It shall be untawful for any person, firm, or corporation to expose for sale or exchange or to give away or store upon any property located in a business district on vacant land or within a temporary enclosure any article of machinery, equipment, automobile. truck, or automobile accessory, either new or used; or junk; or used or second-material of any kind or description, new or second hand materials and articles of a similar aind or character, including lumber, building materials, sand, gravel, cinders, pièces of machinery or equipment or any type of waste materials and new or used personal property of any kind or description without first obtaining a permit to co so, duly issued by the Town Clerk, with the approval of the Town Board.

"2. For the purpose of this Section, land not setually occupied by buildings shall be regarded as vacant

 The conduct of any business on vacant land or within a temporary enclosure, as herein provided shall be subject to the provisions of this Section, if the property is now used for any business purposes, regardless of whether it was zoned residential or for business use, or was used for business purposes prior to the enactment of the Zoning Orimances of the Town of Cheekto-waga, New York; and a prosecution under this Section, shall not be regarded as any admission on the partition in the Town that the property is zoned for business purposes or located within a business district.

The expense of making the improvement described in Section 2 of this resolution shall borne by local assessment upon the several lots and parcels of land which the Town Board shall deterseveral mine and specify to be especially benefitted by such improvement. One of the principal reasons for doing this work is to relieve the flooding conditions in the beach Road-Maryvale Drive area. A review of the existing trunk sanitary sewer indicates that at an exceedingly small cost, a connection could be made from the beach Road sewer approximately opposite Huth Road to an existing 10"sewer at Huth Road, so that part of the flow in the Beach Road sewer, particularly the peaks from the Union Road pumping & station, could be diverted into the Huth Road sewer. This was originally designed for a connection to Beach Road on account of the extra size pipe, but, I believe, these connections were never made. The work would involve about 300' of 10" sewer with the necessary connections and, we believe, would cost in the neighborhood of \$3,500.

In connection with this analysis, we checked on the flows and pipe sizes in the Seaton Road existing sewer in the neighborhood of Woodridge Avenue where the sewers are overloaded at storm periods, resulting in a

backing up in Woodridge Avenue as far as Huth Road.

We believe that a relief can be taken from the man-hole at the end of Woodridge Avenue to connect into an existing 8" sewer in Seaton Road. This work would involve the construction of approximately 200! of 8" sewers and the building of a man-hole for overflows. We estimate the cost of this work at possibly \$2,500 to \$3,000.

These sewers could be constructed as a part of the relief project and arrangements made to finance their construction this Fall, which would have then in service by next Spring when most of the difficulty occurs.

If this suggestion meets with your approval and it is endorsed by both Mr. Kamm and ourselves, we would suggest that you authorize the preparation of these plans at once for an early bidding.

At this location we recommend the installation of two (2) 2500 lumens overhead system street lights on poles #379 R and #379R-1 Community Drive south of Maryvale Drive. In addition to this we recommend the relocation of an existing 4000 lumens overhead system street light from pole #397 to pole #391 Maryvale Drive and the installation of a 4000 lumens overhead system street light on pole #409. The existing 2500 lumens overhead system street light on the southeast corner of Maryvale Drive and Community Drive should be changed to a 4000 lumens to conform with the other street lights on Maryvale Dr.

The charges for the five (5) additional street lights described above will amount to \$14,0.00 per year.

We hereby submit the following information for your approval and direction.

It is our desire to move our present industries from our present location, 1450 Michigan Avenue, Buffalo, New York, to a site now owned by William Zacker. This site has a frontage on new Walden Avenue at the intersection of the new private road known as Good Road. For exact location, see attachment.

We understand that the property herein described is at present zoned for first industrial. It is the opinion of many concerned that our operations come under the classification of first industrial. However, there are no specific cases listed in your manual on zoning that cover our particular operation and we are afraid same may be a border line Case. To accomplish the above, we have to stock steel, cut same, heat treat it and form it. We use an oil heat treat furnace and a quench tank. The operation does require a small amount of hammering by a Blacksmith. Under the name of Buffalo Auto Spring Company we stock and install fifth wheels, dump bodies and hydraulic tail gates. Light welding is necesary at times. We also do front end alignment and brake work.

The second corporation is known as Brodie Industrial Trucks, Inc., of New York. Under this name, we are the distributors for Clark Equipment Company, manfacturers of industrial lift truck equipment. We also have the Coles Cranes and Whiting Trackmobile franchises. We exhibit this equipment in our show room and distribute them to industries in the western half of New York State.
