

Item No. 7 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TOWN HISTORIAN FOR THE YEAR 1956

To the Honorable Town Board:

The Month of January is the time required by law for the annual report of the Town Historian. The year 1956, as far as Cheektowaga 's Town Historian is concerned, was very productive up until October, when illness prevented me from doing a great deal.

All during the past year I have been collecting material pertinent to the Town's History. The possession of a tape recorder, which was made possible by your generous budget, has aided me in this collection a great deal. Material of all sorts is filed against the time when I feel that I have enough source material to start writing an authoritative history of the town.

During the year, I have made an effort to acquire as many pictures as possible of the past years of the Town and its citizens. Where I have not been able to acquire the actual picture, I have had reproductions made of the orginals so that the Office of the Town Historian will have copies for future use.

In February 1956, at the annual meeting of the Association of Towns in Buffalo, 3 large panels of maps were exhibited showing the growth of the towns in New York State. These panels were prepared from enlargements of maps which are reproduced in the Historical Atlas of Cheektowaga.

Item No. 7 Contd ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TOWN HISTORIAN FOR THE YEAR 1956
The reception of this exhibit was so favorable, that
Mr. Uthe, the Association's Executive Secretary, has asked me to place
a similar one on exhibit during the forthcoming Association of owns
meeting in February 1957. Maps which I have acquired during the past
year will make this exhibit more complete, and I hope a credit to the
Town of Cheektowaga.

At the Congress for Local Historical Societies, held in July at the University of Buffalo, part of this exhibit was again displayed at the request of Dr. John Horton, head of the History Dept. and Dr. Wilbur Glover, Eric County Historian.

The Dept. of History (Dept. 26) of the Erie County Fair used many maps from the Atlas as the basis of the theme of the exhibit ransportation in Erie County 100 years ago. Pictures from the Town's collection were exhibited with those loaned by other Town Historians of Erie County.

In December 1956, I appeared as Town Historian, as a witness before the Public Service Commission, at a hearing held in Buffalo. During the year I have been able to be of assistance to Mr. Bossert and Mr. Spencer of the Erie County Planning Board, as well as to Mr. Tryon and the Town Engineering department in connection with research problems they have had.

My public appearances have been limited due to my health. However I gave six talks before groups within the Township, seven in Erie County and three outside the County in connection with historical Work. Students from the University of Buffalo, Buffalo State Teachers College and Canaius College, as well as from public schools both in Cheektowaga and outside have secured information and aid from me during the year. I am having increasing numbers of communciation from all over the United States requesting genealogical and historical information. Some of this I was able to give immediately while some required a good deal of research.

In 1957, I hope to be able to continue research of phases of the Town's History, as well as to expand the collection of maps and statistical material upon which I have worked for some time. My services to Town Officals, Townspeople and others, will only be limited by my health and the time I have available to devote to a job which I thoroughly enjoy and consider a "labor of Love".

At the request of the Chairman the bids were referred to the Town Attorney for analysis and tabulation.

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Item No. 22 Dr. Victor Reinstein was granted the floor and speke as follows in regard to the proposed Sewer District No. 7.

RE: SEWER DISTRICT # 7

The Cheektowaga Town Board and developers committed themselves to try to get sewers into the Walden-George Urban area by July 1957.

At a conference in the Supervisors Office, last September, with officials of Ross Heater Divison of American Radiator, the Town promised to give them sewers on Walden near Dick Road, by July 1957, in return for which, the industry promised to build two plants this year. If temporary sewerage disposal had to be installed, their construction would be greatly curtailed. Since then, July 1957, has been used as a target date for the installation of the sewers.

Last summer and fall in various conferences, attempts were made to solve all problems of disagreement that could delay the installation of the district. It started with a conference in Albany, on July 19, 1956, in the State omptrollers Office with Mr. Kelley and Mr. Hughes of the comptrollers staff. Supervisor Holtz, Attorney Delahunt, and Highway Supt. Zablotny represented the Town. I was also there as an interested property owner. The only formula discussed in that Albany meeting was 75% on assessed valuation and 25% on area.

