ST. JOHN GAULBERT'S CHURCH, a not-for-profit religious corporation, having its principal office at No. 83 Gaulbert Avenue, Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, hereinafter referred to as the "Church,"

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Church is the owner of St. John Gaulbert School facilities located on Alexander Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York; and

Dear Mr. Johnson:

In response to your request for investigation of a "re-arrangement" of Storm and Drainage financing I provide the following data.

General Considerations:

- 1) The present arrangement of 8 small drainage districts and a large portion of the Town without districts precludes:
 - a) Use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds (other than for Highway related drainage).
 - b) Use of General Town Funds for any substantial drainage improvements.
- 2) Dissolution of these 8 districts would allow for:
 - a) No drainage districts leaving drainage as a General Fund item and thus qualifying also for use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds.
 - b) Creation of a Town Wide Drainage District (with a broader assessment base than General Fund Drainage) which, as a Special District, would not qualify for use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds.

Dissolution Procedures:

Section 209-r of Town Law deals with the details of dissolution. An outline of same:

1) A resolution calling for dissolution may be initiated by the Town Board and may provide for all debt service costs to be borne only by the areas presently in the existing indebted districts with only operation and maintenance becoming a General Town consideration.

- 2) A Public Hearing is required on the resolution.
- 3) The resolution is subject to a permissive referendum.
- 4) The resolution must be completed by August 1st to become effective on January 1st of the succeeding year.

After Dissolution:

If dissolution proceedings are effectively completed, Drainage automatically becomes a General Town item unless a Townwide District is created.

Although the creation of a Townwide Drainage District would preclude the use of Federal Revenue Sharing, I feel serious consideration should be given to same for several reasons:

- 1) Federal Revenue Sharing Funds (as the law reads presently) are available for a very wide base of Town needs and the restriction on drainage would not significantly impair the value of Federal Revenue Sharing to the Town.
- 2) A Townwide (excluding Village) Drainage District would allow taxation of a substantially broader assessment base (several assessment exemptions do not apply to a Drainage District). Some approximate figures as provided by the Assessor's office:

General Fund Tax Base (76 Budget) \$120,588,387
Townwide District Tax Base (76 Budget) 130,095,769
Assessment Base Increase \$ 9,507,382

A \$1 per thousand tax rate in such a Drainage District would provide \$130,000 in revenue while the same rate in the General Fund would provide only \$120,600 in revenue.

I will be happy to further discuss this matter with the Town Board if you request. Manipulations with Special Districts can be easily misinterpreted so I recommend very careful explanation of any procedures to all concerned.

Section 1. That this Town Board determine that it is in the public interest to adopt the following amendments to the Traffic Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, and State of New York, and said amendments are herewith adopted and enacted:

ARTICLE IV

Traffic Control Signals

Section 40 - is amended by deleting therefrom the following:

WALDEN AVENUE County Road No. 244 at DICK ROAD County Road No. 317

- (a) Automatic and Clock. 3 Sections, 1st section, 4 sides, 3 lights per side. 2nd section, 1 side, 3 lights facing west and south. 3rd section, 1 side, 3 lights facing east and north.
- (b) Normal operation fully automatic traffic control signal.

Section 40 - is amended by adding thereto the following:

WALDEN AVENUE County Road No. 244 at DICK ROAD County Road No. 317

- 1. This signal shall:
 - (a) Display vehicular faces on each approach as follows:

Faces 1, 2, 3, facing south on DICK ROAD

Faces 4, 5, 6, facing north on DICK ROAD

Faces 7, 8, 9, facing west on WALDEN AVENUE

Faces 10, 11, 12, facing east on WALDEN AVENUE

- (b) Operate as a full traffic actuated signal
- (c) Be equipped with the following:

Detectors located as follows:

- (1) DICK ROAD south of intersection associated with Phase A 1
- (2) DICK ROAD north of intersection associated with phase A 2
- (3) WALDEN AVENUE west of intersection associated with phase A 3 and B 4
- (4) WALDEN AVENUE east of intersection associated with phase A 4 and B 1
- (5) On inside northbound approach lane of DICK ROAD, south of the intersection associated with phase B 2
- (6) On inside southbound approach land of DICK ROAD, north of the intersection associated with phase B 1
- (7) On inside eastbound approach lane of WALDEN AVENUE, west of the intersection associated with phase B 4
- (8) On inside westbound approach lane of WALDEN AVENUE, east of the intersection associated with phase B 3
- (d) Verticle left and right green arrows, left and right yellow arrows, and left and right red arrows facing north and south on DICK ROAD and east and west on WALDEN AVENUE shall be displayed during appropriate interval of the signal cycle.

