

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT between TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA and

THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA POLICE CLUB,



The following Memorandum of Agreement is entered into by and between the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Cheektowaga Police Club, Inc. reflecting changes to the collective bargaining agreement which exists between the parties:

- 1. All sections of the collective bargaining agreement, which are not referred to in this Memorandum, will continue in the successor agreement, without substantive change. Changes may be made to update dates or language.
- 2. The provisions, herein agreed upon, are tentative only, subject to ratification by the Cheektowaga Town Board and the membership of the Cheektowaga Police Club, Inc.
- 3. The memorandum constitutes an agreement which is not separable. That is, either party may accept or ratify the entire agreement or reject the entire agreement. Neither party has the right to accept or reject separate proposed sections.

SECTION 3.03 - NON-COMPETITIVE JOBS

This section to be modified to delete references to airport officers since those positions no longer exist.

SECTION 4.01 - UNIFORM ALLOWANCE

Uniform allowance to be increased to the sum of \$450 during 1987 and the sum of \$490 during 1988.

Officers assigned to motorcycle, honor guard, mounted division and K-9 officers shall be paid the additional sum of \$50 per year.

SECTION 5.02 - SHIFT PREFERENCE

This section to be modified to provide that shift changes shall be effective on the first Monday in May and the first Monday in November, each year.

SECTION 6.01 - SALARY

Each salary position will be increased by 5% in 1987 and an additional 5% in 1982.

Officers who work the afternoon shift will be paid the additional sum of \$173 per year and officers who work the third shift will be paid the additional sum of \$243 per year, pro-rated, which shift-differential will be paid the last pay period of the year.

Beginning January 1, 1988 officers regularly assigned to the afternoon shift will be paid the additional sum of \$.25 per hour and officers regularly assigned to the midnight shift will be paid the additional sum of \$.35 per hour. This shift-differential will not apply to court pay, training time and will not be paid to officers not regularly assigned to those shifts.

SECTION 6.02 - OUT-OF-RANK PAY

. The third paragraph of this section to be amended to read:

If an absent lieutenant is replaced, he will be replaced by the sergeant assigned to that shift. The sergeant shall be replaced by the most senior officer, on that shift, who was working in that unit. If no sergeant is assigned to the shift, or is working, then the most senior officer who is working and who so desires shall be assigned as acting lieutenant and the next most senior officer-who is working that shift or division, and who so desires; shall be assigned as acting sergeant.

A fifth paragraph will read:

Once an officer is assigned to an out-of-rank position, if the assignment is cancelled on less than 24 hours notice, the officer will receive out-of-rank pay for that tour of duty.

SECTION 6.05 - CALL-IN PAY

The following to be added as Paragraph No. 4:

In the event a shortage occurs in a sergeant position, a sergeant will be given the opportunity to fill the vacancy before an officer is appointed as acting sergeant. Call-in will be accomplished in the following manner:

- a) The first consideration will be based upon seniority of sergeants assigned to the shift or division in which the vacancy occurs.
- b) Secondly, upon the basis of seniority within the rank of sergeant.
- c) In the event no sergeant desires to fill the vacancy then the vacancy will be filled in accordance with the provisions of Section 6.02.

In the event of a general call to duty, because of an anticipated or unanticipated emergency, the sergeant will be called for overtime in accordance with seniority within rank and in accordance with the need of the department for the rank of sergeant.

Former Paragraph No. 4 to be renumbered as Paragraph No. 5.

SECTION 6:06 - LONGEVITY PAY

Longevity pay to be increased as follows:

SECTION 6.07 - K-9 OFFICERS

Allowance to be increased to the sum of \$120 per month.

SECTION 6.12 - EDUCATION INCENTIVE PAY

Paragraph No. 1, which provides for education incentive pay to officers with Associate Degrees will be limited to pay only officers who were appointed to the department before January 1, 1987.

SECTION 7.01 - WORK DAY AND WORK WEEK

This section to be up-dated where appropriate.

The fourth paragraph of this section will be replaced with the following language.

Officers assigned as detective, crossing guard officer, police central records officer and police central records computer operator shall be assigned and work 5 days, followed by 2 consecutive days off. This shall be referred to as the 5-2 work schedule. Officers assigned to the 5-2 work schedule will be assigned the same number of days-off as officers who work the 4-2/5-2 work schedule. The granting of any such additional days off will be made in such a manner as to avoid the necessity to work officers overtime.

SECTION 10.01 - VACATIONS

This section to be modified to provide that vacation schedules shall be posted for 60 days prior to the beginning of a vacation period instead of the 90 days presently provided for.

SECTION 11.01 - BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

The following will be substituted in place of the present section:

- Upon request, a police officer shall be granted a leavé of absence because of death in his immediate family. Such leave shall be taken, without loss of pay or other benefits, and shall begin on the date of death.

Such leave shall consist of 4 working days if the officer is assigned to a 4 day work week and 5 working days if the officer is assigned to a 5 day work week.

Immediate family, for the purpose of this Section, shall mean:

Mother, father, spouse, child, grandchild, grandparent, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, brother-in-law and sister-in-law.

In the event of death of a relative, not included in immediate family, the police officer, upon request, shall be granted time-off, without loss of pay or other benefits, for the day of the funeral, which time shall be charged against accumulated time-off or sick leave, at the officer's choice.

SECTION 13.04 - WORKER'S COMPENSATION BENEFITS

The following to be added to the present section:

In the event of a third-party claim, payment of medical expenses and wages will be made pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 207c and not pursuant to Worker's Compensation Law, thereby reserving the right of the Town to pursue reimbursement for sums paid to or on behalf of the affected officer.

SECTION 13.07 - SICK LEAVE UPON TERMINATION

Paragraph No. 3 to be modified to provide the rate of reimbursement to be increased to 40% for 1987 and 45% beginning January 1, 1988.

SECTION 15.05 - HEALTH INSURANCE

This section to be modified to show that officers are provided with \$1,000,000 major medical.

At age 65 years retirees will be provided with Blue Cross and Blue Shield Supplemental coverage with \$1.00 co-pay prescription rider plus those riders which are provided to other Town employees.

The Town will also add Rider No. 8 to the Optical Coverage for those officers who require such coverage.

SECTION 17.01 - CLUB REPRESENTATIVES

The fifth paragraph of this section to be modified to read:

Police officers who are designated by the Club, may attend state-wide conventions and meetings of the Police Conference of New York, Inc., Western New York Police Association and the International Conference of Police Association, in pursuance of their profession of police officers. Attendance at these functions shall be without loss of time or salary. This privilege will be extended to officers of the Western New York Police Association and the New York State Police Conference, Not more than 7 officers covered by this Agreement, plus the President and first Vice-President may be relieved from duty to attend these meetings. Up to 3 additional officers may be granted the privilege to attend, by the Town, without pay, if the functioning of the Police Department is not placed in jeopardy and if approval is granted by the head of the department. The second Vice-President may also attend the said conventions and meetings without loss of time or salary, provided such attendance does not create a pre-determinable necessity to work officers overtime.

SECTION 19.02 - TUITION

The following will be substituted for the present provision of this section:

POLICY STATEMENT concerning Control and Treatment of Alcoholism and Drug Dependency

The Town of Cheektowaga, and the Town of Cheektowaga Employees Association, Supervisory Union, Captains and Leutenants Union, and P.B.A. Union, hereby agree to deal cooperatively and constructively with the problems of Alcoholism and Drug Dependence among employees of the Town.

Alcoholism and Drug Dependence are recognized by medical and public health authorities as diseases which are treatable. Excessive use of alcohol or drugs by employees impairs their ability to function competently or safely. It contributes to increased absenteeism, tardiness, accidents, and compensation cases. This in turn disrupts work schedules creating problems for the majority of the employees who are trying to do a conscientious job.

The following principals will be pursued:

- Alcoholism and drug dependence are diseases for which there is effective treatment and rehabilitation.
- 2. The primary objective of the "Employee Assistance Program" is to achieve restoration of health and full recovery of affected employees by identifying the disease and motivating affected employees to seek early treatment.
- 3. Mutual cooperation is imparative in encouraging the employee to seek diagnosis and treatment, as needed, and all parties agree that no such employee will have either job security or promotional opportunities jeopardized by his/her request, per se, for diagnosis and treatment. To this end, the confidential nature of the medical records and handling of individuals with diagnosed alcoholism of drug dependence will be <u>strictly</u> preserved.

To the extend provided in the Town of Cheektowaga's group insurance contracts, benefits will be available for individuals who accept medically approved treatment for alcoholism or drug dependence.

4. Nothing in this statement is to be interpreted as constituting and waiver of management's responsibility to maintain discipline or the right to invoke disciplinary measures in the case of misconduct which may result from, or be associated with the use of alcohol or drugs; the union may exercise its contractual right to process grievances concerning such matters in accordance with the current agreement.

ALL EMPLOYEES ARE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW SAFE WORK PRACTICES AND TO TAKE AN ACTIVE PART IN OUR ACCIDENT PREVENTION PROGRAM.

LOSS CONTROL AND SAFETY PROGRAM

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LOSS CONTROL & SAFETY PROGRAM

The Town of Cheektowaga Safety Program is hereby accepted as the official Town Safety program. This action indicates support by the Town Board, which directs the program be implemented and the Safety Rules and Guidelines be enforced after a two-week period of personnel indoctrination.

The employed shall provide a safe and healthful workplace and correct all hazards. Nothing shall imply that the Town of Cheektowaga Employee's Association has undertaken or assumed any portion of that responsibility.

Employees and the Union may exercise all their legal rights to secure a safe and healthful workplace without threats, loss of pay or other reprisals of any kind.

All department heads will develop and effect a motor vehicle preventive maintenance program and arrange for repair of defective equipment.

INTRODUCTION

The following safety rules and guidelines have been established to insure the health and safety of the town's employees and the general public. They are applicable to all personnel. In addition, specific Departmental Safety Rules and Guidelines apply to all employees in that department.

THE VIOLATION OF CERTAIN SAFETY RULES, DESIGNATED WITH AN ASTERISK

(*) WILL BE CONSIDERED "SERIOUS VIOLATIONS." IN THE EVENT OF A SERIOUS VIOLATION, THE EMPLOYEE MAY BE IMMEDIATELY SUSPENDED, AND PROCEDURE UNDER RESPECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT SHALL BE COMPLIED WITH.

THE VIOLATION OF ALL OTHER SAFETY RULES AND GUIDELINES WILL RESULT IN PROGRESSIVELY MORE SERIOUS WARNINGS WITH TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT FOR REPEATED VIOLATIONS.

Please re-read the employee's responsibility for safety above and bear in mind these rules and guidelines have been established primarily for your protection. In general, injuries result from unsafe acts and unsafe conditions, both of which are often under the control of the injured employee. You should value your life and limb and that of your co-workers ahead of personal possessions or comfort.

Please strive to make your workplace (and your co-worker's) as accident and injury free as possible.

GENERAL SAFETY RULES

APPLICABLE TO ALL PERSONNEL

1. Consumption of alcoholic beverages or the use of illegal drugs during work hours is strictly forbidden. Furthermore, reporting for work while under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs will not be tolerated.

NOTES: Employees taking drugs prescribed by a physician, or nonprescription medication that causes drowsiness, shall report same to his/her supervisor upon reporting for work.

An employee may demand a breathalyzer test to demonstrate compliance with this rule.

- * 2. Horseplay and fighting will not be tolerated.
- * 3. Firearms and weapons are not to be carried during work hours and are prohibited at work places.
- * 4. Immediately report all accidents causing injury to persons and/or damage to property (including Town property) to your supervisor.
- * 5. Report all dangerous hazards and equipment defects to your supervisor and safety committee upon discovery (in writing).

GENERAL RULES - PERSONAL SAFETY

- Do not remove protective guards or alter safety devices on machinery or equipment.
- Flashing lights will be used when working on or near vehicular traffic areas.
- First aid kits will be provided to work crews and installed in each truck.
- 4. No person shall ride on or in the back of any vehicle cargo area or outside of vehicle.
- 5. No person shall stand on back or side of a moving vehicle or on the cab top at any time.
- 6. Safety chains and protective guards will be provided by the town and shall be used by employees.
- 7. Retaining walls (shoring) and ladders shall be provided where employees are assigned to work in excavations in excess of 5 feet in depth.
- 8. Testing will be done for harmful gases before employees enter a manhole.
- 9. Blindshields for eye protection and portable blind shields will be provided for weld shops.
- 10. Building/garages will be properly ventilated with special provisions made in those garages where vehicles are left running.
- 11. All work areas will be properly illuminated.
- 12. Do not extend legs or arms over side or rear of vehicles.
- 13. Safety classes will be provided for employees.
- 14. All employees may receive tetanus and typhoid vaccinations at town expense, as required.
- 15. No raw sewage shall be transported in enclosed vans where employees are not separated from such storage area.
- 16. Sneakers and shorts may not be worn to perform daily assignments.

