WHEREAS, said petition was duly signed by owners of real property constituting the owners of at least one-half of the entire frontage or bounds on both sides of said portions of said public highways to be so improved as aforesaid, and also constituting resident owners owning not less than one-half of the frontage owned by resident owners along both sides of said portions of said highways to be improved; and

WHEREAS, the said petition was duly acknowledged or proved as to each signer in the same manner as required of a deed to be recorded; and

WHEREAS, at a meeting of said Town Board duly called and held on the 18th day of September, 1961, an order was duly adopted by it and entered in its minutes, reciting the filing of such petition, and improvements proposed, and the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the improvement as stated in such petition, to wit: the sum of Thirty-Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$32,500.00), and specifying that the said Board would meet to consider the petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga, on the 2nd day of October, 1961, at 2:30 o'clock P.M., Eastern Daylight Saving Time; and

WHEREAS, the said order duly certified by the Town Clerk was duly published and posted as required by law; and

WHEREAS, a hearing was held by this Town Board at the place and on the date and at the time hereinbefore mentioned, and at such time and place the said Town Board did duly consider the said petition and hear all persons interested; NOW, THEREFORE,

RESOLVED, that Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, Consulting Engineers for this Town, shall survey said Joanne Lane and Dennis Lane and establish the lines and grades thereof, and shall file such survey and profile in the Town Clerk's Office, and be it further

A G R E E M E N T

AGREEMENT MADE as of the 14th day of October, 1961, between NUNCIO CARDARELLI, residing at Cheektowaga, New York, and GILDO BALDASSI, residing at Buffalo, New York, hereinafter called "Subdividers," and the TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, STATE OF NEW YORK, acting on behalf of DRAINAGE DISTRICT #7, hereinafter called "Town Board," and TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK, a domestic municipal corporation,

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, Subdividers are the owners of certain lands situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Lot 74, Township 12, Range 7 of the Holland Land Company's Survey, and being more particularly described as follows:

Subdividers agree that they will pay to Drainage District #7 such sums as shall be determined from time to time by Town Board acting on behalf of Drainage District #7, as Town Board shall determine to be fair and reasonable charges for the right to use the drainage facilities of Drainage District #7. Such charges shall be apportioned among the several subdivision lots in said Subdivision in proportion to the amount of benefit which the right herein granted by Town Board shall confer upon each such subdivision lot.

4. Subdividers agree that upon the proper installation of drainage facilities in the streets of said Subdivision they will convey to the Town of Cheektowaga said facilities when said Town shall request such conveyance. Upon acceptance by the Town of Cheektowaga of said facilities, and thereafter, Drainage District #7 shall maintain said facilities and the cost thereof shall be charged and apportioned as hereinbefore set forth.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga realizes the necessity of legislation for the benefit of railroads, but is of the opinion that a more equitable method of Railroad Tax Relief be afforded so that Towns like the Town of Cheektowaga, within whose boundaries there are extensive railroad facilities, would not be carrying the major costs and burden of such relief.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cheektowaga Town Board go on record as requesting State Legislation which will more equitably apportion the burden of Railroad Tax Relief and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be, and he hereby is directed to submit certified copies of this resolution to Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller, Senator Majority Leader Walter J. Mahoney, Senate Minority Leader Joseph Zaretzki, Senate Majority Leader George L. Ingalls, Senate Minority Leader Anthony J. Travia.

