THIS AGREEMENT, made on the date referred to above in Box 3, by and between the party of the first part, a political subdivision of the State of New York, identified in Box 1 above, and hereinafter referred to as the MUNICIPALITY, acting by and through the executive or executive body hereinabove identified in Box 2, as authorized by resolution duly adopted by the MUNICIPALITY, a certified copy of which is attached hereto, and the Governor of the State of New York, acting for the State of New York, by and through the Interdepartmental Traffic Safety Committee, hereinafter referred to as the COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has enacted Public Law 89-564, as amended, entitled "An Act to Provide for a Coordinated National Highway Safety Program Through Financial Assistance to the States to Accelerate Highway Traffic Safety Programs, and for Other Purposes," and

WHEREAS, the COMMITTEE has been designated by the Governor, by Executive Order No. 22, dated April 27, 1967, pursuant to Article 16 A of the Executive Law, to act in his behalf and to represent and act for the State in dealing with the Secretary of Transportation for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of said Public Law 89-564, as amended, and

WHEREAS, the Regional National Highway Traffic Safety and the Division Federal Highway Administrators have approved the State's current Highway Safety Work Program and said Program contains a subelement embracing the COMMITTEE approved project described on the attached HS-1 application, and

WHEREAS, the total cost of said project is as stipulated in Box 4 above, of which sum the Federal Government, through the National Highway Traffic Safety and the Federal Highway Administrations, by their approval of the State's Annual Highway Safety Work Program, has obligated itself to pay the State of New York funds equal to or greater than the amount stated in Box 5, above, and

WHEREAS, by Chapter 50 of the Laws of 1976, funds have been appropriated by the State for payment in the first instance by the State of the share of the Federal Government of the cost of implementing projects and programs in accordance with the provisions of said Public Law 89-564, as amended, and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY hereby assures the COMMITTEE that it has available sufficient funds to meet its share of the cost of the project, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government will pay to the State funds equal to or greater than the amount stated in Box 5, and that the amount stated in Box 5 will be applied to this project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

1. The MUNICIPALITY hereby agrees to complete the project described in Box 6 "Description of Project" pursuant to the terms of this agreement.

2. The COMMITTEE hereby agrees to cause to have advanced to the MUNICIPALITY the sum of money hereinabove referred to as "Committee Assistance" in Box 5 above, subject to the provisions of Paragraph 3 hereof, at such time as a certificate of approval of availability has been issued by the Director of the Budget, and a copy of such certificate has been filed with the State Comptroller, the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and the Chairman of the Assembly Ways and Means Committee. Should the Federal Government disallow or disapprove for any reason any portion or all of the Federal aid advanced by the State, the MUNICIPALITY shall reimburse the State in full for all expenditures advanced by the State but disallowed by the Federal Government. Should the MUNICIPALITY fail to repay the State within one year after notice of such disapproval or disallowance, the COMMITTEE may request the State Comptroller to withhold from State assistance to which the MUNICIPALITY would otherwise be entitled, an amount sufficient to reimburse the State in full, and shall credit the same to the State Corporations Fund in repayment of such advance.

3. The COMMITTEE hereby agrees to cause to be transferred to the MUNICIPALITY a sum of money, not to exceed the amount hereinabove referred to as "Committee Assistance" in Box 5 above, for the execution of the above described project, as follows:

(a) Upon the submission to the COMMITTEE of a description of that portion of the project planned to be undertaken by the MUNICIPALITY during the succeeding three month period, together with a detailed estimate of the cost of such portion of the project, and upon the COMMITTEE'S approval of such description and estimate, and upon the approval of vouchers submitted to and audited by the State Comptroller, the COMMITTEE shall cause to be transferred to the MUNICIPALITY the Federal Government's share of such cost, but the amount so transferred for any three month period, for any portion of the project for which the MUNICIPALITY has not, in fact, made payment or become obligated to make payment, shall not exceed the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000); and or

b. When, upon submission of proof, as required by the COMMITTEE, the COMMITTEE determines that the MUNICIPALITY has paid all or any part of the total cost of the project, and upon the approval of vouchers submitted to and audited by the State Comptroller, the COMMITTEE shall cause to be transferred to the MUNICIPALITY that part of such payment which constitutes the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's share thereof and which has not been theretofore transferred to the MUNICIPALITY.

