

WHEREAS, Cayuga Courts, Inc., a domestic corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York with its principal office located at 173 Cadman Drive in the Town of Amherst, County of Erie and State of New York, intends to construct homes on Wellington Road from the westerly line of Subdivision Lots Nos. 7 and 8, as shown ona map filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office under Cover No. 2069 on Ellsworth Drive and Lloyd Drive from its intersection with the southerly line of Joseph Street to the right-of-way of the New York State Electric and Gas Co., Inc., the total distance on said streets being approximately 740 feet, and intends to construct the foundation for the highways on said streets, in accordance with specifications of the Town Highway Department and Town Regulations, but have not placed the topping thereon because heavy trucks will be operating on said streets in connection with the construction of homes and it is the desire of the Town Highway that the topping not be placed on said streets until the weather permits and the construction of homes on said streets has been completed, and

WHEREAS, it has been estimated by the Town Highway Superintendent that the cost of placing topping on said streets would not exceed the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and

WHEREAS, Cayuga Courts, Inc. has agreed to place the topping on said highways and complete the same in accordance with specifications of the Town Highway Department and Town Regulations, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga enter into a contract with Cayuga Courts, Inc., which contract is to provide that the said Cayuga Courts, Inc. will place the topping on said streets and complete the highway in all respects in accordance with the specifications of the Town Highway Department and regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, on or before November 1, 1960.

That the annexed contract is hereby approved and the Supervisor is authorized to execute the same for the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, and be it further

RESOLVED that the said Cayuga Courts, Inc. execute and deliver to the Town of Cheektowaga, a surety bond in the amount of Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) as security for the faithful performance of the aforesaid contract; and be it further

RESOLVED that said contract contain a provision that in the event the said sum of Ten thousand Dollars (\$10,000) be insufficient to pay the cost of the completion of said highways, then the said Cayuga Courts, Inc. agrees to pay any sum required in excess of that amount.

ACREEMENT

This Agreement, made the 5th day of October, 1959, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, located in the County of Erie, party of the first part, and CAYUGA COURTS, INC., a domestic corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with its principal office located at 173 Cadman Drive in the Town of Amherst, Erie County, New York, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the party of the second part intends to construct homes on Wellington Road southerly from the southerly line of Subdivision Lots Nos. 7 and 8, as snown on a map filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office under Cover No. 2069 to a distance of 159.38 feet to the New York State Electric and Gas Co., Inc. right-of-way and on Ellsworth Drive from its intersection with the southerly line of Joseph Street southerly a distance of 289.63 feet to the right-of-way of the New York State Electric and Gas Co., Inc. and on Lloyd Drive from its intersection with the southerly line of Joseph Street southerly 291.15 feet to the right-of-way to the said New York State Electric and Gas Co., Inc. and intends to construct the foundation for the highways on said streets in accordance with the specifications of the Town Highway Department and the regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, and

WHEREAS, the party of the first part has requested the party of the second part not to place topping on said streets until all construction on said streets is completed and weather conditions permit such work,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and other good and valuable considerations, it is hereby mutually agreed,

That the party of the second part hereby agrees to place topping on Wellington Road southerly from its intersection with the southerly line of Subdivision Lots Nos. 7 and 8, as shown on said map under Cover No. 2069 to the right-of-way of the New York State Electric and Gas Co., Inc. on Ellsworth Drive and Lloyd Drive, commencing at the southerly line of Joseph Street and extending southerly to the right-of-way of the said New York State Electric and Gas Co., Inc. and where necessary reconstruct the foundation of said highway and complete the entire highway so that the same shall conform in every respect with requirements of the Town Highway Department and regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga on or before November 1, 1960, and

That the party of the first part, upon the filing with the Town Board of an executed copy of this agreement and a Surety Company Bond in the sum of Ten thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), does hereby accept said highways as Town highways, subject to the jurisdiction of the Town Highway Superintendent.

with the party of the first part a surety bond in the sum of Ten thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, said bond to provide that the party of the second part will in all respects comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement and the accompanying resolution of the Town Board on or before November 1, 1960, and in the event the party of the second part fails to live up to the terms of this agreement, then the party of the first part is authorized to complete said highway so that in every respect the same will comply with the minimum requirements of the Town Highway Department and the regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, and all expenses incurred by it in completing said highways, and in the event the said sum of Ten thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) is insufficient to pay such cost then the party of the second part hereby agrees to pay any sum required in excess of that amount. It is, however, agreed that the maximum liability of the surety is limited to the sum of Ten thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).







IT IS HEREBY ACREED, that the party of the second part agrees to construct highways to be known as Zoerb Avenue, Goering Avenue and Nagel Drive, as above described, on or before the 14th day of October, 1960. It further agrees to construct said highways and complete the same under the supervision of the Town Highway Superintendent so that said highways will conform in every respect to the specifications of the Town Highway Department and the regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, and it is further

UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED, that the party of the second part will furnish the party of the first part a Surety Bond executed by a Bonding Company authorized to do business in the State of New York, in the sum of \$30,000.00, said Bond to provide that the party of the second part will in all respects conform to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the accompanying resolution of the Town Board on or before the 19th day of October, 1959, or upon such date as designated by the Highway Superintendent of the Town of Cheektowaga. ACREED, that said bond is to continue in effect for one (1) year after the completion of the construction and acceptance of the highways by the Town Highway Superintendent; it is, however,

AGREED, that the maximum liability of the Surety Company is limited to the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00).

Upon filing with the Town Board an executed copy of this Agreement and the Surety Company Bond, it is agreed that the party of the first part does hereby accept said highways as Town Highways, subject to the jurisdiction of the Town Highway Superintendent and subject to the above mentioned provisions for one year after approval of the completed proposal by the Town Highway Superintendent.

The Members of the Zoning Board of Appeals subsequently inspected the premises and other premises in the vicinity and feel that a dangerous traffic hazard would develop if the request were granted, and also feel that the proposed use of these premises would considerably decrease not only commercial, but residential values in the vicinity and recommend that the application be denied.
