WHEREAS, the Town Board of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, has determined it to be necessary for the proper maintenance and service of the existing trunk sewer system maintained by Sewer District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga, to increase, improve or reconstruct the facilities of such trunk sewer system and the appurtenances thereto and, at the request of the Town Board, Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, who are competent Civil Engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, have prepared a map and general plan for the improvement or reconstruction of such trunk sewer system and for the increase of the facilities thereof and also an estimate of the expense thereof, and said map and general plan and estimate are dated June, 1952, and have been presented to the Town Board and have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, none of the improvements described in said map and general plan included any lateral sewer main authorized to be constructed pursuant to Section 199 of the Town Law of New York; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to hold a public hearing for the consideration of such map and general plan and estimate, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

(1) The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish and post the following notice:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie and State of New York, will meet at the Town Hall, corner Broadway and Union Road in said Town, on the 21st day of July, 1952, at 7:30 o'clock, P.M., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, and hold a public hearing for the purpose of considering a map and general plan describing proposed improvements to the trunk sewer system maintained by Sewer District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga, and an estimate of the cost thereof, and that the Town Board will, at said time and place, hear all persons interested in the subject of such hearing and will receive all evidence offered which will enable the Town Board to determine, pursuant to the provisions of the Town Law of New York, whether it is in the public interest to make the improvements described in said map and general plan and estimate, either in whole or in part, and whether the property located within the boundaries of said District will be benefited by the making of such improvements.

The improvements hereinbefore referred to are described in a map and general plan dated June, 1952, prepared at the request of the Town Board by Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, Consulting Engineers, now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, and consist of the following:

(1) A trunk sewer together with manholes and other appurtenances suitable for its operation, extending northerly along the right of way of Harlem Road and Old Harlem Road from a point at the intersection of Franklin Street and Harlem Road, across Broadway and across the right of way of the New York Central Railroad to a point about 1600 feet north of the railroad, such trunk line to be connected with the sewer system in the territory added to sewer district No. 3 by an order made by the Town Board on June 30, 1952, at a point near the right of way of the New York Central Railroad, and

(2) the reconstruction of the existing sewage treatment plant maintained by Sewer District No. 3 so as to make such plant capable of disposing of one million gallons of sewage per day.

The estimated expense of making said improvements is Three Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$375,000).

Cheektowaga Town Board

Report of Mrs. Julia Boyer Reinstein, Town Historian on New York State Historical Association, Seminars on American Culture.

Five and a half hours (5½) by car and two hundred and ninety (290) miles from Cheektowaga is located the village of Cooperstown, in which is located Fenimore House, and the Farmer Museum, which are under the supervision of the New York State Historical Association. In addition to this group of buildings, the National Baseball Hall of Fame and it's Museum is also in Cooperstown.

The Seminars on American Culture have been held for the past five years, but this year the course was set up mainly for the benefit of the local historians. I attended the Seminar group on THE LOCAL HISTORIAN each morning, while my afternoon session was called "PICTORIAL AMERICANA". The faculty of the morning session included, Dr. Albert B. Corey, New York State Historian, Dr. Blake McKelvey, Historian for the city of Rochester, Dr. Roy L. Butterfield, retired Superintendent of Schools for Rochester, Dr. Louis Peckham, State Historian for Indiana, and other authorities in the field of Museum, Research, and Allied Historical activities. The afternoon session was headed by Marshall B. Davidson, the author of "Life in America", and editor of publications for New York Metropolitan Museum of Art. His associates were: Douglas W. Gorsline, artist, illustrator and author of a forthcoming book on the "History of American Costume", and Paul Vanderbilt, head of the Iconography Department of Library of Congress. The afternoon session was devoted to the identification and evaluation, and use of collections of pictures. I have found the morning session much more valuable to me. Each day a different aspect of the field of the local historian was presented. The collection and presentation of historical records both public and non-public, impressed upon me the need of adequately procuring all available records, newspapers, letters, diaries, real estate records and pictures relating to the past history and development of Cheektowaga. I am hoping that an adequate fire resistant storage cabinet, as well as a place in the vault, will be made available to me as I begin to collect and use such material.

(2) The improvements described in said map and general plan shall be constructed in accordance with said map and general plan, at a cost of not exceeding Three Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$375,000.).