4. It is understood and agreed that any monies received by the State from the Federal Government for the project which is the subject of this agreement shall be applied to reimburse the State for any advances made pursuant to this agreement and pursuant to the appropriation set forth in Section 2 of Chapter 50 of the Laws of 1976 with respect to State highway safety programs under the Federal Highway Safety Act of 1966.

5. The MUNICIPALITY shall maintain satisfactory financial accounts, documents and records, which shall be made available to the COMMITTEE and the State Comptroller for auditing at reasonable times. Such accounts, documents and records shall be retained by the MUNICIPALITY for three (3) years following project termination.

6. Should the MUNICIPALITY abandon or fail to complete the project as heretofore described, for any reason or cause other than a national emergency or an Act of God, all monies advanced by the COMMITTEE to the MUNICIPALITY shall be repaid to the COMMITTEE by the MUNICIPALITY. Should the MUNICIPALITY fail to repay the COMMITTEE within one (1) year after demand, the COMMITTEE may request the State Comptroller to withhold from State assistance to which the MUNICIPALITY would otherwise be entitled, an amount sufficient to reimburse the COMMITTEE in full.

7. The MUNICIPALITY shall execute and complete the approved project in accordance with the time schedule set forth in the project proposal. Failure to render satisfactory progress or to complete this project to the satisfaction of the COMMITTEE may be cause for the suspension of all obligations of the COMMITTEE or State under this agreement.

8. Contracts entered into by the MUNICIPALITY shall be awarded in accordance with the provisions of all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules and regulations.

9. The MUNICIPALITY shall secure completion of the work in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and shall secure compliance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws and regulations.

10. The MUNICIPALITY shall permit periodic site visits by COMMITTEE personnel to insure work progress in accordance with the approved project, including a final inspection upon project completion.

11. In the event Federal funds should not be available for future stages of the project, the MUNICIPALITY shall bring the project to a point of usefulness to be agreed upon by the COMMITTEE and the MUNICIPALITY.

12. All significant deviations from the project proposal shall be submitted to the COMMITTEE for prior approval.

13. The acquisition cost of real property shall be based upon the appraisal of a competent appraiser. The reports of such appraisers shall be available for inspection by the COMMITTEE upon request.

14. Development plans and specifications shall be available for review by the COMMITTEE upon request.

15. The MUNICIPALITY shall promptly submit such reports as the COMMITTEE may request.

16. Property and facilities acquired or developed pursuant to this agreement shall be available for inspection by COMMITTEE personnel upon request.

17. Interest earned on funds granted pursuant to this agreement shall not be available for expenditure by the MUNICIPALITY, but shall be turned over to the COMMITTEE.

18. The MUNICIPALITY may unilaterally rescind this agreement at any time prior to the transfer of any funds pursuant to this agreement. After any such funds have been transferred, this agreement may be rescinded, modified or amended only by mutual agreement.

19. Failure by the MUNICIPALITY to comply with the terms of this agreement or any similar agreement may be cause for the suspension of all obligations of the COMMITTEE or State hereunder.

20. Failure by the MUNICIPALITY to comply with the terms of this agreement shall not be cause for the suspension of all obligations of the COMMITTEE or State hereunder if, in the judgment of the COMMITTEE, such failure was due to no fault of the MUNICIPALITY. In such case, any amount required to settle at minimum costs any irrevocable obligations properly incurred shall be eligible for assistance under this agreement.

21. No official or employee of the MUNICIPALITY who is authorized in his official capacity to negotiate, make, accept or approve, or to take part in such decisions regarding a contract or subcontract in connection with the project, shall have any financial or other personal interest in any such contract or subcontract.

