RESOLVED, that the decision of the Zoning Board of Appeals granting the application of the petitioner to rezone premises from Residential District to First Industrial District be and the same is hereby confirmed and approved, be it

RESOLVED, by this Town Board that the Ordinance adopted December 21, 1942, and as now amended entitled "Zoning Ordinance", be and the same hereby is amended by changing the Zoning Map so as to change the following described property from that of Residential District to First Industrial District.

#### DESCRIPTION

ALL THAT CERTAIN PIECE OR PARCEL OF LAND situate in

the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Lot No. 7, Township 11, Range 7 of the Holland Land Company's Survey embracing that portion of land deeded by John Haskell and Mary, his wife, to John Batt by deed dated November 1, 1854 and recorded in the Erie County Clerk's Office in Liber 162 of Deeds at page 333 on May 17, 1855 which is situate and lying north of the strip of land 100 feet in width comprising the right of way for what is now known as the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, which parcel is more particularly described in a deed from Mary Wahl, Joseph Pfohl, unmarried, Andrew Pfohl, unmarried, and Lena Pfohl to the Depew and Tonawanda Rail Road Company dated April 10, 1896 and recorded in the Erie County Clerk's Office in Liber 814 of Deeds at page 293 on April 15, 1896; and situate south of the strip of land 70 feet in width comprising the right of way for the County of Erie highway now known as Aero Drive, which parcel is more particularly described in a deed from Florence A. Smith, to County of Erie dated August 20, 1941, recorded in the Erie County Clerk's Office in Liber 3145 of Deeds at page 28 on August 22, 1941; and situate east of the west

line of the said Lot 7 (the northernmost 65.50 feet of which said lot line as it extends south from the southerly line of said Erie County Highway serves as a boundary line between the Town of Cheektowaga on the east and the Town of Amherst on the west); and said piece or parcel being situate west of the center of an old lane two rods wide leading southerly through said Lot 7 and which old lane was reserved to John Haskell and Mary, his wife, and John Batt, their heirs and assigns.

Said piece or parcel of land being further described in a survey prepared by Elmer C. Messer dated April 24, 1941, and marked "Job No. 352-A" as being bounded: on the south by the north line of "Lehigh Valley" 880.45 feet; on the north by the south line of "New Highway" N58° 0' W 789.44 feet; on the west by the west line of Lot 7, Township 11, Range 7; and on the east by center of old lane 2 rods wide 521.07 feet from said north line of "Lehigh Valley" to an iron pipe in the center of Ellicott Creek Road.

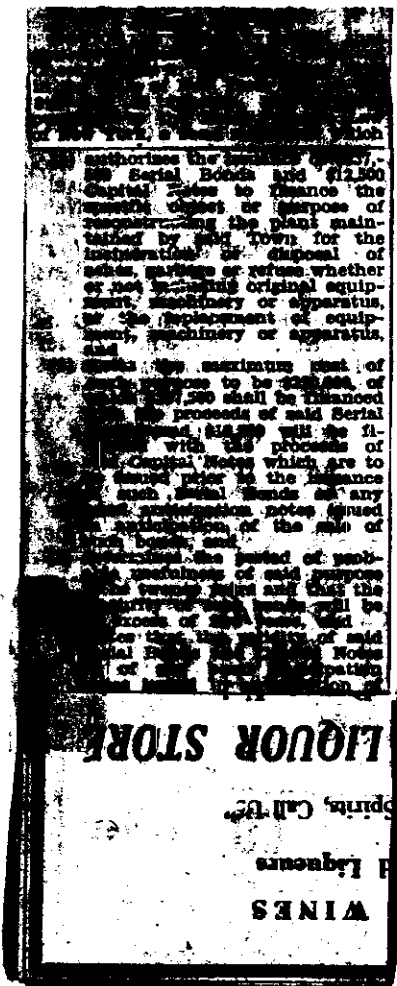

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the party of the first part is the owner of certain real property located on the south side of McNaughton Avenue and the east side of Harlem Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, being 170 feet frontage 170 feet frontage on McNaughton Avenue and 107 feet frontage on Harlem Road, and being Sub-lots 19, 20, 21, 77 and 78, as shown on map North Harlem Land Company filed in the Erie County Clerks' Office under Cover 400, and

WHEREAS, there exists on the rear of Sub-Lots 77, 78 and diagonally to the northwest across Sub-Lots 19, 20 and 21 an open surface water drainage ditch leading to the southeast corner of McNaughton Avenue and Harlem Road, and

 WHEREAS it is hereby given that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie and State of New York, will meet at the Town Hall, corner of Beachway and Union Road, in said Town, on the 14th day of January, 1936, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m., Eastern Standard Time, and hold a public hearing for the purpose of considering a map and plan describing additional facilities for the sanitary sewer system maintained by Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga, and an estimate of the cost thereof, and that the Town Board will, at said time and place, hear all persons interested in the subject of such hearing and will receive all evidence offered which will enable the Town Board to determine, pursuant to the provisions of the Town Law of New York, whether it is in the public interest to make the improvements described in said map and plan, and estimate, either in whole or in part, and whether the property located within the boundaries of said District will be benefited by the construction of such additional facilities.

The additional facilities hereinbefore referred to are described in a map and plan dated December 10, 1934, prepared at the request of the Town Board by Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, Consulting Engineers, now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, and consist of a sanitary trunk relief sewer beginning at a manhole in existing 24-inch diameter sanitary trunk sewer located on west side of Beach Road, said manhole being at the southwest corner of Beach Road and Maryvale Drive. From said manhole a 24-inch diameter sanitary trunk sewer is to be constructed running about 70 feet northeasterly to a manhole to be constructed in an existing 18-inch diameter sanitary trunk sewer in east side of Beach Road, said manhole to be located at the northeast corner of Beach Road and Maryvale Drive; from said manhole there is to be constructed an 18-inch diameter trunk sanitary sewer to run northerly along the easterly side of Beach Road a distance of about 2,200 feet ending at a manhole; from the last mentioned manhole there is to be constructed a 15-inch diameter trunk sanitary sewer to run northerly along the easterly side of Beach Road about 1,335 feet to a manhole; from the last mentioned manhole there is to be constructed a 12-inch trunk sanitary sewer to run northerly along the easterly side of Beach Road a distance of about 1,015 feet to a manhole to be located on the south side of Cleveland Drive; thence from said manhole there is to be constructed a 12-inch diameter trunk sanitary sewer running in a northeasterly direction across Cleveland Drive a distance of about 70 feet, terminating in an existing manhole in an existing sanitary trunk sewer on the north side of Cleveland Drive.
