



Dear Sir:

At the present time this office is preparing plans for the reconstruction of a portion of Transit Road, State Highway 9217, from Broadway south approximately 1.10 miles.

Existing pavement will be widened to four lanes and between Zurbrick Road and Como Park Boulevard the finished surface will be approximately fifteen inches lower than at present. This lower grade and thicker pavement would probably uncover your existing 8-inch water main on the west side of Transit Road and the construction of sewers and cross culverts would cause serious interference, even with the water line lowered.

We are planning on widening our Right of Way to a minimum of eighty feet in the area where you will be affected, and it appears to be more satisfactory for all concerned if your water mains were to be relocated in this area outside our present 66-foot Right-of-Way.

It is requested that the Town of Cheektowaga prepare plans and estimates for the relocation of the 8-inch water line on the west side of Transit Road from Zurbrick Road to Como Park Boulevard, as shown on the attached drawings, and submit five copies to this office for review and approval.

Authorization and reimbursement for the above request is provided by Article II, Section 10, Subdivision 24 of the Highway Law.

Your cooperation will help to progress an early completion of this project.

Gentlemen:

In 1953, the Town of Cheektowaga requested the State Legislature to grant it authority to enact Sidewalk Ordinances so as to include all highways within the Township, including State and County highways. The Bill was vetoed.

As a substitute for the relief sought, the legislature amended the Town Law so as to permit the construction of sidewalks on State and County Highways, provided property owners petitioned the Town Board for sidewalks and agreed to pay the cost thereof. The right to adopt an Ordinance to compel property owners on State and County Highways to construct sidewalks without a petition, was not granted.

Many of the complaints received relative to the lack of sidewalks, involve property located on State and County Highways. On April 13, 1954, the attention of the Erie County Superintendent of Highways was called to the fact that the responsibility for the construction of sidewalks on County highways rested with his Department and that the Town was prohibited, by law, from passing an Ordinance requiring property owners to pay the cost of sidewalk construction on County Highways. The County Highway Superintendent failed to respond to the communication.

The Town Board contacted various Bank and Louing Agencies and requested them to include sidewalks in their specifications in new subdivisions. The Town Board received cooperation from several of the Banks and also had the cooperation of the Federal Housing Administration and the Veterans' Administration.

I quote from the letter received from the Eric County Savings Bank:

"The majority of our construction loans in
undeveloped areas are financed with Veterans Administration
or Federal Housing Administration compliance inspections
and part of the Minimum Property Requirements pertains to
continous public walks in front of newly constructed homes.
In the past, we have enforced this requirement, not only
in cases covered by government regulations, but also in
cases of direct bank loans where the builder was developing
several contiguous lots in a block.

We feel that it is a necessity and will continue to require same in all future building loans.\*

It can be safely said that sidewalks have been constructed in front of property located in the new subdivisions. Our problem is with the streets built up several years ago.

The Town Board has made every effort to get property owners to construct sidewalks and has sent out written communications to them. In one of the circulars sent out, it was pointed out that property owners can install sidewalks themselves cheaper than it can be done under a Bond Issue but if the property owners desired to have the sidewalks constructed under a Bond Issue, the necessary petition would be prepared by the Town Attorney, upon request.

The property owners were further advised that the Town Engineer would prepare the necessary specifications and also establish the grade. The communication further stated that either of the methods above mentioned was preferable to an Ordinance compelling property owners to build a sidewalk.

The efforts of the Town Board produced some results but there are many areas, particularly in school areas, which lack sidewalks. I doubt that a sufficient number of property owners will build their own sidewalks or ask to have them built on a Bond Issue, to justify any further delay in the adoption of a compulsary Sidewalk Ordiance requiring sidewalks to be built on Town Highways, particularly highways which have been developed by the construction of homes, to the extend of at least 60 %.

Section 200 a of the Town Law provides that if the Town Board adopts an Ordinance describing how sidewalks shall be built in the Town, the Town Board may adopt orders from time to time directing the owners of the respective lots and parcels of land in front of which it is desired that sidewalks be built to conform with the Ordinance. The Town can then order sidewalks to be constructed by

publishing a Notice at least twice in the official paper and that if within the time prescribed in the Order and Notice, the sidewalks required to be built shall not have been so built, then the Town Board may cause the same to done and audit and pay the expense and then assess the expense against the property benefitted.

I recommend that the proposed Ordinance be adopted and that the Assessors furnish the Town Board with a list of the Town Highways which are 60% or more built up with homes and buildings and that after that is done, the Town

Boarddesignate, by Order, the streets requiring sidewalks.

While the Town Law only requires a Notice to be published, I think each property owner should be notified by mail, addressed to his last known place of residence. If this done, no property owner will be in a position to compalin that he did not have knowledge of the enactment of the Ordinance.

The Town Board can no longer expose children going to and from school to the danger of being injured due to the lack of sidewalks . and I believe the Town Board should take action immediately.

PROPOSED SIDEWALK ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK ( NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING )

Sidewalk Ordinance Pursuant to authority conferred by Article 9 of the Town Law, the Town Board does hereby enact the following Ordinance respecting sidewalks in the Town of Cheektowaga, outside of the corporate limits of the Villages of Sloan and Depew

SECTION 1. The sidewalks in the Town of Cheektowaga outside of the corporate limits of the Villages of Sloan and Depew, shall be a one (1) course sidewalk and shall hereafter be constructed as follows:

Materials
1. CEMENT—Shall meet the requirements of the Standard Specifications of the American Society for Testing Materials. (Serial Designa-tion C9-26).