22. No person performing services for the MUNICIPALITY in connection with this project shall have a financial or other personal interest, other than his employment or retention by the MUNICIPALITY, in any contract or subcontract in connection with this project. No officer or employee of such person retained by the MUNICIPALITY shall have any financial or other personal interest in any real property acquired for this project, unless such interest is openly disclosed upon the public records of the MUNICIPALITY and such officer, employee or person has not participated in the acquisition for or on behalf of the MUNICIPALITY.

23. No member of or delegate to Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or to any benefit to arise hereupon, unless such benefit shall be in the form of an agreement made with a corporation for its general benefit.

24. The MUNICIPALITY shall be responsible for enforcing the above conflict of interest provisions.

25. No officer or employee of the MUNICIPALITY whose principal employment is in connection with any activity which is financed in whole or in part pursuant to the agreement shall take part in any of the political activity prescribed in the Hatch Political Activity Act, 5 U.S.C. 118k (1958), with the exceptions therein enumerated.

26. The MUNICIPALITY shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, creed, color or national origin in the use of any property or facility acquired or developed pursuant to this agreement, and shall comply with, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000 d-42 U.S.C. 2000 d-4, and all applicable requirements pursuant to the Regulations of the Department of Transportation (Title 49, Code of Fed. Reg., Subtitle A, Part 21). The Municipality further agrees that it will comply with the provisions of Executive Order 11246 dated September 24, 1965 as amended by Executive Order 11375 dated October 13, 1967.

27. It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto, and the Department of Labor Regulations (41 CFR Chap. 60) that this agreement shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the monies therefor, and that no liability on account of the said agreement shall be incurred by the COMMITTEE or the State beyond the monies available for the purposes herein.

28. The MUNICIPALITY hereby agrees to the Waiver of Immunity Clause provided in Sections 139-a and 139-b of the New York State Finance Law, which requires that upon the refusal of a person, when called before a grand jury, head of a state department, temporary state commission, or other state agency, or the organized crime task force in the Department of Law, which is empowered to compel the attendance of witnesses and examine them under oath, to testify in an investigation concerning any transaction or contract had with the State, any political subdivision thereof, a public authority or with any public department, agency or official of the State or of any political subdivision thereof or of a public authority, to sign a waiver of immunity against subsequent criminal prosecution or to answer any relevant question concerning such transaction or contract

(a) such person and any firm, partnership or corporation of which he is a member, partner, director or officer shall be disqualified from thereafter selling to or submitting bids to or receiving awards from or entering into any contracts with New York State or any public department, agency or official thereof, for goods, works or services, for a period of five years after such refusal and

(b) any and all contracts made with the State of New York or any public department, agency or official thereof, since the effective date of this law, by such person and by any firm, partnership, or corporation of which he is a member, partner, director or officer may be cancelled or terminated by New York State without incurring any penalty or damages on account of such cancellation or termination, but any monies owing by the State of New York for goods delivered or work done prior to the cancellation or termination may be paid.

29. The MUNICIPALITY agrees not to assign, transfer, convey or otherwise dispose of this contract or any part thereof or of its right, title, or interest therein, or its power to execute such contract, to any other person, company or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the COMMITTEE.

30. A. The MUNICIPALITY shall incorporate, or cause to be incorporated, into all contracts the following provisions:

(a) By submission of this bid, each bidder and each person signing on behalf of any bidder certifies, and in the case of a joint bid each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, under penalty of perjury, that to the best of his knowledge and belief:

(1) The prices in this bid have been arrived at independently without collusion, consultation, communication, or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices with any other bidder or with any competitor;

(2) Unless otherwise required by law, the prices which have been quoted in this bid have not been knowingly disclosed by the bidder and will not knowingly be disclosed by the bidder prior to opening, directly or indirectly to any other bidder or to any competitor; and

(3) No attempt has been made or will be made by the bidder to induce any other person, partnership or corporation to submit or not to submit a bid for the purpose of restricting competition.