Several days after the return from Albany, a newspaper release given by Supervisor Holtz disclosed the new method of assessment (75% assessed valuation; 25% area) proposed for new sewer districts.

Later in the fall prior to the drawing of the District petitions, an informal meeting was called by Town Attorney George Doyle, sonsisting of members of the Town Board and the larger property owners, to reach an greenent as to the proposed method of assessment. Shortly after the start of the meeting, Supervisor Holtz excused himself, saying as he left that anything the Town Attorney and the Councilmen agreed upon was all right with him. At this meeting there was considerable discussion on the percentage of cost to be based on assessment and area. It varied from 60% on assessed valuation and 40% on area to the method proposed in West Seneca, which is 90% on assessed value. The final compromise which the Town Board and everyone present agreed to was 70% on Assessed Valuation and 30% on area. The reason for this agreement at that time was so that those people taking the petitions around could explain how the costs were to be assessed.

As the result of several meetings between large property owners and the Town's Engineers (including the Town's Consulting Engineers), the district boundaries were agreed upon. The extention out Genesee Street to include Cornell Lab was at the suggestion of the Town's Engineers inorder to relieve the overloading of Sewer District #6's trunk sewer, which carries sewerage from Westinghouse (District #6) to Sewer District #5, which contracts to treat it.

About Holiday time, Officals of Cornell Lab. were given a copy of the petition for investigation and signatures. Action on this petition by Cornell Lab. was repeatedly deferred until the persons circulating the petitions reported to the Town Board at the January 21, 1957 evening meeting that they were unable to get any definite decision from Cornell Lab. Officals. Supervisor Holtz stated at the meeting that he would advise Cornell Lab. to sign the petitions.

Item No. 22 Contd' SEWER DISTRICT # 7 On January 24th., Supervisor Holtz informed the Councilmen at a meeting called for the purpose of meeting with Depew Officals, that he had been advised by Cornell Lab. that they were going to sign the petition to be part of sewer District # 7.

On inquiry about February 1, as to whether Cornell Lab. had signed, I was informed by those in charge of the petitions that Cornell Lab. had not signed, and wanted to know what their cost would be. At present they are paying a nomial rental of \$2000.00 per year for disposal of sewerage from their multimillion dollar establishment. They use a connection that was put across Genesee Street into District #. 6 at the time that Curtiss Wright operated both the present Westinghouse and the orginal Cornell Lab. Plant. No record of any agreement permitting this connection across Genesee St. can be found either by the Town or Cornell Lab. Officals. At that time Curtiss Wright had all of District # 6 which is entirely north of Genesee, and the wind tunnel (the nucleus of present Corenll Lab.) on the south side of Genesee.

When Cornell Lab. later acquired the property south of Genesee St., it was undoubtedly done in good faith, not knowing that the sewer connection was not based on any previous agreement. The Town later charged Cornell Lab. a nominal amount for sewer service they received, knowing that through Dist. # 6 was the only method by which Cornell Lab. could be serviced at the time, since the area south of Genesee Street was not ripe for the establishment of a new sewer district. Recently when Cornell Lab. built a large addition, no new agreement was made with the Town for sewer service to that addition. Thus if ornell was innocent of the illegitimate nature of the orginal sewer connection, they were not innocent of tying in sewer connections to their new addition without an agreement with the Town for service.

I was wrong in predicting that Cornell Lab. would be glad to sign the petition for the new District # 7 in order to have their property in a permanent district where they had a legal right to the service they received instead of going along as at the present, at the discretion of the Town Board without any agreement for the furnishing of service.

Before signing the petition, Cornell Lab. wants to know how much it will cost them. Anyone who can accurately estimate taxes years in advance is a soothsayer. If anyone in the United States should be able to solve questions relating to the unkown, it should be Cornell Lab. That is their business. They have 1200 experts working on solving the unkown.