Section 2. Time to take effect.

- (a) These amendments shall take effect immediately except those parts, if any, which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of teh Vehicle and traffic Law of the State of New York.
- (b) Any part or parts of these amendments which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall take effect from and after the day on which approval in writing is received from the New York State Traffic Commission.

Section 3. Territorial Application

These amendments shall apply to all of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, outside of the Villages of Depew and Sloan.

Section 4. Publication and Posting

That these amendments to the Traffic Ordinance shall be entered in the minutes of this Town Board and shall be published in the DEPEW HERALD AND CHEEKTOWAGA NEWS and in the CHEEKTOWAGA TIMES, newspapers published in this Town, and a printed copy thereof shall be posted on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk pursuant to Subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law of the State of New York, and affidavits of such publication and posting shall be filed with the Town Clerk and the Town Clerk shall likewise enter in the Ordinance Book a copy of this amendment specifying the date of adoption thereof.

Basement or cellar floor drains: Cellar or basement flood drains shall connect into a deep seal trap so constructed that it can be readily cleaned and of a size not less than three inches in diamater. When subject to black-flow or back-pressure such drains may be equipped with an approved deep seal back-water trap of the automatic type not less than three inches in diamater or a stand-pipe not less than two inches in diamater and the same to be four feet above the cellar floor.

The main sanitary drain for any building may be installed hung below the first floor or installed under the cellar floor. Floor drains are not permitted. Laundry trays and washers installed in cellars shall have a gate valve for their waste lines. All plumbing fixtures installed in cellars and basements shall be on a branch line from the main sanitary drain and shall have a gate valve in this branch line to prevent flooding the event the street sanitary sewer becomes clogged. Such gate valves shall be closed at all times except when the fixtures are in use.

2. RESOLVED that Section 4, Subdivision 3 of the Plumbing and Drainage Ordinance which reads:

Sub-soil foundation, clear water and absorption tile drains:

- (A) Where above crown of storm sewer, these drains shall be connected to storm sewer, through a catch basin as may be approved by the Inspector.
- (B) Where below crown of storm sewer, these drains may be connected to sanitary sewer, through cellar drain, excepting in the cases where there exists a spring or other flowing body of water in which case special instructions shall be given by the Inspector and followed by the plumber.

In both cases (A) and (B) where sub-soil drains are placed under the cellar floor or used to encircle the outer walls of a building, the same shall be made of open-jointed drain tile or earthenware pipe, not less than three inches in diamater, and shall be properly trapped and protected against back pressure by an automatic back pressure valve accessibly located before entering stormsewer, house sewer or drain.

All buildings having cellars shall have an adequate sump and sump pump to which ant interior perimeter drain tile and floor drains shall discharge. Sum pumps shall discharge into a storm sewer. Where storm sewers are not available, sump pumps shall discharge into curb drains or road ditch. Weepers through cellar walls are not permitted.

BY-LAWS CHEEKTOWAGA-MARYVALE COMMUNITY CENTER ADVISORY BOARD

PREAMBLE

In accordance with the Agreement made June 2, 1975 between the Checktowaga-Maryvale Union Free School District and the Town of Checktowaga, the Town agrees to establish, maintain and operate a social/recreation center at 3409 Genesee Street (formerly the Metropolitan Insurance Company). To facilitate the operation of the social/recreation center, this Advisory Board has been established as per the Agreement. The Advisory Board shall have the authority to make recommendations to the Town Board regarding the operation of said social/recreation center. The recommendations of the Advisory Board shall not be binding upon the Town Board but shall be given due consideration.

In developing its recommendations, the Advisory Board must be cognizant of the Agreement limitations that no more than 500 square feet of the improvements, which exist or shall exist thereon, shall be used for office space unless approved by the Cheektowaga-Maryvale Board of Education.

The Agreement provides that the Town shall maintain in effect a comprehensive general liability insurance coverage policy which shall protect the members of the Advisory Board and all of their successors and assigns from liability which may at any time occur out of the establishment, maintenance and operation of the Cheektowaga-Maryvale Recreation Center and its activities.

