Section 1. Legislative intent. The preservation and improvement of the quality of the natural and man-made environment within the Town of Cheektowaga, in the face of population growth, urbanization, and technologic change with their accompanying demands on natural resources, are found to be of increasing and vital importance to the health, welfare, and economic well-being of present and future residents and require forth-right action by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga. It is recognized that the biologic integrity of the natural environment on which man is dependent for survival and the natural and functional beauty of our surroundings which condition the quality of our life experience cannot be protected without the full cooperation and participation of all the people of the Town working in partnership with local and state officials and with various public and private institutions, agencies, and organizations. Establishment of a conservation council is a necessary step in fostering unified action on environmental problems.

Section 2. Establishment of the Council. The Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga hereby creates a Conservation Advisory Council which shall be known as the Cheektowaga Conservation Advisory Council, hereinafter called the "Council".

Section 3. Membership. (1) The Council shall consist of ten (10) members of which seven (7) shall be appointed by resolution of the Town Board and who shall serve for 2 years, at the pleasure of the Town Board and the remainder shall be ex-officio members as provided herein. Persons residing within the Town of Cheektowaga who are interested in the improvement and preservation of environmental quality shall be eligible for

appointment as a member of the council. Vacancies on the Council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment except that a vacancy occurring other than by the expiration of term of office shall be filled only for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Section 4. Officers, meetings and committees. The Town Board shall designate a member of the Council to act as chairman thereof. At the first meeting of the Council its members shall elect from among themselves a recording secretary. The Council shall adopt rules and procedures for its meetings. It shall keep accurate records of its meetings and activities and shall file an annual report as provided in section six of this local law.

Section 5. <u>Powers and duties of the council</u>. The powers and duties of the Council shall be to:

- (1) Advise the Town Board on matters affecting the preservation, development, and use of the natural and man-made features and conditions of the Town insofar as quality, biologic integrity, beauty and other environmental factors are concerned. In the case of man's activities and developments, advise on any major threats posed to environmental quality, so as to enhance the long range value of the environment to the people of the Town.
- (2) Conduct and maintain an inventory of the natural resources within the Town of Cheektowaga.
- (3) Maintain an up-to-date index of all open marsh lands, swamps, wetlands and open areas as defined in Section 239-y of the General Municipal Law, in public or private ownership within the municipality. Such index shall include the ownership, present and proposed uses of such open areas, so as to provide a base of

- information for recommendations by the council for their preservation and/or use.
- (4) Seek to coordinate, assist and unify the efforts of private groups, institutions, and individuals within the Town of Cheek-towaga in accord with the purposes of this local law.
- (5) Maintain liaison and communications with public and private agencies and organizations whose programs and activities have an impact on the quality of the environment or who can be of assistance to the council.
- (6) Working in cooperation with the planning board, recommend from time to time to the Town Board features, plans and programs relating to environmental improvement for inclusion in the master plan of the Town of Cheektowaga and, similarly, recommend to the Town Board appropriate and desirable changes in existing local laws and ordinances relating to environmental and land use controls or recommend new local laws and ordinances.
- (7) Prepare, print and distribute books, maps, charts, and pamphlets in accord with the purposes of this local law.
- (8) Obtain and maintain in orderly fashion maps, reports, books and other publications to support the necessary researches of the commission into local environmental conditions.
- (9) When authorized by resolution of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, the Council may accept by gift, grant, devise, bequest, or otherwise, property both real and personal in the name of the Town of Cheektowaga, as may be necessary to conserve

and otherwise properly utilize open spaces and other land and water resources within the boundaries of the Town of Cheektowaga. Such real property may be accepted in fee for land and water rights, or as any lesser interest, development right, easement, including conservation easement, covenant, or other contractual right including conveyance with limitations or reversions.

(10) Carry out such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Town Board.

Section 6. Reports. The council shall keep accurate records of its meetings and actions and shall submit an annual report to the Town Board not later than the thirty-first day of December of each year, concerning the activities and work of the council. From time to time the council shall submit such reports and recommendations as may be necessary to fulfill the purpose of this local law.

Section 7. <u>Compensation and expenses</u>. The members of the council including ex-officio members, shall receive no compensation for their services as members thereof but may be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties within the appropriations made available thereof.

 Proposed Rezoning For Two Family Dwelling

Applicant had been before the committee previously and was told that the subdivision had not yet been filed with the County Clerk and therefore no legal parcels exist to be considered for a rezoning. The applicant was told by the developers that everything had been taken care of but the Town Engineer informed the applicant that this was not the case. The subdivision still does not exist legally and therefore the committee is tabling this item until such time as the subdivision is properly filed.

