Mr. Stachowski and I have gone over the specifications given with each machine and we find several notable differences compared with our specifications. We specified three (3) cylinder machine. Cameron Equipment bid on a four (4) cylinder. The dozer blade is larger on the Cameron Equipment machine than it is on the Brant Machine tractor. The Case Tractor bid by the Cameron Equipment is longer and wider and it cannot make a short turn as required. One track is held stationary while the other turns. The stationary track, being held still, grinds off the rubber on the street pads which we use to prevent damage to the floor. The Oliver Tractor can pivot in one spot with both tracks moving and the wear on the pads does not occur. If we purchased the Case Tractor, we would have to have a new pattern and new molds made for the street pads as they are a different size and shape than that used on the present Oliver machines that we own.

Therefore, I recommend that we buy the 1965 Oliver - Model #0646-3G Crawler Tractor for \$5,376.60 from the Brant Machine, Inc., of Brant, New York.


