Attached are copies of letters from Police Captain Theodore DeFerichis and Central Garage Foreman, George Burst recommending car wash be done at Delta Sonic.



Dear Mr. Bossert:

In view of the Town of Cheektowaga sanitary sewer remedial efforts in Town Sanitary Sewer Districts #3 and #5, it is requested that you amend your order to permit a limited number of sewer taps to be issued in these districts.

Reports on overflows and by-passes were submitted to your office in accordance with the amended order of consent for the period ending June 30, 1976.

Wastewater Treatment Plant #3 is scheduled for phase out in the fall of 1977 at which time wastewater flows will be directed into the Erie County Sewer District #4 trunk sewer. In November-December 1975 remedial work in the amount of \$55,324. was performed. Substantial I/I correction was involved; however, at that time no numerical estimates were made for flows removed. Applying conservative estimates to these thirty-three (33) repairs a removal of 57,900 gpd is arrived at. This is equivalent to one hundred, sixty-five (165) tap-ins. The Town Board at its July 9, 1976 meeting awarded a sanitary sewer repair contract in Sewer District #3 to correct an inflow of approximately 5,760 gpd. This is equivalent to sixteen (16) tap-ins. Enclosed is a summary of the above mentioned work together with flow estimates. The Town Consulting Engineering Firm of Nussbaumer and Clarke recently completed a Sewer System Evaluation Survey for this Cheektowaga Sanitary Sewer District #3. This report is being submitted to appropriate State and Federal Agencies and will serve as the guideline for sewer remedial work in the district.

In Sanitary Sewer District #5 sewer repair work was awarded in December 1975 at a cost of \$3,975. Work was completed; however, no numerical figures were completed at that time for I/I removal. Applying conservative estimates to these seven (7) repairs gives us a removal of 11,460 gpd or thirty-three (33) tap-in equivalents. At its meeting of July 9, 1976 the Town Board awarded a sewer repair contract for this sewer district in the amount of \$4,050. It is estimated that this work will remove I/I of 24,250 gpd. This is equivalent to sixty-nine (69) tap-ins. Enclosed is a photocopy of two (2) points of infiltration that will be corrected. One (1) photo shows two (2) streams and the other a steady spray. Also enclosed is a summary of the remedial work mentioned herein. Continual sewer cleaning is being performed in the district. In addition, to supplement this work a contract for cleaning some forty-two thousand feet (42,000') of sanitary sewer trunks and laterals was awarded on June 21, 1976 to an outside contractor. Work was started and is continuing. Cost is \$15,700. Smoke testing is continuing. Additional sewer remedial work is planned for next month. The Town was recently notified that an E.P.A. construction grant for Phase I of the Sewer District #5 project was approved in the amount of \$3,344,000. This is for the construction of the Northeast Interceptor Trunk Sewer which will provide relief to Sanitary Sewer District #7 and for extension of sewer service to an as yet unsewered area east of the Greater Buffalo International Airport. Bidding and contract awarding is planned for early fall 1976. Completion is expected by January 1977.

We request that your orders for both Sanitary Sewer Districts #3 and #5 be amended to permit twenty (20) permits for each district for the balance of this calendar year. Where permit allocations are not used up during 1976, we would like to carry any leftover into the following year. Additional sewer remedial work is planned this year to compensate for these permits.

A determination having been made with specified conditions relative to the Town of Cheektowaga District No. 3 and No. 5 sanitary sewer systems have changed since the Order was issued by the Commissioner of Environmental Quality on December 5, 1975, and as stated in the attached Report of Findings made August 13, 1976.

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Commissioner of Environmental Quality of the County of Erie,

I DO HEREBY ORDER AND DIRECT:

THAT not more than the following schedule of tap-in equivalents will be allowed during each six (6) month period beginning on the effective date of this order:

- A. Twenty (20) new tap-in equivalents in Cheektowaga Sewer District No. 3.
- B. Twenty (20) new tap-in equivalents in Cheektowaga Sewer District No. 5.
- C. No new tap-in equivalents in Cheektowaga Sewer District No. 7.

THAT the respondent must not permit tap-ins without submitting monthly reports, of said tap-ins that are issued, to the Erie County Department of Environmental Quality.

THAT the respondent will not permit tap-ins without submitting a quarterly report on the progress of remedial work showing the location, type of correction, and anticipated or actual inflow/infiltration removal. Said inflow/infiltration removal must exceed five (5) times the proposed tap-in equivalent flow addition for the same period.




THAT the Town of Cheektowaga shall, where feasible, continue to monitor and report to the Erie County Department of Environmental Quality on a monthly basis the frequency, duration, date, and volume of overflows and bypasses in the Town of Cheektowaga Districts No. 3, 5, and all tributary Districts.

THAT the Town of Cheektowaga shall continue to take all steps necessary to control all overflows, bypasses, or back-ups of sewage in the Town of Cheektowaga Sewer System to minimize their occurrence and effect on the environment.

This Order supersedes the previous Order for said Districts dated December 5, 1975.