(b) A bid shall not be considered for award nor shall any award be made where (a) (1) (2) and (3) above have not been complied with; provided, however, that if in any case the bidder cannot make the foregoing certification, the bidder shall so state and shall furnish with the bid a signed statement which sets forth in detail the reasons therefore. Where (a) (1) (2) and (3) above have not been complied with, the bid shall not be considered for award nor shall any award be made unless the head of the purchasing unit of the state, public department or agency to which the bid is made, or his designee, determines that such disclosure was not made for the purpose of restricting competition.

The fact that a bidder (a) has published price lists, rates, or tariffs covering items being procured, (b) has informed prospective customers of proposed or pending publication of new or revised price lists for such items, or (c) has sold the same items to other customers at the same prices being bid, does not constitute, without more, a disclosure within the meaning of subparagraph one (a).

B. Any bid hereafter made to the MUNICIPALITY, agency or official thereof by a corporate bidder for work or services performed or to be performed or goods sold or to be sold, where competitive bidding is required by statute, rule or regulation, and where such bid contains the certification referred to in subdivision one of this section, shall be deemed to have been authorized by the board of directors or the bidder, and such authorization shall be deemed to include the signing and submission of the bid and the inclusion therein of the certificate as to non-collusion as the act and deed of the corporation.

31. During the performance of this contract, the MUNICIPALITY agrees as follows:

32. During the performance of the contract, the MUNICIPALITY, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest, agrees as follows:

(a) Compliance with Regulations: The MUNICIPALITY, will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d-42 U.S.C. 2000d-4 and all applicable requirements pursuant to the Regulations of the Department of Transportation (Title 49, Fed. Reg. Subtitle A, Part 21). The Municipality will further comply with the provisions of Executive Order 11246 dated September 24, 1965 as amended by Executive Order 11375 dated October 13, 1967 and the Department of Labor Regulations (41 CFR Chap. 60).

(b) Nondiscrimination: The MUNICIPALITY, with regard to the work performed by it after award and prior to completion of the contract work, will not discriminate on the ground of race, creed, color, or national origin in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment.

(c) Solicitations: In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the MUNICIPALITY for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor, supplier, or lessor shall be notified by the MUNICIPALITY of the MUNICIPALITY'S obligations under the contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the ground of race, color, or national origin.

The applicant agency agrees to insert the following equal opportunity provisions in all contracts, the total amount of which equals or exceeds \$20,000, awarded by it pursuant to the subject Highway Safety Program project (the provisions may be modified to clearly identify the parties):



SCHEDULE A

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION

The Town of Cheektowaga, with it's population of over 133,000 population, covers 29.32 square miles and has 222.3 miles of roads and highways, including the intersection of Walden Ave. (C.R. 244) and Union Rd. (N.Y. 277), as per the N.Y.S.D.O.T. the heaviest traveled intersection in upstate New York. In the past 3 years the Town of Cheektowaga has had a marked increase in bicycle and pedestrian involved accidents. In the period from 1973 to 1975 there were 329 bicycle involved accidents with 3 fatalities: there were also 203 pedestrian involved accidents with 7 fatalities.

In the period from 1968 to 1972 there were 6 fatal bicycle accidents and 11 fatal pedestrian accidents.

With Cheektowaga's large population of younger persons and with the marked increase in bicycle involved accidents, either through carelessness, ignorance of the fundamental precepts of traffic safety or through inattention. We feel this has contributed significantly to this increase.

There are 4 school districts entirely within the Town of Cheektowaga. These encompass 27 different school buildings at various locations throughout the town. In addition to the 4 districts within the town, there are 3 school districts in the surrounding towns that have a large percentage of Cheektowaga residents as students who would also be involved in this program. These towns do not have Traffic Safety Officers. The Town of Cheektowaga recently assigned one man to the school traffic safety program but he is dependent upon availability of a vehicle for transportation. These vehicles, being passenger types, when available, provide little storage room for the various types of equipment and training aids so necessary for an effective safety education program.

