RE: Cheektowaga Public Library South Branch

Due to unforseen site conditions it is necessary to perform extra foundation work at the South Branch Library so as to avoid the possibility of future settlement of the building.

Soil test boring taken August 20, 1964, indicated soil of fair bearing capacity. At this time there were no indications of subsurface water so we proceeded to design the footings using calculations of 3,000 # per

Excavation work was started April 12, 1965. In the first area excavated the ground appeared fairly good and there was no indication of subsurface

water. As excavation work proceeded subsurface water was encountered and the bearing quality of the soil began to look unstable. On May 13th, we ordered work to be stopped. At this time we authorized the Empire Soils Investigations Company to make a study and give us an analysis of the foundation conditions. After further boring and a thorough study of ruled out the possibility of widening the footings. Their feeling was out the subsurface water condition, the level of which would vary throughment would result unless the foundations were carried down to firm soil.

On June 24, 1965 Arrigo & Cartonia, Inc. submitted an estimate in the amount of \$14,316.00 to perform the necessary work. At a meeting with Mr. Arrigo and Mr. Cartonia held at our office the foregoing estimate was reduced to \$12, 739.00. It is our hope that the work can be accomplished for less than \$12,739.00, for this reason we would like approval of the following resolution.

For a sum not to exceed the amount of \$12,739.00 Arrigo & Cartonia, Inc. Contractors for the General Construction Work for the Cheektowaga South Branch Library will perform the necessary work to install caissons under the foundation walls, same to extend to firm soil. All to be as per drawings and details prepared by the Architect.

(8) Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga of the aggregate principal amount of \$33,000 shall be issued pursuant to the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, dated February 1, 1965, authorizing the issuance of \$55,000 Serial Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, pursuant to the Local Finance Law," which was adopted by the Town Board on February 1, 1965. Said bonds shall be payable in annual installments on August 1 in each year as follows, viz.: \$1,500 in each of the years 1966 to 1979, inclusive, and \$2,000 in each of the years 1980 to 1985. inclusive. 17

(13) Each of said Serial Public Improvement Bonds shall be deemed to be issued pursuant to each of the Bond Resolutions hereinbefore described and the portion of the indebtedness evidenced by each bond shall be deemed to represent indebtedness incurred by the issuance of bonds pursuant to each such Bond Resolution shall bear the same proportion to \$1,000 or \$5,000 as the amount of bonds of like maturity to be issued pursuant to such Bond Resolution bears to the total amount of bonds of like maturity to be issued pursuant to all such Bond Resolutions.

Ordinance No. 38

PARK ORDINANCE

Section 1. This ordinance shall apply to all public parks and public park approaches owned by the Town of Cheektowaga.

Section 2. All public meetings, and military and other parades, are prohibited in the said parks except with permission of the Town Board.

Section 3. All games of any description must be conducted in a safe and orderly manner and no dangerous practices shall be allowed. No person shall play games for which the Town Board has by resolution required a permit or fixed a fee without first obtaining such permit or paying such fee.

Section 4. No person shall hold a picnic in any park except at those places authorized therefor.

Section 5. Permits for the exclusive use of any picnic are for any specified time not longer than one (1) day may be granted by the Town Board, only to such other official to whom the Town Board shall delegate such authority, and no person shall in any manner disturb or interfere with any person or party occupying such picnic area under the authority of such permit.

Section 6. No person shall climb any tree or pick any flowers or fruit or break, cut down, trample upon. remove or in any manner injure or deface any tree or shrub or any building, fence, bridge or structure or any other property within a park or park approach.

Section 7. No person shall deposit, dump, throw. or place, any earth, rubbish, dust or similar material in or upon any part of a park or park approach except in such receptacles as are provided for same.

Section 8. No domestic animals shall be permitted in a park or park approach.

Section 9. No person shall bathe or swim in any water, whether natural or artificial, within a park or park approach except at such times and in such places as the said Town Board may designate or maintain as bathing or swimming areas, and unless properly attired. No person shall dress or undress in any park or park approach except in such places as may be designated or maintained for that purpose.

Section 10. No person shall skate, use a sleigh, walk or go on any frozen area of water, natural or artificial, within any park or park approach except at such times and in such places as may be designated therefor. No person shall in any park or park approach, coast with sleighs or other similar vehicle except at such times and upon such places as may be designated therefor.

Section 11. Every fire shall be built in a suitable container and be continuously under the care and direction of a competent person from the time it is started until it is extinguished.

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Section 12. All parks shall be closed, except for use on Town highways therein, between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and sunrise the following morning, an d no person shall lounge about or remain in any of the parks during the hours when so closed.

Section 13. No person shall operate any motor vehicle at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour on any of the roads or roadways of the parks or park approaches, and no motor vehicle shall be allowed to remain in any park or park approach for more than 24 hours continuously.

Section 14. No commercial vehicle shall be allowed in any park or park approach except to make deliveries in the park or as otherwise authorized by the Town Board.

Section 15. No parking, shall be permitted except in designated areas.

Section 16. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of an offense and shall be subject to the payment of a fine not exceeding Two Hundred dollars (\$200.00), or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both.

Section 17. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after publication and posting as required by Section 133 of the Town Law, but such ordinance shall take effect from the date of its service as against a person served personally with a copy thereof certified by the Town Clerk under the corporate seal of the Town and showing the date of its passage and entry in the minutes of the Town Board.