Another aspect of the work of the local historian was emphasized by almost every speaker in the group. This was that the Town should make it their business for the historian to assemble and exhibit, photographs, pictures, maps, ledger books, diaries and other historical objects from time to time, either in the Town Hall or some other proper place within the Township. This will ultimately lead to some sort of historical museum exhibit, either in a rented building or in a permanent structure owned and operated by the Town. I realize that this project is a long way off, but it should be considered whenever there is any future planning of expanded town facilities. Another aspect of my job, which was brought to my attention at this Seminar, was my responsibility in relation to the schools and historical celebration within the Town and County. As I go farther in my work, I hope to be a source of material for the press, radio, schools, business organizations, social and religious organisations. I will be very glad to cooperate in any way possible whenever any group within the Township wishes to organize an anniversary program.

I had the privilege of spending one and a half hours with Dr. Corey, the State Historian, in a private and informal conference. The plans upon which I have been working since my appointment were enthusiastically endorsed by Dr. Corey. By Fall I hope to have ready the first exhibit of the Cheektowaga Town Historian, which I should like to have the permission of the Town Board to exhibit in the Council Chambers, and main hall. It will consist of a series of maps showing the development of the Township from Indian to the present times. Such an exhibit will entail the expenditure of less than \$100.00, which I hope the Town Board will allow me in place of the expense account which you told me I might turn in as a result of this trip. At this time I would like to request a small fund for use by the town historian. I assure you that each dollar spent will produce something concrete in assembling material on the history of the town.

I could continue telling you indefinitely of the inspiration which I received from my week at Cooperstown, and the valuable information which I received from the

Forty-five (45) members of the teaching staff, as well as from the other local historians, who were present. The whole conference had a feeling of friendliness and informality, which is seldom found in such a group. Everyone talked to everybody else, and I gained almost as much from talking shop as I did from the evening programs which included a lecture and movie on the restoration of Williamsburg, Virginia by the director of that project.

A talk on folk dances by Miss Elizabeth Burchenal, executive chairman of the Folk Arts Center of New York, and an authority on folk dancing in the United States. Frank Warner, who is an authority on folk songs, especially of Northern United States, spent one evening giving us a review of development of folk music in this section. I was particularly interested in his interpretation of the German, Scotch, Irish and Italian folk songs, which have been adopted and borrowed by so-called Americans.

Highlight of our evening sessions was a talk by Carl Carner, who is an authority on New York Folk History and author of "The Hudson", and the forthcoming "River of America" series, volume the Susquehanna.

I am very grateful to the Cheektowaga Town Board for the privilege of representing the Township as its local historian at the conference, and I am already making plans and looking forward to a return to Cooperstown next year, when I hope to be able to offer more to the group and gain as much from it.

