BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE RESOLUTION DATED JULY 1, 1963, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$13,250 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, IN ANTICIPATION OF THE SALE OF SERIAL BONDS AUTHORIZED TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF PARK AND PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS.

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. The Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, shall issue its Bond Anticipation Notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$13,250, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York, in order to finance the specific object or purpose hereinafter described, in anticipation of the issuance of \$13,250 Serial Bonds, authorized by the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, Dated May 6, 1963, Authorizing the Issuance of \$13,250 Serial Bonds and \$750 Capital Notes of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, Pursuant to the Local Finance Law, for Park and Playground Improvements", duly adopted by the Town Board on May 6, 1963.

Section 2. The specific object or purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed by the issuance of said notes is the improvement of the public park or playground which is located on Nokomis Parkway in the Town of Cheektowaga and known as Nokomis Playground, and is maintained by said Town as a public park or playground, by constructing thereon a Class "B" (fire-resistant) building as defined in Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, for use as a comfort station, and installing therein the equipment needed for its use, and the grading or other improvement of its site.

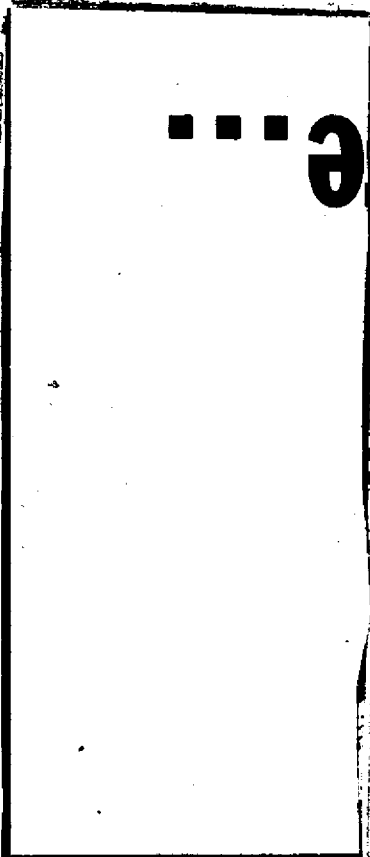

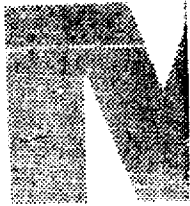

(5) The power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said Capital Notes, subject to the provisions of this resolution, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor. Said Capital Notes shall be sold to the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, New York, at private sale and shall bear an interest rate of Two and Three-Quarters Per Cent (2 3/4%) per annum.

(6) The Faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga are hereby pledged to the payment of said Capital Notes and the interest thereon as the same become due and payable.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK, established pursuant to provisions of ARTICLE 16 of the GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW.

SECTION I - declaration of Policy

The Town Board the Department Heads, Supervisors and all other employees have shared the responsibility of providing the best possible service to the citizens of Cheektowaga.

In providing for the orderly processing of personal grievances of the employees it is intended that these procadures shall contribute to greater public service.

SECTION II - Definition

(a) The Town Board shall mean the duly elected members of the Town Board of Cheektowaga, New York.

(b) Department Head shall mean the Superintendent of Highways, the Town Clerk, the Chief of Police, the Receiver of Taxes and the Town Engineer.

Item No. 14 Cont'd

(c) Supervisor shall mean the immediate Superior of an employee such as a foreman.

(d) An Employee shall mean an employee of the Town of Cheektowaga regardless of capacity.

(e) Grievance shall mean any claimed violation of the Work and Attendance Rules, misinterpretation or inequitable application of existing laws, rules, procedures, regulations, administrative orders which involve an employee's health or safety, physical facilities, material furnished to employees or supervisors of employees', providing it shall not include any matter involving an employee's rate of compensation or retirement benefits.

(f) "Informal presentation" shall mean an oral statement by an employee, or his or her representative, of his or her grievance.

(g) "Formal presentation" shall mean a statement in writing by an employee, or his or her representative, of his or her grievance.

(h) Representative shall mean the person designated by the employees to act in his or her behalf.

SECTION III - Basic Standards and Principles

(a) Every employee shall have the right to present their grievances as herein provided, free from interference, coercion, restraint, discrimination or reprisal.

(b) Every employee shall have the right to be represented at all stages of the grievance procedure.

(c) It shall be fundamental responsibility of supervisors at all levels to promptly take the appropriate action upon grievances presented by employees under their supervision.

SECTION IV - Procedural stages in Chronological Order

STAGE I - The employee, or his or her representative, shall make an informal presentation of his or her grievance, to his or her immediate superior.

If the grievance is not settled within three days after presentation of this stage the employee may within seven days thereafter proceed to State 2.

STATE II - The employee, or his or her representative, shall make a formal presentation of the grievance to the Department Head.

If the grievance is not settled at Stage 2, within seven days after presentation, the employee, or his or her representative, may within seven days after this period proceed to Stage 3.

STAGE III - The employee, or his or her representative, shall file a formal presentation of his or her grievance with the Town Clerk, who shall refer it to the Town Board for a hearing.

The Town Board shall hold the said hearing to be conducted by at least five of its members, upon the grievance of which the employee shall be given at least seven days notice in writing at which hearing the employee with his or her representative shall

be given full opportunity to testify, to present witnesses and to cross examine such other witnesses.

A stenographic record of the hearing shall be taken.

After the hearing, the Town Board shall prepare a written report containing a statement of its findings, conclusions and advisory recommendations and the employee, and his or her representative shall be furnished with a copy thereof.