SOLUTION:

To expose a possible 18,000 children from Kindergarten through 8th grade ages to a safe bicycle driver program, to alert the students of the traffic laws and safe rules and practices and defensive driving principles.

To inform Senior Citizens of their responsibilities when they become pedestrians. To renew the Senior Citizens awareness of the pedestrians "Rules of the Road".

To contact and expose the various bicycle touring clubs throughout the town of their responsibility when they are riding their bicycles on public roads.

To educate the various scout groups and other civic organizations to their responsibilities related to bicycle and pedestrian safety.

To utilize, through the use of a mobile unit assigned and equipped specifically for bicycle and traffic safety, time and energy presenting a structured program of bicycle and traffic safety.

OBJECTIVE:

To present bicycle and pedestrian safety programs in the 4 school districts entirely within the Town of Cheektowaga and into the 3 school districts in the surrounding towns with a large Cheektowaga student population. To reduce all types of bicycle and pedestrian accidents within the various school districts by 15%.

OPERATIONAL PLAN:

The program for bicycle safety will consist of slide presentations showing potentially dangerous situations for Bicycle Drivers. The officer will explain the danger and inform the students of the proper procedure for avoiding the dangerous situation.

The officer will implement a system for keeping accident records for bicycle and pedestrian accidents, this will be by school districts. This system will enable the officer to determine the areas that need further more intense bicycle and pedestrian safety education.

To gather, through the use of these statistics, information as to the most dangerous type of violation that causes the most bicycle and automobile accidents and inform the students of these violations.

Handouts will be given showing the proper care and maintenance of bicycles and proper bicycle driving habits.

The films and certain equipment obtained, (35 MM sound movie projector, slide projector and the training aids and charts) will be available to loan out to various groups. A program will be implemented during the summer months, in conjunction with the town recreation departments Saturday film fest, showing bicycle and pedestrian safety films. Groups included in this after school program will be Senior Citizens, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies, Camp Fire Girls and Bicycle Touring Groups.

The Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Films and the various charts and graphs will be on public display at the various malls in town at certain times during the year. Handouts showing "Rules of the Road", proper care and maintenance of bicycles and pedestrian safety will be given out at these times.

The use of the mobile safety education unit will enable the officer to visit the schools in a orderly manner, contacting the maximum number of students with little or no delay. The officer will patrol the school areas prior to and immediately after school, checking bicycle and pedestrian safety procedures being used.

When the officer would not be delivering the bicycle safety program, he would deliver programs on traffic safety. This would be on a scale of approximately 65% bicycle safety to 35% traffic safety.

Through the use of the training aids and poster material, the officer will show through the use of the posters:

BICYCLE SAFETY

1. a set of posters showing the "Rules of the Road". (15 posters)
2. a set of posters showing proper riding habits and skills. (15 posters)
3. a set of posters on the "don'ts of bicycle riding. (15 posters)
4. a set of posters showing proper care and maintenance of bicycle. (10 posters)
5. a set of posters geared for the various scout groups - key posters. (20 posters)

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

1. a set of posters showing "Rules of the Road for Pedestrians". (15 posters)
2. a set of posters on the "don'ts" of pedestrian safety. (15 posters)
3. a set of posters for Senior Citizen pedestrian safety. (20 posters)
4. a set of posters geared for the various groups, scouts, etc. (20 posters)
5. a set of miscellaneous posters for other types of safety - winter, swimming, school bus, etc. (30 posters)

These posters will be 40"x30", they will be of appropriate cartoon characters and will be drawn by the assigned officer in his off-duty hours. This allows 2 hours per week at \$10.00 per hour. It also allows \$400.00 for poster board. By enabling the officer to work in his off-duty time, he will be able to make almost daily improvements or corrections to the artwork as needed, keeping up with changing situations and freeing his on-duty time for educating students to bicycle and pedestrian safety.