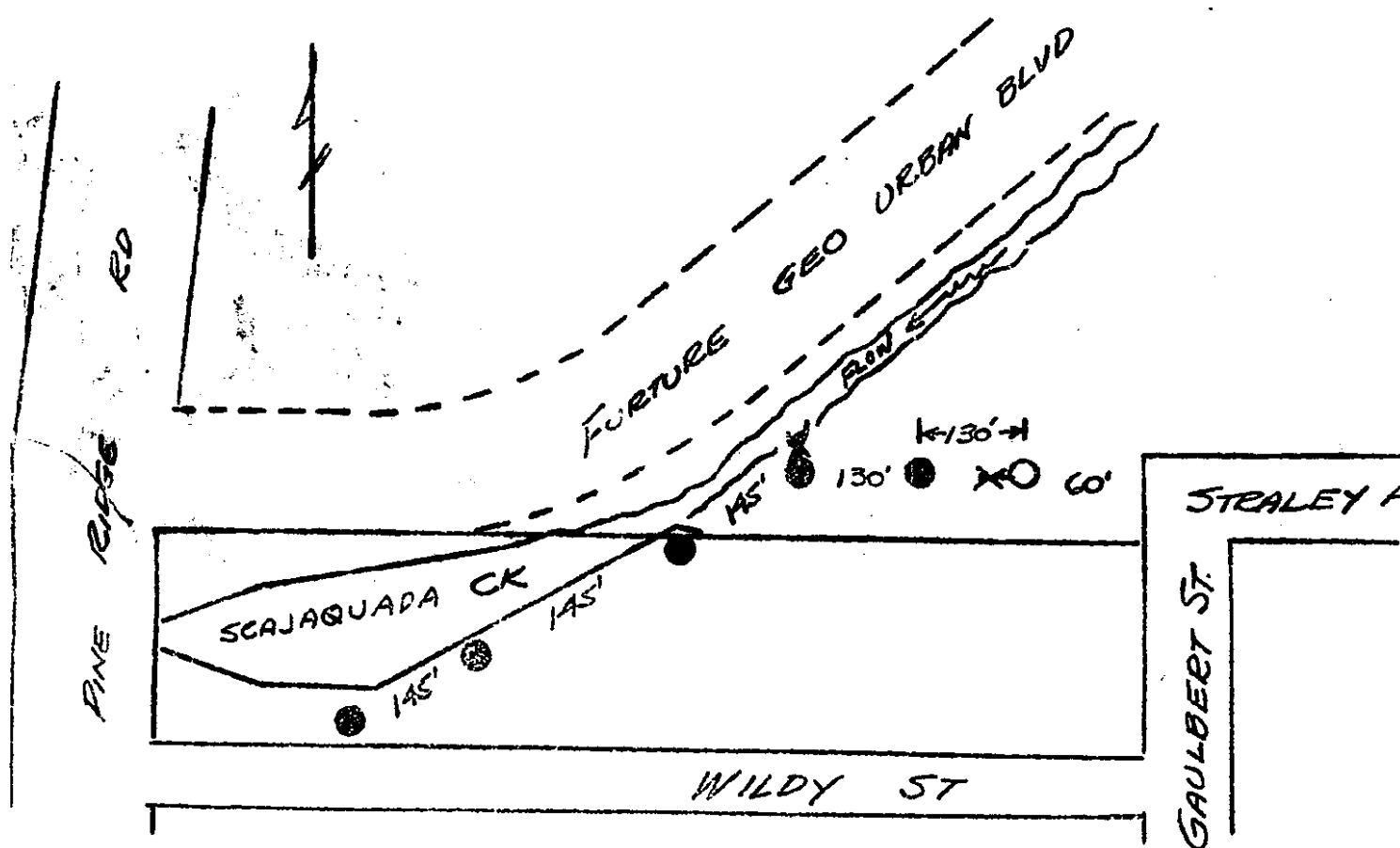



GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

GENERAL

It is the intent of these specifications to describe a gasoline motor driven street flushing unit of the CAB OVER ENGINE type, having a separate gasoline engine driven centrifugal type pump, as follows:

MINIMUM GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT (Class "A" Rating)..... 35,000 pounds.
MINIMUM GROSS CHASSIS WEIGHT.....10,500 pounds.
NOMINAL GROSS CARRYING CAPACITY (Cab, Tank, Equipment,
and Payload)..... 24,000 pounds.
WATER TANK CAPACITY (Approx.)..... 2,400 gallons.
WHEELBASE (Approx.)..... 150 inches.

DESCRIPTIVE DATA, DRAWINGS, PHOTOS, ETC.

The bidder shall submit with his or their bid descriptive data, drawings, photos, etc., in such detail as to enable the Town Highway Superintendent to determine whether the proposed equipment meets the requirements of the specifications hereinafter set forth.

MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS - CHASSIS

(a) ENGINE

Six (6) cylinder gasoline type, having a displacement of not less than 520 cubic inches and having not less than 370 lbs./ft. of torque @1250 R.P.M.

Bidder shall submit with his bid complete details, including certified engine performance curve.

(b) CLUTCH

Single disc type, not less than 14 inches in diameter. It shall have a torque input of not less than 370 lbs./ft.

(c) MAIN TRANSMISSION & TRANSFER CASE

Selective sliding gear type, combined with a two-speed transfer case to give 8 speeds forward and 2 speeds reverse, and 2 power take-off openings. The main transmission shall furnish direct (1 to 1) drive in fourth (high) gear. The transfer case shall have a 1.0 to 1.0 ratio in high speed and 2.5 to 1.0 ratio in low speed.

(d) FINAL DRIVE

(1) Full floating, double reduction type, ratio approximately 7.5 to 1.0, with axle shaft not less than 2 1/4 inches in diameter.

The certified load rating of the manufacturer shall not be less than 26,000 pounds. (Class "A" rating.)

(d) FINAL DRIVE (Continued)

(2) Radius rods of substantial design shall be provided.

(3) The minimum road clearance at the differential shall be not less than ten (10) inches when carrying specified load.

(e) CAPACITY OF AXLES

Both front and rear axles shall have manufacturer's certified rating of not less than the respective per cent of gross load placed on either front or rear axle as determined by the individual design submitted in bid.

(f) SIZE & CAPACITY OF SPRINGS

The front and rear springs shall be semi-elliptic type; adequate for the load; and shall have a length, width, thickness, and number of leaves as hereinafter specified, or approved equal.

(g) FRAME

Reinforcing plates, riveted or welded to side members, will not be accepted. The frame shall be fabricated with chrome manganese alloy heat treated steel side rails, not less than 8 inches in depth and 3 inches width of flanges, and 5/16 inch in thickness. There shall be at least five (5) cross members.

