WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga was the lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") pertaining to the construction and operation of the Walden Galleria and issued a Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") and Statement of Findings approving various permits and activities required for the construction and operation of the Walden Galleria, and

WHEREAS, in November of 1988, pursuant to Chapter 21A of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, the Applicant submitted materials to the Town Board in support of a request for approval to construct the Project in accordance with various plans and drawings, which Project was described generally in the FEIS previously issued by the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to SEQRA, an Environmental Assessment Report ("EA Report") was submitted to the Town, which included an Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF"), in support of the request for approval, and

WHEREAS, the EA Report and the EAF were prepared with knowledge of the content of the FEIS and contained discussion of any and all issues regarding the Project which were not previously considered in the FEIS, and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the request for approval to construct the structural span pursuant to Cnapter 21A of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, the Town Board, with the concurrence of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation ("NYSDEC") declared its intention to continue as lead agency for environmental review of the Project, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board duly published notice of the receipt of the EA Report and the EAF to solicit comments on the application for approval of the construction of the Project, pursuant to Chapter 21A of the Code of the Town of Cneektowaga, at which time all members of the public wishing to make statements concerning the Project were neard, and



The 16" forced main at Alpine Lift Station, 50 Herbert Avenue sprung a leak over the Christmas weekend. Fire Dispatch notified us that water was comming out of the street. As per our conversation Tuesday December 26, 1988, I called Morgan Contractors to make the repair. It was agreed that we would supply dump trucks to haul soil and provide stone for back fill. We would also supply the necessary pumps to take care of the sewage entering the lift station while the repair was

The personnel started the job Tuesday December 26, 1988 in the A.M. and the repair was completed that day. The dresser fitting connecting two of the discharge pipes sprang several leaks. After excavating and measuring the OD of the steel pipe, we were unable to locate a dresser of that size. Erie County Water was also contacted to no avail. It was decided that Morgan's people would try to weld these holes and we would apply several pails of water plug to the coupling to make the repair. The work was completed and a time sheet was turned in for the man hours and equipment by the contractor.

The personnel from Morgan Contractors provided the correct OD size of this steel pipe. Because the size is different than what is used by Erie County Water and the line is approximately fifty years old, I would advise we order one of these dresser fittings for future use. This coupling may have to be made special for us.

We also will square cut the street and have Highway blacktop to avoid additional cost from the contractor.

#### SCAJAQUADA CREEK EASEMENT

THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into this <u>Aoth</u> day of January 1989, by and between PYRAMID COMPANY OF BUFFALO, a general partnership organized under the laws of the State of New York, with its principal office and place of business located at 4 Clinton Square, Syracuse, New York (hereinafter referred to as the "Owner"), and

TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK, a domestic municipal corporation having its principal office and place of business located at the Town Hall, Broadway and Union Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York (hereinafter referred to as the "Town"), and

WHEREAS, Owner owns certain real property in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, described at Exhibit "A" which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof, on which Owner is developing a regional shopping center known as the Walden Galleria (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Owner has proposed the construction of a structural span (the "Structural Span") which will cross the one hundred and fifty foot floodway of Scajaquada Creek (the "Floodway") for a distance of approximately 1,500 feet through the Project site as reflected on Exhibit "B" annexed hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Town intends to perform or cause to be performed inspection and maintenance work in the Floodway through the Project site on the property of Owner and therefore the Town is desirous of obtaining easement rights to facilitate the performance of such work,

#### NOW THEREFORE WITNESSETH:

THAT the Owner, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and no more and other good and valuable consideration paid by the Town, does hereby grant and release unto the Town on the terms and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, a permanent right-of-way and easement for the purposes of:

- (i) regular inspection of the Floodway through the Project site, including the area beneath the Structural Span (hereinafter referred to as the "Easement Area"), in order to inspect the Easement Area for the accumulation of sediments or debris or other circumstances which may impede water flow, and to perform maintenance and pest control; and
- (ii) removal or correction of any such water flow impediment from the Easement Area.

(purposes (i) and (ii) above being hereinafter referred to as the "Work").

TOGETHER with the grant to the Town, its agents, contractors, and employees, of the right to enter Owner's property, as described at Exhibit "A", and gain access to the Easement Area via the proposed Access Roads which will be constructed generally in the locations shown on Exhibits "C" and "D", annexed hereto and made a part hereof (field conditions will dictate the final configuration and exact location of the Access Roads). Nothing herein shall be deemed to grant to the Town a right of access to the Easement Area through or from above the Structural Span or any buildings or other improvements of the Owner, its successors or assigns.

RESERVING, to Owner, its successors and assigns, the right to build, rebuild, restore, renovate or otherwise affect the improvements located over and within the Easement Area.

Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to convey any rights to modify, alter or change any improvements within the Easement Area constructed by Owner, its successors or assigns.

Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prohibit the construction of an expanded Structural Span in the Easement Area in addition to that which is currently proposed in conjunction with the Project.

Owner expressly reserves the right to grant easements to others in or crossing through the Easement Area, so long as said uses do not interfere with the performance of the Work as defined herein.

The rights and easements are herein granted to the Town upon the express understanding that if, in entering the Easement Area for any purpose, any damage is done by the contractors or subcontractors of the Town to landscaped areas, paved areas or other real or personal property located on Owner's lands, then the responsible contractors or subcontractors of the Town shall, at their own cost and expense, promptly repair any and all such damage as necessary to substantially restore the affected area to the condition which existed immediately prior to the commencement of the activities that resulted in such damage. The contractors or subcontractors of the Town shall be responsible for all damage and consequences caused by their negligence during the performance of the Work.

The rights and easements herein granted to the Town are subject to the following specific conditions:

- (a) the Work must be promptly completed and performed; and
- (b) the Town shall require any contractor performing any part of the Work to maintain adequate liability and workers' compensation insurance.

Prior to the commencement of the Work, the Town shall notify the Walden Galleria Mall Manager employed by Owner for the purpose of coordinating security measures for the area beneath the Structural Span.

It is specifically understood and agreed that nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to prohibit Owner from having the right to fully use and enjoy the Easement Area so long as such use and enjoyment does not impair the rights granted under this Easement.



WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga, New York is a municipal corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, Doyle Fire District No. 1, Walden Fire District No. 2, Forks Fire District No. 3, U-Crest Fire District No. 4, Pine Hill Fire District No. 5, Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6, Hy-View Fire District No. 8, Bellevue Fire District No. 9, South Line Fire District No. 10 are all Fire Districts located within the Town of Cheektowaga; and

WHEREAS, the aformentioned Fire Districts along with the Village of Sloan have executed a municipal agreement pursuant to Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York for the purpose of providing a joint Fire Alarm System to notify the several fire departments of an alarm and to dispatch men and equipment to fire and first aid emergencies; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga is desirous of assuming responsibility for the aformentioned dispatch functions which will be merged with the existing function of dispatching men and equipment to police emergencies to create a joint dispatch function to better utilize the new E 911 system; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the parties to provide for the manner in which existing men and equipment presently utilized in the existing Fire Alarm Office will be transferred to the Town of Cheektowaga.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:

### SECTION I - RESOLUTION OF TOWN BOARD

Within thirty (30) days of the execution of this
Agreement by the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, the Town
Board will pass a resolution stating that it will assume the
functions and responsibilities of the Fire Alarm Office of the
Town of Cheektowaga in accordance with the provisions of the
Civil Service Law, Section 70 on the date set forth in Section VI
herein.

#### SECTION II - ADDITIONAL RIGHTS OF EMPLOYEES

The Town will enter into an Agreement with the Town Employees Association and the Town Supervisory Unit to insure the following:

- 1. The titles of Public Safety Dispatcher and Senior Public Safety Dispatcher will be part of the Employees

  Association and the Supervisory Unit respectfully.
- The positions will be full-time and within the competitive class of the civil service.
- 3. Seniority in these positions will be determined by the date of hire by the Town.
- 4. The Fire Dispatchers and Senior Fire Dispatcher will, upon becoming Town employees, be treansferred to the positions of Public Safety Dispatcher and Senior Public Safety

Dispatcher respectively and will retain accrued credits for vacation, sick leave and personal leave and compensatory time and will have their respective seniority with in the Fire Alarm Office credited for vacation selection, vacation longevity, longevity, salary schedule, choice of shift, days off, etc. as applicable, pursuant to the terms of the respective collective bargaining agreements in effect.

- 5. The Fire Dispatchers and Senior Fire Dispatcher will be transferred without any loss of pay and if said transfer occurs after the Town employees receive an increase in pay for the year 1989 their salaries shall be increased to reflect the same raise.
- 6. Effective upon the Fire Dispatchers and Senior Fire Dispatcher becoming town employees, all provisions of the Employees Association or Supervisory Unit contract, as it exists at that time, will be applicable to these employees.

# SECTION III - RETIREES

Effective the date the Town assumes responsibility for the functions of the Fire Alarm Office, the Town shall provide all retirees thereof with the same benefits it provides retirees of the Town who, previous to retirement, were members of the bargaining unit represented by the Town of Cheektowaga Employees Association. This will include benefits, if any, provided by the Town to widows or widowers of Town Retirees.

# SECTION IV - GRANTS AND EQUIPMENT

The Fire Alarm Committee agrees that effective the date the Town assumes responsibility for the functions of the Fire Alarm Office all equipment presently owned, or hereafter acquired, by the Committee and utilized in the operation of the Fire Alarm Office shall be transferred to the Town.

Furthermore, the Committee agrees to transfer all rights in any grants to which it may be entitled.