2. FINE AGGREGATE—Shall con-

sist of natural sand or screenings from hard, tough, crushed rock, gra-vel or slag. Must be clean and well

All fine aggregate shall pass a ¼

inch screen and 95 percent shall be retained on a 100-mesh screen.

3. COARSE AGGREGATE — May be pebbles, broken stone or blast furnace slag. Must be clean, hard, durable and uncoated. All coarse aggregate shall pass a 1-inch screen and 95 percent shall be retained on

4. PROPORTIONS OF MIX-Proportions are to consist of 1 part Portland Cement, 2 parts sand or stone screenings, 3 parts crushed come or pebbles and 6% gallons of the (maximum) per sack of ce-thent. This mix is a 1:2:3 mix and is to be determined by volume. That is 1 cubic foot of cement (1 bag), 2 cubic feet of sand and 3 cubic feet

5. GRAVEL ALITERNATE—In case it is decided to use local combined aggregate for this work, an analysis shall be made so that the material supplied shall conform to 2 and 3.

6. WATER—To be used shall be clean enough to drink.

7. FORMS—Whall be of lumber 2 finches thick of steel forms of expal strength. Flexible stells may be usual on curves. They child-be rigidly field to line and grade by stakes or braces.

8. DIVISION PLATES—Shall be of 1/4-inch steel as wide as the depth of the slab and as long as the width of the walk.

Methods

1. SUB-BASE: The sub-base shall be thoroughly rammed, and all soft spots removed and replaced by some hard material.

When fill exceeding one foot in thickness is required, it shall be thoroughly compacted by flooding and tamping in layers not exceeding six (6) inches.

The top of all fills shall extend at least twelve (12) inches beyond the sidewalk.

A sub-base of cinders or gravel must be placed and compacted to a minimum depth of four (4) inches, if the Town Engineer deems it ne-

2. THICKNESS — The walk shall not be less than four (4) inches thick. Across driveways it shall be increased to six (6) inches thick.

3. CONCRETE — Shall be mixed until each particle of fine aggregate is coated with cement and each par-ticle of coarse aggregate is coated with mortar, and not less than one

minute. 4. PLACING AND FINISHING Concrete shall be placed immediately after mixing. It shall be tamped and struck off with a template and shall be floated with a wood float until the surface has a true contour. Care shall be taken to not bring to the surface an excess of water and fine sand by overfinishing.

5. JONVING-The walk shall be cut into separate rectangular slabs not greater than 6 feet on any one side. The surface edges of each slab shall be rounded to a ¼-inch radius. Markings shall be exactly at cuts between slabs

6. FINISH—Finish shall be brush

finish. 7. PROTECTION—When completed the sidewalk shall be kept moist and protected from traffic and the elements for at least three (3) days. The forms shall be removed with great care, and upon their removal, earth shall be banked against the edges of the walk.

The walk must have a pitch of one-quarter (%) inch per foot. The minimum width of any walk

shall be four (4) feet.
8. TEMPERATURE — No concrete is to be laid when the temperature is lower than 45° Fahrenheit.

2. MILLAVING — Where trees are growing and are likely to cause damage to a proposed sidewalk from upheaval, sidewalks shall be reinforced with steel, if the Town Engi-

neer deems it necessary.
SECTION 2. No person shall construct, reconstruct, repair or grade a sidewalk or any street, avenue or alley, until he shall have obtained a written permit to do so from the Town Clerk, which permit shall de-termine and specify the slope, grade, width, and location of the walk.

SECTION 3. Every owner, or occupant of any premises shall keep the sidewalk of such premises free and clear from snow, ice, dirt and other obstructions.

SECTION 4. A violation of this SECTION 4. A violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment not to exceed three months, or both. SECTION 5. The declaration of any portion of this Article by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, shall not invalidate the entire Article.

shall not invalidate the entire Article but only that part thereof so declared to be invalid, and the remainder of said Article shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after publication hereof in the official paper of the town and the posting conspicuously in at least three (3) public places in the Town lic places in the Town, of a copy thereof.

METHODS

1. SUB-BASE—The sub-base

When a fill exceeding one foot in thickness is required, it shall be thoroughly compacted by flooding and tamping in layers not exceeding six (6) inches.

The top of all fills shall extend at least twelve (12) inches beyond the sidewalk.

A sub-base of cinders or gravel must be placed and compacted to a minimum depth of four (4) inches, if the Town Engineer deems it necessary.

2. THICKNESS—The wark shall not be less than four (4) inches thick. Across driveways it shall be increased to six (6) inches thick.

3. CONCRETE—Shall be mixed until each particle of fine aggregate is coated with cement and each particle of course aggregate is coated with mortar, and not less than one minute.

4. PLACING AND. FINISHING—Concrete shall be placed immediately after mixing. It shall be tamped and struck off with a beautiful and shall be floated with a wood float until the surface has a true contour. Care shall be taken to not bring to the surface an excess of water and fine sand by overfinishing.

5. JOINTING—The walk shall be cut into separate rectangular slabs not greater than 6 feet on any one side. The surface edges of each slab shall be rounded to a 14-inch radius. Markings shall be exactly at cuts between slabs.

6. FINISH—Finish shall be brush finish.

7. PROTECTION—When completed the sidewalk shall be kept moist and protected from traffic and the elements for at least three (3) days. The forms shall be removed with great care, and upon their removal, earth shall be banked against the edges of the walk. The walk must have a pitch of

one-quarter (%) inch per foot.

The minimum width of any walk shall be four (4) feet.

8. TEMPERATURE—No concrete is to be laid when the temperature is lower than 45°Faren-

heit.

9. HEAVING—Where trees are growing and are likely to cause damage to a proposed sidewalk from upheavel, sidewalks shall be reinforced with steel, if the Town