ITEM II

3938 Broadway

Proposed Addition For Globe Amerada

Applicant: Globe Amerada

Determination: Non-Significant With Conditions. The 4,000 square foot addition had been before the committee previously and had been tabled at that time to allow for the Planning Board to review landscaping and for a determination to be made as to whether or not a fire hydrant must be constructed on the street or the property itself. After considerable contact with the Albany office regarding the building code requirements a determination was made that no fire hydrant need be installed either on Ellicott Road or the property.

The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Quality Review Advisory Committee at a meeting held on June 26, 1990, in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

ITEM I

495 Aero Drive

 Proposed Additions Totaling More Than 7,000 Square Feet

Applicant: Mussachio Architects

Determination: Non-Significant With Conditions. This proposal had been before the committee previously and a new plan was requested. The new plan was submitted which shows the site to be partially paved this year and the balance to be paved as the land is needed. Landscaping which was previously approved by the Planning Board will also be installed along Amherst Villa Road and extended along the entire length of the property line in this area as the property is developed.

The applicant has indicated a desire to pipe the drainage ditches along the highways. He will approach the Erie County Highway Department and Town Highway Departments with regards to such piping. The Town Engineers indicated a desire that the drainage system be extended further South into the area that will eventually be paved.

The conditions are that landscaping be installed along Amherst Villa Road and that the drainage system be extended further South.

ITEM II

1049 French Road

 Proposed Addition To The Southline Fire Hall

Applicant: Southline Fire District #10

EQR - June 26, 1990 July 2, 1990

Page:

Determination: Non-Significant. The addition that is being proposed for the fire hall will be for offices, classroom facilities, storage and an expanded meeting area at the rear. Also as part of the addition will be 2 truck bays. The fire district is exempt from all Zoning Ordinance regulations and therefore does not have to appear before the Planning Board with regard to landscaping.

The Town Engineer and Highway Engineers indicated that part of the Suzette drainage system may drain towards the fire district storm system. If this is the case, they will approach the Fire District Commissioners to obtain an easement for the storm line to French Road. This matter will be investigated by the Engineering Department and they will make contact with the Board of Fire Commissioners for the Southline Fire District.

ITEM III 3325 Genesee Street - Proposed Rezoning For A Super Duper And Retail Stores

Applicant: Carmina Silvestri Architects

Determination: Tabled.

The rezoning is proposed for the site of the former Kelly Volkswagon dealership on Genesee Street at the intersection of Beach Road. At present the front portion of the property is zoned General Commercial and the rear portion zoned Residential. The applicant is proposing to rezone the entire piece to Retail Business. The proposal for the site calls for construction of a 62,000 square foot supermarket and a 5,400 square foot addition to the existing building. The addition and old building will be leased for retail sales and other neighborhood "uses". The developer at this time does not propose to lease to a restaurant or bar operation.

The developer has designed the parcel to have a 38 foot landscape buffer along the West with a berm and fencing. A 33 foot to 40 foot berm with landscape buffer will be along the South property line. The developer has indicated that a traffic study is now underway as well as a drainage study. These studies when completed will be forwarded to the appropriate agencies.

The item has been referred to the New York State Department of Transportation for their review and comments.

A number of residents of the area were present at the meeting to ask questions and voice their concerns regarding the proposed project.

Paramount on their list of concerns were flooding and traffic. They have indicated that there is frequent backyard flooding in the area and would like the developer as part of the project, if approved, to alleviate the flooding as much as possible with the storm drainage system.

The traffic generation for such a project was also questioned and the need for better traffic control devices along Genesee Street was expressed. Some residents have even indicated that a traffic signal may be needed at Meadow Place and Genesee Street. Some residents have also questioned snow storage and the possibility of saving as much vegetation as possible that presently exists along portions of the property lines.

The developer has indicated that the traffic study will take into account traffic along Genesee, Beach and Meadow and that the Department of Transportation (DOT) must decide what is necessary to mitigate traffic problems. Snow will be removed from the site and what will remain should not be a problem.

The developer did indicate that the supermarket will probably be a 24 hour a day operation and will have its own security personnel. Some neighbors were concerned that such an operation may increase the crime rate in the area.

The question of noise and loading dock were raised and the developer indicated that loading docks will be along the North side of the building closest to Genesee Street will be screened and all noise producing equipment such as; air conditioners and compressors, will be placed as far away as possible from homes and other noise deadening measures will be taken as needed. Lighting will be provided on the site with some security lighting along the backside of the supermarket.

The committee tabled this item to allow for comments to be made by the New York State DOT and Erie County Department of Environment and Planning as well as to allow for comments by other residents of the area.