The frame shall be adequate to carry the pay (water) load, which weighs approximately 20,000 pounds.

(h) BRAKES

(i) WHEELS & TIRES

Wheels shall be BUDD pressed steel, dish type, 10 studs 3/4" diameter, or approved equal.

Tires shall be standard make, heavy duty, balloon truck type, size 12:00 x 20, 16-ply, single front and dual rear.

(j) STEERING GEAR

The steering gear shall be ample for the purpose required. It shall be Gemmer make, Model #500, worm and roller type, or approved equal.

(k) CAB

The cab shall be of the "CAB OVER ENGINE" type, with shatter proof glass throughout; rubber foam cushions, and an adequate system of ventilation.

(1) EQUIPMENT

1. Electric head, tail, and cab lights.
2. Two (2) 6 volt-150 ampere hour capacity storage batteries.
3. Electric directional arrows front and rear.
4. Heavy duty 12-volt electric generator and starting motor.
5. Electric horn.
6. Two (2) rear vision mirrors, extended arm type on right and left hand side of cab.
7. Two (2) separate windshield wipers, compressed air operated.
8. Four (4) standard reflectors, two (2) amber color at front and two (2) red color at rear of chassis.
9. Front & rear license brackets.
10. Four (4) heavy duty tow hooks, two each front and rear and bolted to sides of frame.
11. Heavy duty grill guard.
12. Heavy duty channel iron type front and rear bumpers.
13. Speedometer, fuel gauge, oil pressure guage, ammeter, and water temperature indicator, mounted on dash.
14. Engine governor, air cleaner, and oil filter.
15. Spare rim.
16. Tool box with complete set of tools, hydraulic jack, and high pressure grease gun.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR ONE (1) STREET FLUSHING UNIT FOR TOWN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

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(m) FLUSHING EQUIPMENT

GENERAL

It is the intent of this division of the specifications to describe the flushing equipment, i.e. water tank, centrifugal pump and auxiliary gasoline engine, flushing nozzles, etc. which shall be mounted upon the chassis hereinbefore specified, together with such other parts and appurtenances as are necessary to make a complete street flushing unit ready for operation.

WATER TANK

The tank shall be of symmetrical, streamline design and semi-elliptical rectangular in shape. It shall have a water capacity of approximately 2250 gallons. The shell, separator, and baffles shall be fabricated of rolled steel sheets, CORTEN corrosion resistant material, or approved equal. The minimum thickness of shell, separator, and baffles shall be #11 U.S. gauge. There shall be at least two (2) baffle plates and one (1) longitudinal separator, installed solidly, within the shell of the tank.

The tank shall be fabricated by the electric welding process.

The tank shall be built with 20-inch diameter water-tight top manhole; 2½ inch filling connection; 4-inch pump connection; 4-inch clean out opening; and 3-inch overflow pipe.

SUSPENSION OF TANK

The tank shall be provided with a flexible suspension upon the chassis. The under-structure of the tank shall be constructed of at least eight (8) I-beam transverse members, not less than 3 inches in depth and properly spaced and cushioned.

CENTRIFUGAL PUMP

A single stage centrifugal pump shall be provided which shall have a capacity of not less than 725 G.P.M. at a minimum pressure of 40 p.s.i. and nominal governed speed of the auxiliary or pump engine (approx. 1400 R.P.M.). The pump shall be provided with an enclosed type of bronze impeller and the pump shaft shall be mounted on suitable ball or roller bearings. The suction side of pump shall be provided with a suitable dirt strainer, the screen to be readily accessible for cleaning.

AUXILIARY ENGINE OR POWER UNIT

The centrifugal pump shall be driven by an auxiliary gasoline engine or power unit, having a displacement of not less than 326 cubic inches and developing not less than 60 B.H.P. at 1500 R.P.M. The engine shall be equipped with electric starter and muffler. The operating controls shall be mounted in cab of chassis except for starting switch and choke.

PIPING AND CONNECTIONS

All piping between pump and spray nozzles shall be not less than 3" I.P.S. All unions shall be flanged and bolted type. Suitable heavy duty rubber hoses, flexible couplings and connections shall be provided wherever needed to relieve strain.

NOZZLES

The spraying nozzles shall be four (4) in number, made of solid brass and polished inside with tapered slots, and shall be threaded for 2½ I.P.S. pipe connections. The nozzles shall be provided with universal connections and lock rings, to permit adjustment to any angle with the pavement. It shall also be possible to increase the thickness of the spray by insertion of shims between the halves of the nozzle. The location of the nozzles shall be as follows:

Two (2) nozzles at front end of chassis and one (1) nozzle each on the right and left side of chassis and at the center of the vehicle.