Getting back to the question as to what their cost will

be, it will be the result of five unkown factors.

First: What eill the cost of the district be? That depends upon the contractors bids. engineers' estimates were based on prices prior to July 1956. Everyone knows that prices shift from year to year, even from month to month.

Second: What will the interest rate be? Last summer and fall, interest rates on Class A municipalities were going up until they reached a peak of 3.28% in December. Since then they have been dropping and were down of 3.14% last week (January 28).

Third: What will the cost of maintenance be? Everyone knows that such costs depend on labor costs and general market conditions.

Fourth: What will be the charge by Sewer District # 5 for treatment of the new District Sewerage?

7 would like to know. The cost depends on a number of unkown factors, one of which is, what District # 5's costs of treatment are; how much of the capital cost of the treatment plant should be included? We are all going on the assumption that whatever the cost by District # 5 will be, it will still be less than it would cost to

build a new treatment plant for District # 7.

Fifth: Last but not least, what will be the assessed valuation of the proposed District # 7 when the assessors books are closed on June 30, 1957?

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Item No. 22 Contd SEWER DISTRICT #7

Everyone knows that the Walden Ave. area is the fastest growing one on the Niagara Frontier. There are millions of dollars of industrial and commercial projects either under way, or in the planning stage. The 1956 figure of \$1,600,000 is no fair estimate of the value at the end of this year.

Every year the valuation of the district will increase. Even Cornell Lab. 's valuation will shift. They have just finished a large expansion, and are reportedly contemplating another addition. What Cornell Lab.'s assessment will be is the jurisdiction of the Cheektowaga Board of Assessors, as is every one elses.

With a estimate of cost based on five unkown quantities,

how can anyone vouch for the accuracy of the resulting figure?

Every taxpaper in the district will be affected up or down just as well as Cornell Lab. The others have faith in the growth of the district and in the fairness of the method of assessment. Nobody denies that the district is ripe for development.

Even after petitions are signed by sufficient numbers of property owners and the creation of the district is approved by the Cheektowaga Town Board, the whole must still be approved by the experts of the New York State Comptroller's Office before the district can be legally established. The Comptroller's organization have the legal responsibility of approving the creation of new sewer districts throughout the entire State, and probably know more about these districts than any other organization in the State. Numerous conferences with the with the omptroller's Office have disclosed that two of the main factors that they are interested in, are (1) that the district is economically and financially feasible; (2) that the formula for spreading costs will not be confiscatory on any group of taxpayers in the proposed district.

The State is very much interested in maintaining the fine financial rating that exists in all the Towns of the State. Officals do not want a repetition of the bankruptcy of some 65,000 parcels of variant land that occurred mostly in Cheektowaga, Tonawanda and Amherst during the 1920's, where the area method of spreading sewer taxes was used.

For the Town to hire at this late date, experts to study what the effect of the 70-30 method of assessment will be on Cornell Lab. will simply duplicate studies that will be made by the State Comptroller's Office. Such a Town study would cause unnecessary delay in setting up the district, beside unnessary expense; for the cost of the comptroller's study is part of State expense. Then too, after the studies would be made, there is no indication whether Cornell Lab. will sign the petition to be included in the sewer district under consideration.

If Cornell Lab. comes into Sewer District # 7, where its property is actually located, and cuts off its connection to District # 6, the amount of sewerage passing through the overloaded trunks of District # 5 will be correspondingly reduced. It is no secret that h the flooding of cellars during storms, in District # 5, is due to overloaded trunk sewers. If the Town Board could induce Cornell Lab. to include its property in District # 7, where it rightfully belongs, the people of the U-Crest sections whose cellars getflooded, would be very grateful, for they would know that an attempt was being made to reduce the flow through the overloaded trunks of District # 5. Some day the victims of these overloaded trunks may realize that their plight could be partially reduced if the area south of Genesee St. were disconnected from the renting District # 6, of which they are actually no part. The voters could demand that the Town discontinue services to the area south of Genesee through District # 6, espically since property owners (Cornell Lab. and Spenser Kellogg) refused to sign the orginal petitions for the creation of Sewer District # 7; such refusal causing a reduction in the size of the new district. The only possible reason for refusing to sign is the difference in cost between the present nominal charge and the equitable charge which will be made in District # 7.