1. Overflows or pumped discharges continue to occur in Cheektowaga Sewer Districts No. 3 and No. 5 as reported monthly by the Town of Cheektowaga.
2. Reduction of cost effective I & I is proceeding in Cheektowaga Sewer Districts No. 3 and No. 5 as outlined in a July 27, 1976, letter from the Cheektowaga Town Engineer.
3. Progress is continuing on a plan to substantially eliminate discharges within Sewer Districts No. 3, 5 and all tributary districts in conformity with Section 6, Article IV-A, Erie County Environmental Quality Code. This information is outlined in a letter dated July 27, 1976, from the Cheektowaga Town Engineer.
4. The addition of twenty (20) additional tap-in equivalents in each district during each six (6) month period will conform to the requirements of Section 6, Article IV-A, Erie County Environmental Quality Code.

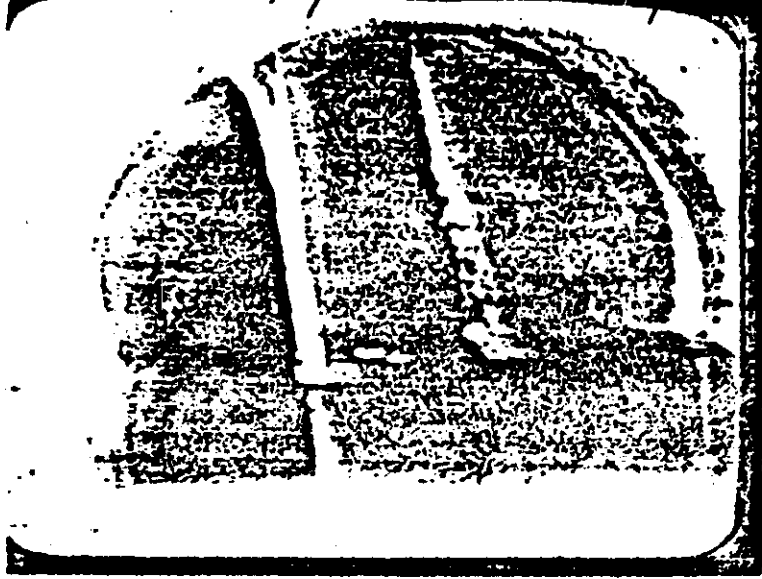



VI - Sick Leave (continued)

Employees who are unable to perform their duties because of injuries or disease received in the course of their employment shall receive Workmen's Compensation benefits according to the Law, and, in addition, shall receive a supplemental sum from the Town by separate check, which shall be the difference between his regular salary and the Workmen's Compensation benefits and such supplemental sums shall be deducted from his accumulated sick leave at the rate of one-third (1/3) day per day of absence due to injury or upon total use of accumulated sick leave, shall be deducted from vacation credits.

An employee who is unable to perform the duties of his employment on account of illness other than Workmen's Compensation benefits, or is quarantined by health authorities or for the purpose of reporting to a doctor with reference to an employment - connected illness shall receive paid sick leave.

Regular full-time employees shall be granted sick leave at the rate of one and one half (1 1/2) days per month which shall accumulate to a maximum of two hundred sixty-two (262) days. An employee must have been compensated or credited with at least five (5) days of work in a month in order to be credited with sick leave accrual for that month.

Each employee shall receive a written record of his accumulated sick leave at the end of each calendar year.

The Town Board, by act or resolution, may authorize extended sick leave payments for sick leave where an employee has exhausted all of his accrued sick leave and any other paid leave benefit (personal leave, vacations, etc.); however, such payment shall not exceed fifteen (15) days, and must be repaid to the Town upon return to service.

No sick leave shall be authorized and no payment shall be made unless the employee shall have notified his immediate supervisor of his absence and the reason therefore at the earliest opportunity prior to the time he is scheduled to report for work and his anticipated date of return.

If a man is furloughed, or his position is terminated, sick leave shall be reinstated as accumulated therefore, providing he returns to work within one (1) year.

If an employee is absent for three (3) consecutive days, the Department Head may require a medical report attesting to the employee's illness before he shall be paid for those days. If any employee is absent the day before and the day after a normal weekend, the day before and the day after a holiday or holiday weekend, such an absence shall be considered as three (3) consecutive days of absence for purpose of this section.

No more than five (5) employees in any department shall be granted personal leave at any time.

**IX - Bereavement Leave**

In the event of death in the family of an employee or his spouse, parents, children, sister, brother, grandparents, grandchildren, father-in-law, mother-in-law, sister-in-law, or brother-in-law, the employee shall be granted five (5) consecutive days without loss of pay. If a death occurs during the regular work day, the day will not be charged as one of the five.

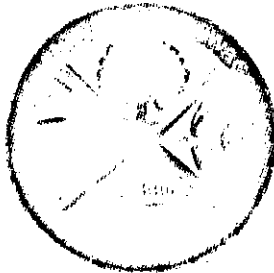

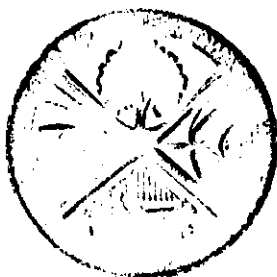