The existence of the Advisory Board shall continue as long as the Agreement between the Town of Cheektowaga and the Cheektowaga-Maryvale School District shall continue. The Advisory Board may continue to exist, thereafter, with the approval of the Town Board. The by-laws of this Organization become effective upon their approval by the Town Board.

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this Organization shall be the Cheektowaga-Maryvale Recreation Center Advisory Board.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

- A. The primary objective of the Advisory Board is to develop recommendations for the Cheektowaga Town Board's information and use in establishing, maintaining and operating the Cheektowaga-Maryvale Recreation Center.
- B. To do the research and study necessary to develop the recommendations cited above.
- C. To provide communications channels between the Maryvale Board of Education, the Town Board and the Community as related to the establishing, maintenance and operation of the Cheektowaga-Maryvale Social Recreation Center.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

- A. The Advisory Board shall consist of six voting members, all residents of the Maryvale School District, three to be appointed by the Town Board and three appointed by the Board of Education.
- B. Initially, appointments shall be made one for one year, one for two years, one for three years to establish a rotational system. Subsequent appointments shall be three years in length. The Advisory Board shall work on a January 1 to December 31 year commencing January 1, 1976.
- C. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board making the initial appointment will appoint the replacement for the unexpired term.
- D. An Advisory Board member resigning from the Advisory Board shall tender his written resignation to the Chairperson of the Advisory Board for consideration at the next meeting. Upon acceptance of the resignation, the Advisory Board secretary will advise the initial appointing Board of the vacancy and request that a replacement be appointed.
- E. In the event a voting member is absent for three consecutive meetings, the secretary shall notify the respective appointing Board who may wish to consider replacing the individual.
- F. The Town of Cheektowaga Recreation Director, by virtue of said position shall be a non-voting ex-officio member of this Advisory Board and not eligible for appointment as a voting member.
- G. Resource personnel Where deemed by the Advisory Board to be beneficial in the fulfillment of the Advisory Board's function, various Town and/or School District personnel may be called upon to assist the Advisory Board with its activities.
- H. Generally the Advisory Board shall function as a "committee of the whole;" however, where deemed appropriate, a sub-committee can be appointed to research a specific tops:

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

- A. The officers of the Advisory Board shall be elected by a majority vote of the voting members of the Advisory Board. The election shall take place in January at the annual reorganization meeting.
 - B. The officers shall be Chairperson and Secretary.

(cont'd)

ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

A. The Chairperson shall:

- preside at all meetings of the Advisory Board.
- call special meetings in accordance with the by-laws.
- develop the agenda for each regular or special meeting.
- appoint sub-committee chairpersons with approval of this Advisory Board.

B. The Secretary shall:

- keep the minutes of the meeting and distribute a copy of the minutes and related materials to committee members and those designated for receipt of said minutes.
- maintain a roster of Advisory Board members and advise said members of meetings.
- contact individuals desired to function as resource personnel to insure their attendance.
- write all correspondence for the Advisory Board.

ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

- A. Regular meetings of the Advisory Board are scheduled bi-monthly. The annual schedule of regular meetings shall be established at the Annual Reorganization meeting held on the second Wednesday in January.
- B. All meetings of the Advisory Board at which action is to be taken are open to the general public.
- C. Executive or work sessions may on occasion, be utilized at which time only Advisory Board members or invited persons shall be present. These sessions are only for discussion purpose and no formal action shall be taken.
- D. Special meetings may be held upon the request of any Advisory Board member. The request to be made to the Chairperson who will delegate the request to the Secretary. The Secretary will notify all members and arrange a meeting within seven (7) calendar days after the receipt of the request. Written notice to be mailed for all regular and special meetings at least four (4) days before the meeting.
- E. A quorum shall consist of four (4) or more voting members of the Advisory Board.
- F. Board meetings shall be conducted according to Robert's Revised Rules of Order. All voting members including the Chairperson and Secretary shall have the right to make and second motions and vote upon all actions before this Board.
- G. Action to pass a motion shall be upon the majority affirmative vote of the voting members.