Because of Cornell Lab.'s large valuation they cannot be overridden by the balance of the property owners in the district. The district will have to be reduced both in area and costs of construction to correspond to the area's valuation and ability to pay within the smaller district.

To maintain the present economic and financial feasibility the cost of the curtailed District # 7 will have to be reduced by reducing the size of the trunk sewers to what is actually needed inside the new reduced-in-size district, without any extra capacity to take care of future enlargements. Then should Cornell Lab. later desire to come into the smaller District # 7, either voluntarily or as the result of District #6 being un-able to accept their sewerage, the plant Officals will find that the curtailed District # 7 will also be unable to accept their sewerage as the size of the trunks had had to be reduced in order to correspond to the reduced valuation at the time of the District's creation.

It can also be argued that by permitting Cornell Lab. to connect their new additions to the already overloaded trunk of District # 6 except on a temporary basis, they were given preferential treatment. Loblaws', two years ago, were given an agreement to connect into Sewer District # 5 temporarily, only until their property could be included in a new sewer district. The owners of property in the area around the West Shore and Dick Road, last year were refused to be allowed to join District # 5 on any condition, on the grounds that the district was already overloaded.

To permit Cornell Lab. to continue to sewer their newer out-of-the-district building into the already overloaded trunks, while at the same time refusal of the same priviledge is denied to other property owners, may cause one to come to the conclusion that Cornell Lab. is

receiving preferential treatment.

Many of the arguments which apply to Cornell Lab. also apply to Spencer Kellogg's Reasearch Center, for they also did not sign the petitions when asked: However in their case they have a five year agreement with the Town of Cheektowaga to use the sewer trunk of District # 6. Their present small valuation cannot effect the outcome of the proposed Sewer District # 7, as in the case of Cornell Aeronautical Laboratory.

Summary and Conclusion:
(1) The inclusion of the Cornell Lab. and Spenser Kellogg areas on the south side of Genesee St. are no vital to the creation of the new sewer district # 7, which is to take care of the Walden and George Urban Blvd. areas.

(2) Cornell Lab.'s request as to what the sewer tax will be is a question that cannot be accurately answered, as it is based upon the answers to five unknown factors, variation of any one would cause a different result.

able assessment. This is guaranteed by the State Comptroller checking all features of the proposed district before approving its creation.

(4) The inclusion of Cornell Lab. in the new district was for the purpose of relieving already overloaded trunks in sewer districts # 6 and # 5, and was one step in a program to relieve the flooded cellar conditions in District # 5.

(5) The inclusion of Cornell Lab. in the proposed # 7 would guarantee that they would receive future service, both for their present installations, and any future additions. Their present service

is not based on any agreement with the Town of Cheektowaga.

(6) Because of a target date of July 1957, there can be no further delay in proceeding with the creation of the proposed district. Cornell Lab. has had the petition for a month, which is more than a reasonable time to make a final decision.

(7) Without any desire by Spencer Kellogg or Cornell Lab. to be included in the proposed district, there is no necessity to include any area on the south side of Genesee St. beyond that owned by Loblaw, Inc.

(8) With a loss of Cornell Lab.'s valuation, the new reduced valuation is not sufficiently large to justify the installation of oversized trunk sewers to take care of all possible future extentions. The maintaining of an economically sound financial basis is

a necessary concern of those planning expansion in the proposed district.

(9) There can be a further saving in costs in the reduced-in-size district, by reducing the depths of construction to levels which will only take care of the property within the district, instead of deep enough construction to take care of any further future extentions.