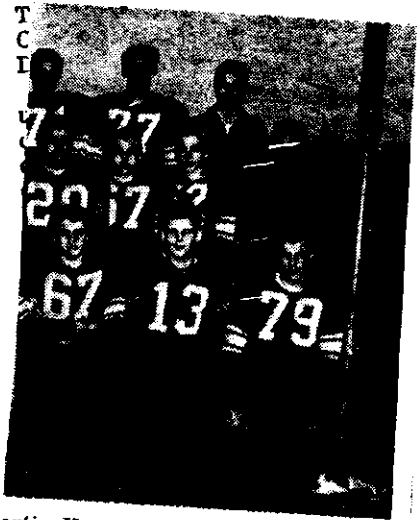

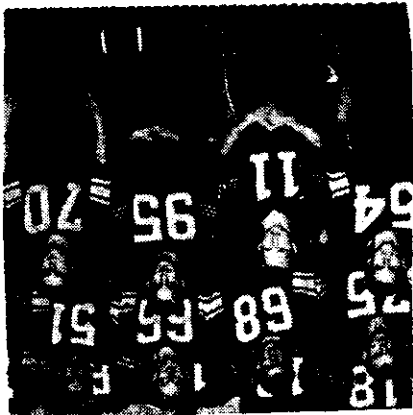

Said bonds shall be payable in annual installments on April 1 in each year as follows, viz.: \$6,000 in the year 1962; and \$3,000 in each of the years 1963 to 1978, inclusive;

(7) Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga of the aggregate principal amount of \$70,500 shall be issued pursuant to the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, Dated February 6, 1961, Authorizing the Issuance of \$75,000 Serial Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, Pursuant to the Local Finance Law, to Finance the Acquisition of Apparatus for Use of the Consolidated Refuse and Garbage District of said Town", which was adopted by the Town Board on February 6, 1961. Said bonds shall be payable in annual installments on April 1 in each year as follows, viz.: \$18,000 in the year 1962; and \$17,500 in each of the years 1963 to 1965, inclusive.

(8) Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga of the aggregate principal amount of \$80,000 shall be issued pursuant to the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, Dated May 2, 1960, Authorizing the Issuance of \$110,000, Serial Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, Pursuant to the Local Finance Law, to Finance the Construction of Sidewalks on Town Highways", which was adopted by the Town Board on May 2, 1960. Said bonds shall be payable in annual installments on April 1 in each year as follows, viz.: \$10,000 in each of the years 1962 to 1969, inclusive.

(9) Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga of the aggregate principal amount of \$15,500 shall be issued pursuant to the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, Dated July 11, 1960, Authorizing the Issuance of \$20,000 Serial Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, Pursuant to the Local Finance Law, to Finance Construction of Curbs on Buffalo Depew Boulevard (now known as Claudette Court)", which was adopted by the Town Board on July 11, 1960. Said bonds shall be payable in annual installments on April 1 in each year as follows, viz.: \$1,500 in the year 1962; and \$2,000 in each of the years 1963 to 1969, inclusive.

(12) All of the bonds referred to in paragraph (1) to (11), inclusive, of this resolution, shall be issued as a single issue of bonds of the aggregate principal amount of \$815,000, to be designated "Serial Public Improvement Bonds", and to consist of eight hundred fifteen (815) bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered from 1 to 815, inclusive, in the order of their maturity, and to be payable in serial annual installments on April 1 in each year as follows, viz.: \$60,000 in the year 1962; \$55,000 in each of the years 1963 to 1965, inclusive; \$40,000 in each of the years 1966 to 1968, inclusive; \$45,000 in the year 1969; \$25,000 in each of the years 1970 to 1978, inclusive; and \$20,000 in each of the years 1979 to 1988, inclusive.

(13) Each of said Serial Public Improvement Bonds shall be deemed to be issued pursuant to each of the Bond Resolutions hereinbefore described and the portion of the indebtedness evidenced by each bond shall be deemed to represent indebtedness incurred by the issuance of bonds pursuant to such Bond Resolution shall bear the same proportion to \$1,000 as the amount of bonds of like maturity to be issued pursuant to such Bond Resolution bears to the total amount of bonds of like maturity to be issued pursuant to all such Bond Resolutions.

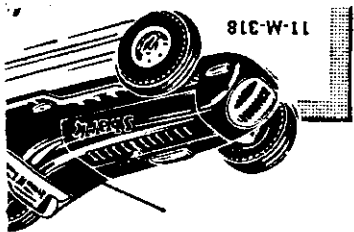

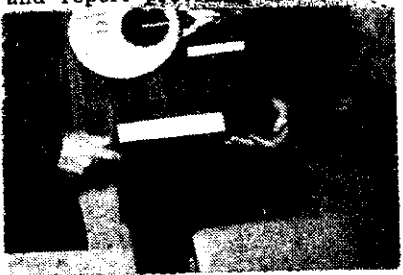
