UNSAFE BUILDINGS AND COLLAPSED STRUCTURES ORDINANCE
OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK,
PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN SECTION 130,
SUBDIVISION 16, OF THE TOWN LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW
YORK

Section 1.

This ordinance shall be known as the "Unsafe Buildings and Collapsed Structures Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga".

Section 2.

When in the opinion of the official appointed by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga for the purposes of enforcing this ordinance any structure located therein shall be deemed to be unsafe or dangerous to the public, he shall make a formal inspection thereof and report in writing to the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga his findings and recommendation in regard to its removal or repair.

Section 3.

The said Town Board shall thereafter consider this said report and by resolution determine if in its opinion the report so warrants, that the said structure or building is unsafe and dangerous and order its removal or repair if the same can be safely repaired, and further order that a notice shall be given to the following persons or corporations and in the manner herein as provided.

Section 4.

NOTICE - The notice shall contain the following:

- (a) A description of the premises.
- (b) A statement of the particulars in which the building or structure is unsafe or dangerous.
- (c) An order requiring the same to be made safe and secure or removed.
- (d) That the securing or removal of the said buildings or structures shall commence within thirty (30) days of the serving of the notice and shall be completed within sixty (60) days thereafter.
- (e) That in the event of neglect or refusal of the persons and/or corporations served with the notice to comply with the same, a survey of the premises will be made by an inspector and architect to be named by the Town Board, and a practical builder, engineer or architect appointed by the said persons or corporations so notified.
- (f) That in the event of the refusal or neglect of the persons or corporations so notified to appoint a surveyor, the two surveyors named by the Town Board shall make the survey and report.
- (g) That in the event the buildings or other structures shall be reported unsafe or dangerous under such survey, an application will be made at a Special Term of

the Supreme Court in the Judicial District in which the property is located, for an order determining the building or other structure to be a public nuisance and directing that it shall be repaired and secured or taken down and removed.

- (h) That the land on which said buildings or structures are located will be assessed for all costs and expense incurred by the Town in connection with the proceedings to remove or secure, including the cost of actually removing said building or structure.

Section 5.

Service of Notice. The said notice shall be served in the following manner:

- (a) By personal service of a copy thereof upon the owner or some one of the owners, executors, legal representatives, agents, lessees, or any other person having a vested or continued interest in the premises as shown by the last preceding completed assessment roll of the said Town; or if no such person can be reasonably found, by mailing such owner by registered mail a copy of such notice directed to his last known address;
- (b) AND by personal service of a copy of such notice upon any adult person residing in or occupying said premises; or if no such person can be reasonably found, by securely affixing a copy of such notice upon the building or structure.

Section 6.

In the event of the neglect or refusal of the persons so notified to comply with said order of the Town Board, a survey of said premises shall be made in the following manner:

- (a) The Town Board shall appoint an inspector and architect, and the persons so notified shall appoint a practical builder, engineer or architect who shall make the said survey and submit a written report thereon in regard to the unsafe or dangerous condition of said building or structure. If the persons so notified shall refuse or neglect to appoint a surveyor within forty (40) days after service of the notice, the two surveyors appointed by the Town Board shall proceed and report.
- (b) A signed copy of such report shall be posted on the said structure.

Section 7.

In the event the building or other structure shall be reported unsafe or dangerous under such survey, the Town Board may pass a resolution directing the Supervisor of the Town to make an application at a Special Term of the Supreme Court of the State of New York in the Judicial District in which the property is located, for an order determining the building or other structure to be a public nuisance and directing that it shall be repaired and secured or taken down and removed.

Section 8.

All costs and expenses incurred by the Town in connection with the proceeding to remove or secure, including the cost of actually removing said building or structure shall be assessed against the land on which said buildings or structures are located.

Section 9.

The said surveyors shall be paid reasonable compensation for the service performed by them in making their survey and in preparing the report thereof.

Section 10.

This ordinance shall take effect ten days after publication and posting or immediately upon personal service as provided by Section 133 of the Town Law.

