOUNDATION COURSE

3. After all drains have been satisfactorily completed and the subgrade has been properly shaped, it shall be thoroughly rolled and compacted with an approved self-propelled roller weighing not less than ten tons Care shall be taken not to roll clay foundations enough to develop a plastic condition. All hollows and deessions which develop shall be filled with acceptable materials and the subgrade shall again be rolled. This process of filling and rolling shall be repeated until no depressions develop. In places where the character of the material make the use of such a roller impracticable, a lighter one may be permitted. The subgrade shall not be muddy, or otherwise unsatisfactory when the pavement is placed upon it. All Crushed Stone or Crushed Blast

suitable materials, graded and rolled to the property lines, and approximately true to lines and grades. All stones larger than 3 inches in diameter or any other objectionable material shall be removed from the INTERECTING HIGHWAYS

5. At all intersecting public high-

ways a smooth riding and satisfactory junction must be produced.
MATERIALS

6. Bottom Courses: Highways may be constructed of gravel, slag or stone and sufficient filler shall be added so that the material will compact in a dense mass. Approval of the proposed material shall be obtained from the Town Superintendent of Highways and/or the Town Engineer before placing the material.

When gravel is used it shall be placed upon the road in layers of not more than 6 inches loose and thoroughly compacted with a roller weighing not less than 10 tons. The final thickness of the compacted mass shall not be less than 8 inches.

When broken stone or slag is used it shall be placed upon the road in layers of not more than 6 inches loose and thoroughly compacted with a roller weighing not less than ten tons. The final thickness of the compacted mass shall not be less than 6 inches.

Top Courses: These may be con-structed by either of the following wo methods:

Asphalt Concrete

The top course shall be Item 52M, Option No. 6, Asphalt concrete-steam dispersion Process of the New York State Public Works Specifications: A course of binder with a compacted thickness of two (2) inches shall be laid, followed with a course of top (fine) with a compacted thickness of one (1) inch. An 8 to 10-ton tandem roller shall be used to com-

pact the asphalt concrete. Bituminous Macadam The top course shall be a total of three (3) inches, compacted thickness, built up in the following manner. Said bonds, each to be designated substantially WATER DISTRICT NO. 9 (SERIAL) BOND, 1951, shall be dated August 1, 1951, in the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered from 1 to 80, both inclusive, maturing in numerical order in the amount of \$2,000 on August 1 in each of the years 1952 to 1961, both inclusive, and \$3,000 on August 1 in each of the years 1962 to 1981, both inclsuive, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually February 1 and August 1. Such bonds shall be in bearer coupon form with the privilege of conversion into bonds registered as to both principal and interest and shall be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company, in Buffalo, New York, which by contract is the paying agent of the issuer. 


