B. No use of land, building or structure shall be permitted the operation of which normally results in any:

1. Fire explosive hazard or

2. Dissemination of atmospheric pollutant, noise, vibration or odor beyond the boundary of the premises on which such use is located or

3. Discharge of any unneutralized refuse material into sanitary sewers and discharge of any refuse material into storm sewers, ditches, or streams."

C. Storage of inflammable liquids shall be entirely underground and in storage tanks approved by the National Fire Protection Association. Safety containers shall be used within any building or structure in which flammable liquids are handled.

D. All side and rear lot lines abutting any lot in any R District or a C District shall be fenced or screened by plantings. No fence effect than one constructed of wire and commonly known as "chain link" fence shall be permitted. Such fence shall not be more than 10 feet in height and shall not project into any required front yard.

ORDINANCE NO. 15

REGULATING THE OWNING, HAVING CARE, CUSTODY, OR CHARGE OF DOGS

- 1. This Ordinance shall apply to the entire Town of Cheektowaga outside the limits of the Villages of Depew and Sloan.
- 2. All dogs while off the owner's premises, whether or not tagged or licensed, shall be restrained by leash and any Peace Officer or designated representative of the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets of the State of New York shall seize any dog not so restrained found off the owner's premises. The Peace Officer or designated representative of the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets of the State of New York, who shall have seized any dog pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall provide for the feeding and caring for the dog and its disposition pursuant to the provisions of Section 114-a of the Agriculture and Markets Law of New York.
- 3. Any person owning or having the care, custody, or charge of any dog, which is kept on the owner's premises or the premises of others, shall, unless said dog is in his or her immediate custody, or within a fenced enclosed area, keep said dog muzzled or securely fastened in such manner as to prevent said dog from biting any person lawfully entering upon or leaving such premises.
- 4. No person, firm or corporation shall keep, or allow to be kept on premises owned by such person, firm or corporation, any dog which by its frequent barking, howling or whining or other noise shall unreasonably disturb the comfort or repose of any person.
- 5. Any violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed an offense and any person found guilty of such violation shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00.

- Br--No-unneutralized-refuse-material-shall-be-discharged-into-sewers, streams-or-ditches.
- B. No use of land, building or structure shall be permitted the operation of which normally results in any:
  - 1. Fire explosive hazard or
  - 2. Dissemination of atmospheric pollutant, noise, vibration or odor beyond the boundary of the premises on which such use is located or
  - 3. Discharge of any unneutralized refuse material into sanitary sewers and discharge of any refuse material into storm sewers, ditches, or streams.
- C. Storage of inflammable liquids shall be entirely underground and in storage tanks approved by the National Fire Protection Association. Safety containers shall be used within any building or structure in which flammable liquids are handled.
- D. All side and rear lot lines abutting any lot in any R District or a C District shall be fenced or screened by plantings. No fence other than one constructed of wire and commonly known as "chain link" fence shall be permitted. Such fence shall not be more than 10 feet in height and shall not project into any required front yard.

Section 4-12 Limitations on Uses in the M2 District -- As specified and regulated in the M1 District with the exception of residential uses which shall be completely prohibited.

- 2. That on Monday, March 15, 1976, the deponent, Michael C. Wagner, President and Richard C. Wagner, Vice President, completed the preparation and assembly of a bid for the general construction of a wading pool and related work for submission to the Town of Cheektowaga.
- 3. That the bid forms were stapled together and double checked by all three of the aforesaid persons and found to be in order. That the complete bid form including the signature page and non-collusive statement together with the bid bond were placed in an envelope and sealed.
- 4. That Richard C. Wagner took the envelope containing the bid forms with him to be filed with the Town of Cheektowaga in the prescribed manner before 7:00 P.M. on that date.
- 5. That at about 6:05 P.M. the deponent and Richard C. Wagner received a telephone call from Michael C. Wagner advising them that he received a call from Donald Hawkins of the James M. Hawkins Co., Inc. reducing a previously submitted price for aluminum pool liner and equipment from \$82,800 to \$78,500, and were instructed by Michael C. Wagner to make the change in the total bid accordingly.

- 6. That the deponent and Richard C. Wagner got together at the office at about 6:20 P.M. and they unstapled the forms and made the change in the aluminum pool liner bid and in the overall bid.
- 7. That they reassembled the bid, placed the forms back in the envelope and to the best of deponent's knowledge all the necessary forms had been returned to the envelope. They then took the newly assembled bid to the Clerk receiving the bids and thereafter when the bids were opened, deponent learned for the first time that the sheet containing the signature and non-collusive clause was missing.
- 8. That on the following day the said missing sheet was filed with the Town of Cheektowaga.

#### **MEMORANDUM**

TO: HONORABLE TOWN BOARD

RE: Bids for new wading pool and related work -

Cheektowaga Town Park

Gentlemen:

At the March 15th regular Town Board meeting bids were opened relative to the above captioned project. There were three major items bid, namely, General Construction, Mechanical and Electrical. The low money bid on the General Construction work was submitted by Michael A. Wagner and Sons, Inc. in the sum of \$201,393. The alleged facts surrounding the bidding indicate that at the time the bids were opened, the Michael A. Wagner and Sons, Inc. bid contained the bid bond and the bid proposal. It appears that pages 3 and 4, which consist of the non-collusive bidding certificate and the signature sheet for the bid were missing as well as page 5 which called for certain information pertaining to partnerships, co-partnerships and businesses operating under an assumed trade name. In the Wagner bid, page 5 was unnecessary since the bidder was a corporation. It further appears that pages 3, 4 and 5 were thereafter submitted to the Town on the following day, March 16, 1976. The bid submitted by Wagner was the lowest bid of all those submitted for the General Construction work.