In settlement of various grievances pertaining to use and compensation of seasonal and part-time employees, the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Cheektowaga Employees Association agree to the following:

- 1.) The Town will fund and fill twelve (12) new bargaining unit positions as follows: Three (3) on 1/1/91, four (4) on 1/1/92 and five (5) on 12/31/92. Such positions will be placed in departments where the need is most critical and will be filled pursuant to bidding procedures as outlined in the bargaining agreement and/or Erie County Civil Service regulations. Section 3.06 shall be modified to 261 effective 1/1/91, 265 effective 1/1/92 and 270 effective 1/2/31/92. If the Town experiences a fiscal crisis, the parties agree to reopen Section 3.06 for further negotiations.
 - 2.) The following article is added to the current bargaining agreement:

"ARTICLE 28 - HEALTH AND WELFARE FUND

The Town will contribute \$3,000 in 1990, \$4,000 in 1991 and \$4,000 in 1992 to the Association's Health and Welfare Fund. Such funds are not to be expended pursuant to the Association's By-Laws and will not be used for political purposes or for general operation expenses of the Association."





The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Quality Review Advisory Committee at a meeting held on July 19, 1990, in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

ITEM I

3325 Genese Street

 Proposed Rezoning For Super Duper

Update:
The New York State Department of Transportation has not yet responded to our referral but we have received suggestions from the Traffic Safety Commission. The commission suggests an additional driveway along the East property line for a means of access for emergency vehicles and suggests several changes as far as striping and traffic lanes. This item will remain tabled until New York State DOT replies.

ITEM II

957 Dick Road

- Veterniary Clinic Expansion

Update:

The architect has indicated that the drainage is being resolved with the New York State DOT and will have additional information for upcoming meeting.

ITEM III Dale Road

- Proposed Niagara Mohawk Substation

Applicant: Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation

Determination: Non-Significant. The site for the substation is located at the East end of

Dale Road adjacent to the New York State Thruway.

Page: 2

At the present time there is a power line "corridor" and an existing substation on the South side of Dale Road. The applicant proposes to construct a new substation on the North side of Dale Road within this power corridor. The two transformers will sit on concrete foundations that will catch any oil leakage which will be directed into oil interceptor tanks. The transformers are normally protected with devices that will notify the power company if there is low pressure/leakage of the oil in the tanks.

The proposal is consistent with what is now in the area: that being power lines, substation and commercial use and will have no adverse affect upon the environment.

ITEM IV 2300 Clinton Street

 Proposed Addition To Pol-Tek Machine Shop

Applicant: Pol-Tek Industries Ltd.

Determination: Tabled.
The contractor was present and after some discussion the item was tabled for additional information and a new site plan. The contractor was informed that the airlock must be moved from the front of the building or a variance will be required from the Zoning Board of Appeals. A detailed landscaping plan must be provided as well as a detailed drainage plan and parking layout.

The contractor indicated the addition was to be of architectural steel panel of the same height as the existing building. It was suggested that he provide the committee with elevations of the building so that they may have a better idea of how the addition will look.

ITEM V Referral From New York State Department Of Environmental Conservation Regarding Kiantone Pipeline Corporation Proposed Crude Oil Pipeline.

The applicant proposes to construct a new gasoline and crude oil pipeline from Pennsylvania to Tonawanda. Part of the line will run through the Town from South to North within the old Lakehead Pipeline Corporation easement which is located within the power line corridor that runs North and South.

The committee agrees that the NYSDEC is best equipped to act as Lead Agency for this project. The committee also expressed some concerns that can be addressed by contact between the pipeline corporation and Highway and Engineering Departments.

The Town Engineer is concerned with the crossing of creeks and drainage ditches within the Town and would wish to review plans of such crossings.

The Highway Department would also review plans for crossings of any Town streets and in all cases any necessary Town permits must be obtained.

ITEM VI 2959 Genesee Street

- Proposed Rezoning For An Addition For An Insurance Office

Applicant: Bernard Cesar

Determination: Significant.

The applicant proposes to rezone a parcel of land to allow for an expansion of an existing office building. After some discussion the committee decided the proposal was significant and if the applicant desires to pursue a rezoning should file a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS).

The committee felt that the proposal would be "over use" of the property and an intrusion into a residential area. By construction of the addition the applicant would require a variance from the Zoning Board of Appeals with regards to setbacks and parking and would be looking for the Planning Board to accept a landscaping plan that had little in way of landscaping on the property.

The applicant, through such a request (rezoning), would be creating his own hardships and would then need to obtain variances or waivers for a number of ordinance requirements.