FIRE & EXPLOSION PREVENTION

RULES

- Do not smoke cigarettes, cigars, pipes, etc., or ignite matches. lighters, or torches in prohibited areas, near fuel tanks, or in the presence of fumes, flammable gases or substances.
- 2. Prohibited areas shall be conspicuously marked.
- 3. Dust and powdered substances in the air are highly explosive. Employees shall not use flammable liquids near open flames or electrical panels or switches.
- 4. Vehicles carying/hauling gas, oil, etc. must be marked accordingly and fire extinguishers
- 5. Smoke detectors shall comply with town ordinance.
- 6. Sprinkler systems shall comply with town ordinance.
- 7. Contents of contrainers/drums will be plainly marked.
- 8. 'No Smoking' signs will be posted in restricted areas.
- 9. Fire extinguishers will be provided in all work areas.
- 10. Tires will be placed in cage and lock rim checked when inflated after repair.
- 11. Cylinders, gas tanks, drums, will be stored in safe, marked areas. In weld shops they will be placed upright and chained.
- 12. Fire extinguishers will be provided for all trucks.
- 13. Waste oil contrainers shall be covered at all times and marked as 'Waste Oil'.
- 14. Evacuation plans shall be conspicuously posted in all buildings.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Know the location of fire fighting equipment and alarms and how to use them.
- 2. Do not block exits, entrances, electrical panel boxes or switches.
- 3. Shut off vehicles while refueling.

MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY RULES AND GUIDELINES

INTRODUCTION

Motor vehicle safety is a combination of: driver training, vehicle inspection and maintenance; and most importantly, proper operation and use of vehicle by driver.

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While much of the responsibility rests with management, the driver's responsibility for routine inspection, and maintenance of the vehicle he operates is necessary for an effective safety program. A driver generally knows when a vehicle should not be driven.

The following rules and guidelines should be considered the minimum standards governing the operation of all Town of Cheektowaga motor vehicles.

DRIVER QUALIFICATIONS AND TRAINING

RULES

1. All current and prospective drivers must be licensed in New York State to drive the type of vehicle being used. A Class 1 or 3 license is required for trucks exceeding 18,000 pounds MGW; a Class 1, 3, 4 or 5 license is satisfactory for passenger cars and trucks 18,000 pounds of less MGW. This rule applies even if the town vehicle is driven only on town premises. Persons with a driver's permit or Class 6 license may not drive town vehicles without authorization.

DRIVER'S RULES AND GUIDELINES

RULES

- Inspect vehicle and attachments in accordance with department rules and guidelines or the Vehicle and Equipment Care and Safety Check List.
- Report any suspension or revocation of your driver's license immediately.
- 3. Place a tag on any defective vehicle or equipment that is not to be used until repaired or replaced.
- 4. Vehicles or equipment found to have steering, braking or other serious defects during the period of operation shall not be driven, but shall be towed to the garage for repairs
- 5. Operate all motor vehicles under posted or legal speed limits.
- 6. Operate all motor vehicles in a "defensive driving" manner and within the laws governing the use of the vehicle on the highway.

- 7. Report any information directly relating to your ability to safely operate a motor vehicle to your supervisor without delay. Also report any conviction of a moving traffic violation during work. Exhibit your ticket stub to your supervisor upon request.
- 8. Be sure any cargo, load or attachments on your vehicle are secure or fastened at all times.
- 9. When backing vehicle, be sure no pedestrians are crossing at the rear and look for small children in particular. When possible passenger should be outside vehicle directing driver.
- 10. Rear doors on trucks must be closed or strapped when trucks are in motion.
- 11. If materials extend/project over rear of truck, doors must be tied and flag attached to end of materials.
- 12. Block wheels before jacking vehicle or equipment and be sure jacks are properly supported.
- 13. Detour traffic around work site with cones or barricades.
- 14. Check vehicle for air packs, flares and other safety equipment before leaving garage area.
- 15. Be sure all person's in work area, particularly those working under vehicles are warned before moving vehicles or equipment in or near work area.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Do not follow closer than the distance required to stop your vehicle before striking another vehicle ahead or a fixed object. Use the "two second rule" as a guide when appropriate.
- 2. Keep the inside of vehicle cab clean and free of all litter.
- 3. Be alert to changing conditions (road conditions, weather, nearby schools, playgrounds, etc.)
- 4. Drive with particular care and caution; At all intersections (watch pedestrian crossings.) Stop fully before making legal right turns at red signals

When changing lanes, signal your plan ahead of time. Avoid "squeeze plays." Yield to passing vehicles (blind spots are not a valid excuse for an accident.

5. Garage areas will be posted with a speed limit of 5 M.P.H.

Driver's Guidelines (con't.)

- 6. At expressway exit and entrance ramps, be sure speed is sufficiently reduced to avoid skidding on exit curves, particularly under slippery road conditions.
- 7. Honk horn twice to warn employees of oncoming vehicle (s).
- 8. If parking on incline, block wheels.
- 9. Tailgates must be raised and equipment or load secured.

PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

RULES

- Wear clothing appropriate to your job. Protective clothing and/or equipment issued or required to perform your duties must be worn in designated work areas and required work situations.
- 2. Hard hats are to be worn when working below any work detail, when working on ladders, scaffolds, low ceilings, when entering manholes, sewers, excavations or when working around excavation equipment, lawn maintenance equipment and grass cutting equipment.

Employees must wear hard hats when working behind trucks.

When in doubt, wear your safety hat.

- 3. Safety goggles must be worn at all times when grinding, chiseling, performing tree work, chipping branches, grinding stumps, operating power equipment (eg. saws, blow torches, etc.), welding and when using chemicals. Also to be worn where flying debris or dust is possible and when operating air compressors or jackhammers.
- 4. Safety shoes must be worn by all employees (excluding office personnel) effective 1/1/88.
- 5. Safety reflector clothing must be worn when working on or near highways, at all times.
- 6. Gloves shall be worn when appropriate.
- 7. Ear protectors must be worn when using air compressors , jack hammers , tree/branch chipper, vac-alls.
- 8. Safety harness must be worn when entering a manhole.
- 9. Employees shall be provided with particle filter masks when working with chemicals, dust exposure or paint.

Protective Clothing (con't.)

- 10. Protective clothing and equipment must be used by welders. Leather gloves and vest (bib) will be worn and proper colored glasses.
- ll. No gloves will be worn when operating power saws or grinders.

HOUSEKEEPING

RULES

- 1. Work areas will be kept orderly at all times.
- 2. Spills and loose debris will be cleaned up immediately.
- 3. Keep inside of truck cab clean from all litter.
- Proper containers will be utilized for the disposal of waste, oily rags and scrap
- 5. Floors, steps and hallways should be kept clean and free of obstructions.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Pick up and return tools and other items to proper place when finished and before leaving your work area.
- 2. "Wet Floor" signs must be used when mopping or waxing floors.
- 3. Be sure all lighting in your work area is maintained in proper operating condition.
- 4. Employees shall not place extension cords, cables, etc., across sidewalks, aisles, hallways or other walkways. Use care in the placement of extensioan cords, cables, etc., to avoid traipping hazards.
- 5. Keep filing cabinet, desk, and other drawers closed.
- 6. No boxes, shelves or chairs are to be used to gain heights. Use ladders only.
- 7. No tools will be placed on ladder tops or steps.
- 8. When using electric tools and equipment, only grounded plugs and cords are permitted.

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ACCIDENT REPORTING

The Cheektowaga Police Department will be notified in the event of a vehicular accident.

Secure names and addresses of witnesses and license number(s) of vehicle(s) involved prior to arrival of police.

Assist in any investigation or inquiry of an accident or damage occurring while you are in charge of vehicle.

Personal injuries shall be reported immediately to your supervisor and employee designated to complete necessary accident/compensation forms.

MAINTENANCE

RULES - APPLICABLE TO ALL PERSONNEL

- Warning tags must be placed on circuit breakers or plugs of machinery being repaired or worked on. Only the person who placed the tag, or an authorized person, may remove it.
- Read and heed all 'Warning' and 'Instruction' labels on equipment, chemicals and other materials and follow accordingly. If you do not fully understand the warning or instruction, ask your supervisor for assistance.
- Keep all gas bottles chained at all times to prevent their falling or rolling.

SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT/SEWER MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT

CHLORINE AND CHLORINATION

RULES

- 1. Check ventilation in Chlorine Room daily.
- 2. A minimum of two (2) employees to remove empty tanks and replace full tanks.
- 3. Check to make sure valves are closed on chlorine container when disconnecting flexible connection.

4. Use Scott's Air Pak when correcting any leaks from Chlorine tank.

GUIDELINES

- Use extreme care in lifting tanks with hoist; do not drop tanks at any time (empty or full).
- 2. Keep Chlorine Room in clean condition at all times.

PUMPS AND SLUDGE REMOVAL

GUIDELINES

- 1. Clean all pumps from sludge, oil, and grease.
- 2. Check electrical equipment for bare wires.
- 3. Use ventilation provided.
- 4. Use gloves, eye protection and respirator when using air borne chemicals.
- 5. Hoses that are used for cleaning pump areas are to be hung up on proper rack.

LABORATORY

GUIDELINES

- 1. Do not handle chemicals with bare hands.
- 2. Check lables on bottles or containers for proper chemical to be used.
- 3. Use tongs or suitable tool when handling hot equipment.
- Avoid smoking and eating except at scheduled breaks or lunch period.
- 5. Use suction bulb when working with pipette.
- 6. Check safety shower and emergency eye wash weekly.
- 7. Vent all fumes.
- 8. Use safety glasses at all times.
- Do not use laboratory glassware for food or liquid to be used for lunch.

- Wear laboratory coats that are provided.
- Il. "Water-Acid"--Always add the acid to the water, never the reverse.

FACILITIES DEPARTMENT - RULE

At least two employees shall be assigned to ice maintenance.

HIGHWAY - RULE

Be sure that safety chain is attached to snow wing at all times when it is on the truck and truck is not in use.

RECREATION - GUIDELINES

- 1. Wear clothing suitable to the activity being pursued. Sneakers and other athletic footwear will be permitted as appropriate and bare feet will be permitted in the pool area, locker rooms and showers.
- 2. Work shoes will be worn by employees excluding officer personnel and those described in #1.
- 3. Use appropriate protective equipment when engaged in athletic activities requiring such equipment.
- 4. Learn and follow the Recreation Department Training Manual and activity rules published.

SANITATION DEPARTMENT - RULES

- Pick up on one side of the street. Do not cross traffic lanes when picking up refuse, except where specific exception is made by Department Head.
- 2. Step away from falling containers.
- 3. Do not overfill hopper.
- 4. Do not dump while hopper is operating.
- Stand to the side of hopper while it is pacing (rather than behind it.
- 6. Do not throw containers filled with unknown substances into hopper.
- 7. Do not run behind truck where materials could fall from or be ejected by packer

GUIDELINES

- Establish driver-rider coordination. Lifter should use hand signals to direct driver in backing.
- Driver shall not move truck until both employees are securely placed on the steps or in the cab (except when proceeding or backing at the direction of a lifter.)

OPERATION OF PACKER CONTROLS

RULES

- Never try to dislodge, catch, or push back waste while the packer is operating. Keep away from hopper while it is in operation.
- 2. Lay boards and other long items in hopper so that they do not stick out or swing about when compacted.

GUIDELINES

- Use left hand if controls are on right side; signal co-workers before operating packer.
- 2. Check positions of hands before closing tailgate.

MOUNTING AND DISMOUNTING

GUIDELINES

- Mount and dismount only when truck has stopped and completed its backward lurching motion that occurs when stopping.
- 2. Watch where you place your feet.
- Grasp handholds firmly. Always use two hands before mounting and until both feet are securely on the ground when dismounting.
- 4. Step up firmly and steadily when mounting, and dismount backwards (do not jump).
- 5. Inspect welds and braces supporting steps for cracks at the start of each shift.

RIDING IN OR ON TRUCK - GENERAL - ALL EMPLOYEES

RULES

- No employee is to ride on step if the truck is moving beyond two blocks.
- Do not ride on truck when truck is backing.

PROPER LIFTING TECHNIQUES

GENERAL GUIDELINES - ALL PERSONNEL

- 1. Rock containers to determine approximate weight before lifting.
- 2. Use two-man crews to lift overweight containers in a slow, steady lift in unison.
- 3. Always maintain a firm grip on containers and keep them close to body.
- 4. Take a step while turning to dump, do not jerk or twist while lifting.
- 5. Know how much you can lift and use correct lifting techniques.
 Do not attempt to lift or carry anything by hand that is too
 heavy or bulky for one person to handle safely. Use the correct
 lifting device for the job.

GUIDELINES - GENERAL

- 1. Report all unsafe conditions to supervisor promptly.
- 2. Familiarize yourself with your duties and the tools and equipment used to perform those duties. Recognize the hazards of your job and equipment and do not take unnecessary risks.
- 3. No employee shall misuse, overload or overextend any town equipment or vehicle. Employees shall use correct tools and equipment for the work to be performed. Employees will check the condition of town equipment or vehicles for safety prior to use.

- 4. The Town of Cheektowaga Police Department will investigate all accidents involving Town motor vehicles, maintain a record thereof, and assist department heads and supervisors in the furtherance of this program.
- 5. Supervisors or department heads will assist driver's in reporting all accidents, filing appropriate reports with the Town's insurer, the State of New York (when required) and the Town Supervisor.

Each Department shall retain a copy of all accident reports and investigations with a copy included in the driver's file.

GUIDELINES - EQUIPMENT - GENERAL

- Always check ladders, steps, scaffolds, lifts, chainfalls, chains, chokers, cables, hooks, ropes, slings, hoists, jacks, grates, guards, etc., for wear or unsafe condition before use.
- 2. All machinery and power tools should be inspected for wear and hazardous conditions before use. Defective or hazardous equipment should be tagged and reported to your supervisor.
- Do not operate power equipment and tools unless and until properly instructed in the safe use and handling of such equipment.

DEPARTMENT HEAD, SUPERVISOR AND FOREMEN

RULES AND GUIDELINES

RULES

- Become fully acquainted with the Town Loss Control and Safety Program and the Safety Rules and Guidelines.
- 2. Always enforce the General, Motor Vehicle and Department Safety Rules and Guidelines, and treat suspected violators impartially.
- 3. Be sure all employees, particularly new employees, are made aware of the Town Loss Control and Safety Program and are instructed in the safe manner of performing their work.
- 4. On the job training shall be provided.
- 5. Personally inspect and record the condition of all safety and fire fighting equipment at least monthly.
- 6. Review the Daily Maintenance and Care Check Lists and establish a schedule of periodic maintenance for all vehicles, equipment and tools.
 - Arrange promptly for the repair of all defective or hazardous tools and equipment.
- 7. Develop ways to improve upon the General, Motor Vehicle and Department Safety Rules and Guidelines and reduce the number of accidents and injuries. The Town Supervisor and the Town Safety Committee should be informed of any proposed changes.
- 8. Take a personal interest in the operation of your Department Safety Committee. Review their work and investigations of accident causes. Encourage the development of a positive attitude toward a safe place to work.
- 9. Take all reasonable steps to comply with our Insurer's recommendations and promptly advise the Insurer, the Town Supervisor and the Town Safety Committee of compliance or compliance problems.

GUIDELINES

- Whenever possible, rely on re-training and explanation of hazards, which the Safety Rules and Guidelines are designed to avoid. Do not, however, fail to impose appropriate penalties for repeated violations. Consider job reassignments for persons unable to safely perform their assigned duties at all times.
- 2. Read and become familiar with the "Supervisor's" Safety Guide Book and other safety publications and books (available from the Safety Committee and local libraries).

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

supervisor's and The primary purpose of disciplinary action is to obtain the/employee's willingness to comply with rules and regulations. The object is to change the employee's behavior regarding extablished rules of conduct and safety without stimulating undesirable results.

Frankly, it often takes some doing to get compliance with rules willingly and, at the same, retain a cooperative and productive employee.

We believe the vast majority of employees will respond to education, reinstruction and persuasion when confronted with safety rule violations. There may, however, be some chronic rule breakers who will require special handling and individual attention.

We recognize the handling of "safety problem" employees is difficult and usually distasteful to supervisors. Supervisors and Department Heads must strive vigorously to overcome any tendency to "let this one go by" for whatever reason.

Only if violations are handled skillfully, fairly and always with respect to an individual's dignity, will this program and the humane benefits it holds be accomplished.

A better understanding of safety is essential and all Supervisors and Department Heads should be able to find information available to assist him/her. A basic understanding of safety can be obtained from the booklet entitled "Supervisor's Safety Guide Book." A copy has been given to each Department Head. Supervisors wishing to have a copy need only ask. In addition, the local libraries have been asked to stock books or reading matter on this subject and the Town Safety Committee has safety and loss control material available.

PENALTIES FOR RULE AND GUIDELINE VIOLATIONS

1. SERIOUS VIOLATIONS:

Violation of a safety rule marked by an asterisk(*) will be treated as a serious violation under Article 19 and the employee charged is subject to possible suspension.

2. VIOLATION OF REGULAR SAFETY RULE:

- A. First violation will result in a documented oral reprimand.
- B. Second violation within a one-year period will result in a documented written reprimand.
- C. Third violation within a one-year period will result in a labormanagement conference and possible suspension under collectivebargaining contract procedures.

3. VIOLATION OF SAFETY GUIDELINES:

- A. First violation will result in a safety reminder slip (copies to be provided to employee, Union and personnel file).
- B. Second violation within one year will result in issuance of second reminder slip as above.
- C. Third violation within one year will result in issuance of oral reprimand.
- D. Fourth violation within one year will result in a formal written reprimand.
- E. Fifth violation within one year will result in a labor/management conference and possible suspension under collectivebargaining contract procedures.

CONCLUSION

The work of operating a town encompasses many diverse operations which makes it impossible to prepare rules for each and every function or hazard. Thus, only a general set of rules can be formulated. Common sense, consciousness of one's activity and interest in safety is a requirement of each employee.

Safety is to be the concern of all and no job should be started unless thought and effort is given to providing for a safe operation.

Although safety starts with supervision, it is not enough for a supervisor and foremen to be conscious of performing safely on the job, but is the responsibility of each employee to be aware of his or her own safety and that of his/her fellow workers.

Accident prevention is a consideration from a humanitarian point of view and is an important obligation that we bear, and it must be remembered that each of us has a stake in safety.



WHEREAS, the General Municipal Law of the State of New York does not presently authorize counties, cities, towns, villages or fire districts to establish hazardous materials response (Haz-Mat) teams, and

WHEREAS, members of the State Senate and Assembly have proposed an amendment (Legislative Bill 16046-01-6) to authorize counties, towns, cities, villages and fire districts to establish Haz-Mat teams and also to authorize counties to designate one or more fire departments or fire companies as county Haz-Mat teams, and

WHEREAS, State government officials have determined that county Haz-Mat plans may include the following:

- procedures for emergency call-up;

- procedures for sharing and storage of equipment;
- agreements for the bulk purchasing of equipment;
- acceptance of donations;
- requirements for membership;
- methods of selection of the members;
- participation in training and drills; and
- provisions for coordination with industry hazardous materials emergency response plans,

and

WHEREAS, State officials have further proposed that two or more counties be authorized to form one or more regional Haz-Mat teams by mutual agreement, and that resulting Haz-Mat plans include the aforementioned provisions plus an additional provision for the selection and designation of a regional coordinator, and

WHEREAS, the proposed State legislative amendment provides for the designation of personnel who are not members of a fire department or fire company but who, by experience or training are qualified to be members of a Haz-Mat team, to serve in that capacity, and

WHEREAS, proposed amendments to the General Municipal Law and Volunteer Firemen's Benefit Law provide that any such person who services voluntarily and without compensation be protected against liability and also qualify for the following benefits which are provided to volunteer firefighters: death benefits; disability pensions for permanent total and partial disabilities and temporary total and partial disabilities; and any medical expenses incurred for examination, tests, treatment or rehabilitation required for injuries which result from services performed in the line of duty, and

WHEREAS, no part of the proposed legislation precludes a county, city, town, village or fire district from making any agreements for either self-insurance or with private insurance carriers to assume partial or full liability coverage (in addition to that provided by the Volunteer Firemen's Benefit Law) for personal or property damage incurred when an individual is rendering service as a member of a Haz-Mat team, and

2150-2190 Walden Avenue

Proposed Additions To Three Existing Buildings - Totalling 19,300 Sq. Feet.

Benderson Development Corporation Applicant:

Determination:

Tabled - Present at the meeting were representatives of Benderson Development, Mr. Bob Alonzo and Mr. David Wybieracki. The proposed development would be used for distribution/warehousing space with accessory offices. After some discussion it was decided that the proposed project would tend to over-develop the property. A number of potential problems were shown to exist. Access for fire fighting equipment to the rear of the parcel was discussed. The access roads between the buildings were shown to be 16 ft. wide but it was indicated that at least 5 ft. of this was obstructed by exterior gas meters. Mr. Wybieracki indicated that gas meters as well as an underground luel tank at the rear of the property would be relocated so they would not pose any type of safety hazard. This was to be noted on plans. The drainage was shown to be sloped pavement towards Walden Avenue. The Engineering Department determined that this was inadequate and is requesting a detailed drainage was shown as well as pipe sizes and outfalls. The additions would not meet the Zoning Ordinance requirements for set-backs and the Benderson people were questioned on this. The hardship for a reduced side yard is self-created and it was strongly recommended that this project be re-designed to conform to the Town Zoning Ordinance. Landscaping was shown to be within the Walden Avenue right-of-way. This project must be presented to the Town Planning Board for their approval/recommendations. The project will be referred to the Traffic Safety Commission for their comment before any further action is taken. before any further action is taken.

Rear of 55 Benbro ITEM II

Proposed 13,050 Sq. Ft. Building

Applicant: Benderson Development Corp.

Determination:

Tabled - The representatives for Benderson Development indicated that this building would be utilized for warehouse distribution with accessory offices. The only landscaping that exists on this property is a grass area to the rear. This landscape area would be eliminated with the construction of the building. Therefore this project must also be reviewed by the Town Planning Board and their recommendations followed. As in the case of the Walden Avenue project, the drainage plan was inadequate and a new drainage plan was requested showing existing and proposed elevations and drainage system for the property. Non-Significant - With Stipulations
Mr. Hernandez was present at the meeting
and explained that the company that
would be utilizing the building is
Del Prince & Sons Paving. They intend
to use part of the front for their offices with the remainder to be leased out
to other tenants for offices. The rear
portion of the building which formerly
consisted of racquetball courts would be
remodeled as a storage garage for paving
equipment which includes pavers, bulldozers, backhoes, and dump trucks. No

Tabled - The plan that was submitted to the Committee does not meet all the requirements of the Town Zoning Ordinance. The site lacks the 10 foot perimeter landscaping around the rear parking area. Also a detailed drainage plan must be submitted to the Engineering Department for their approval. After some discussion it was decided that the East, West and South walls of the building, which were shown to be plain concrete block on the building plan elevations, should be finished in such a manner as to make it aesthetically compatible with the adjacent or neighboring residential homes.

ITEM V 180 Stradtman

Proposed 80 X 130
 Distribution Warehouse

Applicant: Bernard DiPizio

Determination:

Tabled - The building would be located in the Anchor Industrial Park - the site of the former Anchor Concrete Products. A number of concerns were expressed by the members of the Committee. The Town Engineer and Highway Engineer indicated that there were drainage problems in that area and the best way to correct them would be for on site retention of storm waters. This would be accomplished through proper grading of the parking area and proper pipe sizing of the drainage system on the site is connected to storm water receivers which are located near an existing fuel island and there was concern that an accidental spill will result in fuel flowing through the Town's storm sewer system. It was recommended that the drainage be designed to eliminate the possiblity of fuel flowing into the storm sewer or to devise a spill control system. The site does not meet the Zoning Ordinance Landscaping requirement therefore the developer would have to establish landscaping, preferably with berms along Cirard Avenue or to present his proposal to the Town Planning Board for relief. It was brought to the attention of the Committee by the Town Fire Inspector that a fire hydrant must be installed at the rear of this complex. He also relayed to the Committee that the developer is requesting the fire district to install a hydrant along Stradtman to further improve the water supply for fire fighting purposes.

274 Cayuga Road

 Proposed Rezoning For Storage Of Roofing Materials And Equipment

Applicant: Richard Neth

Determination:

The Town Environmental Quality Review Advisory Committee has reviewed the proposed site plan for the new building and other improvements on the site.

Although the owner would make considerable improvements in way of landscaping, traffic control as well as removing unsightly and deteriorated buildings, the Advisory Committee cannot recommend that the rezoning be granted. This stretch of Cayuga Road from Genesee Street to Cleveland Drive is composed of retail sales, offices and residential properties. There are only three uses in this stretch of Cayuga Road that are incompatible with these classifications. ITEM I

350 Cayuga Road

 Proposed Conversion Of Multiple Family Dwelling To An Office And Two Dwelling Units

Applicant: Empire National Realty Corporation

Determination:

The applicant proposes to have a real estate office in the front portion of the building located at 350 Cayuga Road. The area is zoned for restricted business and there are numerous offices in the area. There was concern about landscaping located to the rear of the property. The existing blacktop, which the applicant wishes to utilize, may be in place all the way to the property line. The applicant was advised to redraw the site plan showing exactly where the edge of the blacktop is in relation to the property line and to make several changes to conform with the Town Zoning Ordinance. These changes would include a 25 ft. wide driveway for the first 50 ft. of the property. Fencing or screening on the West and the North property lines and any additional landscaping to be installed. The new site plan must be submitted before this Committee will make a determination.

ITEM II 2437 Union Road

- Proposed Banquet Facility

Applicant: Anthony Marczak

Determination:

Non-Significant with stipulations. applicant and architect were present at the meeting and indicated that the original proposal was for a banquet facility as well as a picnic area at the rear of the property. After considerable discussion it was determined that any outside activities could result in a number of nuisances or impacts for the The site is located South of Groell Avenue and approximately 7.00 ft. West of a new subdivision. Outside activities and related music would affect these residential areas, as there is not sufficient screening or noise deadening vegetation in place. The Committee was of the opinion that the banquet facility and rezoning for same would be appropriate providing there is no outside activity permitted. Therefore this proposal is considered non-significant provided the following are adhered to: banquet facility only are adhered to: banquet facility only no outside activity, the picnic area designation on the plan is to be removed; a detailed drainage plan is to be submitted to the Town Engineer for approval; "protection" must be provided along the top of creek bank, this being guard rails or similar barricades; the New York State DOT must be notified of the applicant's proposal and curb cuts must be obtained from the DOT; a new site plan must be submitted to the Town for approval with all changes.

ITEM III 760 Dick Road

 Proposed Commerce Center/ Warehousing

Applicant: Benderson Development Corporation

Determination:

Non-Significant with stipulations. parcel of property up for rezoning is presently zoned for apartments. There are residential homes to the South of this site and to the East with a railroad right-of-way to the North. was determined that this type of use would not be detrimental to the area. The 100 ft. railroad right-of-way to the North will act as a buffer for any residential properties along that right-ofway. The homes on Harris Court to the South, will be buffered by means of a solid fence and bermed landscaping. developer has indicated on his plans that only private vehicles (automobiles) will be parked along that side of the development. All truck traffic will be entering and exiting on the North side of the property with a truck turn-around at the rear so that at no time should truck traffic be using any roads bounding the Harris Court properties. The buildings themselves will be constructed of architectural block, dry-vit system and architectural aluminum trim. They will be used strictly for offices and office/warehousing, no truck terminals are allowed. Sufficient access for fire fighting will be provided as well as yard hydrants for fire department connections. A new site plan must be submitted to the Town Planning Board and to the Traffic Safety Committee for their recommendations on this project. the type of landscapings must be indicated on the plan as well as sewer easements that may or may not exist at the present time. Determination: Non-Significant - The developer proposes to construct two additions to an

He has been before the Committee at the previous meeting and has amended his site plan to provide better access for fire fighting equipment, to remove gas meters that were in hazardous locations, and to provide a drainage plan for the Town Engineer. The developer has approached the New York State DOT and has not received any final recommendations from them. The Traffic Safety Committee has reviewed the proposal and recommended that the New York State DOT's recommendations be followed. The developer has also proposed to the Planning Board that trees will be planted along the length of Benbro Drive to enhance the looks of the ared as little else can be done to improve on landscaping. Drainage must be approved by the Engineering Department. The area now is used predominantly for similar businesses, warehousing and offices. This building will be utilizing the last ' empty space for development along Benbro Drive. No significant impacts are anticipated as this construction will not increase traffic by any large amount.

ITEM VI Walden Avenue Sanitary Sewer Extension

Applicant: Town of Cheektowaga

Determination:

Non-Significant - The Town is proposing to construct a sanitary sewer extension along Walden Avenue East of Dick Road. The sewer extension is proposed to connect existing businesses only. These businesses must be connected since their septic systems are failing which could lead to health and/or environmental problems.

ITEM VII Seminole Drive/Nokomis Parkway Storm Sewers

Applicant: Town of Cheektowaga

Determination:

Non-Significant - The storm sewer system is being proposed for an area of Town off George Urban Boulevard between the Thruway and Union Road. This area is subject to considerable street flooding and hazardous ice conditions in winter due to poor drainage. The system will drain the storm waters from the streets to the George Urban Boulevard storm system and to the U-Crest ditch. This system will benefit the residents by resulting in the elimination of water and ice conditions from the streets.

ITEM VIII Vale Subdivision Drainage System

Applicant: Town of Cheektowaga

Determination:

Non-Significant - The Vale Subdivision is located between Beach Road and Union Road directly North of Maryvale Drive. This area is subject to extensive street flooding and hazardous ice conditions in winter. The subdivision has little or no surface drainage for the roadways and this proposed system will eliminate the problems that are now encountered by the residents.

ITEM IX 45 Gardenville Pkwy

 Proposed Extension Of Mini Warehouse Complex

Applicant: Eugene Piotrowski

Determination:

Non-Significant - The applicant proposes to construct a 25 x 300 ft. mini warehouse in an existing mini-warehouse complex off Cardenville Parkway near Union Road. This building will be fronting on Gardenville Parkway adjacent to the existing warehouse office building which now has a brick front. It is assumed by this Committee that the new building will also have a brick veneer front to match the existing. This will maintain the aesthetic qualities of the complex. Since the complex was constructed, there have been no significant impacts nor substantial increase in traffic. The area is now a warehousing/office complex and this Committee can find no significant impacts.

ITEM X Armond & Borden Road

Proposed Rezoning From Residential To Restricted Business For Additional Parking

Applicant: Richard Stiegler

Determination:

Tabled - The plans submitted to the Committee by the applicant is not to scale and does not conform with the Landscaping Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga. The Engineering Department is also requesting a proper drainage plan for the parking area. The applicant will be so notified.

ITEM XI 1025 French Road

- Proposed Office Building

Applicant: Donato Construction Company

Determination:

Non-Significant - The applicant had been before the Committee previously and was requested to make several revisions. The revised plan that was submitted at this meeting showed a wood frame with vinyl siding building which would be aesthetically pleasing and the building was down sized and site laid out to conform with Zoning Ordinance requirements both for parking and for landscaping. The drainage plan must be submitted to the Engineering Department for approval. This area of French Road was zoned restricted business for offices so there is no deviation from the Town's Master Plan. With the re-design of the building the architecture will be more compatible with surrounding uses.

ITEM XII 180 Stradtman

Proposed Warehouse

Applicant: Bernard DiPizio

Determination:

Tabled - The applicant proposed to construct a warehouse office building on his Anchor Industrial Complex on Stradtman Road. Although the Committee feels that the concept for a complex in this area is not detrimental and will have little or no significant impact on the area, there are a number of concerns that must be addressed by the owner: (1) The owner must submit a revised drainage plan showing on site retention of storm waters. There is a large amount of storm water which flows into the Town's existing sewer system and it is a belief of the Committee that increased construction and paving will further increase the pot "tial for flooding on the residential streets to the South of this complex. (2) There is an existing fuel pump island and tanks located at the Southeast corner of this property which are near an existing storm water drainage system. There is concern that an accidental spill at this location will result in the flow of fuel down the residential streets or in the residential storm sewer system. Therefore the Committee is requiring that the developer do one of several things to rectify the situation. They are to move the pumps and fuel tanks further into the complex; to design a spill control system for that location or; remove the storm water drainage system from the area entirely.

- (3) The applicant must submit a landscaping plan for the entire complex following the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance or to approach the Planning Board for relief.
- (4) The applicant is requested to indicate on the site plan any other future construction.
- (5) Locate new yard hydrant(s) on the site plan and timetable for installation.

ITEM XIII Walden Galleria Mall - Proposed 1.2 Million Sq. Ft. Shopping Mall

Applicant: Lancer Development & Construction Co

Determination:

The developers representative, Kenneth Cannon, met with the Committee to discuss several concerns. The major concerns center around traffic and traffic flow pattern as well as drainage for the area at Scajaquada Creek. The developer has indicated that new plans are now being drawn with more detail as to drainage and traffic. Discussions are also under way with the Thruway Authority and their own highway engineers to design access to the Thruway and to Walden Avenue. The developer has indicated that there are a number of other possibilities for access that they are now exploring and will be presenting in the future.



Tax Assessment & Litigation Overview

Dear Mr. Kozminski:

During the past several weeks we have had an opportunity to continue our review of current pending assessment protests.

Our review indicates that there are better than 1,000 grievances filed as of last year, of which 330 pertained to commercial industrial properties.

Currently, there are better than 275 Article VII proceedings underway which, as you know, is the formal tax litigation involved in property. Of these properties, it is estimated that better than \$83 million dollars worth of assessments is involved.

Your specific short-term needs concern three major properties located in the Town of Cheektowaga, one being Joy Manufacturing and two others pertaining to Benderson Properties, one a major strip shopping center, and the other the original GEX facility. Each property has unique uses and problems related to Fair Market Value. Collectively, the properties represent_fair market values and assessments approaching \$15 million dollars.

Since each case has different problems, our recommendation of preliminary value analyses are set forth below.

We stand ready to assist your department and the Town Board in any way possible to assure equality of assessments and values for properties in the Town.

Joy Manufacturing Facility

The Joy manufacturing company is located at 3101 Broadway on the south side, west of Union Road, and represents a substantial industrial facility in the Town of Cheektowaga of high quality design. The facility has approximately 200,000 square feet of buildings and the land encompasses better than 50 acres.

The facility is assessed as two tax parcels on the rolls and is denoted as Tax Account No. 102.04-3-17.11 and 12 with a value of \$6,000,000.

On March 3rd of this year, in your presence, we conducted a tour of the facility. The results indicate a modern industrial facility with heavy wiring accommodating the existing manufacturing use involved in high technical engineering, design and construction of air compressors, which are shipped to an international markets. This case has been pending for a considerable length of time and needs immediate attention, as you requested, to possibly resolve an equitable Fair Market Value estimate. My recommendation is to conduct a 2-step analysis which would result in a preliminary value finding and critique of the facility.

The tax petitioner has submitted an appraisal performed by Realty Appraisal Companies, Inc. of Plymouth, Pennsylvania, the appraisal being submitted in early 1986 and applies to a valuation as of December 11, 1985.

My suggestion is to review this report thoroughly to critique the analysis and findings as it particularly relates to market sales of other industrial facilities. It is noted that the appraiser did not consider the cost or investment analysis in this process.

We intend to review each of the sales in the field to determine comparability of the property.

As a correlary, we propose to offer additional industrial sales located in the Buffalo and western region of New York State. As you know, there are very few facilities that have sold that relate to the quality of construction and condition of this property and, therefore, we may have to research comparable sales outside the immediate Buffalo area. We feel confident that we can develop comparables that fairly equate value. Once we critique the first appraisal, the second step will be to resolve our own independent preliminary estimate of value and then correlate findings and present an analysis to your department.

We estimate approximately 30 to 45 days to complete this analysis and the cost will be \$3,500 for our preliminary findings.

2. 2510 Walden Avenue (formerly GEX facility)

The property under review noted as number 2 is the old GEX facility at 2510 Walden Avenue. The property has extensive improvements consisting of 125,000 square foot original GEX retail center, another retail facility with approximately 32,000 square feet, a storage facility with roughly 44,000 square feet of building area, a restaurant and full retail gas operation.

Your current value is \$4,500,000 and we propose to review the entire facility based on Highest & Best Use, and derive a preliminary value considering market and/or investment analysis. This will offer your department a basis on which to evaluate your current assessment and market value estimate. Our estimated cost to complete this preliminary review is \$4,200 and we also note that we have had experience with this property in the past.

3. 3875 Union Road, Urban Union Plaza

The third property which requires immediate attention is the Urban Union Plaza at 3875 Union Road, on the east side, north of Walden. This strip center has undergone modifications to tenancy and renovations over the last number of years. Its value components consist of a 125,000 square foot shopping center, with approximately 10 tenants, a separate free-standing restaurant out parcel, as well as a Midas Muffler operation. We would anticipate a valuation of the whole facility in conjunction with the sum of the parts. Your current value is approximately \$4,000,000 and we would estimate an approximate fee of \$3,500 to conduct a combination Income and Market Valuation of the is property, depending upon the availability of data.

Our valuation review for items 2 and 3 above can be completed within the 45 to 60 day period but we will stress most importantly the Joy manufacturing facility.

As in all of our consulting efforts for the Town of Cheektowaga, we stand ready to support your department in any way possible, yet considering our total independence as a real estate consulting firm.
