AGREEMENT

This Agreement made by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, of the County of Erie and State of New York, party of the first part; and BOWMANSVILLE VOLUNTEER FIRE ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED, a corporation organized under the Membership Corporation Law of the State of New York, having its office at Bowmansville, in the Town of Lancaster, County of Erie and State of New York, party of the second part:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga by appropriate resolution and action of its Town Board established Fire Protection District No.1. more particularly hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Town Board, at the Town of Cheektowaga, held on the 7th day of September, 1965, duly adopted a resolution calling for a public hearing to be held at the Town Hall on October 4th, 1965, at 2:30 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of considering the advisability of entering into a contract with the Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Incorporated, to provide fire protection for said Fire Protection District, and

WHEREAS, following a public hearing duly called, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga met on the 4th day of October, 1965, at 2:30 o'clock P.M., and a public hearing was held by said Town Board as to the advisability of entering into said contract and an opportunity was afforded all persons interested in the subject matter to be heard, and the Town Board having decided that it would be to the best interests of the Town of Cheektowaga and said Fire Protection District that a contract be entered into between the Town of Cheektowaga and said Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Incorporated, to provide fire protection for said Fire Protection District in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in said resolution, adopted September 7th, 1965, and in the notice published, as therein provided, and

WHEREAS, the party of the secon d part is willing on

such terms and conditions contained in said resolution to furnish said

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), each in hand paid to the other, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowed do COVENANT and AGREE:

- 1. The Corporation represents and agrees that it now has adequate and suitable fire fighting apparatus and equipment as well as prompt and adequate fire protection to enable it to furnish suitable, hereinafter more particularly described, and further agrees that it will adequate and suitable fire equipment and apparatus as well as sufficient protection fo said District.
- 2. The Corporation agrees that it will throughout the terms of this Contract, furnish adequate, suitable and prompt fire protection to said Fire Protection District, and in connection therewith, attend any and all fires occurring in said District, and to the best of and injury to person or property therefrom.
- 3. The Town of Cheektowaga agrees that it will pay for such services for one year commencing the 1st day of January, 1966, and ending the 31st day of December, 1966, to the said Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., \$1200.00, levied against the property situated within the limits of the Fire Protection District, and the payment of said money to be marde to the Corporation between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of December.
- 4. The Corporation agrees that it will use and devote the money so received by it from the Town solely and exclusively to fire fighting and fire protection purposes, and to provide insurance coverage for the Town and the said District against any liability under Section 205 of the General Municipal Law.
- 5. The parties hereto agree that this Contract shall continue to the 31st day of december, 1966, and may be renewed for the additional periods of one (1) year, by Agreement of the parties hereto.
- 6. The Fire Protection District to which the fire protection shall be furnished as hereinbefore provided, consists of and includes the territory and property within the following boundaries.

COMMENCING in the center line of Transit Road at the north line of the Village of Depew, running thence west along the north line of the Village of Depew to the east line of the lands of the Lembigh Valley Railroad, thence north along the East line of the lands of the Lehigh Balley Railroad to the north line of lands of the West Shore Railroad, thence west along the north line oflands of the West Shore Railroad to the west line of lands of Albert J. Schulenberg, thence north along the west line of said lands of Albert J. Schulenberg to the center line of Genesee Street, thence east along the center line of Genesee Street to the center line of Sugg Road, thence north along the center line of Sugg Road to the north line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad; thence west along the north line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad to the center line of Spies Road, thence north

Dear Mr. Weber:

As a councilman in the Town of Cheektowaga, I hereby submit for the record the following statement and request relative to the budget adoption meeting to be held this evening.

On the question of the budget, you are the Chief Fiscal Officer and I as a councilman request that you detail, item by item the specifics of your suggested three (3) lump sum budget cuts. You suggested to the council last Thursday at the public hearing that if these three (3) items were not cut to your figures, that a town tex would be assessed next year.

First, may I point out to you that only one of these three (3) suggested cuts effects the General Town Tax namely, the cut pertaining to the Shade Tree Fund. This items is in the General Fund Budget. I am informed that the expenditures in this item are to be used to cut down a large number of diseased elms and to replace them with young healty trees. This is a widely accepted and desirable program which effects the entire Western New York area. Now do you propose to cut this Fund and how will your proporal affect next year's tax rate?