ARTICLE VII - REPORTS

- A. The Advisory Board will make a minimum of one annual report to the Town Board during the month of June. Copies of the report to be sent to the School Board. The report to contain the Advisory Board's recommendations concerning the establishing, maintaining and operation of the Cheektowaga-Maryvale Recreation Center for the coming fiscal year. The June date may be delayed with the consent of the Town Board but in all cases, must be in the hands of the Town Board in time for due consideration to be given in budget planning.
- B. Other reports may be given to the Town Board, with copies to the School Board, where deemed desirable by the Advisory Board or requested by the Town or School Boards.

ARTICLE VIII - BY-LAWS & AMENDMENTS

- A. These By-Laws become effective upon their acceptance and approval by the Cheektowaga Town Board.
- B. The By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the Advisory Board's voting members and upon the amendment's acceptance and approval by the Cheektowaga Town Board.

CASE FOOD SERVICES, INC., a domestic corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, having its principal office for the transaction of business at 1810 Dale Road, Cheektowaga, New York, party of the second part, hereinafter referred to as "Concessionaire."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town is the owner of the Cheektowaga Recreation Center located in the Cheektowaga Town Park, Cheektowaga, New York, and

WHEREAS, the Concessionaire submitted a bid for the Food Concession at said Recreation Center; and the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga having awarded said Food Concession to the Concessionaire by Resolution dated the 20th day of January, 1975

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Town hereby grants a license to the Concessionaire for the period commencing the 3 day of following, 1975 and terminating the 30th day of June, 1977, with the option and privilege to the Town to renew said license for an additional two (2) years, to use and occupy the concession room, including

a storage room, located at the Cheektowaga Recreation Center, Cheektowaga Town Park, Cheektowaga, New York.

- 2. The Concessionaire shall have the exclusive right and privilege to sell, vend, serve and dispense, in the above referred to concession room, food, ice cream, hot and cold beverages, confections, pop-corn, tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, and other related items for on-premises consumption, but excepting, however, intoxicating liquors.
- 3. The Concessionaire agrees to operate his concession daily from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. from September 1 through May 30; and daily during all hours that the recreational facilities are in operation and being used by the public from June 1 through August 31.
- 4. The Concessionaire agrees to furnish for his concession all necessary furniture, fixtures and equipment to adequately and properly serve the public; and the Concessionaire acknowledges and agrees that any and all cooking must be done electrically; and that no open fire cooking is allowed.
- 5. The Concessionaire agrees to keep the concession area and all areas used by the consuming public in a clean and sanitary condition; and that all rubbish, waste and garbage, wet or dry, shall be kept in a tightly covered container or containers and said rubbish, waste and garbage shall be removed daily from the premises.
- 6. The Concessionaire agrees to comply with all laws, rules and regulations of any municipal authority applicable to his concession.
- 7. The Concessionaire agrees not to post any signs of any type whatsoever, other than on the inner or inside limits of the concession area; and that said permitted signs shall not be attached to the inner walls or parts thereof without first

obtaining the written permission of the Town and/or the Human Resources Committee of the Town of Cheektowaga.

- 8. The Concessionaire agrees that no structural changes shall be made to the areas assigned to him, nor shall any fixtures or equipment be affixed to the building without first obtaining the written permission of the Town and/or Human Resources Committee of the Town of Cheektowaga; however, Concessionaire agrees to put, maintain and insure that the areas assigned to him are in keeping with the decor of the recreational facility itself.
- 9. The Town agrees to supply light, heat, power and water service for the usage of the Concessionaire in the areas assigned to him.
- 10. The Concessionaire agrees to return the areas assigned to him, at the termination of this License Agreement, in the same condition as at the commencement of the term of said License, normal wear and tear excepted.
- 11. The Concessionaire agrees that no adjustment shall be made in its favor, nor may a claim by it against the Town be based, upon any shut-down of the said Recreation Center caused by weather, faulty construction or equipment or for any reason whatsoever other than by the gross negligence of the Town.
- 12. The Concessionaire agrees not to assign or sublet the license hereby granted to any other person, firm or corporation without first obtaining the written consent of the Town and/or the Human Resources Committee of the Town of Cheektowaga.
- 13. The Concessionaire agrees to assume all risk of loss to property owned, leased or used by it, whether arising out of loss by fire, theft, inclemency of weather or otherwise.
- 14. The Concessionaire agrees to take out, assume and pay for public liability insurance, in an amount determined sufficient by the Town, indemnifying and holding harmless the

Town against loss by reason of negligence of the Concessionaire; and said liability insurance is to include "products liability" coverage.
