Mr. Neibert was well known in the Niagara Frontier for his kindness and colorful person-

With his father, Joseph Neibert Sr., he operated the famous night club known as the Milling House at 2400 Genesee St., Great towaga, at the city line, from 1917 until July 1937. Top entertainers, sportsmen and political figures gathered at his club throughout the years. He had a close friendship with Gene Tunney, Jack Dempsey, Jimmy Slattery, Barney Ross, Jimmy Goodrich, Babe Ruth and other sports greats.

Helped Raise Funds

He attended most of the championship fights and World Series baseball games with his wife, the former Florence A. O'Brien. He home at 2332 Genesee St. He lime with autographed pictures of sports figures, entertimers and political leaders.

described him as one of the

best-natured, kind and helpful

figures of his era.

During depression days, a radip broadcast from his nightclub raised as much as \$7000 for Caristmas baskets for the poor which were distributed by the Jackson Club, a Democratic organization of which he was a member.

Active in Democratic politics of many years, Mr. Melliert was serving his 13th year as a Check-tology councilmen at the time of Mr. Seath.

When first elected, he was presented an over-sight oak desk chair by the Chesktowaga Millionaires Club, of which he was a member.

MEMORANDUM SETTING FORTH CONDENSED EXPLANATION RELATING TO THE RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF CHERKTOWAGA FIXING FORMULA FOR SPREADING COSTS WITHIN SEWER DISTRICT NO. 7

FORMULA

The annual costs of Sewer District No. ? shall be levied against the individual parcels of property therein as follows:

1. TRUNK LATERAL CHARGE

Various parcels of property having frontage on the trunk sewer lines will not be forced to install lateral sewer lines. Accordingly, these properties which are able to tap directly into the trunk sewer should, in order to keep all property equal, pay for the privilege of tapping directly into a trunk sewer. The charges to these properties shall be determined as follows:

(a) Of the existing bond issue of \$800,000.00, the principal and interest due each year on \$100,000.00 of such bond issue shall be allocated

ratably to the taxable frontage.

The preliminary determination of taxable frontage is as follows:

 - (d) A list of all parcels of property specifically exempted from (a), (b) or (c) above and an indication as to which items the exemption applies and also whether such exemption applies to rental and maintenance only or to both rental and maintenance and debt service.

Future exemptions from (a), (b) or (c) above shall be approved by the Town Board before elimination from the list of taxable property.

All persons, firms, corporations or associations be and the same hereby are prohibited within the area of the Town of Cheektowaga, exclusive of the Villages of Depew and Sloan, from using and discharging any fire arms, unless the same be by permission granted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York.

SECTION 2. Any person violating the terms of this ordinance and found guilty thereof by a Court of competent jurisdiction shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment not to exceed three (3) months or both such fine and imprisonment.





ACREEMENT

This agreement made this 3rd day of November, 1958, by and between Michael and Inconarata Barone, parties of the first part, and Nunzio N. Gentile, party of the second part.

The Corporation agrees that it will throughout the term of this Contract, furnish adequate, suitable and prompt fire protection to said Fire Protection District, and in connection therewith, it further agrees that it and its members will promptly respond to and attend any and all fires occurring in said District, and to the best of its and their ability will extinguish such fires and prevent loss of life and injury to person or property therefrom.
- 3. The Town of Cheektowaga agrees that it will pay for such services for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1959, and ending the 31st day of December, 1963, to the said Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., such amount of money as may be raised by an assessment at the rate of \$1.80 per thousand dollar assessed valuation, levied against the property situated within the limits of the Fire Protection District, and the payment of said moneys to be made to the Corporation between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of April each year.