ITEM VII 3412 Broadway

- Proposed Expansion Of A Construction Storage Yard

Applicant: William Nunz/Lake Steel

Determination: Tabled.

The committee reviewed the proposal and is requesting the applicant to submit a new plan showing landscaping, screening and drainage of the lot. The lot must be paved with either concrete or blacktop and the applicant must reflect same on his site plan. A letter will be sent to the applicant requesting a new site and until such time as the plan is submitted the item will remain tabled.



In our August 20, 1990 letter to your office, Wegmans Food Markets, Inc. committed to construct all improvements associated with the above-referenced project as required by the Town, NYS Thruway Authority and NYSDOT.

These commitments, along with those requested at our August 28, 1990 meeting with the Town, are as follows:

- A. During construction Wegmans will:
 - Maintain all public roadways free of dirt, construction debris, etc. to the maximum extent possible.
 - 2. Retain water trucks or other means on the site to control fugitive dust.
- B. Prior to receipt of the Certificate of Occupancy for the two (2) front buildings, Wegmans will submit and adhere to a temporary Maintenance and Protection of Traffic Plan, acceptable to the Town Highway Superintendent, which will delineate the boundary line between Duke Road and the Wegmans' parcel in order to ensure controlled access to the site.
- C. Prior to receipt of the Certificate of Occupancy for the food market, the following work will be completed:
 - 1. Widening of the Duke Road approach to Walden Avenue to provide one left turn lane, one left thru lane, and one right turn lane.
 - 2. Widening of the Walden Avenue eastbound approach to Duke Road to provide two left turn lanes, three thru lanes and one right turn lane.
 - 3. Widening of the west Galleria driveway approach to Walden Avenue to provide one left turn lane, one left/thru lane and two right turn lanes.

Widening of Walden Avenue eastbound to provide a deceleration lane approaching the I90 eastbound entrance ramp.

TO:

- Widening of the Duke Road approach to Union Road to provide 5. one left turn lane and one right turn lane.
- Provision of a signal timing and progression scheme, acceptable to NYSDOT for the intersections of Walden/I90, Walden/Duke, Walden/K-Mart, and Walden/Jim's Truck Stop.

- 12. Provide a drainage easement for the existing twin 36" storm sewers in a form acceptable to the Town Attorney, Town Engineer and Town Superintendent of Highways are conveyed to the Town.

We have reviewed the June 28, 1990 Supplemental Traffic Analysis for the proposed Wegmans Food Market and Retail Plaza on Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga.

Our review has focused on whether the Supplemental analysis, combined with the March 1990 Traffic Analysis, provides an acceptable evaluation of a reasonable range of traffic impact mitigation alternatives, and whether it adequately considers, in a balanced manner, the critical issues of level-of-service, safety, queuing, and traffic progression.

We have concluded from the analysis presented, that the traffic impacts on the State Highway System from the proposed development can be satisfactorily mitigated if the following improvements are made.

- 1) The Duke Road approach to Walden Avenue should be widened to provide one left turn lane, one left/thru lane and one right turn lane.
- 2) The Walden Avenue eastbound approach to Duke road should be widened to provide two left turn lanes, three thru lanes and one right turn lane.
- 3) The west Galleria Driveway approach to Walden Avenue should be widened to provide one left turn lane, one left/thru lane and two right turn lanes.
- 4) Walden Avenue eastbound at the I90 eastbound entrance ramp should be widened to provide a deceleration lane.
- 5) The Duke Road approach to Union Road should be widened to provide one left turn lane and one right turn lane.

AN EQUAL OPPORTUNITY/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION EMPLOYER

- 6) A signal timing and progression scheme, acceptable to NYSDOT, should be provided for the intersections of Walden/I90, Walden/Duke, Walden/K-MART, and Walden/Jim's Truck Stop.
- 7) The two-lane approach of the I90 eastbound exit to Walden Avenue eastbound should be lengthened.

Final approval by NYSDOT on this traffic impact mitigation plan is contingent upon the following:

- Concurrence by the NYS Thruway Authority that traffic impacts in areas of their concern are satisfactorily mitigated.
- Approval by Pyramid Corp. of Buffalo for reconstruction of West Galleria Driveway.

These improvements must be constructed by the developer at their expense, subject to conditions of a required NYSDOT Highway Work Permit. Some additional traffic analysis to finalize pavement widening and signalization details may be required.

By copy of this letter, the Town of Cheektowaga is requested to condition the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy upon completion of these improvements to NYSDOT's satisfaction.

