AGREEMENT MADE as of the 14th day of October, 1961, between NUNCIO CARDARELLI, residing at Cheektowaga, New York, and GILDO BALDASSI, residing at Buffalo, New York, hereinafter called "Subdividers," and the TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, STATE OF NEW YORK, acting on behalf of DRAINAGE DISTRICT #7, hereinafter called "Town Board," and TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK, a domestic municipal corporation.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Subdividers are the owners of certain lands situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Lot 74, Township 12, Range 7 of the Holland Land Company's Survey, and being more particularly described as follows:




