





Separate Assessment of Certain Items of Property. Section 3 of L. 1972, c. 274, as amended L.1973, c. 112, § 1, provided: "Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, the specified items of property which are entitled to exemption from taxation pursuant to section two of this act and which were assessed as taxable real property on the assessment roll next preceding the first assessment roll to which this act applies regardless of whether or not such items were separately assessed on such preceding assessment roll, shall be separately assessed as a parcel on the taxable portion of the first assess-ment roll prepared after the effective date of this act and the next succeeding three assessment rolls. Said real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of twenty percent of the assessed valuation on said first assessment roll, forty percent of the assessed valuation on the said second assessment roll, sixty percent of the assessed valuation on the said third assessment roll and eighty percent of the assessed valuation on the said fourth assessment roll. Said partial exemption on each of said four assessment rolls shall in no event exceed an amount computed by applying the exemption percentage applicable for that year to the full exemption to which said real property would have been entitled as computed pursuant to section two of this act after application of the 23.85 percent limitation set forth in said section two. Thereafter said real property shall be entitled to the full exemption accorded by section two of this act."

### § 489. Exemption from taxation of alterations and improvements to multiple dwellings to eliminate fire and health hazards; abatement

1. (a) Any city to which the multiple dwelling law is applicable, acting through its local legislative body or other governing agency, is hereby authorized and empowered, to and including June first, nineteen hundred seventy-six, to adopt and amend local laws or ordinances providing that any increase in assessed valuation resulting from alterations and improvement to (1) class B multiple dwellings or other buildings or structures converted to class A multiple dwellings not buildings or structures converted to class A multiple dwellings not used in whole or in part for single room occupancy or (2) existing class A multiple dwellings or buildings consisting of one or two dwelling units over space used for commercial occupancy to eliminate presently existing unhealthy or dangerous conditions in any such multiple dwelling, or to replace inadequate and obsolete sanitary facilities any of which represent fire or health hazards, except insofar as the gross cubic content of the building is increased thereby, shall be exempt from taxation for local purposes for a neriod not to exceed be exempt from taxation for local purposes for a period not to exceed twelve years after the taxable status date immediately following the completion thereof, provided that the alterations or improvements for which the benefits of any such law or ordinance are claimed were started after March first, nineteen hundred fifty-five, and completed within two years from the date on which they were started and in any event poler to December thirty-first a

Any such local law or ordinance may also provide for the abatement of taxes on such property, including the land, by an amount no greater than eight and one-third per centum of the cost of such alterations and improvements each year for a period not to exceed twelve years commencing with the first tax bill after the completion of such alterations and improvements, except that abatement of taxes on property aided by a loan made pursuant to article eight of the private housing finance law shall commence with the first tax bill after such alterations and improvements were started but such abatement of taxes in any consecutive twelve-month period shall in no event exceed the amount of taxes payable in such twelve-month period. It may also provide for the abatement of taxes on such property including the land, at such per centum of the cost of such alterations and improvements each year for a period of not less than thirteen nor more than twenty years commencing as to property aided by a loan made pursuant to article eight of the private housing finance law with the first tax bill after such alterations and improvements were started and as to all other property with the first tax bill after completion of such alterations and improvements as will not in the aggregate exceed the total cost of such alterations and improvements, but such abatement of taxes in any consecutive twelvemonth period shall in no event exceed the amount of taxes payable in such twelve-month period.

Any such local law or ordinance may also provide that its benefits shall not become available to any multiple dwelling, building or structure as provided in paragraph (a) of subdivision one of this section unless and until such multiple dwelling, building or structure as provided in paragraph (a) of subdivision one of this section complies with the applicable provisions of law. Any such law or ordinance may make provision as to the date as of which particular improvements and alterations shall be deemed to have been completed or commenced therefor, as the case may be, for the purpose of qualifying for the benefits thereof. Any such local law or ordinance may make provision authorizing the adoption of rules and regulations by the local agencies of government for the effectuation of the purposes of this section.

The specifications prepared by the consulting firm of Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. separated this sewer project into 2 parts in order to secure more competitive bidding.

Under Contract No. 1, eleven (11) bids were received ranging in price from \$3,462,581.50 to \$4,525,528.00. The three (3) lowest bids are as follows:

After a review of the base bids and alternates, it is recommended that the bid for Contract No. 1 be awarded to Herbert F. Darling, Inc., 131 California Drive, Williamsville, New York 14221 for the alternate bid price of \$3,462,581.50. This is the lowest bid meeting the requirements of the specifications. Since the bidder had to add a liner pipe in order to receive approval for the New York State Thruway Crossing, this bid award is conditional upon the Town's receipt of a permit for this method from the New York State Thruway Authority.

For Contract No. 2, it is recommended that the bid be awarded to Amadori Construction Co., Inc., 65 Jackson Street, Lackawanna, New York 14218 for their alternate bid price of \$2,543,980.00. This is the lowest bid meeting the requirements of the specifications.

The bid awards are conditional upon their approval by the NYSDEC and the U.S.E.P.A. This total bid award is in the amount of \$6,006,561.50. This compares to the engineers estimate of \$7,419,765.00.

On May 2, 1977, bids were received for the Northeast Interceptor Sewer Project, Contracts 1 and 2. Eleven (11) bids were received for Contract No. 1, ranging from \$3,512,030 to \$4,525,528. Eight (8) bids were received for Contract No. 2, ranging from \$2,564,600 to \$3,710,862.50.

Our estimate for Contract No. 1 is \$4,270,740 and for Contract No. 2 is \$3,149,025.

A comparison of the three low bidders for Contract No. 1 is as follows:

The alternate total includes an alternate write-in method and bid price for crossing the New York State Thruway which is different from the base bid method proposed in the Plans and Specifications.

After a careful review of the bids, it is apparent that the H. F. Darling Co. is the low bidder using the alternate bid total and should be awarded the Contract in the amount of \$3,462,581.50.

Our recommendation for Contract No. 1 is conditioned upon the Town's being able to secure approval from the New York State Thruway Authority of a modification of the Thruway's Occupancy Permit No. 2438 issued in conjunction with the crossing of this interceptor line of the Thruway incorporating an alternate method of crossing with materials and installation consistent in capacity, quality, strength and performance to those required by the Plans and Specifications, with said alternate method of crossing to be accomplished at a cost to the Town not in excess of the Alternate Bid of the Contractor under Bid Item No. 19A.

If an approval from the New York State Thruway cannot be obtained with a modification to the permit, then the Town should award the contract to Amadori Construction.

A comparison of the three low bidders for Contract No. 2 is as follows:

The alternate total includes alternate write-in methods and bid prices for crossing State and County highways which is different from the base bid methods proposed in the Plans and Specifications.

The bid proposal included a requirement that the Contractor sign a statement agreeing to the selection by the Town of the alternate methods and bid prices. Amadori Construction Co. did not sign this agreement item; therefore, after careful review, Amadori Construction Co. is the low bidder for Contract No. 2 and we recommend they be awarded the contract using the base bid total in the amount of \$2,564,600.

Both H. F. Darling, Inc. of 131 California Drive, Williamsville, New York and the Amadori Construction Co., Inc. of 65 Jackson Street, Lackwanna, New York, have successfully performed sanitary sewer construction designed by our firm in the past. The type of construction work has been similar to that which is required for this project.

SECOND: RESOLVING AND DETERMINING THAT (a) the notice of hearing was published and posted as required by law and is otherwise sufficient; (b) all the property and property owners within the District are benefited thereby; (c) all the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the District and (d) that the establishment of the District is in the public identity.

THIRD: FURTHER RESOLVING AND DETERMINING that the establishment of the District be approved, that the proposed sewer system shall be constructed therein; DESIGNATING such District as Sanitary Sewer District No. 8, in the Town of Checkstowaga, and DESCRIBING the District by metes and bounds;

FOURTH: RESOLVING that the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of said sewer system, consisting of sewer makes, manholes, pumping facilities, buildings, acquisition of necessary land and rights in land and original equipment, machinery and appara-tus, is \$3,614,581, which is planned to be financed by the issuance of serial ment, levy and collection of special ts upon the several lots and parcels of land in the District which the Town Board shall deem especially benefited by said sewer system so ich upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall afer upon the same and the establishment and collection of sewer rests, pursuant to the Town Law, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and the costs of operation, maintenance and repair; any amounts received from grants of Federal and State funds are planned to be expended towards the construction of the sewer system or to redemption of the bonds or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, or budgeted as an offset to the taxes, seesments and-or sewer rents for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds. #### FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE

Section 1.0 STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION, FINDINGS OF FACT, PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

# 1.1 STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION

The Legislature of the State of New York has in the Environmental Conservation Law and Town Law delegated the responsibility to local governmental units to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry. Therefore, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York does ordain as follows:

#### 1.2 FINDINGS OF FACT

- (1) The flood hazard areas of the Town of Cheektowaga are subject to periodic inundation which results in loss of life, property, health and safety hazards, disruption of commerce and governmental services, extraordinary public expenditures for flood protection and relief, and impairment of the tax base, all of which adversely affect the public health, safety and general welfare.
- (2) These flood losses are caused by the cumulative effect of obstructions in flood plains causing increases in flood heights and velocities, and by the occupancy in flood hazard areas by uses vulnerable to floods or hazardous to other lands which are inadequately elevated, floodproofed, or otherwise protected from flood damages.

# 1.3 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the public health, safety and general welfare and to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific areas by provisions designed to:

- (1) To protect human life and health;
- (2) To minimize expenditure of public money for costly flood control projects;

- (3) To minimize the need for rescue and relief efforts associated with flooding and generally undertaken at the expense of the general public;
- (4) To minimize prolonged business interruptions;
- (5) To minimize damage to public facilities and utilities such as water and gas mains, electric, telephone and sewer lines, streets and bridges located in flood plains;
- (6) To help maintain a stable tax base by providing for the sound use and development of flood-prone areas in such a manner as to minimize future flood blight areas;
- (7) To insure that potential home buyers are notified that property is in a flood area;
- (8) To make residents and property owners eligible for purchase of Federally subsidized flood insurance authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended; and
- (9) To comply with the regulatory measures specified in the Federal Insurance Administration Rules and Regulations adopted pursuant to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended, specifically Section 1910.3(b), (c), and (d) thereof, as they become applicable and as they may be amended.

# 1.4 METHODS OF REDUCING FLOOD LOSSES

In order to accomplish its purposes, this ordinance uses the following methods:

- (1) Restrict or prohibit uses which are dangerous to health, safety and property due to water or erosion or in flood heights or velocities.
- (2) Require that uses vulnerable to floods, including facilities which serve such uses, be protected against flood damage at the time of initial construction.
- (3) Control the alteration of natural flood plains, stream channels, and natural protective barriers, which are involved in the accommodation of flood waters.

- (4) Control filling, grading, dredging and other development which may increase flood damage.
- (5) Prevent or regulate the construction of flood barriers which will unnaturally divert flood waters or which may increase flood hazards to other lands.

#### Section 2.0 DEFINITIONS

Unless specifically defined below, words or phrases used in this ordinance shall be interpreted so as to give them the meaning they have in common usage and to give this ordinance its most reasonable application.

"Appeal" means a request for a review of the Town Engineer's interpretation of any provision of this ordinance or a request for a variance.

"Area of shallow flooding" means a designated AO or VO Zone on a community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) with base flood depths of from one to three feet where a clearly defined channel does not exist, where the path of flooding is unpredictable and indeterminate, and where velocity flow may be evident.

"Area of special flood hazard" is the land in the flood plain within a community subject to a one percent or greater chance of flooding in any given year.

"Base flood" means the flood having a one percent chance of being equalled or exceeded in any given year.

"Development" means any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations located within the area of special flood hazard.

"Existing mobile home park or mobile home subdivision" means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more mobile home lots for rent or sale for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lot on which the mobile home is to be affixed (includ-

ing, at a minimum, the installation of utilities, either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads, and the construction of streets) is completed before the effective date of this ordinance.

"Expansion to an existing mobile home park or mobile home subdivision" means the preparation of additional sites by the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the mobile homes are to be affixed (including the installation of utilities, either final site grading or pouring of concrete pads, or the construction of streets).

"Flood" or "flooding" means a general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from:

- (1) The overflow of inland or tidal waters
- (2) The unusual and rapid accumulation or runoff of surface waters from any source.

"Flood Insurance Rate Map" (FIRM) means the official map on which the Federal Insurance Administration has delineated both the areas of special flood hazards and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.

"Flood Insurance Study" means the official report in which the Federal Insurance Administration has provided flood profiles, as well as the Flood Hazard Boundary-Floodway Map and the water surface elevation of the base flood.

"Floodway" means the channel of a river, stream, creek or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved in order to discharge the base flood without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than one foot.

"Habitable floor" means any floor usable for living purposes, which includes working, sleeping, eating, cooking or recreation, or a combination thereof. A floor used only for storage purposes is not a "habitable floor".

"Mobile home" means a structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities. It does not include recreational vehicles or travel trailers.

"New construction" means structures for which the "start of construction" commenced on or after the effective date of this ordinance.

"New mobile home park or mobile home subdivision" means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more mobile home lots for rent or sale for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lot on which the mobile home is to be affixed (including, at a minimum, the installation of utilities, either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads, and the construction of streets) is completed on or after the effective date of this ordinance.

"Start of construction" means the first placement of permanent construction of a structure (other than a mobile home) on a site, such as the pouring of slabs or footings or any work beyond the stage of excavation. Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading, and filling, nor does it include the installation of streets and/or walkways; nor does it include excavation for a basement, footings, piers or foundations or the erection of temporary forms; nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not as part of the main structure. For a structure (other than a mobile home) without a basement or poured footings, the "start of construction" includes the first permanent framing or assembly of the structure or any part thereof on its piling or foundation. For mobile homes not within a mobile home park or mobile home subdivision, "start of construction"

means the affixing of the mobile home to its permanent site. For mobile homes within mobile home parks or mobile home subdivisions, "start of construction" is the date on which the construction of facilities for servicing the site on which the mobile home is to be affixed (including, at a minimum, the construction of streets, either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads, and installation of utilities) is completed.

"Structure" means a walled and roofed building that is principally above ground, as well as a mobile home.

"Substantial improvement" means any repair, reconstruction, or improvement of a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the market value of the structure either:

- (1) before the improvement or repair is started, or
- (2) if the structure has been damaged and is being restored, before the damage occurred. For the purposes of this definition "substantial improvement" is considered to occur when the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of the building commences, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the structure. The term does not, however, include either:
  - (1) any project for improvement of a structure to comply with existing state or local health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which are solely necessary to assure safe living conditions, or
  - (2) any alteration of a structure listed on the National Register of Historic Places or a State Inventory of Historic Places.

"Variance" is a grant of relief to a person from the requirements of this ordinance which permits construction in a manner otherwise prohibited by this ordinance where specific enforcement would result in unnecessary hardship.

#### Section 3.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

3.1 LANDS TO WHICH THIS ORDINANCE APPLIES

This ordinance shall apply to all areas of special flood hazards within the jurisdiction of the Town of Cheektowaga exclusive of the Villages of Sloan and Depew.

3.2 BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD

The areas of special flood hazard identified by the Federal

Insurance Administration through a scientific and engineering

report entitled "The Flood Insurance Study for the Town of Cheektowaga, dated March, 1974, as edited and prepared for publication
by Dewberry, Nealon and Davis, Consulting Engineers, Arlington

Boulevard, Fairfax, Virginia 22030, December, 1975", with accompanying Flood Insurance Rate Maps and Flood Boundary-Floodway Maps
and any revision thereto are hereby adopted by reference and
declared to be a part of this ordinance.

#### 3.3 COMPLIANCE

No structure or land shall hereafter be located, extended, coverted, or structurally altered without full compliance with the terms of this ordinance and other applicable regulations.

# 3.4 ABROGATION AND GREATER RESTRICTIONS

This ordinance is not intended to repeal, abrogate, or impair any existing easements, covenants, or deed restrictions. However, where this ordinance and another ordinance, easement, covenant, or deed restriction conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent restrictions shall prevail.

## 3.5 INTERPRETATION

In the interpretation and application of this ordinance, all provisions shall be:

- (1) Considered as minimum requirements.
- (2) Liberally construed in favor of the governing body.

- (3) Deemed neither to limit nor repeal any other powers granted under state statutes.
- (4) Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

#### 3.6 WARNING AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

The degree of flood protection required by this ordinance is considered reasonable for regulatory purposes and is based on scientific and engineering considerations. Larger floods can and will occur on rare occasions. Flood heights may be increased by man-made or natural causes. This ordinance does not imply that land outside the areas of special flood hazards or that uses permitted within such areas will be free from flooding or flood damages. This ordinance shall not create liability on the part of the Town of Cheektowaga, or any officer or employee thereof, for any flood damage that result from reliance on this ordinance or any administrative decision lawfully made thereunder.

# 3.7 VIOLATIONS

The violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is an offense for which the violator shall be subject to a fine of not more than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) or to imprisonment for a period of not more than fifteen (15) days, or both. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and additional violation and shall be punishable hereunder.

In addition to the foregoing penalties, the Town of Cheektowaga may institute any appropriate action or proceeding to prevent, correct or restrain any violation of this ordinance.

#### 3.8 EFFECTIVE DATE

Upon adoption by the Town Board, this ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its publication and posting as required by the laws of the State of New York, except that this ordinance shall take effect from the date of its service as against a person served personally with a copy thereof, certified by the Town Clerk under the corporate seal of the Town, showing the date of its passage and entry in the minutes.

#### Section 4.0 ADMINISTRATION

#### 4.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF DEVELOPMENT PERMIT

A Development Permit shall be obtained before construction or development begins within any area of special flood hazard established in Section 3.2. Application for a Development Permit shall be made to the Town Engineer on forms furnished by him and may include, but not be limited to, the following plans in duplicate drawn to scale showing the nature, location, dimensions, and elevations of the area in question; existing or proposed structures, fill storage of materials; drainage facilities, and the location of the foregoing. Specifically, the following information is required:

- (1) Elevation in relation to mean sea level, of the lowest floor (including basement) of all structures.
- (2) Elevation in relation to mean sea level to which any non-residential structure has been floodproofed.
- (3) Plans showing how any non-residential floodproofed structure will meet the floodproofing criteria of Section 5.2-2 and after the structure is built, a certification by a registered professional engineer or architect that the structure as built meets the criteria of Section 5.2-2.
- (4) Description of the extent to which any watercourse will be altered or relocated as a result of proposed development.

shall be paid to the Town Clerk for each Development Permit prior to issuance.

#### Section 4.2 DESIGNATION OF TOWN ENGINEER AS ADMINISTRATOR

The Town Engineer is hereby appointed to administer and implement this ordinance by granting or denying development permit applications in accordance with its provisions.

4.3 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TOWN ENGINEER

Duties of the Town Engineer shall include, but not be limited to:

# 4.3-1 PERMIT REVIEW

- (1) Review all development permits to determine that the permit requirements of this ordinance have been satisfied.
- (2) Review all development permits to require that all necessary permits have been obtained from those federal, state or local governmental agencies from which prior approval is required.
- (3) Review all development permits to determine if such proposed development is located within the floodway. If the proposed development is to be located in the floodway, a certification shall be obtained in accordance with Section 5.2-4(1).

#### 4.3-2 USE OF OTHER BASE FLOOD DATA

When base flood elevation data has not been provided in accordance with Section 3.2, BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD, then the Town Engineer shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation data available from a federal, state or other source, in order to administer Section 5.2, SPECIFIC STANDARDS.

## 4.3-3 INFORMATION TO BE OBTAINED AND MAINTAINED

(1) Verify and record the actual elevation (in relation to

mean sea level) of the lowest habitable floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures.

- (2) For all new or substantially improved floodproofed structures
  - (i) verify and record the actual elevation (inrelation to mean sea level), and
  - (ii) maintain the floodproofing certifications required in Section 4.1(3).
- (3) Maintain for public inspection all records pertaining to the provisions of this ordinance.

#### 4.3-4 ALTERATION OF WATERCOURSES

- (1) Notify adjacent communities and the New York State

  Department of Environmental Conservation prior to any alteration or relocation of a watercourse, and submit evidence of such notification to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- (2) Require that maintenance is provided within the altered or relocated portion of said watercourse so that the flood carrying capacity is not diminished.

### 4.3-5 INTERPRETATION OF FIRM BOUNDARIES

Make interpretations where needed, as to the exact location of the boundaries of the areas of special flood hazards (for example, where there appears to be a conflict between a mapped boundary and actual field conditions). The person contesting the location of the boundary shall be given a reasonable opportunity to appeal the interpretation as provided in this article.

#### 4.4 VARIANCE PROCEDURE

#### 4.4-1 APPEAL BOARD

(1) The Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from the requirements

of this ordinance.

- (2) The Town Board shall hear and decide appeals when it is alleged there is an error in any requirement, decision, or determination made by the Town Engineer in the enforcement or administration of this ordinance.
- (3) Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Town Board or any taxpayer may appeal such decision to the Supreme Court of the State of New York, as provided in Article 78 of the Civil Practice Law and Rules.
- (4) In passing upon such applications, the Town Board shall consider all technical evaluations, all relevant factors, standards specified in other sections of this ordinance, and:
  - (i) the danger that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others;
  - (ii) the danger to life and property due to flooding or erosion damage;
  - (iii) the susceptibility of the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and the effect of such damage on the individual owner;
  - (iv) the importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to the community;
  - (v) the necessity to the facility of a waterfront location, where applicable;
  - (vi) the availability of alternative locations, not 's subject to flooding or erosion damage, for the proposed use;(vii) the compatibility of the proposed use with existing
  - (viii) the relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and flood plain management program for that

and anticipated development;

area:

(ix) the safety of access to the property in times of flood for ordinary and emergency vehicles;

- (x) the expected heights, velocity, duration, rate of rise and sediment transport of the flood waters and the effects of wave action, if applicable, expected at the site; and,
- (xi) the costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems, and streets and bridges.

  (xii) generally, variances may be issued for new construction and substantial improvements to be erected on a lot of one-half acre or less in size contiguous to and surrounded by lots with existing structures constructed below the base flood level, providing items (i-xi) have been fully considered. As the lot size increases beyond the one-half acre, the technical justification required for issuing the variance increases.
- (5) Upon consideration of the factors listed above and the purposes of this ordinance, the Town Board may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this ordinance.
- (6) The Town Engineer shall maintain the records of all appeal actions and report any variances to the Federal Insurance Administration upon request.

# 4.4-2 CONDITIONS FOR VARIANCES

- (1) Variances may be issued for the reconstruction, rehabilitation or restoration of structures listed on the National Register of Historic Places or the State Inventory of Historic Places, without regard to the procedures set forth in the remainder of this section.
- (2) Variances shall not be issued within any designated floodway if any increase in flood levels during the base flood discharge

would result.

- (3) Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief.
- (4) Variances shall only be issued upon:
  - (i) a showing of good and sufficient cause,
  - (ii) a determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant, and
  - (iii) a determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of the public as identified in Section 4.1-4(4), existing local laws or ordinances.
- (5) Any applicant to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice that the structure will be permitted to be built with a lowest floor elevation \_\_\_\_\_\_ feet below the base flood elevation, and that the cost of flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation.

# Section 5.0 PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION

#### 5.1 GENERAL STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards the following provisions are required:

# 5.1-1 ANCHORING

- (1) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be anchored to prevent flotation, collapse or lateral movement of the structure.
- (2) All mobile homes shall be anchored to resist flotation,

- (3) Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief.
- (4) Variances shall only be issued upon:
  - (i) a showing of good and sufficient cause,
  - (ii) a determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant, and
  - (iii) a determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of the public as identified in Section 4.1-4(4), existing local laws or ordinances.
- (5) Any applicant to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice that the structure will be permitted to be built with a lowest floor elevation \_\_\_\_\_\_ feet below the base flood elevation, and that the cost of flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation.

# Section 5.0 PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION

5.1 GENERAL STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards the following provisions are required:

#### 5.1-1 ANCHORING

- (1) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be anchored to prevent flotation, collapse or lateral movement of the structure.
- (2) All mobile homes shall be anchored to resist flotation,

collapse, or lateral movement by providing over-the-top and frame ties to ground anchors. Specific requirements shall be that:

- (i) over-the-top ties be provided at each side of the mobile home, with two additional ties per side at intermediate locations and mobile homes less than 50 feet long requiring one additional tie per side;
  - (ii) frame ties be provided at each corner of the home with five additional ties per side at intermediate points and mobile homes less than 50 feet long requiring four additional ties per side;
  - (iii) all components of the anchoring system be capable of carrying a force of 4,800 pounds; and,
  - (iv) any additions to the mobile home be similarly anchored.

# 5.1-2 CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS AND METHODS

- (1) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed with materials and utility equipment resistant to flood damage.
- (2) All new construction or substantial improvements shall be constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damage.

#### 5.1-3 UTILITIES

- (1) All new and replacement water supply systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system;
- (2) New and replacement sanitary sewage systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters; and,

(3) On-site waste disposal systems shall be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding.

# 5.1-4 SUBDIVISION PROPOSALS

- (1) All subdivision proposals shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage.
- (2) All subdivision proposals shall have public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage.
- (3) All subdivision proposals shall have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage.
- (4) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed development which is greater than the lesser of 50 lots or 5 acres.

# 5.2 SPECIFIC STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards where base flood elevation data has been provided as set forth in Section 3.2 BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD or Section 4.3-2.

USE OF OTHER BASE FLOOD DATA, the following provisions are required:

# 5.2-1 RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

New construction or substantial improvement of any residential structure shall have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to or above base flood elevation.

# 5.2-2 NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

New construction or substantial improvement of any commercial, industrial or other nonresidential structure shall either have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to the level of the base flood elevation or, together with attendent utility and sanitary facilities, be floodproofed so that below the base flood level the

#### 5.3 FLOODWAYS

Located within areas of special flood hazard established in Section 3.2 are areas designated as floodways. Since the floodway is an extremely hazardous area due to the velocity of flood waters which carry debris, potential projectiles and erosion potential, the following provisions apply:

- (1) Prohibit encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial improvements and other developments unless certification by a professional registered engineer or architect is provided demonstrating that encroachments shall not result in any increase in flood levels during the occurrence of the base flood discharge.
- (2) If Section 5.3(1) is satisfied, all new construction and substantial improvements shall comply with all applicable flood hazard reduction provisions of Section 5.0 PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION.
- (3) Prohibit the placement of any mobile homes, except in an existing mobile home park or existing mobile home subdivision.

## WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the atreus theatre company, hereinafter called atc, is a professional troupe of actors who perform plays and conduct drama workshops for youth, and

whereas, the Town of Cheektowaga, hereinafter called the Town, through the Youth Bureau, is desirous of sponsoring performances as part of its Cultural Enrichment Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

- 1. The atc agrees to present four (4) performances to be held on Monday, July 4, Wednesday, July 20, Tuesday, August 2, and Thursday, August 11, 1977.

A permit to do plumbing work shall be issued only to a Master Plumber duly licensed by the Town of Cheektowaga or to an individual resident owner, who has proved to the satisfaction of the Building and Plumbing Inspector that he is personally qualified to perform such plumbing work within his own home.

Each licensee shall file with the Town Clerk, a bond in the sum of \$2,000.00 by an indemnity company or individuals with no less than two sureties satisfactory to the Town Board of Cheektowaga conditioned to indemnify and save harmless the Town of Cheektowaga and from all damages and losses which may result from the work of said licensee or officers, agents or employees being done carelessly or imperfectly or in such a way that injury or loss results to persons or property thereby, or by reason of the Licensee failing to comply with all and singular, the rules and regulations as now or may hereafter be established by the Board of

Plumbing and Drainage Examiners, or with any ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga in relation to making excavations in the public streets or with any provision of the ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga and the Laws of the State of New York applicable.

The fee for the license required by this Ordinance shall be \$10-99 per year, or part thereof, each license expiring on the December 31st, next after issuance.

Each licensee shall file with the Town Clerk, a bond in the sum of \$2,000.00, a personal liability of \$50,000.00 and a property damage liability of \$10,000.00, by an indemnity company or individuals with no less than two sureties satisfactory to the Town Board of Cheektowaga conditioned to indemnify and save harmless the Town of Cheektowaga and from all damages and losses which may result from the work of said licensee of officers, agents or employees being done carelessly or imperfectly or in such a way that injury or loss results to persons or property thereby, or by reason of the Licensee failing to comply with all and singular, the rules and regulations as now or may hereafter be established by the Board of Plumbing and Draining Examiners, or with any ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga in relation to making excavations in the public streets or with any provision of the ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga and the Laws of the State of New York applicable.

The fee for the license required by this Ordinance shall be  $\frac{$50.00}{31st}$ , per year, or part thereof, each license expiring on the December  $\frac{$31st}{31st}$ , next after issuance.