Secondly, you have made two (2) other budget cut sug-

gestions. May I bring to your attention, Mr. Weber, that neither the highway budget nor the consolidated garbage district budget are part of the Town's General Fund Budget. They are separate budgets, with separate tax rates and they do not effect the General Fund tax rate this year or next year.

I respectfully request an item by item account from you as to exactly what services to the people you wish to curtail as part of your request to cut the sum of \$93,000 from the highway budget, and the sum of \$30,943 from the garbage district budget.

We, as a Town Board, have a right to know the details of your fiscal policy in order to act intelligently on the budget. As for myself, I will support any budget cut you make which you can justify to me as being in the best interests of the people.

It appears to me that you may have some misgivings about your determination to eliminate the town tax last year when the town received a "l - shot windfall" of sales tax money revenues. It further appears to me that your plan to wipe out the town tax emounted to near-sighted planning a year ago.

Do you now realize that perhaps you have started something that you may not be able to keep up. I believe the people of Cheektowaga are realistic and would rather have a small tax rate on the General Fund rather than going down from \$10.00 a thousand to zero, and then inevitably going back to General Fund tax next year.

It would seem that by cutting the present budget, which is no where near the point of extravagency, but rather it provides everyone with essential services, your proposals would apparently result in the taxpayers suffering by cutting down the services they need. Furthermore, your proposals would have the effect for laying the groundwork for blaming the council next year for accumulated problems of this year and next year.

As councilmen elected to serve the people we have a right to know here your item by item cut suggestions and some clarification of your fiscal policies. I, for one will certainly approve any budget cut you make which you can justify as being in the public interest.

HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE TOWN BOARD:

Myself and two of my colleagues on the board. Councilman Fath and Councilman Kaczmarek have just returned from a two day Suburman, Richard D. McCarthy.

The prime motivating factor in sponsoring this conference of suburban areas. Statistics have shown that the mass exodus from large two acres per second. This tremendous shift in population has caused essential services of community living over very short run periods in Suburban communities have often been forced to develope the same type over 10-20 year periods that had taken larger cities 60-80 years to

This type of urbanization has led many communities to develope in a rather hectic manner with little planning toward long range of the last 20 years, we must orient our future planning and programming basis of the entire urban complex. The federal government has a variety at least cost to the taxpayer. However, it will require comprehensive for assistance.

The underlying theme behind all these assistance programs is well developed and integrated plans for community growth which do not necessarily terminate at predetermined town or village boundaries,

Although the new Housing Act of 1965 will release additional federal funds for public improvements, the basis for obtaining the assistance, in the main, has been oriented to metropolitan areas rather than to specific communities. One such new program contained in the act which will make \$100 million available for construction of water and sewer facilities stresses that the application for such a grant must be on an area wide basis. Another feature of the 1965 act is the availability of funds for advance acquisition of land to be saved by local communities for future growth. Under this provision, the government would advance funds without interest to acquire sites for future development provided such development occurs within a five year period.

Still another feature of the new law provides for the broadening of the FHA insurance program under which sub-dividers can obtain insured loans for land acquisition and site development at 6 per cent interest instead of the 20 per cent they may have to pay private lenders. This section will encourage builders to better plan their development with an eye towards community needs on the whole.

It would be impossible within the framework of this meeting to comprehensibly describe to you all the varied programs of Federal assistance under which our town might benefit. Suffice it to say at this time, that we have returned from this conference with the tools that will enable us to take the necessary steps to fully exploit those programs which would benefit us and to take the necessary steps in instituting the planning which would enable us to qualify under

Item No. 49 Cont'd

these programs.

I would like at this time to very breifly outline some of the more important programs under the new law.

THE HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1965 (Public Law 89 117)

This act will add significantly to the volume of good housing that can be provided for low income families who are elderly, sub standard housing. Some of the more important programs contained in this act are:

LAND AND ACQUISITION DEVELOPMENT—The FHA is authorized to insure mortgages to acquire and develope land for residential and replan developed or being developed for the area. Improvements financed could include water and sewer facilities, roads, streets, sidewalks and large supply of properly planned and improved building sites to small as estimated value of the property when developed or 50% of the value before development.)

GRANTS FOR BASIC SEWER AND WATER FACILITIES Grants are authorized to public bodies to finance up to 50% of the cost of expanding, enlarging and improving basic public water and sewer facilities.

GRANTS FOR ADVANCE ACQUISITION OF LAND - Grants are authorized to finance the acquisition of sites to be used in future construction of public works and facilities. Such grants would be equal to the reasonable interest charges on loans for such land purchases up to the time of construction but for not more than five years.