# SECTION V - POLICY DETERMINATIONS

The parties agree to the establishment of a committee consisting of one (1) member from each of the duly organized volunteer fire districts in the Town, one (1) member from the Village of Sloan Fire Department, a senior fire (public safety) dispatcher, the Chief of Police or his designee, and one (1) member designated by the Town Board. The committee shall advise and consult with the Town Board on matters relevant to it and shall be empowered to implement changes in established policies and procedures governing fire and first aid calls, unless such changes are violative of any rules or regulations governing the Dispatch Office, including those of the Federal Communications Commission or the County of Erie Department of Emergency Services, upon notification to the Town Board of such changes.

# SECTION VI - EFFECTIVE DATE

The following events will occur at 12.01 A.M. on the 1st day of October, 1989.

1. The Town will assume full responsibility for the

operation and funding of the functions of the existing Fire Alarm Office of the Town of Cheektowaga.

- 2. All responsibility on the part of the Boards of Fire Commissioners which presently comprise the Fire Alarm Committee of the Town of Cheektowaga for the operation, except as set forth in SECTION V above, and funding of the functions of the existing Fire Alarm Office of the Town of Cheektowaga shall cease.
- 3. The Fire Dispatchers and the Senior Fire Dispatcher shall become Town employees in the titles of Public Safety Dispatcher and Senior Public Safety Dispatcher respectively.
- 4. All current retirees of the Fire Alarm Office shall begin receiving the benefits provided to retirees of the Town.
- 5. All equipment owned and utilized by the Fire Alarm Committee in the operation of the Fire Alarm Office will be transferred to the Town along with any and all rights to any grant monies.

The applicant stated that he is now sole owner of the business, having formerly been a partner, and that he now desires and has the ability to improve on the appearance of the premises by providing additional landscaping and stockade fencing to screen abutting residential properties. The applicant proposes to eliminate one of the two existing driveway entrances on Genesee St, and it was the opinion of the Committee that the existing driveway on Colden Ct should also be eliminated. The Zoning Ordinance requires that a specific number of outside parking spaces be allotted based on the number of garage bays and, the applicant was directed to provide a more detailed, dimensioned plot plan which would demonstrate sufficient parking spaces in conjunction with the proposed auto display area.

ITEM III Seneca Paper Co.

Proposed 47,000 S.F. Office/Warehouse

Applicant: Allied Builders Inc.

Determination: Non-Significant

The project is proposed for sites no. 3 and 4 of the New Erie Industrial Park. The New Erie Industrial Park is slated for Spring 1989 construction consisting of what will become a dedicated Town highway with related storm sewer and sanitary sewer improvements on a 28 acre parcel formerly occupied by the Broadway Drive-In. The Seneca Paper Co. site will be located on the east side of the proposed highway and will occupy 4.4 acres. Seneca Paper Co. is relocating their present Buffalo facility to this site and currently employs approximately 30 workers, running a one-shift operation. The proposed warehouse structure will be 20 feet in height and will be constructed of pre-cast concrete panels housing paper goods and acting as a distribution center. 7000 S.F. of the proposed structure will house sales and office personnel. A significant portion of the 4.4 acres will remain undeveloped at this time and will accomodate future expansion.



We are submitting for Town Board approval, Change Order No. 2, for the Sewer District No. 3 Rehabilitation Contract held by Firstrhyme Construction Corporation, Inc. Change Order No. 2, in the amount of \$73,870.00, involves the rehabilitation of a 24" diameter V.T.P. sanitary sewer beneath the Harlem Road pavement located between #1316 Harlem Road and the Parker Street intersection (MH 13 B 19 to MH 13 B 18).

The scope of work to be performed under this rehabilitation project, including the type and extent of the various repairs was established and designed based on internal video inspection performed during 1981. The contract drawings anticipated the rehabilitation of three (3) sections of 24" diameter V.T.P. sewer, at the aforesaid location, totaling 36 lineal feet, using link-pipe repair methods at a unit price of \$345.00 per lineal foot. Pre-televising this particular pipeline prior to performing the specified repair under the contract revealed further deterioration over the past several years and existing conditions not suitable for link-pipe repair, as pipe in this section was found to be cracked, deformed and structurally unsound.

In view of the fact that open cut operations were not permitted on Harlem Road, 415 lineal feet of Insituform repair lining was ordered and installed at the established contract unit price of \$178.00 per lineal foot. The Insituform repair technology, installed from manhole to manhole, specified for installation under this project for other Harlem Road locations restores structural integrity to the pipe and was installed from MH 13 B 19 to MH 13 B 18 under this contract through Change Order No. 2 to guard against potential collapse under the Harlem Road pavement and the possible consequences of such an occurrence.

Upon Town Board approval, Change Order No. 2 documentation will be submitted to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for approval under the Grant Reimbursement Program.


