Such bonds shall be in bearer coupon form with the privilege of conversion into bonds registered as to both principal and interest and shall be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of Amers Trust Company in Buffalo, N. Y., which by contract is the paying agent of the issuer. 

A hearing was had on the application before the Zoning Board of Appeals on the 5th day of October, 1951. At this hearing the petitioner was represented by counsel and several property owners within a radius of 300 feet of the property of the petitioner appeared and opposed the application.

The property in question adjoins a residence district.

In the past few years the adjoining area zoned residential has been improved by the construction of homes. On the other hand, only small portions of the premises in the vicinity of Walden Avenue have been actually used for industrial purposes. For the most part it has remained vacant property.

It appeared at the hearing and from other proofs called to the attention of the members of the Zoning Board of Appeals that the proposed use of this property would involve steel plate fabricating, shearing, welding and shaping of steel plates and construction shapes.

Such operations, in the opinion of the Zoning Board of Appeals, might involve offensive odors and smoke. It seems to be conceded that a great deal of noise would be created.

A hospital will soon be built in the immediate neighborhood. This fact was emphasized by members of the Town Park Taxpayers' Association who also oppose the granting of the application.

We do not believe it would be in the public interest to change the zoning in this particular area and for that reason we are denying

the application.

Incidentally, from our inspection of the neighbor-hood, we recommend that the area north of New Walden Avenue be zoned residential, and that appropriate proceedings be instituted to accomplish this result.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. In order to finance the specific object or purpose hereinafter described the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, shall issue its capital notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$1,000 pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York.

Section 2. The specific object or purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution is the purchase and installation of street lighting equipment pursuant to Section 198 of the Town Law of New York, along Kenview Boulevard from Cleveland Drive to Burke Drive within the Town of Cheektowaga, to serve properties on both sides of said highway.

Section 3. It is hereby stated that:

(a) The maximum cost of said purpose, as estimated by the Town Board, is \$1,000; and

 (b) No money has heretofore been authorized to be applied to the payment of the cost of said purpose;

 (c) The Town Board plans to fi-

nance the cost of said purpose entirely from funds raised by the issuance of said capital notes; and (d) All of such cost is to be paid

by assessments upon benefited real property in an area less than the area of said Town.

Section 4. For the purpose of paying the cost of such purpose, there are hereby authorized to be issued, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, \$1,000 capital notes of the Town of Cheektowaga, designated substantially Lighting District Capital Notes Series B of 1951, which shall bear a date not earlier than December 21st, 1951, such date to be fixed by the Supervisor, in the denomination of \$500 each, numbered 1 and 2, maturing in numerical order in the amount of \$500 on April 1 in each of the years 1952 and 1953, and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding five percent (5%) per annum, payable semi annually on April 1 and October 1. Such capital notes shall be in bearer form, with the privilege of conversion into capital notes registered as to both principal and interest, and shall be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America, at the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company, in Buffalo, New York, which by contract is the paying agent of the issuer. Such capital notes shall be signed in the name of the Town of Cheektowaga by its Supervisor, and sealed with its corporate seal and attested by its Town Close.

Section 5. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such capital notes shall be determined by the Supervisor. Such capital notes shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law as the Supervisor shall determine.

Section 6. The faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such capital notes as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such capital note becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land especially benefited by the aforesaid improvements in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvements shall confer upon the same, and in the manner provided in Section 202-a of the Town Law, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such capital notes as the same become due and payable.

Such capital notes shall be sold at private sale by the Supervisor at a price of not less than par value of and accrued interest, if any, and the proceeds of such sale shall be applied solely for the purpose aforesaid, but the receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such capital notes who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchaser meney.

The validity of said capital notes may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication; or if said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.