GRANTS FOR NEIGHBORHOOD FACILITIES To finance neighborhood facilities such as community or youth centers, health stations or similar public buildings. The grants may cover up to 2/3 of project cost of 75% in areas approved under the Area Redevelopment act,

GRANTS FOR URBAN BEAUTIFICATION AND IMPROVEMENT - Matching grants authorized to assist municipalities in programs of beautification and improvement of open space and other public lands. The programs covered could be included for such things as street landscaping, park improvements, tree planting and upgrading of malls and squares. In addition, in order to encourage experimentation and innovation, the act authorixes a specific program under which grants can cover up to 90% of the total cost of such experimental activities.

OPEN SPACE LAND GRANTS — Grants authorized to states and local agencies to cover up to 50% of the cost of acquiring and developing land for recreational, conservation and other public uses in accordance with comprehensive area plans. The act also authorizes the purchase, clearance and development of land in built up areas for such open space needs as parks, squares, playgrounds, etc.

URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS The act increases the authorization for low interest rehabilitation loans for improving structures in urban renewal areas. The act also grants aid to municipalities to assist them in carrying out concerntrated code enforcement programs in deteriorating areas.

WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PROGRAM - This program is ad-

ministered by the Public Health Service with the Department of Health, Education and Welfare and provides for direct financial aid to help build new waste treatment plants or enlarge or modernize existing facilities, building or improving waste treatment facilities, (limited to \$600,000), for a sometimes stretch local tax dollars ever farther by the limit would be increased to \$2,400,000.

RECREATION PROGRAMS - Many programs such as the Land and Conservation Fund Program channel relief through state agencies to local levels for urgently needed public outdoor recreation areas and facilities.

Recreation is an activity that is becoming increasingly important to federal legislators. Under the Department of Interior's Bureau of Outdoor Recreation there is matching fund assistance available to plan, acquire and develope lands and waters for outdoor recreation. Paths to hiking trails and from beautification to active sports facilities.

Other varied programs provide for assistance in education, aid to the mentally retarded, educational facilities for the health professions and community hospitals to mention only a few.

REPORT of Mrs. Julia Boyer Reinstein

Suburban Growth Conference Washington D.C. December 2-3, 1965

sponsored by Congressman Richard McCarthy

When the announcement of Congressman McCarthy's conference was made, I realized that all people of Cheektowaga should be vitally interested. As a member of the Cheektowaga Public Library Board I was aware that some of the adjoining towns had received Federal aid in library building programs. I wanted to ask the question, "Was Cheektowaga eligible for such aid?" I was interested, also, in securing Federal aid in the expansion of our "green areas" and park systems. This has been a concern of mine for over 15 years because of the rapid and really uncontrolled subdivision development in the town. I was also curious about the fate of the building expansion program of the Town Hall, for this involved my activities as Town Historian. Then there is the new project of the development of a Town of Cheektowaga Civic Center, that would ultimately have a cultural activities and recreation building that could serve all groups of the Town.

To me, as a citizen, the planning and accomplishment of these projects were very important. Hence my so called "junket" to Washington, I knew that overall planning, in the form of a comprehensive Master Plan was needed, before Federal help could be secured. What I wanted to know was what the citizens and officials of Cheektowaga had to do before we were qualified for the Federal aid. My attendance as Town Historian, was so designated so that I could be a part of the official group for the conference, and not as an interloper.

Representative McCarthy prepared a most comprehensive agenda for the meetings, and had heads of departments, including Secretary of Interior Udall, as speakers. I came away with a great deal of nent aspects of the future of Cheektowaga.

Before Federal money can be obtained for any project, the Town must fulfill the basic qualifications of having a comprehensive MASTER PLAN. This plan must fit into a regional or area plan; such a plan covering the adjacent towns and areas of the Niagara Frontier. At this conference, was verified what I had found out, and reported, from Niagara Falls.

The necessity for this Master Plan was brought out by every panel member in the two day program. This qualification applies ment of the Town Hall, open "green areas" and parks, a civic center or libraries, or flood relief.