The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Quality Review Advisory Committee at a meeting held on May 3, 1990, in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

New Erie Industrial Park

- Proposed Tops Frozen Storage Facility

Applicant: Allied Builders

Determination: Non-Significant. This item had been before the committee previously at which time the applicant was told he must modify the plans. He has submitted a revised site plan which removes the trailer storage area, modifies landscaping to Planning Board requirements, increases the number of parking spaces for employees, moves the driveway for additional landscaping and improve traffic flow and they have also reviewed the drainage for conformity with the initial plan that was submitted to the Town.

In discussing this proposal with the applicant it was suggested that additional trees be added along the perimeter property line to help screen the building from the public. This suggestion will be taken up at a subsequent Planning Board meeting.

ITEM II

Dewberry Lane

- Proposed (Buffalo Telephone) Cellular Telephone Tower

Applicant: Buffalo Telephone

Determination: Non-Significant.

The applicant has applied to construct a 199 foot tower at the end of Dewberry Lane for the purpose of providing cellular telephone service in the area and to improve what services may exist at the present time. The tower will have a low power, line-of-sight microwave dishes connecting their other facilities in other towns.

Members of the committee visited the site that is now in operation next to the Erie Community College South Campus and have found no adverse impacts.

The applicant had looked at other sites in the Town but found no site that was both "electronically" feasible and some distance from residential areas.

ITEM III 2001 Walden Avenue

Proposed Wegmans
 Shopping Center

Applicant: Wegmans Food Markets Incorporated

Determination: Non-Significant With Recommendations. This item is considered a Type I Action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and therefore a negative declaration in this matter cannot be "conditioned".

The item has been referred to a number of agencies for their consideration. The New York State Department of Transportation has been consulted by the applicant and design work has progressed for the traffic flow at the intersection of Duke Road and Walden Avenue. The Town Highway Department has commented upon the reconstruction of Duke Road from Walden to old Duke Road and the applicant has indicated a willingness to meet the concerns and comments of the highway department. The New York State Thruway Authority has not submitted written comments and will be contacted by the applicant so that any concerns may be addressed as soon as possible. The Erie County Water Authority, although notified, has not submitted written comments on the project. The Erie County Department of Environment and Planning has no immediate concerns except traffic which is being reviewed by the New York State DOT at the present time.

This project involves the demolition of all existing buildings on the site and removal of the blacktop parking area. The re-build will increase the amount of building area by more than 50,000 square feet and involves the use of an additional 10 to 12 acres at the southern most end of the site. Because of the nature of the project and the existing situation on the site the review focused upon mitigation measures for traffic, drainage and landscaping for (improved aesthetics).

The committee is recommending to the Town Board that a negative declaration be issued for this project. The Town Board may wish to request some guarantee or surety that all traffic mitigation measures be instituted and the committee recommends that additional traffic measures be instituted above in addition to what was presented to the Town. The recommended additions are:

Reconstruction of Duke Road in its entirety from Walden to old Duke Road at Buffalo Forge. This to be to Town Highway Superintendent specifications.

The intersection of Walden and Duke Road/Galleria be modified to New York State Department of Transportation specifications.

We have reviewed the traffic, drainage, noise, and air quality analyses for the Wegmans Food Market development on Walden Avenue as they relate to Thruway Authority interests in the area, and we have the following comments on these documents:

Concerning the traffic analysis, we agree with New York State Department of Transportation's comments contained in the attached August 16, 1990 letter from A. E. Taylor to James E. Smith. Specifically that the existing northbound Thruway exit ramp to Walden Avenue should be widened to two lanes an additional distance from the stop bar, so that the two lane section will extend a sufficient distance back from the intersection from the stop bar to contain the traffic queue from the traffic signal at Walden Avenue. This distance will be governed by the traffic signal timing at the intersection of Walden Avenue and the northbound exit ramp. The southbound Thruway entrance ramp deceleration lane should be lengthened along Walden Avenue so that the deceleration lane terminates at the Walden Avenue overpass.

We have no substantive comments on the Drainage analysis. However, the drainage plan should be revised so that the runoff from the roof on the building labeled "Limits of Future Retail Space" will drain towards Walden Avenue. Specifically this will mean that the culverts that connect DD-1.1 to DD-1 and DD-1 to DD-2 will be eliminated and two culvert should be added one to allow DD-1.1 to drain into DD-2 and the other to allow DD-2 to drain into DC-1.1A.

Thirty-Five Years Of Service To Travelers 1954 - 1959 We have no substantive comments on the noise and air quality analyses.

We require that Wegmans provide the Authority with assurances that they will construct these improvements, and that and that they will do so at no expense to the Authority.

Before final approval to begin the highway work is granted the Authority must review the final plans and proposal.