11. July 31, 1977.....Final Bike Rodeo.
12. First quarterly report due 3 months after start of program.
13. Second, third and fourth reports due every three months from first report.

EVALUATION

A decrease in both bicycle and pedestrian accidents of 15% is expected. Results of this program will be available through the Cheektowaga Police Accident Records Bureau and the bicycle and pedestrian accident records system implemented with this program.

There will be an end of year review of the program to establish a pattern that will be used to establish a permanent schedule.

Evaluation of the mobile equipment and other equipment will be through a survey of individuals who visit the equipment at public displays and evaluate their input.

A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT, made as of the 1st day of November, 1976, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, Erie County, New York a domestic municipal corporation, with offices at Broadway and Union Roads, Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "TOWN"

AND

The ERIE COUNTY CHAPTER, NEW YORK STATE ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED CHILDREN, INC., a civic and charitable organization, with offices at 470 Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "ASSOCIATION".

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, the Association, in cooperation with the TOWN, is desirous of operating and maintaining a youth recreation program for retarded children, and

WHEREAS, the Town is a municipality eligible to receive state aid and reimbursement of expenditures from the State of New York for sponsoring a "Youth Recreation Project", and

WHEREAS, the Town will appropriate the sum of \$1,040.00 for said "Youth Recreation Project",

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

1. The TOWN will sponsor a Youth Recreation Project and pay to the ASSOCIATION a sum not to exceed \$1,040.00 during the term of this Agreement for the operation and maintenance of a youth development recreational program to be staffed by community volunteers. as sponsor of the project in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Executive Law of the State of New York.

The amount paid by the TOWN will be paid as follows:

The ASSOCIATION will submit all expenses incurred on duly authorized vouchers accompanied by bill, receipt and copy of purchase order. Upon receipt of the vouchers, the TOWN will then process all approved expenditures for payment.

3. The ASSOCIATION agrees to operate said project utilizing community volunteers and to provide the said volunteers with all training necessary for them to accomplish their work. The project shall be open to all youths regardless of race, color or creed.

4. The ASSOCIATION agrees to carry out the terms of this Agreement in accordance with the Division for Youth Act and the rules and regulations of the Cheektowaga Youth Board and the State Division for Youth; and the project will be operated in compliance with all laws and the Constitution of the State of New York.

5. The ASSOCIATION agrees to provide the community volunteers with budgeting assistance and program consultation for said project.

6. The ASSOCIATION agrees to provide liability insurance coverage for specific program locations, volunteers and staff of said project.

7. Except with relation to the duties normally accepted and imposed upon the ASSOCIATION, this Agreement shall constitute the full and complete obligation of the parties hereto.

8. This Agreement is contingent and conditional upon approval of required renewal applications and acceptance by the New York State Division for Youth.

9. This Agreement will cover Fiscal Year 1977.

The amount paid by the TOWN, in accordance with paragraph 1., constitutes the TOWN'S full and complete obligation with regard to this Agreement and all consequences arising therefrom, except the TOWN shall be entitled to apply for state aid and reimbursement of expenditures as sponsor of the project in accordance with the applicable provisions of

the Executive Law of the State of New York.

The amount paid by the TOWN will be paid as follows:

The AGENCY will submit expenses incurred on a quarterly basis on duly authorized vouchers to the TOWN. Upon receipt of the vouchers, the TOWN will pay the AGENCY for services rendered during the quarter.

3. The AGENCY'S share of the project expenses will be twenty-five (25) per cent of the total costs and expenses incurred, not to exceed \$7690.00. The TOWN will bill the AGENCY for the AGENCY'S share of the project expenses upon payment by the TOWN of expenses incurred during the final quarter.

4. The AGENCY agrees to operate a Youth Service Project whereby school drop-outs and potential school drop-outs within the TOWN, regardless of race, color or creed, will receive vocational, educational and personal adjustment counseling.