WHEREAS, the attorneys for the Railroad have agreed to a compromise reduction in assessment of \$70,000 with interest at the rate of 3% per annum from date of payment of the taxes by the Railroad, and as part of such compromise would agree to discontinue other lawsuits of the Erie Railroad Company involving assessments for the years 1959 and 1960 wherein it is sought to reduce the assessments by approximately \$80,000 and about \$86,000 respectively, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the compromise settlement should be effected,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the pending lawsuit of the Erie-Lackawanna Railroad Company involving assessments of railroad properties for 1962 be compromised by reducing the same by \$70,000 and that the pending lawsuits involving assessments of the Erie Railroad Company for the years 1959 and 1960 be settled without any reduction in such assessments, and be it

WHEREAS, pursuant to said resolution, the Town Board did meet on the 7th day of November, 1966, at the Town Hall, in the Town of Cheektowaga, for the purpose of considering the advisability of adopting said proposed Local Ordinance No. 39, and

WHEREAS, an opportunity to be heard was afforded all persons interested in the subject matter; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by this Town Board that it is in the public interest to adopt Local Ordinance No. 39 as set forth below, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that there is herewith enacted Local Ordinance No. 39 as follows:

LOCAL ORDINANCE NO. 39
OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA,
ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK

PARTIAL TAX EXEMPTION OF REAL PROPERTY FOR
CERTAIN PERSONS 65 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER.

Section 1. The purpose of this ordinance is to grant a partial exemption from taxation to the extent of fifty per centum of the assessed valuation of real property which is owned by certain persons with limited income who are sixty-five years of age or over meeting the requirements set forth in Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law.

Section 2. Real property owned by persons sixty-five years of age or over shall be exempt from town taxes to the extent of fifty per centum of the assessed valuation subject to the following conditions:

a. The owner or all of the owners must file an application annually in the assessor's office at least ninety days before the day for filing the final assessment roll or such other time as may be hereafter fixed by law.

b. The income of the owner or the combined income of the owners must not exceed \$3,000 for the twelve consecutive months prior to the date that the application is filed.

c. Title to the property must be vested in the owner, or if more than one, in all the owners for at least sixty consecutive months prior to the date that the application is filed.

d. The property must be used exclusively for residential purposes, be occupied in whole or in part by the owners, and constitute the legal residence of the owners.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect ten days after publication and posting or immediately upon personal service as provided by Section 133 of the Town Law.

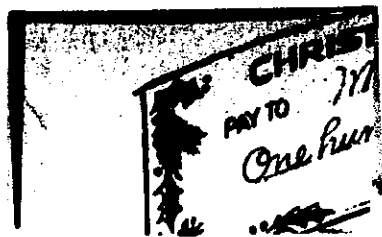

- (g) That in the event the buildings or other structures shall be reported unsafe or dangerous under such survey, an application will be made at a Special Term of the Supreme Court in the Judicial District in which the property is located, for an order determining the building or other structure to be a public nuisance and directing that it shall be repaired and secured or taken down and removed.
- (h) That the land on which said buildings or structures are located will be assessed for all costs and expense incurred by the Town in connection with the proceedings to remove or secure, including the cost of actually removing said building or structure.

(h) That the land on which said buildings or structures are located will be assessed for all costs and expense incurred by the Town in connection with the proceedings to remove or secure, including the cost of actually removing said building or structure.

Section 5. Service of Notice. The said notice shall be served in the following manner:

(a) By personal service of a copy thereof upon the owner or some one of the owners, executors, legal representatives, agents, lessees, or any other person having a vested or continued interest in the premises as shown by the last preceding completed assessment roll of the said Town; or if no such person can be reasonably found, by mailing such owner by registered mail a copy of such notice directed to his last known address;

(b) AND by personal service of a copy of such notice upon any adult person residing in or occupying said premises; or if no such person can be reasonably found, by securely affixing a copy of such notice upon the building or structure.

Section 6. In the event of the neglect or refusal of the persons so notified to comply with said order of the Town Board, a survey of said premises shall be made in the following manner:

(a) The Town Board shall appoint an inspector and architect and the persons so notified shall appoint a practical builder, engineer or architect who shall make the said survey and submit a written report thereon in regard to the unsafe or dangerous condition of said building or structure. If the persons so notified shall refuse or neglect to appoint a surveyor within forty (40) days after service of the notice, two surveyors appointed by the Town Board shall proceed with the report.

(b) A signed copy of the report shall be posted on the said structure.

Section 7. In the event the building or other structure shall be reported unsafe or dangerous under such survey, the Town Board may pass a resolution directing the supervisor of the Town to make an application at a Special Term of the Supreme Court of the State of New York in the Judicial District in which the property is located, for an order determining the building or other structure to be a public nuisance and directing that it shall be repaired and secured or taken down and removed.

Section 8.