Unfortunately, because Cheektowaga has a 94,000 population, it does not qualify for Federal aid in making such a Master Plan. Only municipalities of under 50,000 are eligible for such aid. For Cheektowaga to take advantage of any Federal grants, this Master Plan must be developed with speed and precision, instead of having to wait several years. The entire cost of such a Master Plan is estimated at about \$50,000.00 when done by a qualified outisde planner under contract. If the Cheektowaga Engineering Department did the detailed "leg work" under the supervision of such an outside planning expert, and with the assistance of the Erie County Planning Commissioner, this cost could be cut from \$50,000.00 to about \$10,000.00, plus the cost of the Town's engineering staff. By starting immediately, and doing much of this research during winter months when outside engineering is slow, the biggest share of the detailed work could be finished before good engineering weather arrives in the late spring and early summer. In this way, the professional planner could make his report to the Town Board in 6 to 8 months, rather than in several years.

With such a comprehensive Master Plan that would coordinate with the regional plan, then Cheektowaga would be in line for Federal assistance during the year 1966. Unless the Town acts speedily we may repeat the situation that existed in connection with the enlargement of the Town Hall plans. The funds became exhausted and the department abolished before our plans were acted upon - so that now this project will have to be sent through new channels when we are qualified for Federal assistance.

All plans, as many of the panel speakers emphasized, must be consistent with a 15-20 year projection, as well as fitting into this regional plan. This refers to land use, housing, transportation, or other problems. The towns around Cheektowaga all have acceptable Master Plans. We seem to be the one blank spot on the map of the area. I am still of the opinion that a town this size should use the services of a professional planning engineer rather than the services of a planning board made up of laymen, to bring this Master Plan into being, very soon. Speed and professional knowledge are essential at this point, if Cheektowaga is to catch up with its neighbors.

For many months there has been agreement on the expansion of the Town Hall property to the east in order to create a Town of Cheektowaga Civic Center. By using this additional land, under various catagories of Federal grants we can obtain Federal assistance, both towards the acquisition of the land, and its development. Your first

Item No. 26 Cont'd

step was advocating the construction of the fire training town for volunteer firemen, at the south end of the plot. The Council of Cheektowaga cultural organizations is advocating (as I have also advocated) the construction of a Cultural Activities building on the north end of the plot, to complement the present dignified Town Hall building, Such a building to provide facilities for the civic theater, the community orchestra and chorus, the artists groups, Senior Citizens, a historical center, youth and ethnic groups, can be substantially financed through Federal grants. Recreational facilities could be planned within this Civic Center complex, in order to add to present recreational facilities in the town. The enlargement of the Cheektowaga Town Hall must be resubmitted, so this too, could become part of the over-all plan for the Town's Civic Center. A center of this sort, planned by a professional, for the future, would be a "first" among Western New York Towns. Again speed is of the essence. It has been much too long since the appraisals were ordered last summer. No report had been submitted by the last Town Board meeting on December 6, 1965.

Another concern of mine, in conjunction with this suburban problems conference, was the Town Park project, as well as the "open space and green area" situation in Cheektowaga. At this conference I learned that we can receive some Federal money in addition to state money for park land acquisition. Park development funds, which I believe is 50% can come from Federal grants. Again we have to have a Master Plan before we qualify for any Federal grants. I can see no excuse for the dragging of this program for the past four years.

I also learned that the Federal government has funds available for small neighborhood "open spaces-green areas" - even as small as an acre in a tightly built up area. Aid is available for acquisition and demolition of buildings within heavily populated areas that are starting to deteriorate, for such open space projects.

As the land became 100% subdivided in Cheektowaga, it is unfortunate that there no provisions made for green areas within the subdivisions. As most subdividers are not civic minded, the Town may have to turn to Federal help to acquire what should have been acquired years ago.

One of the main reasons for my trip to Washington was to find out about Federal assistance in the Town's Public Library Program. This related to the two future branch libraries for the town, as well as regional reference libraries in the suburbs, one of which I hope to have located within our town's boundaries. I found out that Federal funds can be used in acquisition of lands for library use, as well as towards buildings. Resources under the Library Services and Construction Act of 1964 should be explored in conjunction with regional Reference Libraries. Such a project would involve Erie County as well as the Town and Federal departments. I also was assured that Federal grants would not be lost, if private gifts were involved in the project.

There were many other aspects of suburban problems which were discussed that are vital to the orderly development of the Town of Cheektowaga. Urban renewal, aid to subdividers for subdivision development; fllod control, water pollution control, and education are a few. Sometime I will touch upon these.

I hope, in spite of the fact that my trip to Washington was privately financed, that this report will receive the same consideration that is given to any other of the official reports.
