BE IT RESOLVED, by the T own Board of the T own of Cheektowaga, in the C ounty of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. The Town of Cheektowaga, in the 'ounty of Erie, shall issue its Serial Bonds of the aggregate principal amount of \$237,500. and its Capital Notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$12,500, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York, in order to finance the specific purpose hereinafter described.

В 7 Е Item No. 8 Contd' Section 2. The specific purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"), to be financed by the issuance of such Serial Bonds, is the reconstruction of the plant maintained by said own for the incineration or disposal of ashes, garbage or refuse, whether or not including orginal equipment, machinery or apparatus, or the replacement of equipment, mach-

inery or apparatus.

Section 3. It is hereby stated that (a) the maximum cost of said purpose, as estimated by the Town Board, is \$250,000 and (b) no money has heretofore been authorized to be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, and (c) current funds in the amount of \$12,500 will be provided for the financing of suchpurpose prior to the issuance of said Serial Bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and (d) the Town Board plans to finance the cost of said purpose entirely from funds raised by the ussuance of said Serial Bonds and Capital Notes.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in Subdivision 6 of Paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said

purpose is twenty years.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the purposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five years.

Section 6. This resolution shall be published in full by the Town Clerk of said Town, together with a notice insubstantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of said Local Finance Law, and such publication shall be in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga New and in the Cheektowaga Sun, which are newspapers published and having a general circulation in said Town. The validity of said Serial onds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said Serial Bonds may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expendmoney, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or if said obligations are authorized in violation of the previsions of the onstitution of New York.

Section 7. This resolution is subject to a permissive