The present question before the Board to be considered is, may the Board accept a bid in which the non-collusion certificate is not included at the time of opening of the bids.

Section 103d of the General Municipal Law outlines the provisions governing bidding as related to non-collusion certificates. In order to expedite the details of said law I am submitting my memorandum on a similar question which came up at the time of the first Land Reclamation bid in 1974 together with my letter to attorney Joseph Nasca dated June 7, 1974. It appears that the important matter to consider is whether or not the omission in the case at hand has been properly explained, justified and legally executed in accordance with said law. I have discussed this matter thoroughly with Fred Marczak of Foit and Maharan and Supervisor Kenneth Meyers. The attorney representing Wagner had contacted me at my home late last night and he agreed to furnish affidavits which fully detail the circumstances surrounding the bidding by Wagner. The affidavits, signed under oath,

have been executed by Richard C. Wagner, Michael C. Wagner and Harold V. Creenan, all persons being principals of the corporation. Briefly, the affidavits indicate that the non-collusion certificate was completed and executed on the list prior to the bidding and the entire package was available, placed in an envelope and sealed. Thereafter, and still prior to the bidding, a new figure was submitted by one of the subcontractors which required that the entire bid be redone to reflect the new figure and in the course of the reassembling of the forms and documents, the non-collusion certificate was apparently not returned to the envelope. The newly assembled bid was then placed in an envelope and submitted to the Town Clerk prior to the opening of the bids. When the bids were opened, it apparently was learned for the first time that the sheets containing the non-collusive clause (pages 3 and 4) were missing.

OPINION: The contents of the affidavits appear to substantially excuse and justify the action of the bidder and qualify him as the lowest responsible bidder. Please note that the difference between the case at hand and the Land Reclamation case is that the statements under oath of the officers of the corporation indicate that the non-collusion certificate and the signature sheet were in fact signed and placed in a sealed envelope on April 15, 1976. The subsequent reopening of the envelope apparently in order to reassemble the new bid apparently resulted in an actual omission to replace the non-collusion certificate and the signature sheet into the envelope with the reassembled bid. In the Land Reclamation case, the failure to include the non-collusion certificate was discovered some time after the opening of the bids and after a thorough investigation by the Town Attorney's Office of the proceedings at the Town Board meeting and the records and activities in the Town Clerk's Office relating to the bid opening. The Town Attorney's Office notified the bidder in writing of the omission and the attempt to correct said omission was not made until some time after the bid opening. Apparently, no noncollusion certificate was in fact executed prior to the bidding, unlike the case at hand. The law and State Comptroller's opinion also indicate that:

## "8. Time of considering or accepting certificate

A municipality may accept a non-collusion certificate after the bids are opened but before the contract is awarded. Op. State Compt. 70-589.

A non-collusion certificate should be accepted only where the failure to submit the certificate with the sealed bid occurred through inadvertence or mistake and where late acceptance will result in no material advantage to the low bidder and no material disadvantage to the other bidders. Id."

It appears that the affidavits in this case explain and justify the failure to submit the certificate and it further appears that no material disadvantage would result to the other bidders in accepting the bid. Furthermore, the overriding consideration that the public gain the advantage of a low bid must be seriously considered Honorable Town Board March 19, 1976 Page 3

by Town officers when voting upon the award. Under the circumstances set forth herein and the supporting documents, it is my opinion that the Board would be acting legally and properly in awarding the bid to the apparent low bidder, Michael A. Wagner and Sons, Inc.



Enclosed is a letter from the Corp of Engineers to the previous owner showing flood elevations which indicate the Marywood III Subdivision to be above the 100 year flood elevation.

Ted Skowron, the Highway Department Engineer and I have inspected the maps for the Marywood Part III Subdivision and find that they meet the specifications as set forth by the Town of Cheektowaga and subject to the following regulations:

- 1. Bituminous coated metal pipe and concrete for storm sewers.
- 2.
- Crusher run for road base. It will be the responsibility of the subdividor and/or the builder to plant a tree in front of every new home, between the sidewalk and curb within one year after homes are built.
- Constrcution of paving, curbs, receivers and connections in the Marywood Part III Subdivision roads described as follows:

Dear Mr. Patterson:

This is in reply to your letter of 17 June 1975, requesting flood data for a proposed subdivision, approximately .3 mile upstream from the Rowley Road bridge bounded by Cayuga Creek on the north, Rowley Road on the south and the Penn Central Railroad on the east.

Based on a Flood Insurance Study for Cheektowaga, NY, that the Buffalo District prepared for the Federal Insurance Administration, the estimated 100-year flood elevations in the vicinity of the proposed site are:

Upstream of Rowley Rd. Bridge - 624.5 ft. Valley Cross Section J (Stream Mile 5.78) - 626.5 ft. Downstream of Penn Central R.R. - 627.0 ft.

The above flood elevations are on U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey Datum. I am inclosing pertinent information for the site that was extracted from the Flood Insurance Study. Inclosure 1 shows the water surface profiles for the 10-, 50-, 100- and 500-year events and Inclosure 2 shows the floodway required for the passage of a 100-year event.

I trust this information will meet your needs.