5. The AGENCY agrees to carry out the terms of this agreement in accordance with the Division for Youth Act and the rules and regulations of the Cheektowaga Youth Board and the State Division for Youth; and the project will be operated in compliance with all laws and the Constitution of the State of New York.

6. The AGENCY agrees to hire as its own employees any and all personnel required to implement and effectuate the operation of the Youth Services Project.

7. Except with relation to the duties normally accepted and imposed upon the AGENCY, this Agreement shall constitute the full and complete obligation of the parties hereto.

8. This Agreement is contingent and conditioned upon approval of required renewal applications and acceptance by the New York State Division for Youth.

9. This agreement will cover the period from January 1, 1977 to December 31, 1977.





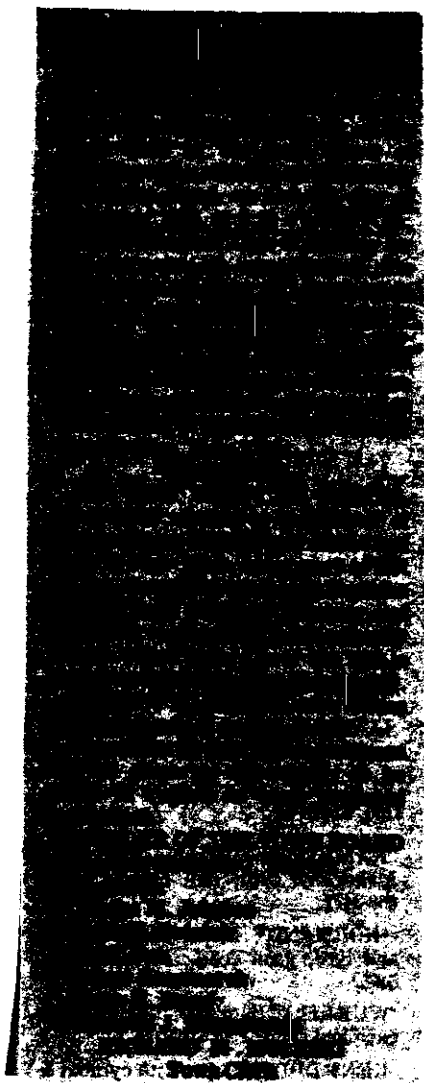

A permit to erect and maintain said advertising sign (as defined in Section 1-53) shall be issued at the discretion of the Town Board, by a Town Board resolution and upon prior recommendation by the Building Inspector.

The Highway Engineer and I have inspected Newport Road and find that it meets our specifications as well as those set forth by the Building Inspector's Office and Town Engineer, letters attached.

NEWPORT ROAD: Beginning at a point in the easterly line of Newport Road, 184.77' south of the south line of Greenway Blvd., as measured along the easterly line of Newport Road; running thence westerly at right angle to the easterly line of Newport Road, 60' to the westerly line of Newport Road; thence southerly along the westerly line of Newport Rd., 105', more or less, to its intersect with an extension westerly of the southerly line of subplot #74, as shown on map filed in Erie County Clerk's Office under cover #162B; thence easterly along said extension westerly of the southerly line of said subplot #74, 60' to the easterly line of Newport Road; thence northerly along the easterly line of Newport Road, 105', more or less, to the point or place of beginning.

As you can see by the length of pavement, 130', this is an extension of pavement in an already developed subdivision and will front only two (2) sublots, #33 and 35.

A tree must be planted by the builder in front of each house, as per Town Highway requirements.

As the pavement meets specifications, and a bond and deed are on file, I recommend acceptance of Newport Road into the town system of highways.

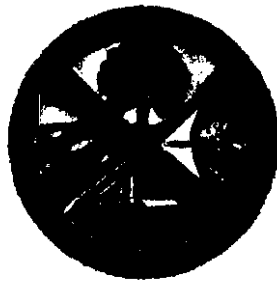


1. Concrete storm sewer pipe for main storm sewer, with proper appurtenances as specified on detail sheet.