DISCHARGE AND CONTROL VALVES

Each nozzle shall be provided with 2½ inch quick-opening globe type discharge valve, operated from the cab through the medium of air pressure. These valves shall be so designed as to prevent back pressure in the line when they are closed. It shall be possible to operate each nozzle valve individually or to control all valves as a whole. The system of valves and control levers shall so arranged that this procedure can be carried out as the driver may desire. The throttle lever, controlling the speed of the pump motor and the pressure of water delivered to the nozzle piping system shall be located convenient to the driver.

WATER LEVER GAUGES

The tank shall be equipped with suitable water level gauges. One gauge shall actuate a warning light at the rear of the tank where it can be seen by the operator controlling the street hydrant and thereby prevent excessive overflow and splashing of water. The other gauge shall be arranged to operate a warning light installed in the cab, whereby the driver will know when the supply of water in the tank is low and should be replenished. The "high water" indicator shall be set to operate at a distance 12 inches below the top of the tank. The "low water" indicator shall be set to operate at a distance 8 inches above the bottom of the tank.

TANK INLET STRAINER AND FILLING HOSE

The inlet to the tank shall be equipped with a water strainer to prevent the entrance of debris. This strainer shall have removable perforated metal basket, the body of strainer to be furnished with quickly removable cover.

Filling hose will be furnished by the Town of Cheektowaga.

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EXTRA LIGHTING EQUIPMENT

The flushing unit shall be equipped with extra lighting equipment, in addition to that hereinbefore specified under chassis requirements.

(1) One (1) extra tail light, to conform with the regular tail light and placed on opposite rear end of chassis.

(2) Three (3) 3 C.P. enclosed lights, with red lenses, shall be mounted at top rear end of tank and above "access" doors.

(3) Three (3) C.P. enclosed lights, with green lenses, shall be mounted at top front of cab and above windshield.

MOUNTING OF WATER PUMP AND POWER UNIT

The combined water pumping and power units shall be mounted at the rear of truck chassis and shall be enclosed within a "beaver-tail" design of housing. This housing shall streamline into the rear end and sides of the water tank so that the contour of the sides, top, and skirting shall be uniform and unbroken. Ventilating openings, protected by suitable screens shall be provided on either side of the housing. Access to the housing shall be furnished by means of a right and left hand hinged door, opening outward from the center and equipped with suitable locking device.

MISCELLANEOUS EQUIPMENT

The tank, pump, and all piping shall be arranged to drain out easily. Suitable pipe fittings, plugs, and valves shall be installed where necessary to accomplish this procedure. Check valves of the globe or angle type shall be provided where necessary in the piping system. A light shall be installed in water pumping enclosure.

FINISHING AND PAINTING

The complete flushing unit, i.e., chassis, cab, tank, skirting, fenders, and pumping unit enclosure shall be finished smooth with a minimum of joints and shall have a sufficient number of coats of metal priming to insure a durable paint and varnish finish.

The finish coats for the entire flushing unit shall be a high grade aluminum paint, protected by a clear lacquer, of the make and kind specified by the Superintendent of Transportation. He shall also specify the kind and color of trim required.

The interior of the tank shall be coated with a standard metal preservative, the material to be approved by the Superintendent of Highways.

LETTERING

Lettering will be done per your specifications.

PERFORMANCE

The bidder shall guarantee the performance of the flushing unit to be satisfactory in all respects for the work to be done. The specifications hereinbefore set forth represents the minimum size of power plant, frame, axles, springs, auxiliary power unit, centrifugal pump, etc. to perform the work of flushing streets, i.e., adequate power to propel the chassis and its payload, suitable gear ratios; and a satisfactory separate engine driven water pumping unit.

The bidder will be hold strictly repsonsible for the results obtained and no payments will be made by the Town of Cheektowaga until the requirements are fulfilled to the satisfaction of the Town Highway Superintendent. In the case of failure to meet the requirements, the bidder shall agree to make such changes as may be necessary without cost to the Town of Cheektowaga.

The essential requirements are (1) adequate power, (2) quietness of operation when flushing at normal highway speed of about 12/15 miles per hour, (3) satisfactory cooling of chassis power plant under continuous operation in the normal second (2nd) and third (3rd) gear, and (4) comfort of drivers and helpers under summer conditions. All of these factors will be considered in determining whether the equipment is satisfactory for the work to be done.
